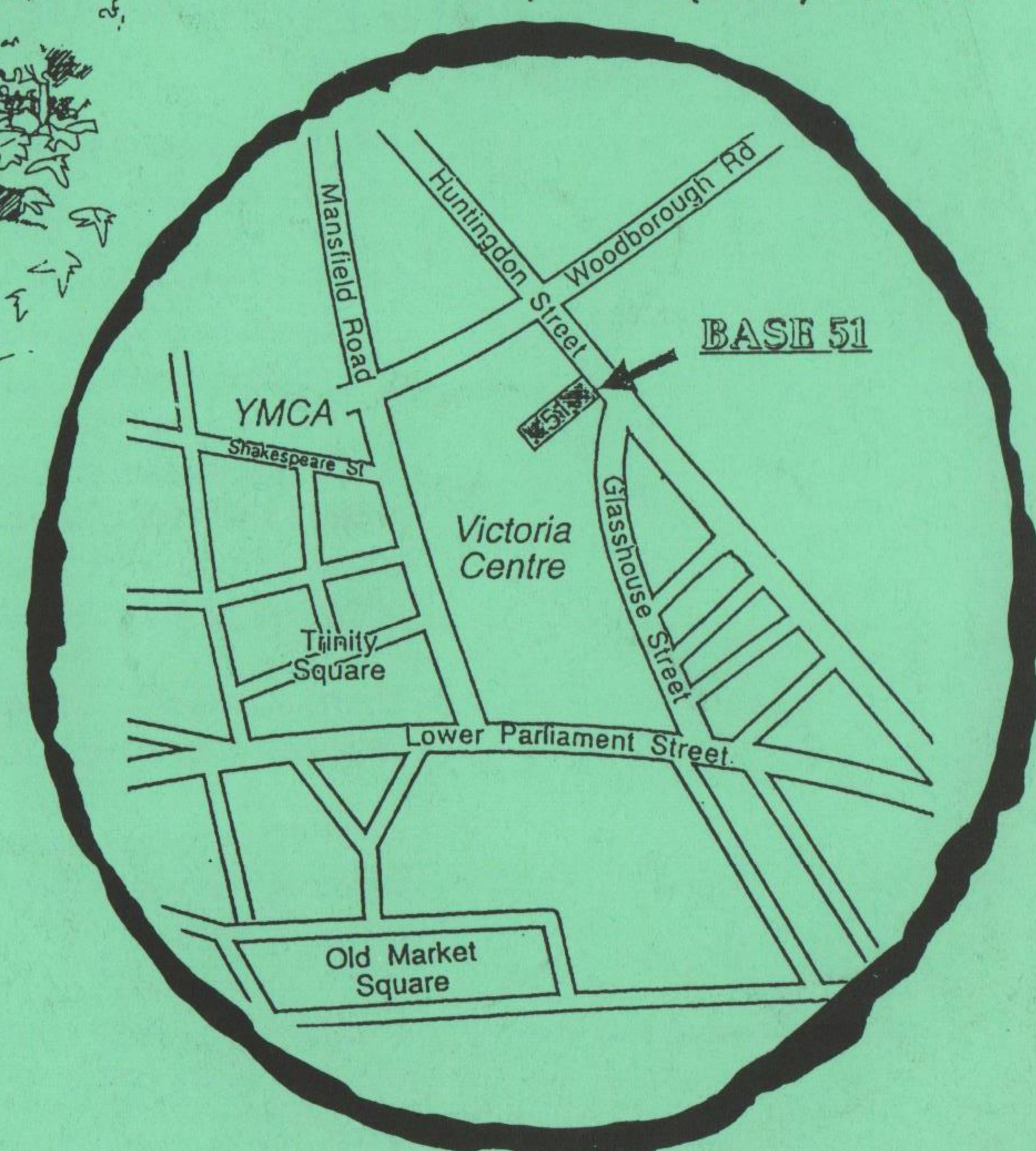

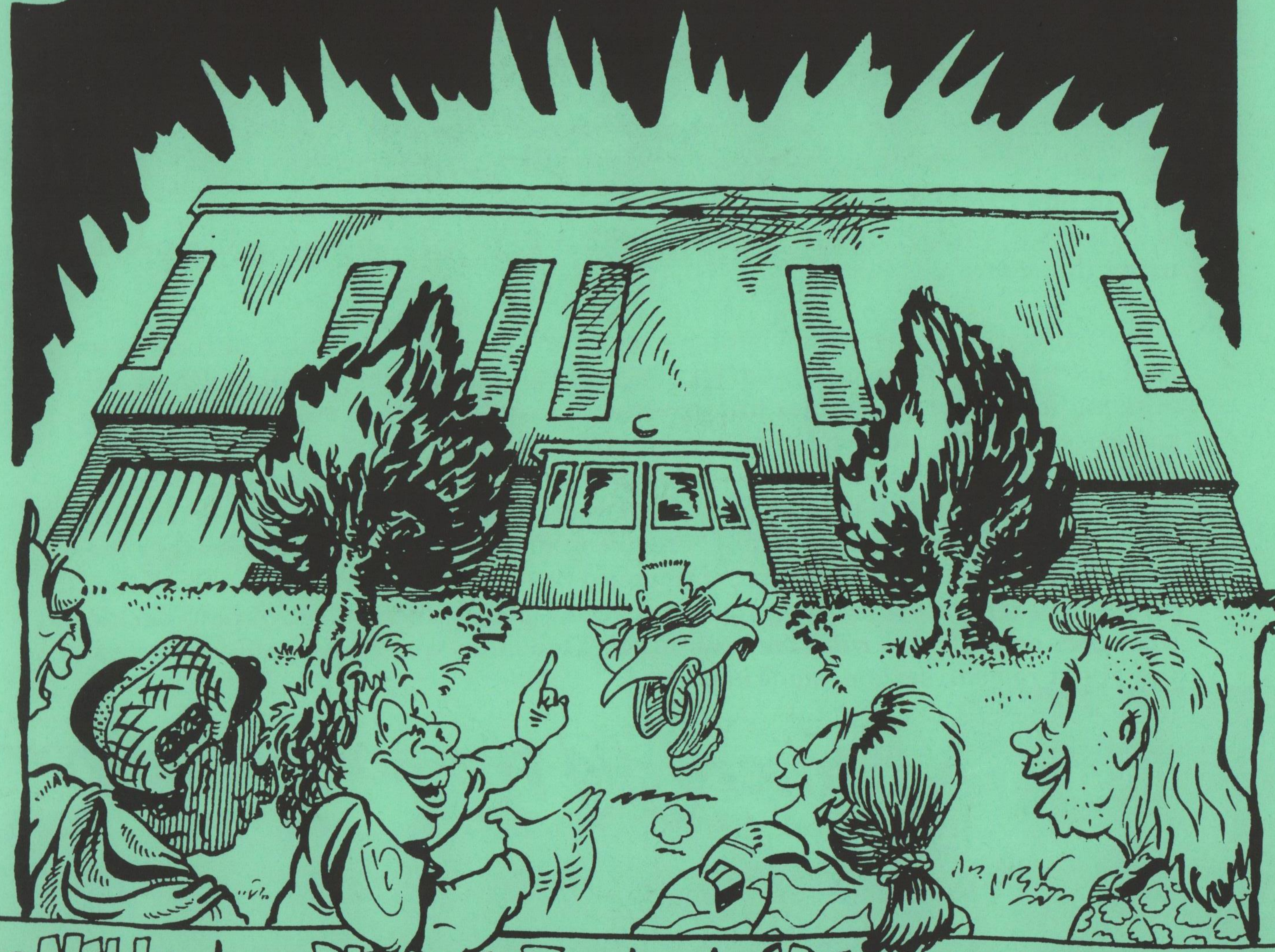

What is BASE 51? ?

BASE 51 at the moment is a **DEMOLITION SITE!** Walls have been knocked down and you can now get a true picture of the sheer size of the place... and it's **BIG!** With all of the hard work that is going into the building and the project, BASE 51 should be opened by March next year (1993).

What will it offer?

Once the building is rebuilt to our design, young people (12 to 25 years) will be able to drop-in to BASE 51, 6 days a week, from mid-day until 9:00 at night.

There will be:

CAFE - with cheap meals
COUNSELLING - immediate and long-term
INFORMATION AND ADVICE
HEALTH CARE - including pregnancy testing,
GP care for homeless, clinic sessions

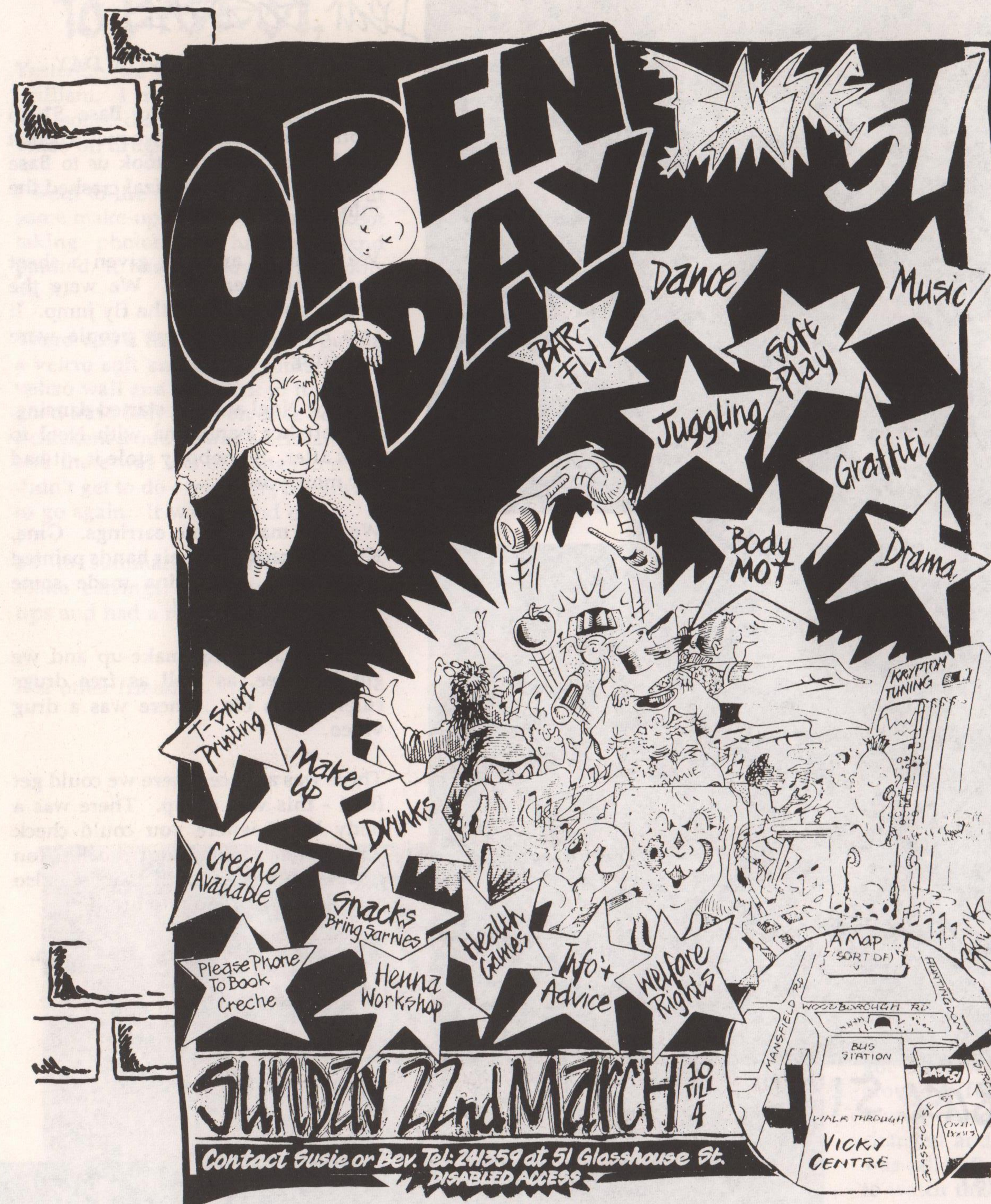
Lots of other activities will take place in the centre - possibly dance, drama, music, self defence -- exactly what 'other activities' will depend on what young people using the centre want!

Outreach workers have been visiting schools, colleges, hostels, and youth clubs to find out what young people want in the centre and also what would put them off of using it. The most popular things wanted included: advice sessions, computer games, cafe with multi-cultural food, careers advice, confidential counselling, disco/rave parties, drama lessons/workshops, games -football, netball, martial arts, hairdressing and make-up classes, information library, music room, pool/snooker table, tv/video room, weight lifting, etc. People were worried about: whether the centre will be totally confidential; if it would be expensive (it will all be free); that people will tell you what to do (we want young people themselves to help decide what goes on and what rules are needed); that too many questions would be asked; and about racism, sexism, smoking, etc.

BASE 51

- Where did the name come from?

In February of this year young people in schools, colleges, homes, youth clubs were asked to vote on a name for the Centre. We had a list of names which had been suggested and they voted on the one they liked the best. BASE 51 was the winner!



OPEN DAY AT BASE 51 - MARCH 1992

A very successful Open Day was held at Base 51 in March. It was attended by over 150 people and 'a good time was had by all.' There were a lot of activities to choose from - make-up, dance, making rave music, body MOTs, jewellery making, henna hand-painting, t-shirt printing, bar-fly, etc. The most popular activity was the bar-fly, with body MOTs the next best. The photos and letters on the next pages give an idea of what happened on the day. It is hoped that a lot of the activities done at the Open Day will be available when Base 51 opens in March next year.

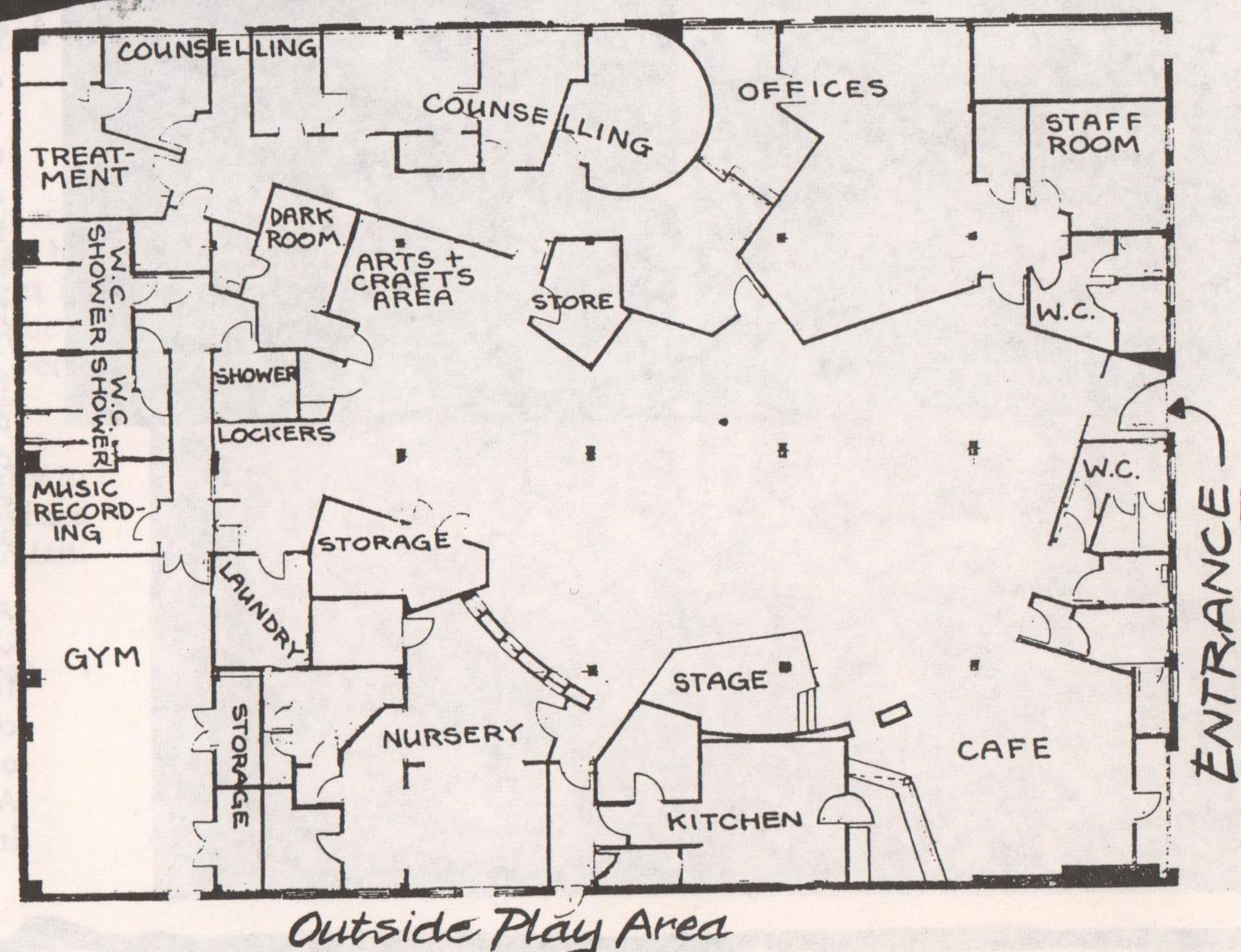

THE DESIGN PLANS FOR BASE 51

A lot of time has gone into developing the design plans for Base 51. The architects have gone out with the workers and members of the Outreach Group to talk with young people about what they would like to have in the building. Finally we have our final design plans - and we have the money for the building works to be done.

The building is very big and will offer space for lots of different things to take place!



Who works at BASE 51?

From September there will be three full-time workers at Base 51.

Project Director: Susie Daniel has been working on getting the centre opened for the last three years, and was appointed the Project Director in February.

Centre Manager: Jim Coogan will start as the Centre Manager on 14th September. He is moving here from London, where he has been involved in several young people's projects.

Admin/Finance: Ian Thomas starts work the 1st September as the Administration/Finance Officer. He, too, is joining us from London and will hopefully help us to get more money to get the project going!

We currently have an office at the front of Base 51 - the rest of the building is an empty shell. When the builders come onto site, in October, we will be working in portacabins in the carpark at the front of the building. There will not be a lot of space for lots of visitors but if you would like to see what is happening and get involved - please do come and see us!
