Why I don't read comics by snopes

FOR TOO MANY YEARS when I was young the only reading material to make it into our culturally deprived household was the Daily Mail and the Farmer and Stockbreeder neither of which appealed to me as a child any more than they do to me now as an adult. However, one rainy saturday night this was to change when uncle Willie returned home from his ritual pilgrimage to the chip shop in the neighbouring town with a bundle of comics under his arm. Why he chose to do this will remain one of the many mysteries of uncle Willie but us kids fell on them like wasps on ripe plums. There was Buster, Sparky, Valiant, Lion and Princess and one other girlie one whose title I can't remember. My favourite was Valiant. I shudder to think of the rampant racism of it now but my fave strip was Captain Hurricane. Captain Hurricane was his name and routing the) yellow peril his game. He was about ten feet tall and juggled 💢 tiny japanese soldiers ten at a time when, towards the end of each episode he had one of his Ragin' Furies. My other favourite was The Toys of Doom and featured some evil professor who was trying to conquer the world with his lethal teddy bears and toy tanks which packed REAL LIVE explosives. I more than others. Relationships touch everyone. The question could dig that. I have heard it said that men are more stimulated by visuals than women but I think it has more to do with habits and what's

When I decided to write this article I went to my local comic shop to look for a comic I could read. I found none. Some of them have good graphics but the stories I just could not relate to at all. I read an article in a 留作は一个人

Sunday Newspaper on why there are so few high profile women cartoonists. The gist of it was that women have tended to stick to the area of relationships in their work and that this is not a good thing.

"Women want a chance to prove that they can be as versatile as men". I don't know that men ARE more 'versatile' I feel it's more a matter of men having a different set of culturally determined interests. Some subjects touch your life

Ever wondered why there are few women political cartoonists? Well it depends on what you define as political. If you include the personal as political then there's no shortage of women in there making trouble but if you mean BIG politics like war, business and international capers it's just EASY to see why there aren't many women doing it. Just count the number of women in political life. It's not OUR experience - which is not to say that I want women to stay in the ghetto of relationships where they belong. I'd like to see women commenting on, for instance, the Gulf War. Maybe they weren't asked to. Maybe the commissioning editors are men.

In the same article I quoted above I read that "Women cartoonists rarely please anyone. Why?" Well for a start it's a fucking lie. Women cartoonists please me and other women like me That's why women don't read comics. You can't find any. It's

Thelma and Louise - feminist fascists? Nah. They're just two women who've had a gutful of men and decided to spew up over a few of them.

If you haven't seen Thelma and Louise (the movie) you may not know what I'm on about, so for those of you who missed out, a brief summary; two american women attempt to get away from it all for a weekend. Thelma's husband is a pig. Louise gives more than she gets to a rock musician who sees the relationship side of things as women's work.

Their weekend of freedom goes well until they run into a bloke who won't take no for an answer and decides to rape Thelma in a roadhouse carpark. Louise comes to the rescue with a gun and ends up shooting the man dead. Thelma and Louise know they don't stand even a slim one of convincing the law of the facts so they go on the run.

Along the way they hold up a grocery store, intern a state trooper in the boot of his patrol car and terrorise a leering trucker, raising a cheer from the women in the audience when they explode his ego along with his truck. Unfortunately the law eventually catches up with them.

Thelma and Louise hasn't made much of an impact at the box office. There is no merchandise accompanying the film; Thelma and Louise T shirts are nowhere to be seen and, sadly, there are no male trucker dolls for little girls, angered and frustrated by an unbearably oppressive patriarchal system, to pull the arms and legs off.

Thelma and Louise did, however, make an impact on the minds(?) of woolly liberal, middle class males who found the film degrading to their sex. Well, Ha Ha Ha.

For your amusement I will roughly summarise their whinings: one male critic deemed the film guilty of portraying men as stereotypes of testosterone- crazed behaviour. Another critic divined 'an explicit fascist theme wedded to the bleakest form of feminism.'

Not all those who have criticised the film have been men but opinion has been split roughly along the gender divide

Unfortunately, women defending themselves (and WINNING) doesn't go down too well. Thelma and Louise are persued to the edge of the Grand Canyon by more police than would be needed to arrest the population of

Texas. The women weigh up the odds and decide to go out in style, driving their Thunderbird at full speed over the edge. I guess they didn't fancy a life sentence - the maximum term given to many women who have had the audacity to defend



## SELF-DEFENCE IS NO OFFENCE

For ten long years Kiranjit Ahluwalia was subjected to humiliation and treated like a slave. She was not allowed to go out and see her friends or family. There were strict curbs on her behaviour and ordinary everyday activities. She could not even eat chillies or drink black coffee.

Violence everyday occurence. were faced terrified of their father. Kiranjit herself was slapped, kicked and punched. She was beaten with belts, shoes and pieces of furniture. She was sexually abused. with threatened was knives and hot irons and strangled. nearly confident was her husband of his control over his wife that he regularly threatened to kill her.

On the 21st of December 1989, Kiranjit Ahluwalia, a 33 year old Asian woman, was convicted of the murder of her husband. When she was tried at Lewes Crown Court, Kiranjit had pleaded not guilty to the charge of murder. Her husband had died of burns after she had thrown petrol at him and set fire to the room.

law, murder premeditated act. If you act defence against in self severely violence or are not provoked, are or responsible for your actions on grounds of insanity, you can plead that you are not responsible for murder. Men killed their have partners have often used these defences successfully but the courts have been very unsympathetic to women who defend themselves against violence by retaliating.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE IS THE REAL CRIME SELF-DEFENCE IS NO OFFENCE That a woman may have suffered years of abuse from a violent partner does not count as far as the law is concerned. Such women are not given to sudden, temporary losses of control. If they decide to defend themselves they can't AFFORD to make a mistake.

The law ignores the reality of abused womens lives and worse, punishes them severely if they defend themselves.

By jailing women like Kiranjit Ahluwalia and Sarah Thornton the so called justice system reveals its misogynistic heart. One of the great bastions of patriarchy, it conspires to help insure that women remain, as far as possible, victims.

Those women who refuse to be victims any longer of violent partners will almost certainly become victims of the 'law.' The unspoken law that, if you are female, you must not be allowed to win.










# POLL TAX HOSTAGES!

### THEY ARE IN THERE FOR US...

As this goes to press, four local people are locked up at Her Majesty's Pleasure in Lincoln Prison for poll-tax related offences.

One - Alan Robinson - is serving three months for an "assault" committed during his liability order hearing: he got so angry with the way the magistrates humiliated and insulted him that he threw a jug of water at them. In the chaos that followed, the police claim that Alan bit one of them on the finger... even though he doesn't even like bacon.

The other three - Soroosh Ayandeh, Bob Lee and Les Hensworth - are all in for non-payment.

Of course, these four aren't the only people who've been locked up because of this evil tax. There are a few dozen more non-payers in jail across the country, and there are at least 20 other prisoners serving longer sentences, following the police attacks on poll tax demonstrations at Trafalgar Square and Brixton last year.

## ... WE ARE OUT HERE FOR THEM

The press, when they aren't busy pretending the poll tax doesn't exist any more, would have us think that jail is unavoidable if we don't pay our poll tax. In fact, nothing could be further from the truth. The truth is they'd rather you pay any small amount than go to prison.

The magistrates offered Soroosh Ayandeh "not a few hours, but days, possibly weeks" to think again about his decision not to tell them anything about his income. Soroosh refused, saying "I don't need any more time - my mind is made up. I do not wish to pay any of this evil tax because of the suffering and poverty it has brought innocent people. I accept the consequences of what I am saying ... I would rather lose my right arm than pay your poll tax"

Bob Lee also refused to tell the court anything about his income and



circumstances, forcing them to either jail him or wipe out the debt in full. Since Bob hadn't been dead helpful to them - he handed back the income enquiry form they gave him with "BOLLOCKS" written all over it! - they sent him down.

## WHY YOU NEED NOT GO TO PRISON..

Fact is, you have to try bloody hard to get sent to prison for not paying your poll tax. Here's why:

First, they have to prove that you deliberately didn't pay - this is more difficult than it sounds.

Second, you can make an offer to pay at the last moment, actually during your commital hearing. You'll get better terms here than you will by trying to settle "out of court" with the council and they're almost certain to accept it, because..

Third, and most important, they don't want to jail anyone for not paying the poll tax. It doesn't get them their money in fact, it costs them over £300 a week and it makes them unpopular in the runup to an election.

And fourth, even if they wanted to jail all the non-payers they simply couldn't do it. The prisons are overcrowded already can you imagine them trying to fit in 14 million non-payers as well?

## WHY YOU SHOULD SUPPORT THE PEOPLE WHO DO GO TO PRISON

Because jailing all the non-payers is impossible, they rely on picking out a handful of people and jailing them, to frighten the rest of us into paying. This is the kind of terror tactic that all governments (yes, even good old, peace loving "democratic" Britain) resort to when everything else fails: that's why we say that they aren't just prisoners but HOSTAGES.

When this happens we need people like Alan, Bob, Les and Soroosh, people who refuse to be terrorised, who say a big FUCK OFF! to the rich bastards who run this country, by taking the worst they can dish out and then bouncing back with two fingers still stuck firmly in the air. Like we said earlier - they're in there for us, we're out here for them.

Perhaps you'll think about this next time you turn on the TV or pick up a paper, and see all the talk of democracy and freedom for Eastern Europe, Russia and China. The Tiananmen Square protestors were praised (quite rightly) for making a stand against injustice and oppression. But the Trafalgar Square anti-poll tax protestors, who were doing exactly the same thing when our police attacked them (just as the Chinese military attacked their people) were described by politicians of all parties (including both Labour and Militant Tendency) as thugs, hooligans and vandals.

Yet Trafalgar Square and Tiananmen Square were both about the same thing: the fight of ordinary, decent people against the rich and the priveledged, who took their wealth by force and will use any means to keep it.







## KICK OUT THE FASCISTS!

In July a public meeting was called in Forest Fields in response to concern over the number of racist incidents that had been taking place. These incidents have involved both people and property. In particular the Mosque on Gladstone Street has been broken into, grafitteed, and had religious paintings stolen. On one occasion scum even left shit on prayer mats. Individuals in Forest Fields have been attacked and insulted. Cars have been vandalised.

The meeting was called by the Forest Fields Anti-Racist Action Group (FFARAG), comprising local people including representatives of the Mosque Defence Committee, concerned not only with the rise in racist incidents locally but also with the lack of interest shown by Radford Road Police Station.

Following the public meeting a march was held on August 19th attended by over 450 people. They demanded a public inquiry into the attitude of the police, and carried a clear message of opposition to racists: Forest Fields is a multicultural area and racists are not welcome.

The situation was made more worrying by the increase locally in the activity of the *British National Party* (BNP) and the *NF*. NF stickers and leaflets and racehate grafitti had appeared across the city. Fascists have become more openly active in outlying areas including Eastwood, Ilkeston, Heanor and Hucknall. Last year BNP attempted to hold a rally in Nottingham. Lawrence Johnson of the BNP is standing at the next election in Erewash.

On August 10th the NF attempted a paper sale in Nottingham and it was this which finally alerted anti-fascists in the town that something had to be done. Responding to the NF sale we faced two problems: mobilising a large group at short notice; and having clear ideas of what we might do once there. Both these require prior discussion and planning.

So FFARAG together with Nottingham Trades
Council organised a meeting on September 5th looking at the
issue of fascist organisations. It was decided to initiate antifascist co-ordination across the city, and future organising
meetings are planned.

It was generally agreed that a broad non-sectarian campaign was needed that would allow different groups to make a contribution. So many campaigns have been destroyed by various left-wing groups throwing party lines at each other and seeking to dominate the campaign!

And we can't afford to be complacent. The BNP in particular is openly Nazi and committed to violence. The East Midlands is a target BNP growth area. What are their tactics? To recruit in the largely white areas around the city, and then to move into the more multi-racial inner cities as 'killing grounds'. Is the higher profile of the BNP/NF in Nottingham itself indicative of an increased confidence; that they are ready to move into a 'killing ground'?

Let's admit the problem but let's not exaggerate the racism in Forest Fields; this is not on the whole a racist area. Black and white live, work and play together. The NF has a national membership of only 5-600, having declined since its

1970's peak when it threatened to overtake the Liberals in many inner city constituencies. The BNP's membership is some 1600.

The BNP/NF are only the hard extreme of the problem. It is not the case that all or even most racist attacks, involve these organisations. The danger lies in them tapping into the undercurrent of racism and prejudice that exists. And unfortunately the current climate is quite sympathetic to them.

For what has been happening here is part of an ugly national trend. Currently there are an estimated 70,000 cases of racial harrassment each year. With the harsher economic situation ordinary people face, scapegoating black people becomes easier. Unemployed white youth are particularly targetted by the BNP/NF. Racist ideas are becoming a more acceptable part of the political mainstream, lending fascist groups respectability. Since the 1970's the immigration issue has become more significant as deportation orders are increasingly common.


There is an international dimension too. In France the Front National has enjoyed remarkable success. Fascist groups are active across Europe including Eastern Europe where, with the collapse of 'communist' regimes, right-wing nationalist/fascist organisations have come out into the open. Now, as '1992' comes closer the questions of just who has the right of free travel in Europe and just what does it mean to be European has brought ideas of colour and race to the fore. The free market will be a free white market!

There are two lines of work. We need to combat the general undercurrent of racism and argue against those local, national and international developments which support its growth. Also we need to stop fascists before they start. This isn't the first time the fascists have come to Nottingham. In the 1970's the NF tried to set up their national HQ here. They were pushed out by anti-fascists. Now we need to revive this work. We need co-ordination and organisation - to stop them whenever and however they show their faces; we need to do our detective work - to put names to faces; we need to go out onto the estates and to the football grounds and win the white youth away from their poison. We have to be prepared for physical confrontation, but mostly we need a broad mass campaign that will unite black and white, particularly young people, to isolate these garbage and push them back into the holes where they came from.

feather in the cap of the new East Midlands Arts super-boss, feather in the cap of the Green.


