

THE IRISH IN MEXICO

"We like the irish around here"
Subcomandante Marcas

t is now 6 years since the EZLN (Zapatista Army of National Liberation) came to the attention of the world when they seized five towns in Chiapas, Mexico on New Year's day in 1994. The years since have seen only a couple of weeks of actual warfare. However the uneasy cease-fire has seen hundreds of land accupations and several national and international gatherings. Thousands, if not tens of thousands, of people have travelled to Chiapas to see the rebellion with their own eyes. Hundreds have been deported by the Mexican government for doing so. Solidarity groups exist in most western countries, including Ireland. In 1993 Chiapas was as unknown backwater in Mexico. Now, in the eyes of many activists, it has moved to centre stage.

The Irish in Mexico have an honourable history. Their most celebrated intervention was that of the San Patricio Battalian some 200 Irishmen who crossed to the Mexican side in 1848 during the war with the US. It's impossible to be sure what inspired their defection but it seems that reminders of a shared faith, offers at land, and large amounts at tequila all played their part! Kindly, the Mexicans today insist the Irish became convinced of the justice of the Mexican cause.

It is true that the San Patricio Battalion fought bravely and was decorated for its exploits in the Battle of Buena Vista before being overrun at Churobusco. Fifty of them were court martialed by the US army and sentenced to death. They were taken to where they could see the Mexican citadel, the Castillo de Chapultepec, and only when the last of its defenders the 'child heroes' had hurled themselves from the battlements to avoid capture and the Stars and Stripes had been run up over the fortress were the Irish hanged.

Today, almost 150 years later, in the mountains of Southeastern Mexico, where the people, peacefully pursuing the age old demands of land and freedom, have suffered years of repression and deliberate marginalization, the Zapatistas have affered themselves as instruments of the Mexican people in their struggle for democracy. They have met with a ferocious and disproportionate military response. Chiapas is now occupied by 40,000 government troops. I for every man, woman and child, who threaten an all out offensive at any moment.

Writing to supporters of the Zapatistas around the world on March 17th of this year, Marcos invoked the spirit of the San Patricio Battalion. This is what he said: "When Mexico was fighting, in the last century, against the empire of the bars and crooked stars, there was a group of soldiers who fought on the side of the Mexicans and this group was called 'St. Patrick's Battalion'. And so I am writing you in the name of all of my companeros and companeras, because just as with the 'Saint Patrick's Battalion', we now see clearly that there are foreigners who love Mexico more than some natives who are now in the government. And we hear that there were marches and songs and movies and other events so that there would not be war in Chiapas, which is the part of Mexico where we live and die. When you are old, then you will be able to say to the children and young people of your country that, 'I struggled for Mexico at the end of the 20th century, and from over here I was there with them and I only know that they wanted what all human beings want, for it not to be forgotten that they are human beings and for it to be remembered what democracy, liberty and justice are, and I did not know their faces but I did know their hearts and they were the same as ours.' Good-bye.. Health and a promised flower: a green stem, a white flower, red leaves, and don't worry about the serpent, that flapping of wings is an eagle which will take care of it, you will see..."

We in Ireland have been slow to pick up the internationalist banner of our ancestors, but there is still time, perhaps we have just been shaking off the political lethargy that afflicts our generation. But now we must act. Once again there is an unjust war in Mexico, once again the Mexican people are being dispossessed, this time by their own government backed elite, in thrall to the US. Once again they need our help. The more international support the Zapatistas have the more likely it is that can open up space for a political solution to the conflict, and the less likely it is they will have to hurl themselves from the mountains in defence of their land, their people and their hopes. The Mexicans need another San Patricio Battalion; the cause is still as just, the shared faith in human dignity is still as strong, and the tequila is still is good. Be a Zapatista wherever you are!

From Mozambique to Lonbridge - Multinational Capitalism is wrecking people's lives.

SAVE MUMIA ABU JAMAL

Mumia was a founding member of the Black Panthers in Philadelphia, The FBI have maintained a surveiliance of him since he was 16. Mumia was convicted of first degree murder and given the



death penalty for the alleged shooting & killing of a white police officer on December 9th 1981. He had no prior criminal record.

He has been on death row in Pensylvannia for 17 years awaiting execution - the only political prisoner on death row. Initially scheduled for execution on August 17 1995 the execution was stayed by a court order 10 days prior to being carried

Since his incarceration on death row Mumia has written 2 books, Live from Death Row & Death Blassoms. His first book has been translated into 7 languages and widely read in the US. A 3rd book, Race for Justice, has been written about his case by his attorneys. National Public Radio in the US agreed to air 12 of Mumia's commentaries taped while on death row. After presidential aspirant Robert Dole attacked the NPR for doing this on the floor of the Senate, the programmes were cancelled.

Mumia was awarded an honorary law degree from the New School of Law in San Francisco: was voted an honarary vice president by the 5000 member National Lawyers Guild, a progressive lawyers association in America; named an honorary citizen of the Central District of Copenhagen, as well as the city of Palermo in Italy.

An International Tribunal made up of outstanding personages from all over the world convened in Philadelphia on Dec 6 1997 and reviewed the circumstances of his case, voting unanimously to free Mumia, and calling for an investigation into the agencies responsible for his prosecution and imprisonment. After visiting Mumia the Secretary General of Amnesty International issued a statement expressing concern that the "original trail may have been contaminated by the deep-rooted racism that appears to taint the application of the death penalty in Pennsylvania".

MICHAEL WOODWARD GROUP We take our name from Michael Woodward, an Anglo-Chilean worker priest, who was tortured to death in September 1973, weeks after Pinochet's coup. He was a member of the political alliance which formed Allende's government.

The Group has maintained contact with & supported financially people in Chile who:

- provide legal support for political prisoners
- developed self help groups
- gave evidence about torture before the UN
- are currently political prisoners
- have developed training for working class women to become trade union activists

Currently we are asking for support for the release of Dante Ramirez, leader of a construction union, who was shot in the head while being arrested in 1996. The bullet remains lodged in his brain causing progressive damage. Along with other political prisoners he was brutally treated and tortured in the high security prison at the beginning of last year. We are asking people to campaign for medical treatment and his release.

Workers of my country:



THE BATTLE OF CABLE STREET

By 1935 Oswald Mosley's British Union of Fascists had been reduced to a mainly London-based movement. Moseley decided to concentrate his forces on a "conquest of the streets" in the capital. Mussolini & Hitler had used this tactic & Moseley thought he could repeat their success by marching through the East End. Encouraged by initial success in whipping up hatred against the Jews, Mosley prepared for a great demonstration on 4th October 1936. Despite calls to ban the march from all of East London's Mayors, the Home Secretary & Commissioner of the Metropolitan Police deployed thousands of foot and mounted police to safeguard the Fascist's route. As 7000 blackshirts prepared to march, the police tried to clear their path. They had not reckoned on the determination of anti-fascists, workers & the Jewish population to stand their ground. Utilising the Spanish rallying cry "They Shall Not Pass!", 10,000 ex-servicemen blacked the main fascist route, forcing the police to move towards Cable Street.

At Cable Street the police found hostile crowds of 50,000. They had constructed a huge barricade and the roadway leading to it was strewn with broken glass as a defence against mounted police. More than a dozen baton charges were made by hundreds of police before the barricade was breached, but the resistance was not broken. The anti-fascists simply regrouped in their thousands and prepared new barricades behind the first. Unable to disperse the anti-fascists, the Commissioner told Mosley (who had bought a new uniform for the occasion) that it was all over and ordered him to stay away from the East End. The Battle of Cable Street was a historic victory for anti-fascism in England.

The following year, October 1937, Mosley targeted South Landon. This march ended in some of the worst street fighting the capital had seen. An eyewitness described how "mounted and foot police, with lashing bottons, swept again and again into the crowds of anti-fascist demonstrators.....side streets were strewn with the injured, many of them women, struck down in these charges, and more than 100 anti-fascists were arrested". But the point had been made, and the Blackshirts were never again able to mount a large, provocative march through the streets of any British city.

AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL ETHIOPIA - TRADE UNIONIST UNDER ATTACK

President of the Ethiopian Teachers' Association (ETA), Dr Taye Woldesmayat, was found guilty of conspiring to overthrow the state and sentenced to 5 years imprisonment. Dr Taye was arrested in May 1996 and was not charged until 3 months later. He was kept in solitary confinement for months and shackled 24 hours a day. After international pressure his conditions were improved for a time, but in February 1998 he was transferred to a "darkness cell". As leader of the ETA Dr Taye spoke critically against governmental education policies, including regional decentralisation and sought better conditions for teachers.

Amnesty International is concerned that his trail didn't meet international standards for fairness, especially after allegations that witnesses used against him were tortured. Amnesty International is also calling for an independent inquiry into the killing of the ETA General Secretary Assefa Maru on 8th May 1997.





TAKING ACTION AGAINST GENETIC MODIFICATION

The controversy about Genetically Modified (GM) foods has raged in the last couple of years, with much argument about the potential risks to our health and environment. The battle over GM has become the latest frontline in the angoing struggle between the technocratic elite, who seek profit and control, and the rest of us, who seek life and liberty.GM can be seen as the direct heir of the agricultural explosion of the 1960s and 70s, where intensive chemical-dependent farming came to dominate global agriculture, concentrating power and money in the hands of the agricultural multinationals whilst poor farmers suffered and the poorest starved. The same promises were made then about intensive agriculture as are now made for GM - it will feed the third world, it will be better for the environment, and so on. Why should we believe them now? While food is solely a commodity to be patented and sold, the poor and dispossessed will starve. There are many who do not want the global food chain to fall even further under the control of capital, and they are resisting. GM crops have been destroyed across the world, from India to North America and Europe. In the UK, dozens of GM test crops have been pulled up, in large demos and stealthy night-time raids. It is in this sort of resistance, in such acts of refusal and empowerment, where hope lies. Just as the Luddites, who first rose at Bulwell, took direct action against the introduction of mechanised loams - a technology "hurtful to the commonality" - so today's radicals act against GM - the latest technology of control and profit. Saptal Ram is serving a life sentence for defending himself against a racist attacker. On 16 November 1986 Saptal went for a meal in Birmingham. He was attacked by a group of 6 white people who threw plates & glasses at him. One of the men broke a glass & stabbed Saptal in the face. After being stabbed twice satpal took out a small knife which he used at work to warn off his attackers. The racist continued to attack saptal who bleeding & in fear for his life, fought back in self defence. In the struggle the attacker received 2 knife wounds. The attacker, who refused medical attention, later died. Saptal was later arrested on a charge of murder.

Saptal was given only one 40 minute consultation with his barrister shortly before the trail during which he was advised to change his plea from self defence to "provocation". He was also advised not to speak in his own defence. Most of the prosecution evidence came from the group that attacked saptal. Because some of the defence witnesses spoke mainly Bengali an interpreter should have been provided. Saptal's defence did not insist on this & vital evidence was not understood. Due to the mistakes of the judge & Saptal's defence lawyer, he did not receive a fair trail. He was found guilty of murder and sentenced to life. It took almost 10 years to get an appeal which was lost. The appeal judges only took evidence from the group that attacked him!

Saptal Ram has consistently fought his conviction. As a result he has been labelled a 'disruptive prisoner'. He has suffered solitary confinement, beatings & has been moved from prison to prison. Saptal's spirit however is not broken. He has steadfastly supported other prisoners' campaigns including those of the Bridgewater 4, the Birmingham 6 and Winston silcott. Saptal has had a rough ride at every stage. His case is another example of why black & Asian people have little confidence in the ability of the criminal justice system to deliver any actual justice. What has happened to him could happen to any of us. Saptal defended himself against a racist attack for which he was ultimately sentenced to life imprisonment. We say again: SELF DEFENCE IS NO OFFENCE.

On the night of 14 October 1997 Ricky reel & 3 Asian friends were racially abused & attacked in Kingston. Fearing for their lives they fled. That was the last time anyone saw Ricky. The racial incident was immediately reported to the police. In the first week of his disappearance the police took no action, leaving his family & friends to organise search parties & interview potential witnesses. Seven days later when the police searched the river Ricky's body was found. Unbelievably that same evening, even before the post mortem was completed, the police concluded that further investigation was not necessary. Initially the police refused to recognise the racial motive of the attack & treated the family & his friends as suspects. The police have maintained that Ricky died instantly by slipping over the river edge accidently after urinating in the river. They refused to investigate other avenues. The pathologists & local people who know the location have discredited police theory.

Now after 2 years the police have been forced to admit that the initial attack was racially motivated. The inquest into Ricky's death was heard on 1st November 1999. Despite the police's attempt even at this point to push for an 'accidental death' verdict, the open verdict delivered served to vindicate the family's concern that Ricky was probably killed. Consequently had the police gathered more evidence the verdict might have been unlawful killing.

Ricky will never be replaced, but his death must not be in vain. We want you to join us in our struggle for justice and urge you to donate money to the campaign, making it possible for his family and friends to seek the truth.

SUPPORT MARK BARKSUEY AND RESIST THE PRISON STATE

Mark Barnsley is a working class Sheffield man who in 1994 was beaten up by students and then framed by the police for being an anarchist, and sentenced to 12 years. When out for a quiet afternoon drink with a family friend and his new born child, he was attacked by a gang of fifteen drunk students. They smashed something heavy over his head and chased him 150 yards, bringing him to the floor again and again. One of the students produced a knife, and in the protracted struggle several of them, and Mark himself, sustained knife injuries. Despite his serious injuries and every independent witness saying that Mark did not produce the knife or start the fight, guess who was the only one arrested.

As a long-standing anarchist who has always stood up for justice and against oppression, the police, prosecution and local paper made every move they could to frame him. In a trial characterised by lies, perjury, media hysteria, and withholding of evidence, Mark was convicted of "wounding with intent" and was sentenced to 12 years! More than a rapist would normally get. This is a necessarily brief summary of what happened to Mark to squeeze it into this short article. The more you read about it, the more horrific it seems - if you have been politically active, imagine that it could have been you.... They wanted to frame a working class anarchist and let the middle-class students off. On these Mayday celebrations, it is appropriate to remember that Mayday was made international Worker's Day in 1889 in remembrance of the Haymarket Martyrs, anarchists who were framed and executed for the violence that broke out during the mass strike of Mayday 1886. These is a campaign to get him out of prison and his conviction overturned, but as with every miscarriage of justice campaign we all need to make a lot of noise to force the state into releasing him. His case has just been referred to the Criminal Cases Review Commission (CCRC), but if they can get away with it, they will do nothing for several years. We must pile up the pressure on them, and continue to support Mark, to ensure he is released. NOTTINGHAM HUNT SABOTEURS

Nottingham Hunt Saboteurs are a group of like minded people who regularly take direct action against blood sports. We use a combination of voice and hunting horn to gain control of the hounds from the houndsman, these tactics save thousands of foxes every year. Most hunts go out at least twice weekly between early August & March. There are 12 mounted packs and 5 foot packs in the Nottm area alone, as well as a mink hunt from May to September. We also target shooting (people shoot grouse, pheasants and basically anything that moves!).

Direct action is the only way to tackle the hunters. The undemocratic "talking out" of the recent private members bill against hunting shows a Parliament dominated by the hunting fraternity.

Our tactics cause no harm to hounds, horses, or people. Hunters have made serious efforts to discredit us - this comes as no surprise as people who torment animals for fun are bound to be bullies and thugs.

CAMBRIDGE TWO

In Dec 1999 Ruth Wyner, Director & John Brock, Daycare Manager of Wintercomfort, a charity for homeless in Cambridge, were sentenced to prison for 5 & 4 years respectively because some of the people using the day centre service had secretly been trading drugs on the charity premises. There was no suggestion that Ruth & John had been personally involved with drugs. Indeed Wintercomfort has a strong anti-drug policy & frequently banned clients suspected of using drugs.

After an undercover police operation the two were charged under the 1971 Misuse of Drugs Act of "knowingly allowing or suffering to be permitted the sale of drugs on the premises". There are real fears that these convictions, marking the first use of the 30 year old law in this way, in combination with clandestine police operations might become a precedent for more dragonian zero tolerance measures, within other public institutions such as schools & universities. The implications for any social workers as well as nurses & teachers are enormous. Please support the campaign & publicise the case. ROBERT HAMILL WHY DID HE DIES

In Portadown, in the early hours of April 27, 1997, Robert Hamill was kicked to death by a mob of 30 Loyalists in full view of an RUC Landrover, 200 yards from an RUC station. Four RUC officers, wearing body armour and armed with machine guns, remained in the Landrover until after the attack. They ignored warnings of a potential incident. They ignored pleas for them to intervene during the attack. They did not fire in the air or attempt to disperse the crawd. They did not administer first aid to Robert. They didn't declare a crime scene, collect forensic evidence or take statements. They only detained one suspect but released him after only a few minutes. No arrests were made for 2 weeks.

Robert's family want to know why.

"Every state has a duty to protect its citizens. In Robert Hamill's case, the state has failed and failed abysmally" Rosemary Nelson, Hamill family solicitor, murdered 15th March 1999.

FOREST FIELDS INDEPENDENT RESIDENTS GROUP

So far our focus has been the campaign against the closure of Noel Street Baths & Victoria Leisure Centre to make way for the proposed building of a new 'flagship' leisure centre on the Forest recreation ground, this has been an ongoing campaign for about the last 18 months helping to raise the profile of the group & demonstrate that the council is not to be trusted. We live in an area with very few leisure facilities; those that we have got are well used by local schools, sports clubs & residents. However the council claims that it's time Nottingham updated these services. We don't oppose the idea that a new leisure pool is a good idea but not at the expense of pools that with investment could be brought up to standard. We believe there is enough funding from places like the European Union to invest in local projects.

They claim the new centre will not take up much room on the Forest. However with the whole of Nottingham & surrounding towns & cities coming to use the pool there will soon be talk of expanding the car park & at the time of writing, work on the new tram is about to begin, resulting in more disruption for local people. This is not done for the benefit of local residents but for the corporate image of Nottingham that the council is pandering to. They don't care that people who live in St Anns & Sneinton will have to travel on 2 buses to get to a pool the council are calling local! They don't care about the loss of space & green area to residents of the surrounding areas. They don't care that local schools will have to travel turther to a pool & they will have to compete with the rest of Nottingham for time & space.

We also propose that an alternative site be found for a new facility which would not build on the nicest bit of the Forest. We think the whole project is badly thought out & done without proper consultation with local residents & pool users. We think that Victoria Leisure Centre could be upgraded to a Leisure pool & Noel Street refurbished to fully functional. The council is run by the Labour Party who were supposed to act in the interests of the working class & the common good of the city. It seems business is calling the shots at the council chambers nowadays & those voted in by local residents soon forget about the support they received. We have never aligned ourselves to any political party. We think grass roots community action is the first step to progressing the community's views & aspirations.
