

PAUL WHETTON

Paul Whetton was dismissed from Bevercotes Colliery in February 1986 for posting a notice at that colliery calling an NUM Branch Meeting.

After a long and bitter battle with the Coal Board, an Industrial Tribunal in Nottingham in February 1987 came to the decision that Paul had been unfairly dismissed and had been dismissed for trade union activity and had not contributed to his own dismissal.

Despite this, the Board still refused to reinstate Paul at Bevercotes Colliery. Paul was offered many financial inducements to sacrifice his job, but with the support of his family - which caused much anguish to them - he refused to betray his principles and fought on to retain a job in the Industry. Finally, in July 1988, he proudly started work at Manton Colliery in Yorkshire.

Although Paul should have had his job back at Bevercotes, nevertheless he has at least stayed in the Industry and will be a valuable asset to the NUM, both nationally and in Yorkshire.

We, the Nottinghamshire NUM congratulate Paul on the principled stand he has taken over the years and wish him and his family all the best for the future.

JUSTICE FOR MINEWORKERS CAMPAIGN

The 11th June 1987 brought the worst news to our sacked lads since their dismissal, the return of a Tory government. It means the struggle to gain them reinstatement will be against an organisation determined to make examples of anyone who dares to stand against their ideology. This means the J.M.C. must redouble its eforrts in pressing the case of our sacked lads. No one should be allowed to forget these were ordinary working men fighting for a future for themselves and their children. The case for their reinstatement must be stressed at every opportunity and a continual lobby of Parliament by the mining M.P's must highlight the injustice of the dismissals. The J.M.C. will continue to organise Gala's, Rallys, meetings and speaking tours on behalf of our sacked colleagues until every last one has been reinstated.



Also at that time, he was a Councillor at Clay Cross Council for 12 years. In 1970 he was elected to Parliament for Bolsover.

In 1976 he became Chairman of the Miners' Group in Parliament. In 1978 he was elected to the N.E.C. of the Labour Party Nationally.

Dennis Skinner is a married man with three children. He lives in Clay Cross. This year he has been asked to speak at Yorkshire Miners Rally, the Durham Miners Gala, South Wales Miners Rally and now at the Nottinghamshire Miners Gala.



GUEST SPEAKER

Socialist greetings to those participating in and enjoying this year's Nottinghamshire Miners' Gala. All of you are aware of and understand the necessity, significance and importance of this event in both the mining community and, more widely, to the whole of the Labour and Trades Union Movement.

This is shown to be fact by present circumstances, with mining communities having suffered more than any other since the election of the Conservatives to Government in 1979. Further, tens of thousands of miners have lost their jobs, over a hundred pits have been closed, contract work rife within the industry, coal imports at record levels and the Tories seemingly intent on full-blooded privatisation of the industry.

However, as this gathering shows, the Labour movement has long been used to such circumstances. It is therefore the task of us all to respond to the call for Justice for our people. Much work is needed to be done, for instance more than two hundred miners remain sacked from their jobs since the 1984/85 strike. They have to be re-instated along with their colleagues employed by P & O and others within the printing industries.

Many retired ex-miners, their widows or families need protection against Government legislation designed to lessen their home security. Whilst pits are closing, cheap imported "blood coal" dug by either slave or child labour in South Africa or Columbia continues to arrive in the U.K. This has to be stopped and pressure exerted to establish complete s anctions on the regimes involved.

Brothers and Sisters, the trials and tribulations facing our people at the present time are enormous. It is therefore appropriate that you should gather together in unity today under the umbrella of the movement's vanguard. For as the N.U.M.'s history shows, it is the job of us all to represent our class, whatever our creed or colour, towards the ultimate goal of justice for all.


