### ARTHUR SCARGILL VINDICATED!


A special Delegate Conference of the NUM in Sheffield called to consider the critical report by Gavin Lightman QC passed a vote of confidence in the NUM leaders Arthur Scargill and Peter Heathfield, by an overwhelming majority of 4-1.

The NUM delegates by a similar majority threw out a call from South Wales for the national officials to resign and seek re-election. They showed a great degree of confidence in the NUM leaders for their handling of the union's finances during and after the miners' strike of 1984-5. Howard Wodsworth, a member of the Yorkshire Area Executive said Mr. Scargill had been vindicated and that the union now regarded the controversy as closed. Support for Arthur Scargill and Peter Heathfield from the largest areas - Yorkshire, the Midlands and the North East - ensured that critisism from the South Wales and Scottish areas was rejected.

The conference then resumed to debate the NUM's affiliation to the International Miners Organisation(IMO) in Paris, which had been at the heart of the dispute which played a key part in allowing the NUM to evade sequestration and recievership during and after the Great Strike. The £742,000 deal with the IMO to settle the issue of a disputed 1985 Soviet donation of money was accepted by a large majority.

Arthur Scargill was taken to hospital 2 weeks ago in Blackpool with pneumonia, but despite this he addressed the Conference against doctors advice.

#### BAMBATHA'S CHILDREN

In May 1985 almost 1,000 workers employed by the British multi-national British Tyre & Rubber (BTR) in Natal, S. Africa were sacked for staging a one day strike for union recognition. They have been trying to pressurise BTR to reinstate them ever since. The strikers are members of the National Union of Metalworkers of South Africa(NUMSA). One of the ways they have raised support and awareness of their struggle is to produce plays which have toured South Africa and Britain. In 1987 'The Long March' toured Britain and now in the autumn of 1990 comes 'Bambathia's Children' (see diary overleaf for dates & venues).

TUCOSH has extensive resources available for use by trade unions. These include the 'Barbour Health & Safety Microfile' - an information system of over 95,000 pages covering legislation, government circulars, British standards, guidance notes etc.
