Seafarers from the P&O shipping company have been on strike since the 6th of February, 1988.

The NUS members took action against the company's plans to make 500 redundancies and to bring in new working practices. These include a system of 7 day working - 7 days on the ship and 7 days off.

The company want members to work 16 'payed' hours in every 24 hours. This would mean that the men and women of the NUS would be on board the ship for 56 hours of the week with no pay. The 8 hours that the members are not on duty they will still be on emergency standby.

The safety standards on the ferries are already low, as was shown by the Zeebrugge tragedy, job cuts and making people work 16 hours shifts will not improve situation.

This is yet another trade union busting excercise by a multi-national company.

Another group of workers are having to defend against their wages being driven down, their working conditions and living standards being dismantled and the management allowing little or no trade union representation to defend them against further attacks.

Despite the major propaganda exercises of the company, the threats of bringing in 'strikebreakers' and the inticement individual of offers to members, the strike will continue.




