# WHAT THE

TALKING of rubbish, a Left-wing correspondent in today's Dear Sir accuses the local newspapers of Right-wing bias and hints that they suppress news.

It is a familiar Left-wing myth, to which Leftwingers cling without bothering to produce any evidence.

Unlike the publications our correspondent supports, the Gazette is independent. It speaks as it finds. It has no political axe to grind.

A myth? Political axes? I quickly looked through the remainder of that edition of the Gazette to see what coverage had been given to the previous day's row between top Tories over new ward boundaries. You guessed. NONE AT ALL. By contrast there was coverage of a split in the Labour group and by the size of the headline you'd have thought it was of deep political significance for the town, instead of that laughable affair of the 'death-threat', involving the new Tory mayor and 2 Labour councill-

However my main bone of contention is over the splits in the Labour and Tory groups. Goring's answer is to say that the Tory row over the boundaries was too late for the Gazette. Firstly, it should be noted that the Gazette does cover many stories a week late. Secondly it appears that events which happen on Thursday afternoons are only too. late for the Gazette when it suits them. A couple of weeks ago the Gazette covered the Sussex Students' Union meeting on the student progress committee which took place on a Thursday afternoon and reported on one of Brighton and Hove Albion's new signings which had also happened at that time in the week. According to Goring they should both have been too late for the Friday Gazette, but they both appeared in prominent positions on the front and back

# Labour split

Seeing the editorial comment as a challenge to produce evidence to substantiate my claims in the original letter, I duly replied. I took up this question of the difference in the way in which the splits among Tories and Labour had, or had not, been reported. I also reminded them of the fact that neither of the Brighton papers had even mentioned Bowden's attempts to stifle the Voice by putting pressure on newsagents an important local story by any standards.

I was obviously naive to expect the Gazette to publish the evidence it had clearly called for. I did, however, receive a personal letter from the editor Ed.Goring who attempted to answer my points. Since then several letters have passed between us. The gist of Goring's arguments is that he was not here in 1976 when Bowden wrote his letter to the newsagents advising them against the Voice but that he presumes the previous editor did not find it newsworthy. What makes it newsworthy now? Why did the Gazette finally get round to mentioning it in its article on the Voice well over a year after Bowden's letter? Surely Bowden's action in itself showed that the Voice was worthy of notice

at the time.

So why no news of the Tory squabbles ? I HAVE REPEATEDLY ASKED FOR THE RIGHT FOR THIS POINT TO MADE IN THE LETTER COLUMNS OF THE GAZETTE, AND NOT JUST PRIVATELY TO MR GORING. WHY WON'T HE PUBLISH MY EVIDENCE, PARTICULARLY WHEN HE ACTUALLY ASKED FOR IT IN HIS EDITORIAL?



PRISON SECRETS by Laurie Taylor and Stan Cohen (NCCL/RAP, £1.25)

This is an important book, which throws some light on a very dark corner. It explains the totally discretionary nature of prisoners' "rights", which can be withdrawn without warning or stated reason, and deliberately breaks the Official Secrets Act over 150 times in the process.

The basic rules of prison life have been published, but they only provide a framework which is filled in by the secret Prison Department Standing Orders. These cover every conceivable subject, from letters to riots, but no prisoner is ever allowed to see them - only a heavily edited and often misleading excerpt.

For instance, the section on letters does not mention Rule 33(3), which allows the Governor "at his discretion, to stop any letter or communication on the grounds that its contents are objectionable or that it is of an inordinate length".



Protests to the Prison Authorities are not likely to improve things either; the Governors' Handbook states cynically that letters and petitions are "often amusing to read". It continues: "who knows, an accompanying report, if entertainingly written, may well service to cheer the Secretary of State or one of his servants merrily on his way, even if it is not successful in

assisting the petitioner to gain his request".

While it is nice to know that someone benefits from prisoners' misery, "Prison Secrets" takes us into the frightening world of Kafka, though with one major difference: this is for real. If you have any illusions left about "British Justice" or "fair play", read this book.

### from the

TAMESIDE, LANCS: Tameside Housing Dept. is to secretly classify every Council tenant on a scale from "very good" to "unsuitable". Only "good" families will be able to move into the better estates, and "bad" families may be compulsorily rehoused in poor estates; the "accepted standards would be based on the degree of cleanliness, maintenance of payments of rent and general social attitude" according to Council minutes.

If you are a tenant-or on the waiting list-officials will be checking up on how often you mow the lawn and clean the windows; presumably "social attitude" is how polite you are to the person doing the checking. (NCCL: Rights) LEEDS (1): A year ago, there were

13,000 families on the housing waiting list; now there are over 20,000. Despite this, the Council have cut the house building programme by 500; one of the reason reasons given for this by the Chairman of the Housing Committee was that "the waiting list is static". (Leeds Other Paper)

(2): Leeds Trades Council has set up a Co-ordinating Committee Against Racism. Its programme includes a march for racial harmony, fighting for a ban on

demonstrations, pressing the Council to remove fascist graffiti from walls, etc., and urging all parties and organisations to adopt a platform of open opposition to racialism and to help foster racial harmony. (LOP) KIRKLEES, YORKS: At Kirklees Council meeting last month the Labour Group proposed that no public facilities should be available for facist organisations. The Conservatives, enamoured of free speech and patriotism, disagreed with the Labour motion. The Chairperson of the Education Committee, Cllr. Mason, commented: "I would rather see a bunch of patriots using public property than a group of pansies". (People's News Service)

LONDON: Thirty trade unionists took part in a demonstration outside Thames Magistrates Court in Stepney to protest against the arrest of nine Asian building workers. The workers were arrested while picketing the construction site of the National Westminster Bank's new £45 million management services centre in Aldgate. Police swooped on the only picket line manned by Asians, kicked over

They were charged with obstructing the footpath and "wilfully making a bonfire", other picket lines with braziers, manned by white workers, were ignored. During the firemen's strike, pavement bonfires were commonplace, but not one arrest was

made. (PNS) NORTHERN IRELAND: After years of pressure by gay groups, it was agreed last year that the law in N.I. would be brought into line with the rest of Britain. Ian Paisley has predictably leapt into action with his "Save Ulster from Sodomy" campaign, which is collecting signatures for a hostile petition. He clearly has some support in the RUC, which continues to harass gays, using other legislation. (PNS) MANCHESTER: National Front local election candidate John Boyle has been fined £110 for illegal possession of firearms and ammunition. At his trial he was convicted of having a rifle, two revolvers and ammunition; a Luger was found hidden loaded behind an electric fire.

He stated in court: "I kept the gun loaded because I thought it was the best place to keep the bullets." (Manchester City Enquirer).

### trespassers

The first case was brought to persecuted court under this new act on Wednesday 22nd February, 1978. Mr. Alan George Bedoe appeared before South London Magistrates court at approximately 2.30 p.m. charged with "offering resistance" under Section 10 of the act; the resistance taking the form of pouring cold water from an upstairs front window upon Robert Miller, a county court bailiff, acting on a warrant for possession of No. 2 Westbridge Road, which had been occupied for four years by squatters.

Alan Bedoe was and is still squatting at another house in the borough of Lambeth and had entered the house prior to the eviction by invitation of the occupants. The reason for the resistance seems to be as a result of some doubletalking by the Borough, or rather t the occupants had been led to believe that alternative accomodation would be made available but that the council were not then forthcoming at the later point, leaving the occupants feeling cheated and without alternative accomodation.

The defending barrister was David Watkins, who has been involved relentlessly with the campaign against the law at every stage from its initial commissioning of a report back with Mr. Heath's government in 1975.

With a situation that trespass was not a 'crime', the new law makes 'criminal' that which was not before, and gives up to 6 months imprisonment, or up to £1000 fine, or both, offering to the hands of magistrates and judges quite a hefty piece of equipment to be wielded against trespassers and in many cases denying the right to a Lal by jury, which is one of the traditions of British Criminal Law.

It was in this context that the magistrate saw no "special significance" in that the young man had been charged under this act as he could, he said, have "been charged with assault". This was

followed by a "veiled threat" by the magistrate as he drew attention to the 6 months and £1000 saying that he would not normally consider in that order (or words to that effect) but that "if you insist in going into the background of the law, I might think differently". He was becoming most perturbed at the prospect of being lectured by Mr. Watkins, although he had wriggled rather tweely whilst bemusedly

remarking that he had read and re-

read the act and didn't know whether

he fully understood or not. Well as the defendant was pleading guilty anyway, not too much expertise was required. Suffice to say that he would go to prison for 1 month. He rambled again, allowing what seemed like a year and a half to pass before telling him that it was to be suspended for one year and would not be brought into effect unless he committed an offence of this kind within that period. Costs were also awarded at £50 to be paid at £5 per week.

The young man was very shaken by the experience. He was a person with no previous convictions and had been basically employed since leaving school at 16. It looks as if he has voluntarily laid himself on the altar of the "criminal trespass law" in protest at increasing homelessness -and the government's bludgeoning answer to it?-that is the first case. dealt with in a way similar to a case of "obstruction", and we do expect more to follow.

### RUBBING OUT THE FRONT

Recently Fascists have daubed the Adur flyover and nearby roads leading out of Shoreham with Racist slogans such as "Wog Free Britain is White" and "Kill a Wog for Jesus". Local residents and supporters of the Anti-Nazi League are taking round a petition demanding that the council remove the eye-sores or else allow local residents to do so.

Up until now the Nazis have effectively gone unchallenged around Shoreham and Worthing; getting lavish and uncritical coverage in local press and being treated as a respectable political party. The National Front has already announced its Shoreham and Worthing candidates for the local elections in May. The

Anti-Nazi League intends to mount an extensive campaign against all fascist candidates and will soon be holding public meetings in Shoreham and Worthing to gather together all those interested in helping to expose the NF and NP for what they really are.

Did you know that advertising or handing out leaflets of any sort within 6 miles of Charing Cross in London is illegal unless specifically approved by the Commissioner of Police ? Neither did the NUJ until two of their officers were nearly arrested during an official strike for explaining the circumstances in written form.

It is an offence under the Metropolitan Street Act 1867 - one of the many dead laws periodically resurrected to deal with people the police don't like. Funnily enough Soho strip clubs 'massage parlours' etc. don't seem to fall foul of this restriction on advertising. Presumably the Commissioner approves of them along with more obvious 'infringements' on buses, hoardings and shops.

Not so bad after all ! 'I despise the National Front. No one should have the right to tell anyone they can't live here

because of the colour of their skin or their religion or the size of their nose. How could anyone vote for something so ridiculously inhumane ?' (Jonny Rotten, Sex

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

We just thought you'd like to know: a man carrying a flickknife in his pocket, when he was arrested for loitering around parked cars, told police he was a member of the National Front and was carrying the knife to 'cut the niggers'. He said,

'When my party the NF gets in, blacks. If any 'sooty' comes near me he'll get more than he bargained for. I'll kill him do you hear? I don't want to hurt anyone I just want to cut the niggers. They don't count as humans.' (From CARF)

#### The Labour Party is, for better or worse, the only party which commands the mass support of the working class. However lousy one thinks it is, never-the-less 11 or 12 million people will regularly turn out and vote for it and see it as their party.

You don't need to abandon all critical faculties though. If the Government is pursuing a wrong policy, it's the vital job of the rank and file Labour Party to point it out. The Brighton party has consistently opposed things like public expenditure cuts and forcing the firemen to accept a lousy pay deal. As far as I'm concerned, if the Government continues with its present policies, it's going to lose the next election. "





I m not a pacifist and I think as far as the NF are concerned, you have to deny them the right to speak or have public meetings - certainly the right to march through immigrant areas. Our Labour councillors are opposed to letting the NF hold meetings on council property".

Geoff is quite pleased with the anti-fascist committee in Brighton. On the question of whether it is broad enough, he said:

#### Law



We are talking about opposing fascism practically, not just about trying to combat racist ideology. One of the reasons the NF is gaining some small support is that people are unemployed, they've got lousy housing, they see their social services falling apart and they look for a reason. The NF gives them a scapegoat. You've got to give people some sort of way of looking forward, a positive alternative, and that is the socialist transformation of society. Could the Liberals, Conservatives or the church go along with a leaflet saying this sort of thing?"

Most Labour Party members have a great respect for the Law. As far as I'm concerned, the legal system is just another means of class exploitation. It's quite obvious that it is biased against the working class. As people get more involved in political action, they see that the impartiality of the system is a sham. Grunwicks is a good example of this.

#### Parliament

Parliament is a talking shop. It has a certain amount of power but when it comes down to it, as you can see from the ministerial memoirs, power really rests firstly, in the hands of the permanent civil service, and secondly, even the civil service is playing the tune which big busineas tells it.

The Labour movement has become enmeshed in the toils of Parliamentary democracy, being unable to see anything outside it and thinking that it is the highest form of democracy.

I don't believe that you can change society via Parliament. But the point is that you've got Parliament there and as far as the large majority of people are concerned, that is the government of the land. So, although you know its powers are very restricted, you use them to the extent that you can, prepared to go the next stage which is to mobilise and deal with the problem practically and directly. The Tories are quite prepared to thwart the 'will' of Parliament when their major interests are threatened. For example the resistance to the steel nationalisation in 1950 and the present murmerings that maybe pa amentary democracy is becoming unwrkable.

If they were all working there would be an immediate 20% increase in the national product. It's ludicrous. We need a programme for nationalising the commanding heights of the economy so that we can plan. Then the sky is the limit.

Alas, there is as yet little historical evidence to support his hope that the demoralised masses and exploited slum dwellers find socialism more attractive than facism in times of economic misery. Given no other choice, capital- labelled social democracy. ists will undoubtedly prefer facism to socialism, but the masses are likely to make a similar choice because only facism relies on appeals to what Geoff calls "powerful pre-cultural instincts"

(I am not so sure about the term 'pre-cultural'). Also, it is just no longer true to blame capitalism for racism, the small national capitalist The debate about anti-facism is very might find it useful, but the large multi-nationals have nothing much to gain from it. Indeed, they have produced their own brand of ideology appealing to the brotherhood of man.

> The question we must answer today is not which socio-economic system will best abolish racism and racial conflicts, about the answer to which there cannot be much doubt, but which is the greater threat to the growth of socialism as political force in Britain and Europe- the rise of 'national socialism' with its promise of glory and a very rapid end to the existing, rather dull coalition


> While history does not repeat itself, the fall of the German Republic in the 1930's may teach us a lesson. The rise of the Nazis, the Second World War and the elevation of

The Communists took to the streets in a noble attempt to destroy the Nazis, but parliamentary government collapsed, the masses did choose Hitler, the Communist Party was physically destroyed, and Europe is still suffering the consequences. ### S.O.S. CAMPAIGN

### BUSMEN AND COMMUNITY FIGHT



As has been reported by the Voice the Brighton busmen have gained much. both in working conditions and in trade union consciousness over the past year. It was therefore with great pleasure that our Voice reporter was invited to the first inter-depot meeting of the Save our Services Campaign.

Delegates came to the meeting on the 11 Feb. at Conway St.garage in Hove from all over the Southdown fleet area - from the Edward St. garage in Brighton, from Worthing, from Chichester and from Portsmouth. Save our Services is a large campaign and is certainly something that the busmen cannot win alone, but it was encouraging to see the extent to which individual busmen are taking up the fight. For example, at Conway St. the S.O.S. sub-committee was set up by the rank and file members who felt that the trade union committee was not doing elough on the matter.

Reports were given on what had been done so far. Labour parties and trades councils had been pressurised for their support, and community groups had been contacted. Members of the S.O.S. committee had received an encouraging response from the latter.

A lot of time was rightly given to a discussion on the relevance of public transport and who it should serve. It was agreed that 'regular' travellers such as schoolchildren and workers should be encouraged to travel far more. Bob Turner from Conway St. noted that a 210% fare increase in the Brighton area was hardly the way to encourage the public to travel. 'We are fighting for a socially necessary bus service,' noted Brian Avey, also from Conway St. Matt Masters from Worthing was in no doubt as to where they must campaign for support, 'We must recognise the importance of the community' he said. This is a vital point - the busmen and the community are at one on this campaign. In no sense is this just an internal trade union/management matter. Together, the busmen and the community can make real gains.

After the meeting we talked to Bob Turner from Conway St. We asked him why the S.O.S. committee had been formed. Bob had no reservations.

'To campaign against cuts in public transport, rising prices, inadeq ate services and poor reliability, 'he said. 'We would like to see an integrated transport system for our local area.' Bob saw the committee as having a number of definite aims namely:-

\*To improve the bus service structure.

\*To radically improve the fare structure. To have a flat fare rate in town and to give cheaper tickets to workers who use the buses regularly. A true half fare for children. and an abolition of the child's full fare before 9.00 am.

\*Bus routes should at all times be free of traffic congestion. Buses should be given definite priority in roads such as Blatchington Rd, Hove, and in St. James's St.

\*To bring back 'relief' buses extra to the service to cope with the rush hour periods. 'We are thankful for the amount of support received from within our own branch and from many outside organisations, but we still need as much support and as many suggestions as possible to assist us in our

### TYME TO HALT ROAD BUILDING

The demonstration at Falmer on 28th February, which temporarily disrupted construction of the £1.8 million road scheme which is carving up Falmer Village, was more than a gesture to the authorities.

The presence of John Tyme, who has opposed motorways throughout the country, and representatives from many organisations from East and West Sussex through the auspices of Transport 2000 marks the beginning of a determined campaign to fight the massive road schemes which the so-called Department of the Environment decided to build many years ago.

The government has committed itself to a fundamental reconsideration of the national trunk road system following the Leitch Committee Report. This report says that future traffic flows to justify road schemes need dramatic revision, and that other forms of transport should be considered. It also says that the cost/benefit studies used are inadequate.

Transport 2000 have demanded, in line with the Leitch Report, a complete reappraisal of the proposed schemes for the A27 at Falmer, Brighton, Hove, Lancing and Worthing. They want a Transport Inquiry with the full participation of British Rail public transport management and the local people as well as traffic engineers and planners.

Opposition to these schemes, which involve hundreds of millions of pounds in Sussex, is increasing. A large allparty pressure group in Worthing is demanding that their by-pass be chucked out completely. In the Brightom area, the Liberals have consistently campaigned against the scale of the proposed A27 Brighton by-pass and this is also opposed by Elizabeth Howard (Labour Councillor for Lewes) and many Tory Councillors in Hove.

The biggest real threat is the allpowerful road lobby which is ever present in government at all levels.

Both the Department of Tra sport (or, in truth, Road-building!) and East Sussex Highways and Transpotation Committee are dominated by road engineers. In East Sussex, Denys Charnock and his side-kick Leslie Wilson (ex-Road Construction Unit) are watching public transport fall apart while they are obsessed by planning more and more roads. Chairman of Highways Committee, Pat Drake seems happy to rubber stamp her officials approach and her justification of the A27 Brighton by-pass firstly on economic grounds (in contradiction to the Leitch Report) and then by threatening an alternative road through Brighton is quite naive. Dear Brighton Voice,

The grounds on which you attack me for marketing the Waffen SS book are seriously mistaken. I strongly condemn totalitarianism, left or right, because it deprives individuals and minorities of freedom and rights. There is no difference between "itler's concentration camp system

nd the Gulag Achipelego. The best way to safeguard ourselves against these is to study totalitarian regimes and understand them. To do this, we need an accurate history of them, which is based on historical evidence and records, and eschews popular myths and 'official' history. You should not therefore condemn me for making historical evidence about the Waffen SS publicly available.

Your article was very inaccurate. You misquoted 'The Bookseller' badly about the book. You called me a fascist although I have neither links nor sympathy with the National Front or similar. But I would defend their right to selfexpression, and yours too. None of the popular press doubted my sincerity and they interviewed me which you did not. I am not a language teacher. The book's advertising was easily covered by its sales and not 'secretly' absidized. Someone last month kindly refuted your innuendo about my wife. Mr Robert Beaumont is not an 'habitue' of mine. I had not heard of him until he appeared at my door twice last November. If you had come and interviewed me, you would have been just as much an 'habitue' of mine.

My father-in-law fought as a Waffen SS officer in the German Army. He was implicated in no atrocities, all of which he utterly condemns (including Hiroshima, Dresden, our forced repatriation of the Russians, Russian atrocities in Germany 1945). He supported Hitler's dictatorship as Germany's only way out (except for a communist dictatorship) of the political and economic chaos after 1918. He feels now that a totalitarian regime 'must lead in the end to an inhuman attitude' (his words Nov.18 Daily Mail). Please do not discredit your very useful and valuable function as this community's alternative voice with such inaccurate unfounded and intolerant pieces as you did on me.

We print this letter from Patrick Hinchy, the British publisher of a recent book on the Waffen SS, for two reasons: firstly because we publish almost every letter that we receive, and secondly because we made several mistakes in our article about him in issue 43. We relied too much on circumstantial evidence which linked him to Fascist groups in the town. We apologise for this and are pleased to know that he was prepared both over the phone and in this letter to condemn the National Front for its racism and persecution of minorities.

As for his book, or rather the book which he published, we have not seen the collection of photographs which make up the main part of the publication but we have now read the introduction, which Mr Hinchy sent to us. It is, on any count, an appalling piece of history. It sets out to correct the record of the Waffen SS by arguing at every possible point that the Waffen SS was merely doing its military duty. All the war crimes for which it has been rightly condemned are 'put in context' which means leaving out most of the incriminating evidence. This is not the place for a long review, but if Mr Hinchy thinks he has helped the cause of serious history he is either incredibly naive or far more determined to present a sympathetic view of the Nazi war machine than he suggests in this letter. Just one example:

On 9 June 1944 the SS division Das Reich murdered 99 men, chosen at random in the French town of Tulle. There was no trial and no effort whatsoever to establish whether these men were or were not part of the local French Resistance. They just took the first 99 men they found and strung them up to their balconies or on lamposts, and made the women and children watch. This last, revolting, fact is totally absent from the book, and the account we are given invents a reason for the hangings which is totally false. It accuses the French Resisters of having murdered over 50 German soldiers after they had surrendered to the Resistance. There is no truth in this whatsoever as the author of the book could have found out if he had gone to the legal

records of the Tulle massacre established after the affair. In fact although the book spends over a page and a half on Tulle it has not consulted a single French source, What is worse, the massacre on the following day (June 10 1944) at the village of Oradour, when over 600 innocent villagers were shot and burned alive in the village barn and church, is only given eight lines. The book gives no figures; it does not mention the fact that these were just village men, women and children, with no resistance contacts, nor does it condemn it as a 'war crime'. This is all it says:

"The 'case of Oradour' occurred in the midst of the conflict subsequent to the allied invasion. It too can be described as a reaction to an attack carried out by the French Resistance movement. In this case, however, a company leader of the Das Reich Division committed an excess which obliges one to share the grief and sympathy for the victims. Nonetheless it should be remembered that Oradour involved one company, whereas the Das Reich Division contained about 70 companies altogether."

This is not history of any kind. If Mr Hinchy had met any of the wives who were forced to watch their husbands being hanged at Tulle, or any of the villagers of Oradour who returned to their village from a neighbouring market to find children burned to ashes but still in positions of terror clasping their mothers, he would, for the sake of humanity as well as history, dissociate himself from these socalled historians of the Waffen SS.



# save the clinics

On Friday 27th January, 200 people picketed the meeting of the Area Health a £15,000 cut-back in spending. Authority and presented a petition with over 17,000 signatures protesting against the Authority's proposals to cut back the Family Planning Clinic service. The meeting agreed in principle to make cuts of up to £15,000 in Family Planning and cervical cytology (screening for cancer). This constitutes approximately one-sixth of the Family Planning Clinic budget. The final decision will be made in March or April when the year's budget is known.

A nucleus of F.P.C. workers and local women's liberation and political groups are continuing the campaign to publicize and fight these proposed cuts. Its implications that we fight to maintain We want to widen the campaign by involving other local groups-political parties, tenant's organisations, etc. in a co-ordinating committee. The response from people we have petitioned shows that there is a lot of support for our fight.

The four clinics involved are Brighton(including I.U.D. fittings at the New Sussex Hospital), Lewes, Newhaven, and at Sussex University. In the Brighton Area alone, 14,000

families use the Clinic service. Many women prefer to go to the Family Planning Clinic for contraception rather than to their GP's. At the clinic they know they will find a consistently sympathetic attitude, the choice of seeing a woman doctor, cancerscreening and a specially trained

The Family Planning Clinics are also extremely cost-effective. If women transfer to GP's for contraception the actual cost to the NHS will rise. It would simply mean that the cost was being transferred from the local to the national budget.

Last year the Brighton Clinic saw approximately two hundred new patients each week. As it is, there is a as I.U.D. fittings, and inadequate provision for others. Far from being able to stand a cut-back of one-sixth of its budget, the F.P.C.'s are in need of expansion.

It is essential that we do not allow a decision of such importance to be taken without proper discussion of and Union branches to establish (and improve) the existing F.P.C service, and that we continue to provide women with the choice of going either to their GP or the Clinic for contraception.

Women have a right to control their own bodies; contraception is a service which should be made more, not less, easily available.

### NUPE calls for action on housing

In a 57 page booklet published last month, the National Union of Public Employees, together with Services to Community Action and Tenants (SCAT), called upon the Labour Movement to take up the long neglected issue of housing.

The booklet is called 'Up against a brick wall- The dead-end in housing policy'. It is an excellently waiting list for certain services, such researched and closely argued document. It covers the present condition of housing in Britain, the effect of the cuts and catalogues the failures of government policies.

NUPE is asking the TUC to call a one day conference on housing. It hopes to encourage Trades Councils closer links with tenants' and community associations and to kee? a closer watch on local authority policies.

The booklet is strongly critical of the government's Green Paper on housing policy. It shows that increased spending on housing has been channelled into repayment of debt charges rather than new construction. Cutbacks in public expenditure and council house building have been accompanied by an increased reliance on the private sector- owner occupation and housing associations.

It's too early to see any results of NUPE's initiative in Brighton yet, but the union will be sending informat ion and advice to its branches. Housing has always been a big problem in Brighton, as readers of the Voice will know. Let's hope our Trades Council and union branches respond to this new challenge.
