

Lets run them out of Brighton, out of the country,



VICTORY

Congratulations are due to all those involved in the Campaign Against Regent Hill Development for their success in forcing Brighton Council to reconsider plans for a new car-park to be built behind Johnsons store on Western Rd. Planning permission was applied for to build a car-park right in the middle of a conservation area between Marlborough Street and Regent Hill. Apart from destroying the character of the area, it would have attracted more cars and lorries into narrow residential streets of too many vehicles caused by the closure of Western Road to traffic and its subsequent diversion into Upper North St..

This anachronistic bit of planning as the residents pointed out, is entirely contrary to the concept of keeping town centres alive with an indigenous working community rather than the creation - as with many other town centres - of a 'ghost town' dedicated to the notion of commercial expansion at any cost. "Poverty at work, or poverty on the dole"

Last month's 'Voice' carried a report from the Trades Council Low Pay Committee showing that Brighton a low pay 'Black Spot'. Here's st one example of the level of exploitation in the town and how it is backed up by the local state ...

Stanley is a skilled chemical engineering worker. 56 years old, he was made redundant and came south looking for a job. He worked as a kitchen porter in one of Brighton's posh restaurants - the English Oyster Bar. (In case you're thinking of going there, remember that starters are £8 and that the final bill is often over £100!) For a 45 hour week of hard dirty work, Stanley was paid £37.

These wages were so inadequate that he could not afford to pay his gas bill and so packed in the job. The Dept. of Health and Social Security suspended his Unemployment Benefit because he had left his job 'voluntarily'. He was therefore forced to depend on supplementary efit of £28 per week. So - be ereful if you decide to leave your job out of poverty - DHSS might think you are not poor enough!

If this was not too much to bear, Stanley read in the 'News of the World' about 'scroungers' on social security. Of course there are jobs at reasonable rates of pay for the unemployed to go to. After all,

there was the employer in East Grinstead who was almost in tears because no one would come and work for him at £75 p.w. Like many others Stanley immediately got in touch with the firm - prepared to put up with travel problems. The wages were in fact £42 p.w.

Is it so surprising that so many Brighton workers leave early every morning to go to factories in Burgess Hill and beyond? They seek the employment and wages that Brighton will not provide (this escape is an illusion as the other article on this page shows). The choice for those who remain in the town sems to be poverty on the dole or poverty at work.

Low pay cartel on industrial estate.

When members of the A.U.E.W. at the Laser Engineering Hydraulics Company in Burgess Hill, voted for a work-to-rule on July 11th., over low pay and redundancies within the Company, they were faced with the Catch 22 situation of trying to negotiate a fair deal with a company that denies them full negotiating rights; the Company is not a member of the Employers Federation, and asserts that it need not therefore comply with the Employers Federation regulations designed to safeguard the employees 'position. Workers are given only a verhal agreement over pay and productivity against which A.J.E.W. representatives on the Works Committee has no concrete bargaining power.

The workers had been led to believe that the Company was a member of the C.B.I., but current discussions have revealed that the Company, not content with paying its workers a wage below the

National Poverty Lines, has not even put hand to pocket to renew its subscription to the C.B.I. (which would protect the position of its employees).

Furthermore, the Director of Personnel at Lasers, Mr. J Lake, is also Chairman of the Industrial Group, and hence has control over the rates of pay on the Burgess Hill Industrial Estate. The Managing Director of Lasers conceded that wages were low, but assured his employees that they were comparable to wages on the Estate generally. This is not surprising when one considers the monopoly that Mr. J Lake has over those rates of pay! Lasers treats a skilled engineer as if he/she were an unskilled worker, paying a wage which is below the national minimum rate.

There have also been 49 redundancies proposed occuring in two stages, by the Company, and a third stage is possible. In the first stage, already brought into effect, 9 "undesirable" workers were moved from the job for which they were qualified to another position, only to be told that they were redundant in the latter position. Yet their original position was not redundant.

The Works Committee has been successful in reinstating 5 workers made "redundant" in this way. But until the Union Body can escape the negotiating monopoly that the Company has over it, the workers have no effective way of applying pressure where it is most needed.

After a 48 hour ultimatum the work to rule was called off following a statement by the Managing Director that; "meaningful talks" would take place. But to speak of meaningful talks without the context of negotiating regulations, is meaningless. Hence Mr. J O'Sullivan, the Factory Convenor of the A.U.E.W. at Lasers is concerned that a Shop Stewards Union be formed on the Industrial Estate, to counteract the negotiating monopoly of the Industrial Group. Darling's of Beaconsfield Rd. have been taken over by the NSS chain of newsagents, and have stopped selling Brighton Voice. The manager told us that "I've been told not to stock it anymore".

We trust our readers will bear this in mind when buying papers, sweets etc. The nearest Voice sellers are now Constable's of New England Rd. and Marvan's of Beaconsfield Rd.

FASCISM the real danger

In stark contrast to the respectable image presented by the NF when well-dressed members canvassed in the Lewes Road by-election, its real face was exposed at the Town Hall as the results were announced. Gone were the Burton suits, to be replaced by camouflaged combat jackets; no doubt useful when hiding amongst the Town Hall's floral display, or later, when trecking across the Pavilion Gardens in pursuit of two Anti-Nazi League members.

The Front's defeat in the by-election was greeted enthusiastically by all anti-fascists. Candidate Harold Jones was shouted down with cries of: "32 votes, one less than last time!" and "The National Front is a fascist front."

Considering the work which the fascists put into the election, this result was a huge victory for us. Similar defeats have occured all over the country. They are due to the work of all anti-fascists, and in Brighton due particularly to the consistent campaign waged in the Lewes Road ward through the Labour Party and the local Anti-Fascist Committee over the last two years. This has kept the NF vote the lowest in the country. Such defeats on a national scale are a massive blow to the Front. Their plan to build a respectable image has backfired on them and national NF organiser Webster (the fat one) is being blamed by his cronies for these failures.

This respectability has also been shattered locally when Worthing Council refused to let Council property for Front meetings. No such strong-minded decision has been made by our own Council however, who have opted out by agreeing to review each application for the use of a hall "on its own merits". It sticks in one's throat that Council buildings, owned and maintained by the people of Brighton, might be made available to an extreme group who threaten everything these people have worked for and believe in.



Thus, having elected to turn a deaf ear to the urgent and justified protests of the ANL and the Anti-Fascist Committee, Brighton councillors are openly allowing the NF to use the public's property to recruit the thugs they need.

For, as with all fascist parties, once they have been defeated at the

polls, the fighting begins. Locally, there has been a new development, with a small lumpen thug element appearing in the NF ranks. Such elements have little or no political awareness and the NF must satisfy their need for aggression. The result is the kind of attacks on local individuals and anti-fascist groups which have come to light in 'Brighton Voice'.

On no account must we be intimidated by such vicious attacks, for they can only discredit the fascists further. We must make sure our meetings are properly stewarded. Entrance should be by invitation only; known fascists should be barred and departure should always be in groups. The strongest protest must be made to the authorities when incidents occur, though this is no guarentee that action to ensure our safety will be taken. We must, therefore, be organised and disciplined, relying on our own resources and strength in order to stop attacks. Links between Anti-Fascist Committe and the Anti-Nazi League will be of the greatest importance. No political differences should break the unity of our movement. This unity is one of the most important lessons to be learnt from the events of the '30s.

In the coming months, with the possibility of a General Election, we will see more fascist activity; especially on the first anniversary of Lewisham in August. Every antifascist must be prepared to give immediate and active support to our work.



OFFENSIVE PLANNING

Those members of the Voice-buying public who carefully sit through County Council Public Protection Committees, or diligently read the lists of Chief Officers printed annually in the municipal yearbook, may have come across Emergency Planning Officers. Some of you may have asked 'who are they, what are they for and whose emergencies are they planning for?' Good questions indeed.

A pamphlet entitled 'REGION 1 - An Examination of the State's Plans for Repression in the North East' throws considerable light on the work and workings of these little-known departments. The pamphlet, produced by the Black Jake ripllective and sponsored by the yneside ABC Defence Committee, gives details of emergency planning work undertaken by Emergency Planning Organisations (EPOs). Ostensibly the EPOs were appointed under the terms of the 1974 Local Govt. Act to draw up plans for wartime and peacetime emergencies. The job of EPOs was to draw a plan for co-ordinating the local authority services; such as police, fire, health, education etc.; enabling them to work with the military in the event of nuclear or other conventional forms of attack. They also had to produce plans for peacetime emergencies like flooding, oil pollution, chemical spillage, rabies outbreaks and other 'natural disasters'.

Seventy-five percent of the EPOs' funding is direct from the Home Office and little is known of their activities. However, what is known isn't very encouraging. In his book, 'Beneath the City Streets', Peter Laurie wrote of Civil Defence:

"Although powerless to give people at large effective protection from attack, Civil Defence nevertheless fulfills its real purpose, which is as a defence against civilians; it protects the Government from its people. And this it will do equally in time of war or of insurrection. Both problems are the same." (Laurie 1972, p257)

The Black Jake publication reveals the real menace hidden behind Civil Defence and nuclear preparation rhetoric. It concludes that those worried about the communist build-up of arms are really more interested in the threat from within. Emergency planning exists in all County Councils; it is part of the Local Authority preparation for Regional Seats of Government. The last person to think about this seriously was Edward Heath when the miners got the better of him. The other major peacetime emergency which brought them to the fore was the General Strike in 1926.

Trades Unionists, Labour Movement activists, Radicals, Blacks, Gays, Squatters,

Claimants, indeed any 'dissidents' should at least know what to expect - 'REGION 1' spells it out. Brighton is in Region 6. The question remains; what happens

here? The Voice hopes to have a feature on Emergency Planning in the next issue, with a who's who of Counter-Insurgency Government.







.... (Great uproar of discussion) John: It might be a laugh. Bob: I wouldn't like being shot at. If you put the Pirhanas in a revolution they'd take away our guitars and give us guns, and we wouldn't know what to do.

Zoot: All we can do is run round stirring trouble everywhere, and be an influence.

V: Obviously you see revolution as violent. Supposing you had a nonviolent revolution.

Bob: I think revolution is utopian. John: I don't trust me future to a load of politicos on the left, just



as much as I don't trust it to a load of politicos on the right. Parties sit back and delegate responsibility. You follow someone else's decisions and you eventually stop thinking about the decisions or else you disagree with it but by then it's too late.

V: So you're anti revolution? (Pause) John: No I'd like one but I don't think it would necessarily be an answer.

Zoot: Let's face it, at the moment the system is boring, it would make

V: So what about the situation now, you know 7% of the population owning 84% of the wealth or thereabouts ?

Bob: I feel sorry for those people who haven't got the brains to get their share.

John: Well what we can do about it is point out the situation. Bob: I don't think there is any easy answer, there's always people with brains who would come and grab more of the money.

John: But it's always worth a try, upset the apple cart a bit. Zoot: What you are going to get is the alternative soiety which is going to run at the same time as the capitalist one, which is just going to go on for the rest of the world because there's room for it, you know. Capitalism will tolerate them, they step on them occasionally, but it will probably end up owning the organic bakery.

V: What about co-operatives? John: Yeah, that's a much better idea. If you give the individual more control over his situation you end up with a better individual. Zoot: Most places, I've worked at, the workers actually keep the place going. It's more in spite of the

management than with their help. If you take the management away no-one notices except that the place might start running better.

Bob: People are happier if they are doing something they can have pride in rather than....

John: Yeah if it's for them, and not for someone else. Bob: At the moment workers tend to

think, "Fuck me why should I do more than I have to, cause I m not getting anything for it. "It doesn't do them any good.

John: Yeah they are right to think like that. The basic daily routine, it is rubbish really.

V: Is there anything else you want to get into print?

"Yeah, please come to the next gig." John: Brighton Groups have something in common. V: What's that?

John: Well it's about not boring your audience with your virtuosity.

"Yeah, and all Brighton bands should work in the spirit of co-operation and all the people who live in Brighton should support their Brighton bands.

John: In Brighton the bands seem to be much more about ideas. Bob: They don't worry about musicianship too much - but it's intelligent cause there's the audience for it - I think.

A lot of groups around here have been thinking about forming their own label. There are a lot of bands who never get out of the garage because they haven't got an amplifier, so if bands read this and want some help or a P.A. system they have only got to go to the Resources Centre and ask a few questions because half the bands around are gigging down there.

ANL vs. COUNCIL

Over 100 people crowded into the Resources Centre on July 19 to attend the meeting of the Anti-Nazi League. Many were no doubt outraged by the Council's decision to refuse the ANL the right to hold their Carnival on the Level. Even more were no doubt shocked to hear their reasons for banning it - such as: "The violence of the 1930s was not caused by Fascists, but by the Left Wing"; and "with punks and rockers and left-wing militants, there's bound to be violence".

These well-reasoned Tory opinions were no protection against the beating up of 2 ANL members in the Volunteer pub shortly after the last meeting. Security at the present meeting was justifiably tight, following the NF's previous attempt at sabotage. But we knew we would be safe, because the Argus had sent its reporter along.


Further measures for the protection of ANL members were called for. One member recounted the frightening experience of how she was visited by 10 National Fronters while alone in her house. Rather than rely on the police, she suggested that the ANL organise a 'telephone tree', through which members could be contacted for immediate assistance in case of an attack.

What has emerged from the recent Council decisions is that the authorities see the Anti-fascists as a greater threat to the state than the NF. This is because they see their own role as protectors of property, not of people. (It doesnt matter what happens to a few blacks and left-wing unionists, as long as the factories keep running and the money keeps pouring in.) With total control over the mass media, the authorities can, and do, distort the role of the ANL and the Anti-Fascist committee. While allowing a number of NF letters to appear in its columns, the Argus has printed virtually no letters from any of the Anti-Fascist organisations. The ones it has printed have been torn apart in the 'Opinion' column the following day. The Argus reporter at the meeting assured us that his paper was only acting out of

"naivety and ignorance"...I think
we would credit Gorringe with
slightly more intelligence than
that. In protest against the Argus'
discrimination, the Anti-Fascist
committee has planned a picket of
the Argus offices on August 12.

However, it is obvious that the Argus will never present the Anti-Fascist organisations in a favour-

able light. Therefore, it is important that the Anti-Fascist and the Anti-Nazi committees make clear to the Brighton public, in the most effective way, that their aim is to safeguard the individual rights of everyone, and that the NF is committed to the abolition of these rights. The Council has most forcefully exercised its powers to prevent the Anti-Nazis from getting this across to the public. They have banned the ANL fom using Council (i.e. the people's) property for its proposed Carnival. They have presumably leaned very heavily on the University not to accept the Carnival on the



campus. In a letter to Student Untion President Su Wilkins, · Vice Chancellor Denys Wilkinson pointed out that he could not allow the Carnival to take place on campus, because the University had a responsibility "to its relationship with the community at large." And to 'justify' this lame excuse, he claimed it would be unhygienic. (of course, with all those punkers and lefties around!) These 'reasons' are just as pathetic as the ones put forward by the Council against holding the Carnival on the Level.

Recognising that the local authorities present almost as great a threat to individual freedom as the Nazis, it was agreed at the meeting to hold a rally on the Level on August 10, and then to march on the Council chambers to protest against the ban. It was also agreed to hold some kind of 'event' on September 3 (the proposed date of the Carnival and the anniversary of Hitler's defeat) as a challenge to the reactionary policies of the Council. Full support for both rallies is essential if they are to be effective. As one member pointed out, we must not

give in to the authority's decision - otherwise it would be like leading ourselves to the gas chambers.

In the meantime, the more standard forms of publicity were organised: further leafletting of houses, and the fly-pitching of a stall in the London Road shopping area on Saturdays. It was also proposed to hold discos on estates such as Whitehawk and Moulsecombe (popular recruiting grounds for the NF) - not simply to improve finances, but as away of making contact with frustrated unemployed kids and showing them that they don't need violence to change their situation: "The NF can offer them a good punch-up, we want to offer the them a good time." Another way of getting across to the kids was to set up a 'Seagulls Against the Nazis' group, in which ANL members would leafiet football matches, and call for support from Albion players.

On the problem of youth unemployment, there is now to be a CAYU alternative to the Trades Union conference this summer.

What must be made clear about Ahti-Fascist organisations is that they are a broad-based alliance of several groups, and there fore should represent all oppressed and potentially oppressed groups in the community. We must remember that we are not only fighting racial fascism, but sexist and anti-gay fascism as well. Future ANL and Anti-Fascist meetings must therefore devote some time to the re-education of our own attitudes towards sexism and gays. We must remember, as one member pointed out, that after they have annihilated the blacks and the Jews the fascists will turn their violence against women's groups and gays.

e Andrew Bowden at the Conservative HQ. FOE's viewpoint on a halt to the developments at Windscale was accepted by Bowden, because of the logical reasons supporting their argument, as opposed to the illogical ones raised by BNFL. When The Commons voted on the Windscale issue Bowden was one of the minority of MPs who voted against the development of the reprocessing plant.

Activities have included informing the general public about the dangers of nuclear power as there are so many people who are unaware of the present situation. The new FOE stall has been set up at a number of community festivals and includes a display unit on the alternatives to nuclear power and the real hazards to man and his vironment in a fissile society.

WOMEN AGAINST NAZIS

A Women Against the Nazis group is being set up in Brighton. Why another group besides the ANL? Many women feel there are valid reasons for an autonomous women's group within the ANL. For a start, the Anti-Nazi League has so far tended to be somewhat male-dominated, not only in its 'leadership' but also in its attitudes.

Take the last meeting of the ANL in July, for example. When women objected to certain sexist remarks made during the meeting this was passed off as irrelevant and a diversion from the 'real issue' of fighting fascism. While it is of course vital for women and men to fight the National Front together, it is also important to recognise that sexism is an integral part of

fascism, so that to attack one and not the other would be absurd.

The experience of fascism in the 'thirties indicates that National Front policy would oppress women as well as blacks, gays, trade unionists etc.

Repressive laws (e.g. on abortion and contraception) would prevent women from having equal rights, and under the guise of glorifying 'the family', would make women into little more than breeding machines.

If any doubts remain about
the relevance of sexism
against women to the fight
against fascism, just cast
your mind back to the Rock
Against Racism concert in June
(reported in the last Brighton
Voice). Remember the offensive
sexism of the Fabulous Poodles?
It was especially bad at a
concert demonstrating
intolerance of racist oppression.

The Women Against the Nazis group hopes, among other things to look at the position of women under fascism, and to see what constructive criticism can be offered to the Anti-Nazi movement as a whole. It also needs to reach women hitherto outside the ANL and Women's Movement. So although most of those at the first meeting were there via these connections, it is hoped that other women in Brighton will want to come along in future. The next meeting will be on August 10th at the Resource Centre, 8 pm. There is still lots to talk about, and all women interested are welcome.

NHS Cuts~SMACHS Fights On

SMACHS is a broad-based, local campaign against cuts in the National Health Service. Within the Brighton Health District there are serious reductions in staffing, there are still threats to the New Sussex Hospital and the cytology service, beds have been closed in Hove General and there are intolerable waiting lists in chiropody and IUD clinics. Nurses are under incredible pressure and are unable to provide the care which they want to give and you expect to receive.

Three public meetings have been well attended. However, for an effective campaign we need you to contribute your experiences of NHS care, and ideas of how it could be improved. We welcome individuals,

trade unionists, NHS workers and consumers, to come along to our next meeting, or contact SMACHS at 132 Ladysmith Road for further details. We also welcome affiliations at £1.00 a go from trade unions and other bodies.

Future action is to be aimed at the Trades Union Congress from 4 - 8 September. On the Thursday of that week there will be picketing and street theatre outside the Conference Hall. Petitioning has also begun in the hopes of getting as many signatures as possible in support of a demand to improve our health service locally, but not at the expense of other districts.


The 'Argus' is notorious for its misreporting of many local issues, especially strikes and meetings of the Labour and Trade Union Movement. Many events are simply not reported at all.

After a well fought campaign by the residents - culminating in demonstration directed towards group of visiting councillors, the Council reconsidered the plan. This will be a great encouragement to other Residents' Associations.

Its importance lies in the belief held by many residents that this attempt at expansion by Johnsons was being seen by other interests along the Western Road as a testcase for future developments. Western Road store-owners want to fight against the continuing decline of their business since the completion of the highly successful (in business terms) Churchill Square complex. It is known that both Owen & Owen and Waitrose are thinking of similar expansion which could involve the demolition of the Classic Cinema building - whose lease runs out this year. Let us Regent Hill scheme doesn't mean a shunting of the car-park further along Western Road onto someone else's doorstep.

It is interesting to note that the campaign was well supported by several local Tory councillors and that the Gazette gave them an unprecedented amount of support, with full-scale articles including artists impressions of the resultant traffic congestion caused by the car-park etc., as well as a voracious leader article after the Council's decision claiming it as a great victory.

Why, one asks, did the campaign get this(very welcome) support? Is it something to do with the fact that the editor lives within the threatened area in Clifton Terrace? One wonders what effect a similar influential resident would have had on the plans for the notorious Falmer "by-pass".

London: A West Indian who arrived here twenty years ago and has five (English) children appeared before Col. Ronald Gardner-Thorpe City Magistrate, for non-payment of a traffic fine. The Colonel began by remarking that he "looked the sort of person that was always in trouble" and asked him if he had thought of returning to Barbados. He then said " I am a member of an organisation which would gladly pay your fare." No prizes for guessing which one. (Socialist Worker) In an important test case affecting the privacy rights of employees, a construction worker has been awarded £1,600 compensation for unfair dismissal. Beaufort Construction, a subsidiary of the Savoy Hotel, decided to introduce compulsorary identity photos and sacked the man when he refused to have one taken. (NCCL: Rights)

Oxfordshire: Racial abuse and more was hurled at a party of Birmingham schoolchildren on a visit to an Oxfordshire village. Captain Patrick Uptor threw a stick and a piece of concrete at them, while shouting that they"should be kept in the classroom". He then threatened to shoot them and their teacher. (Carf)

Japan: The state-owned railway has disciplined 140,000 union members for taking part in strikes over pay. A spokesman stated that 2,777 had been suspended for up to a year, 1,257 had had their wages reduced and the rest had been admonished. (Leeds Other Paper)

FROM THE FREE PRESS

York: The central island of a zebra crossing has been damaged so often by passing juggernauts that residents are campaigning for traffic lights to be installed. The crossing is regularly used by schoolchildren and it can only be a matter of time before someone is seriously injured. However, the Council says that unless it can be shown that enough adults will use the crossing to justify the cost, nothing will be done; statistically, children don't count. (York Free Press)
