EDITORIAL At the last but one NAFA meeting we came up against one of our most difficult decisions. At the time there were two national demonstrations in London on October 16th see the enclosed leaflet. Whilst the majority at the meeting were in favour of supporting the "Unity" demonstration, a minority were in favour of the ARA demonstration. Rather than having a straight vote a compromise was agreed that we publicise both events and at the same time criticise the national organisations for their failure to agree to have one and only one national event on the same day. Possibly the decision failed to please anybody but it was felt important that we were not torn apart by coming down in favour of one side or the other. What was clear is that the major national organisations themselves are undemocratic and plough on regardless of the movement as a whole and the views of their own members who have no decision making role. As an independent, democratic local group NAFA has to plough its own furrow and has increasingly been in contact with other independent groups in the region and elsewhere. That's fine for local activities but a major problem for national activities. Perhaps we can, next year, start discussing organising a conference of independent antifascist groups, of which there are many, to try to work our way through this problem.

A number of NAFA members have been discussing setting up a youth project/event aimed at white youths from the estates where fascists are finding support. The aim is to both show the realities of fascism to the youths and get them to look at their own problems rather than seeking scapegoats. This is an important activity and requires careful planning. At the moment the group are looking at options, funding and resources and have had a positive response from youth workers. ARYAN FESTIVAL

The last mailing concerned the proposed Aryan Festival which we were trying to stop. With the few days notice available NAFA concentrated on contacting councillors, MPs, MEPs and others to try to get the event banned. This the police did and their operation covered all we had asked the Police Committee for. The premises were closed, no attempt at fascist regroupment was allowed and the roads off the motorway were controlled, fascist buses were turned away. The day before the event NAFA agreed to call off our mobilisation and monitor the event only, cars were sent up to keep watch. The ANL did stage a small demonstration in Heanor, but the police were true to their word in stopping any fascist activity. We understand incidently that one of those responsible for the proposed Aryan Festival was the owner of Better Fuels, a coal distributor from Brinsley.

A week later 50 people drawn from a number of independent groups throughout the region did a follow up leafleting in Heanor and Ilkeston and found considerable support.
