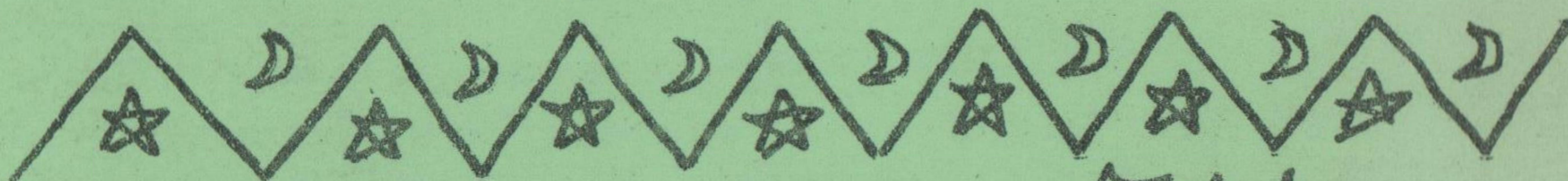

If anyone has any ticket stubs left, please return them to Crabapple now. They have to be in Birmingham by 21st, and the draw is on April 26th.




J.R. and the School of Sincerity

THE BASIC CASE

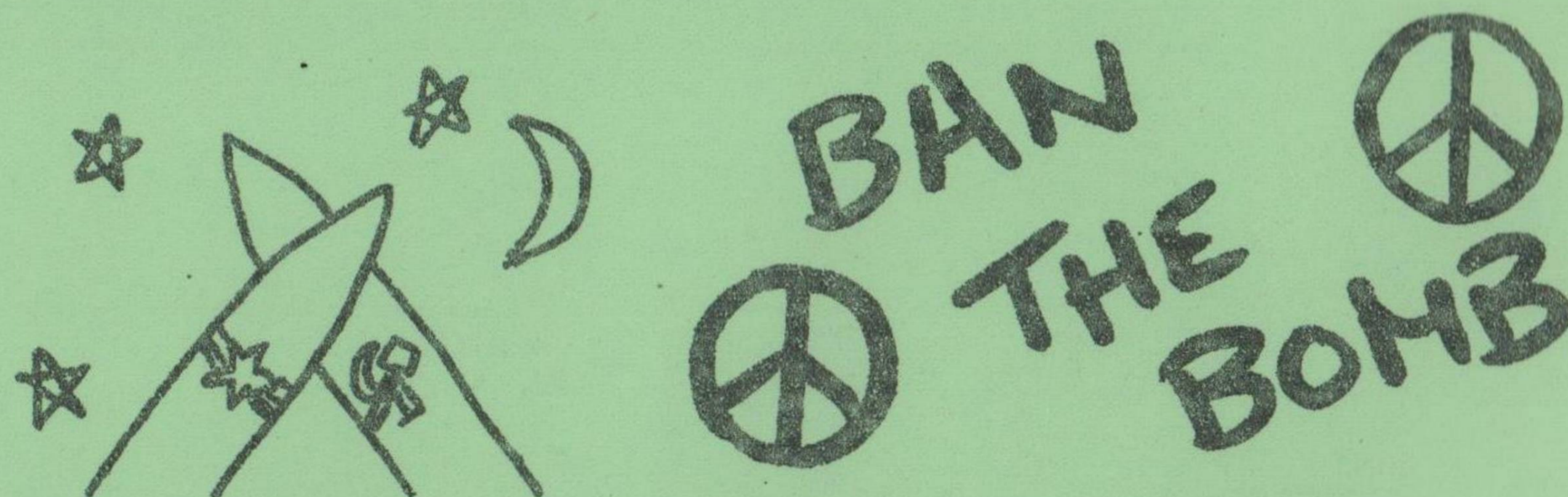


Starting on Thursday April 17th, CND is launching its Extended Public Information Campaign. (EPIC)

The purpose of this EPIC is to get back to CND's basic case for No Nuclear Weapons in Britain and to explore the theme "Support CND for a Future Without Fear". EPIC 1 will demonstrate "the common sense of our proposals for nuclear disarmament, common sense exhibited by the majority of the worlds nations who are taking the non-nuclear initiative, and the benefits to ourselves, and to the rest of the world to be gained by joining the majority."

Why do we need it?

We have identified an 'undecided' group of people who are against cruise and Trident, but think that we should possess some nuclear weapons. They want to halt the arms race, but feel helpless to do so. Some dislike CND's image. Others feel that they do not know enough about the issues. We have to convince them, despite the propaganda, that British 'independent' nuclear weapons are expensive, irrational and not even independent. They do nothing to defend us since inviting suicide is not a sensible defence policy.



This campaign will culminate with a mass lobby of parliament on July 8th. The message will be "YES to nuclear disarmament - NO to Star Wars." At the time of going to press, no definite details are available but we will probably be sending a coach from Shrewsbury. More details in later newsletters.

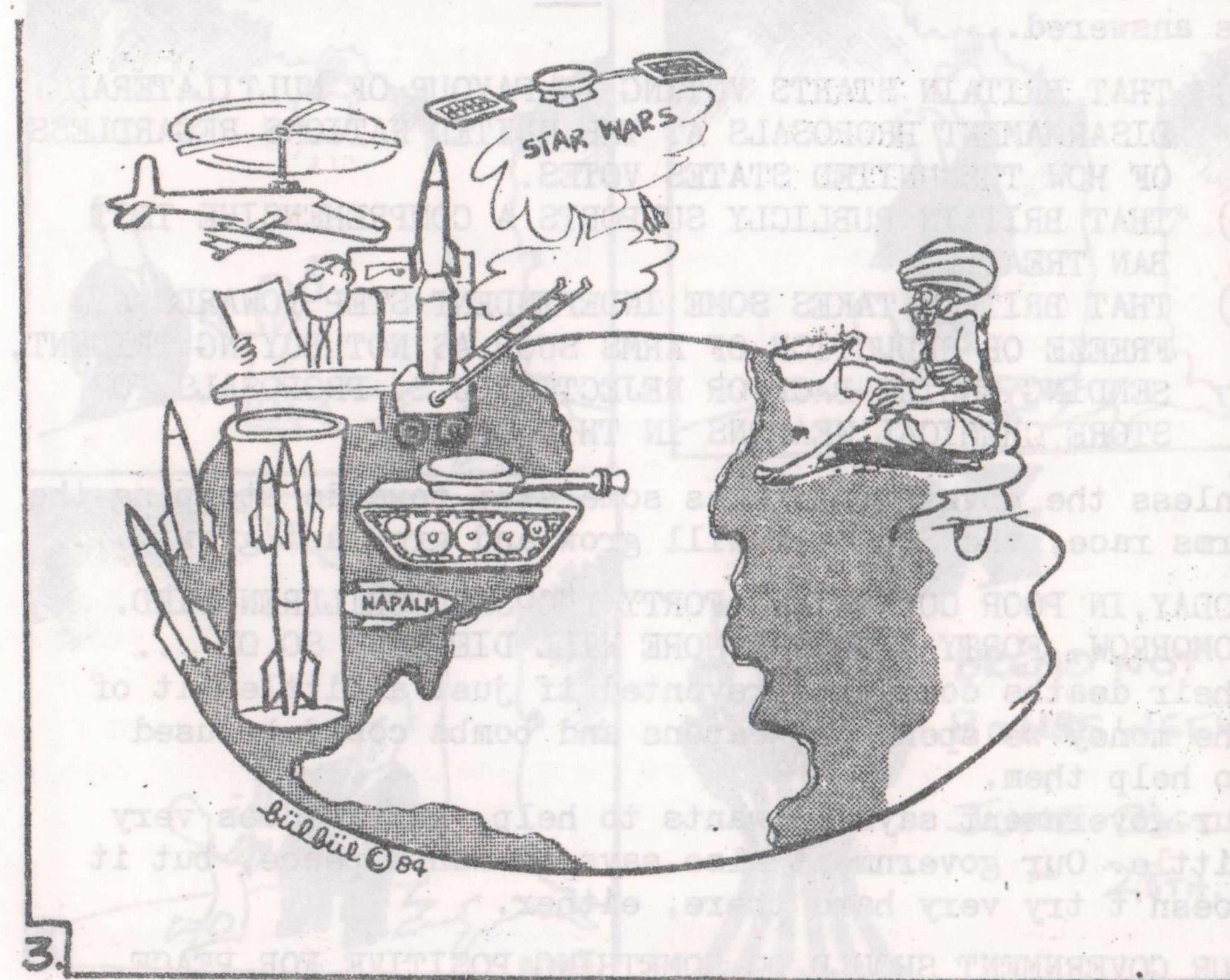

THE SNOWBALL CAMPAIGN



The Snowball Campaign is a non-violent action but it means breaking the law. Each of the Snowballers cuts a single strand of the perimeter wire fence at a local nuclear base.

With this action they are saying :

LIFE ON THIS EARTH IS MORE IMPORTANT THAN ANYTHING ELSE !!

The Snowball started with three people cutting the fence at USAF Sculthorpe in Norfolk, then nine, then twenty-seven, then eighty-one. The numbers grow and grow.

Each of the Snowballers goes to the police and hands in a statement explaining why s/he cut the fence. Each person also writes three letters - either personal or to a public figure - explaining why this action was taken. Each promises that the Snowball will stop if one of three simple requests is answered...

- 1) THAT BRITAIN STARTS VOTING IN FAVOUR OF MULTILATERAL DISARMAMENT PROPOSALS AT THE UNITED NATIONS REGARDLESS OF HOW THE UNITED STATES VOTES.
- 2) THAT BRITAIN PUBLICLY SUPPORTS A COMPREHENSIVE TEST BAN TREATY.
- 3) THAT BRITAIN TAKES SOME INDEPENDENT STEP TOWARDS A FREEZE OR REDUCTION OF ARMS SUCH AS NOT BUYING TRIDENT, SENDING CRUISE BACK OR REJECTING U.S. PROPOSALS TO STORE CHEMICAL WEAPONS IN THIS COUNTRY.

Unless the government takes some step towards stopping the arms race, the Snowball will grow and grow and grow.....

TODAY, IN POOR COUNTRIES, FORTY THOUSAND CHILDREN DIED. TOMORROW, FORTY THOUSAND MORE WILL DIE. AND SO ON ... Their deaths could be prevented if just a little bit of the money we spend on weapons and bombs could be used to help them.

Our government says it wants to help, but it does very little. Our government also says it wants peace, but it doesn't try very hard there, either.

OUR GOVERNMENT SHOULD DO SOMETHING POSITIVE FOR PEACE.

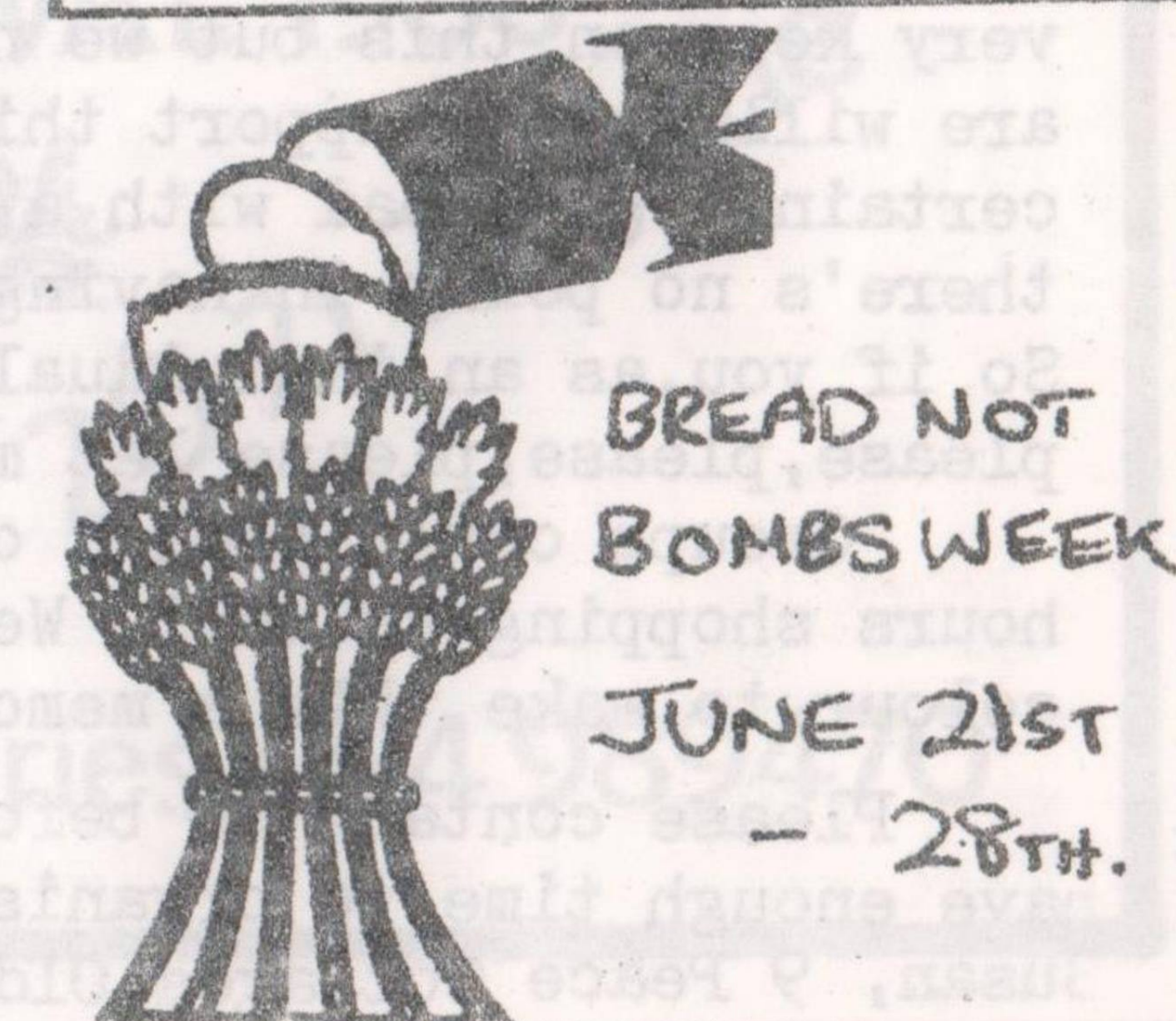
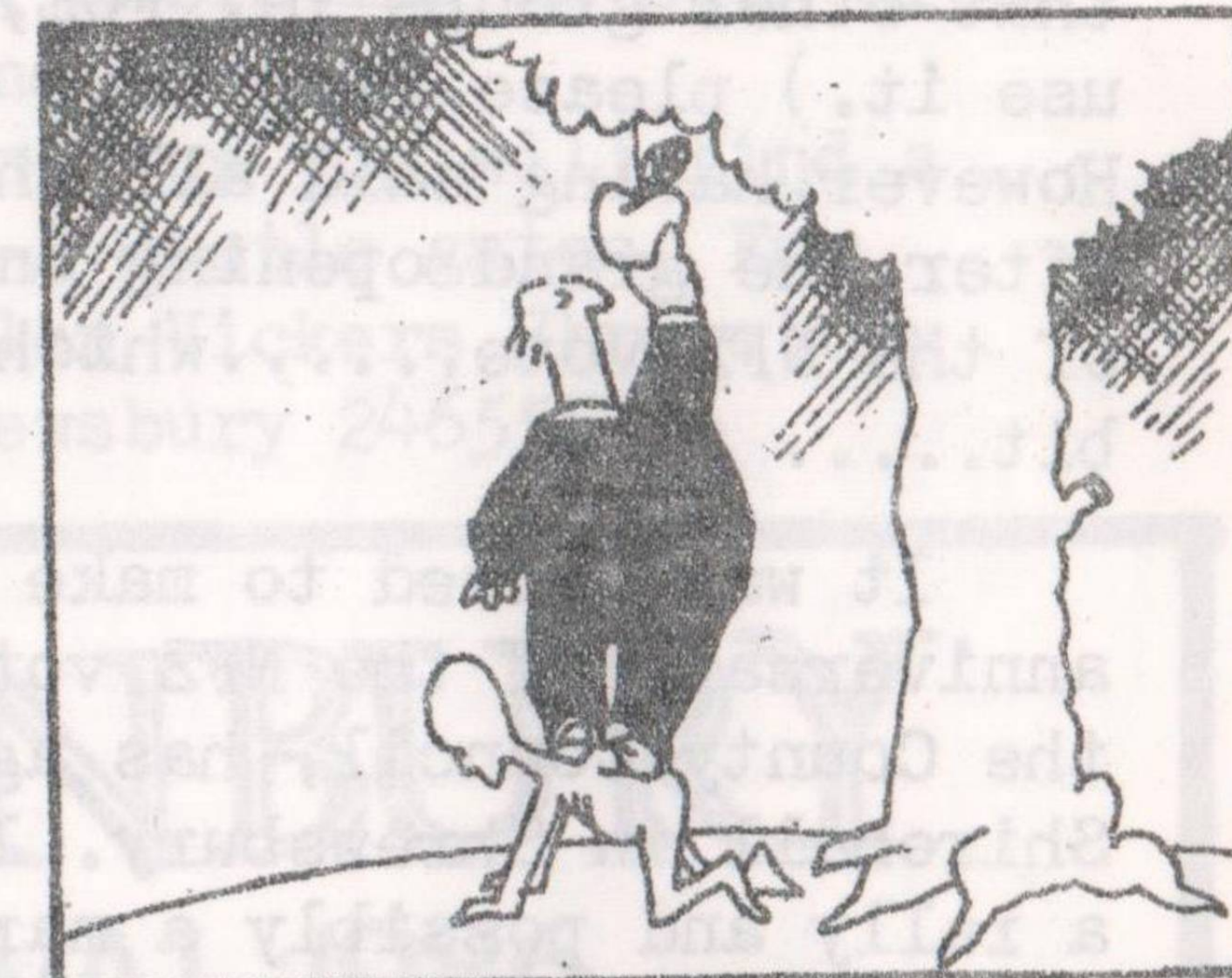
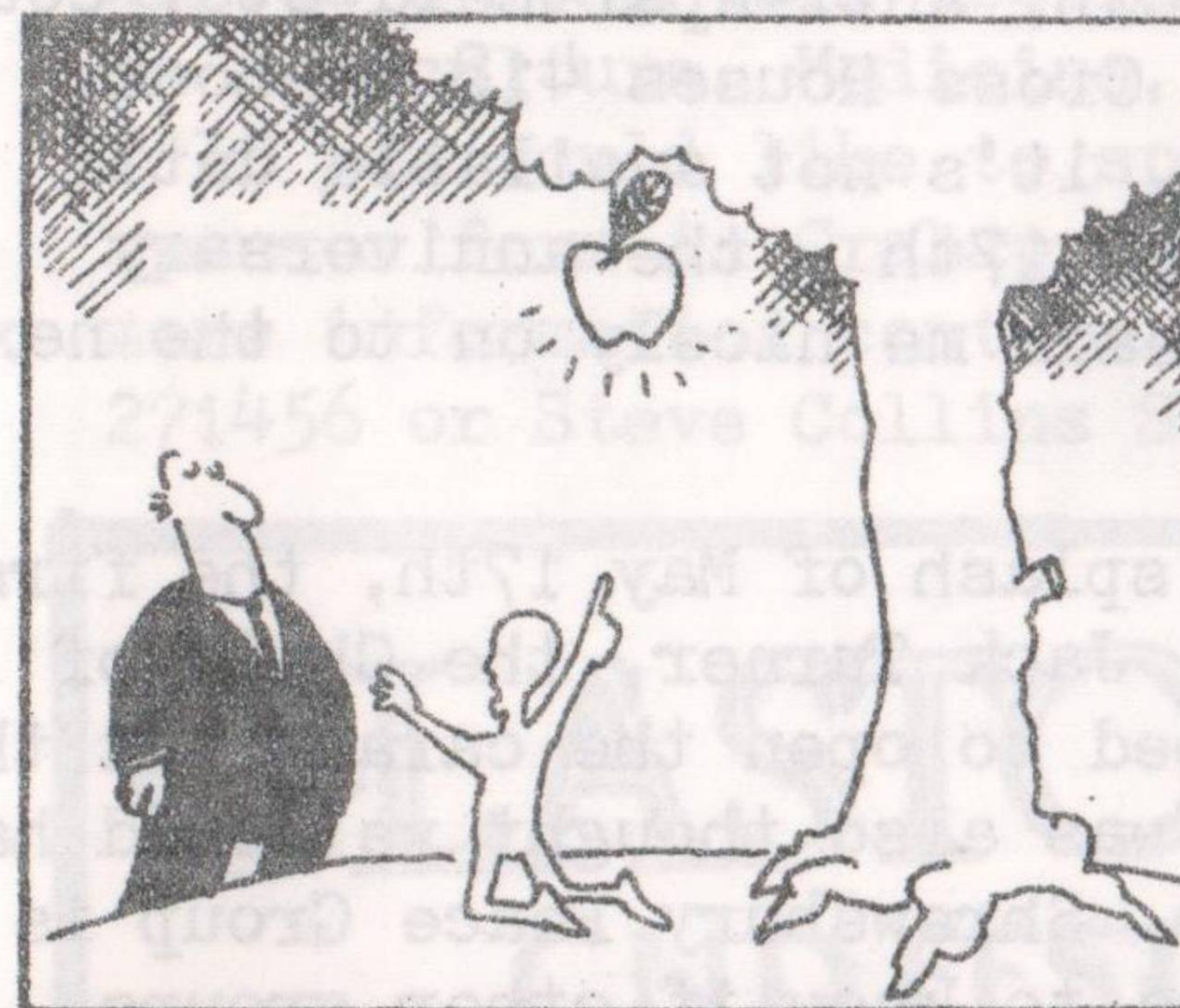
URENCO's enrichment plant at Capenhurst (Cheshire) provides fuel for nuclear power stations. The new MoD plant on the same site has cost £100 million, and is to make highly enriched uranium to fuel Trident submarines, and also for nuclear weapons.

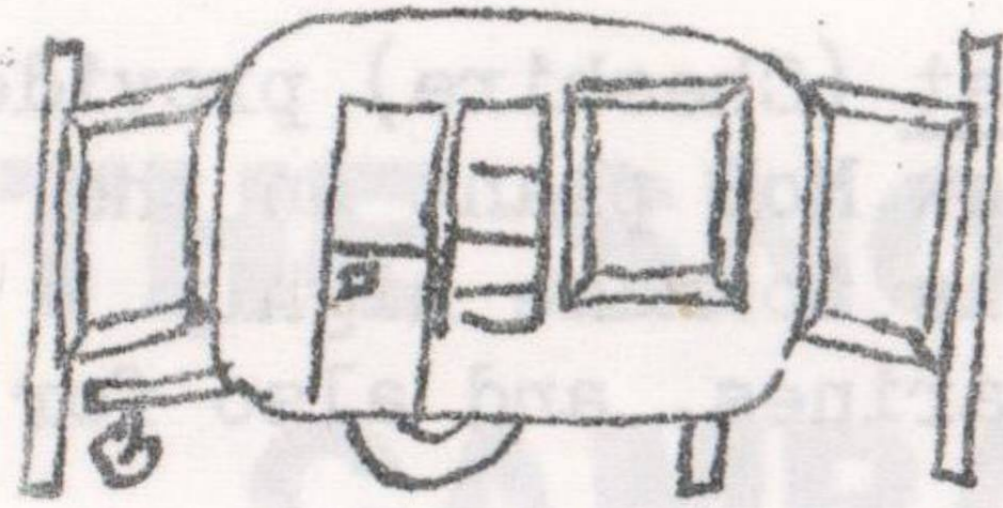
The uranium which is enriched for military use is mined under inhuman conditions in Namibia by Rio Tinto Zinc, a British company. This is in defiance of the United Nations Decree which makes it illegal to import raw materials from Namibia while that country is occupied by South Africa.

Most ordinary people (no such thing-Ed.) long for peace and justice. They have tried hard to make our government listen, without success. So the Snowball Campaign began.

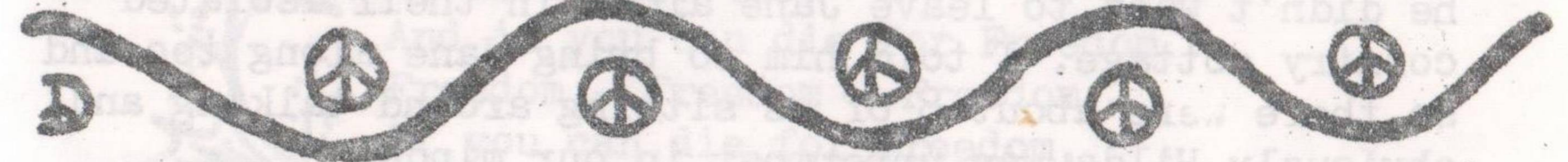
Groups could book a coach for the day and have a few hours shopping as well. We need you, your banners and your colour to make this a memorable celebration!

WHO KILLED HILDA MURRELL?

We still don't know, do we?
I'm not sure why I went to see this play. I knew that I'd be very depressed afterwards.....

Shortly after Hilda was murdered, I was sharing an evening with some friends out at Plox Green. I had seen Mick earlier in the day and he had said that he wouldn't be able to come because, in view of the circumstances, he didn't want to leave Jane alone in their isolated country cottage. I told him to bring Jane along too and so there were about 8 of us sitting around talking and obviously Hilda was uppermost in our minds.

We convinced ourselves that there was no way that the security forces/police/government etc. could have had anything to do with Hilda's death. That sort of thing doesn't happen in this country. We were all very disturbed by the implications of some of the evidence but managed to persuade ourselves (?) that it just wasn't possible. Our police wouldn't do it....would they? The Government was pretty rotten but they couldn't sink that low..... could they?

As time went by and evidence came in and issues were evaded and nothing happened, realisation dawned on us that we were almost certainly wrong in our previous conclusions.

The play was superb and caringly performed. The Music Hall was packed. There must have been 500 people in that hall. How did they feel....Many of my friends were there, I think I know how they were feeling. There were amusing parts but I couldn't laugh. It was all too distressing. I was shaking by the end.

Nothing particularly new was said but the issue of Hilda's death was raised again. Odd how the police had an incident caravan in the Square that previous week asking for further information.

One piece of information did come to light....I don't think I'll ever forget it. About 3 months before Hilda died a Mrs Goodman disappeared. Who?.....Mrs Goodman was area secretary for CND; a member of The Council for the Protection of Rural Wales. She was of an age with Hilda and her involvement in conservation and the peace movement

were very similar. She went shopping one day from her home in Corwen and has not been seen since.

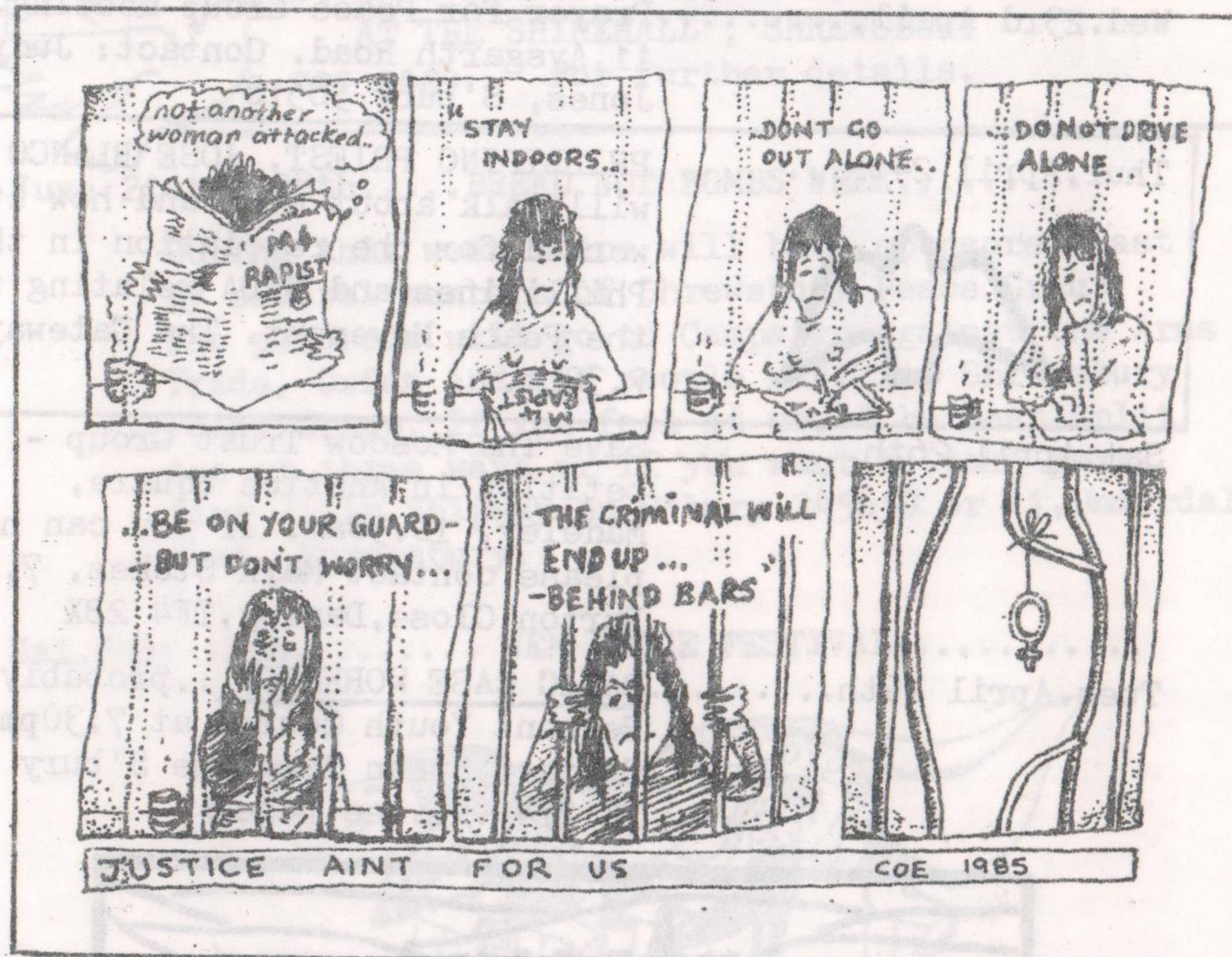
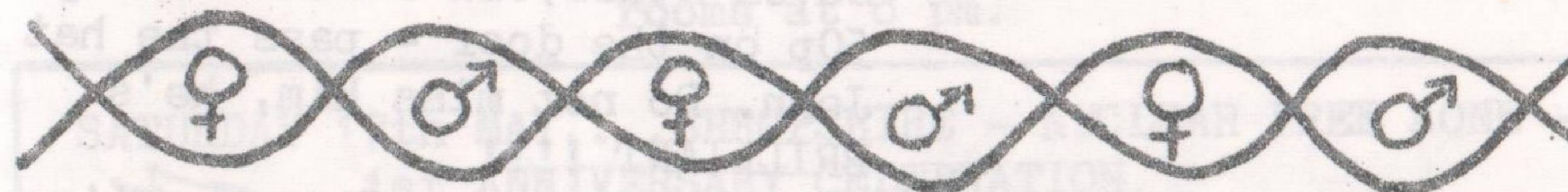
I didn't think we had Karen Silkwoods in this country but it looks like I was wrong again.

POP-A-REACTOR WITH FRIENDS OF THE EARTH



Sometime in May, the bulky outline of Trawsfynydd Nuclear Power Station will be graced by hundreds of balloons soaring upwards in front of it. Some of the tags attached to them will be sent back to us, drawing attention to how far radioactive dust could travel in the event of a serious accident. Trawsfynydd, 50 miles to the west, is our nearest nuclear reactor.

There are two particular points to this exercise. First, the existing station is 23 years old, a few years away from the end of its life. And so, shall we say, not in its safest condition - as has been pointed up by the recent leak of radioactive carbon dioxide.

Secondly, after the Sizewell Inquiry report comes out around September, the Electricity Board will press - whatever the recommendations - for a whole 'family' of Pressurised Water Reactors. One likely site is (you guessed?) Trawsfynydd. The PWR design is inherently more dangerous than previous designs because of the tremendous pressure at which it operates. So if anything goes wrong, it gets serious in fractions of a second. So quickly that humans cannot deal with it. It has to be left to computers.

The nuclear power industry, worldwide, is teetering on the brink of its own grave. Let's help it to fall in. Pop-a-reactor from Crabapple and other outlets throughout the area; 40p buys a tag to tie on a balloon. Further details: Shrewsbury Friends of the Earth; phone Shrewsbury 67968.

KEEPING THE BOAT AFLOAT

Defence is not a subject in which Parliament takes much interest. There is a brief 'open season' at the beginning of the year, two days given over to debating the White Paper which is the annual announcement by the Government of its defence policy, and a further three days devoted to the interests of the three services. Unless there is a sudden change of policy, eg. the run down of the surface fleet as encouraged by Mrs Thatcher and John Nott in the early 1980's (thus giving a signal to the Junta that there were likely pickings in the South Atlantic), defence comes low in the list of Parliament's priorities.

For several years I have been one of three Vice Chairmen of the Conservative Party's backbench defence committee, a task which cannot be described as arduous. The Chairman is Sir Anthony Buck, the Member for Colchester and a former 'naval person'. We meet weekly on Wednesdays at 16.15 in order to listen to a sequence of guests: academics, journalists and retired admirals with something lethal to sell. Some of our guests have even been known to bring Charts.

The party should not be confused with the all-party select committee which takes itself altogether more seriously. The select committee can summon witnesses and write reports, which as they are rarely given debating time on the floor of the House, enjoy a brief life, as short as that of the mayfly, but less productive. The party committee, on the other hand, acts to keep the boat afloat while not actually rocking it.

We have few illusions. Less than 4% of Parliamentary time is devoted to defence on which has been spent since the end of the Second War between a quarter and a third of all Government expenditure.

Parliament can either approve or disapprove of Government policies. It has no power as Congress has, to even alter the pattern of allocation. *****: it is in defence matters, as in no other subject, that the differences between the elected on both sides of the Atlantic are so great.

17 And yet there are limits beyond which no prudent Tory Secretary of State would willingly go. After the Nassau agreement in 1963, the Knights of the Shires feared lest the deterrent would be no longer independent. Whatever the costs of the Trident programme, there is no doubt that the Government would not consider its cancellation, modification, or replacement, this side of the next election. Too much emotional capital has been invested in it.

The backbench Conservative MP has long been regarded as the lowest form of political life. By "Conservative", I mean "Government"; an opposition backbencher can have more fun. As a Tory my task is to sustain the Government in office. As an MP who has taken an interest in defence matters for more than twenty years, I have no doubt in the role that Parliament is called upon to play.

Parliament has been excluded from direct participation in the policy making process. It is for our masters to gauge what it is they can get away with. Parliament has no voice in many, if not all, of the major policy decisions that have been taken since the War. Lord Atlee never informed or consulted his cabinet, let alone Parliament before embarking on the construction of a strategic nuclear force. Operation Antelope, later renamed the Chevaline project, was revealed to the House by Francis Pym ten years after its inception. The list is endless.

Parliament's failure to provide a forum for defence policy has set a limit to the size of an informed public opinion on matters of defence. This, in its turn, has meant that the authority with which the Government of the day can clothe their policy decisions has made them immediately acceptable to public opinion as a whole. The evidence of the public opinion polls has been that the public attitude to policies, whether conscription, the level of spending or the independent nuclear deterrent, has been one of support for whatever the Government's view on any of these topics may have been at any one time. The public approved a three per cent increase in real terms in defence spending; now that the party is over, and defence will be squeezed, no one seems to care very much.



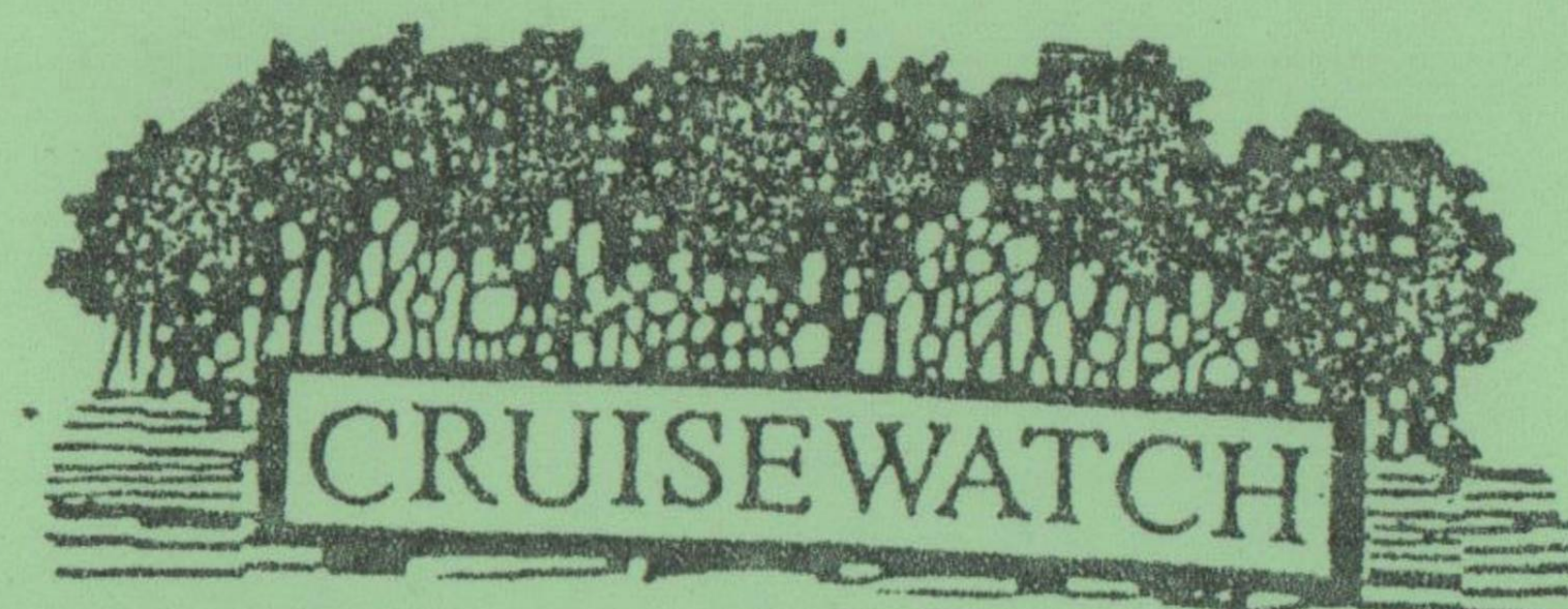

In fact some women are coping with the evictions better than ever thanks to a special new tent that can be removed and carried away, complete with contents, in about ten seconds. This amazing new tent (with built in ground sheet) has been built by a sympathetic camping firm in Cumbria, and financed by the Quakers who are donating them to Greenham.

However, even the new tent doesn't stop the bailiffs attacking women. And when women are attacked the police always look the other way.....

Meanwhile, inside the base, the Americans are spending 250 million dollars on "new facilities".....

AT GREENHAM.

Over the last couple of years, many women at Greenham have become ill with strange symptoms - sickness, headaches, dizziness and disrupted menstrual cycles for example. With many women experiencing these symptoms at the same time, and with the effects being noticed particularly at one gate, it was thought that it might have something to do with the base itself. Visiting doctors and scientists have connected the symptoms to low-level microwave radiation, and have found that areas around the base are being subjected to radiation levels much higher than expected. Microwaves can cause physiological and neurological changes in humans, and very high levels can cause blindness and death. Both Americans and Russians are trying to develop microwave battlefield weapons - the Americans tested an "electronic flamethrower" back in 1972. The military isn't "allowed" to experiment on humans, but perhaps they see Greenham women as guinea pigs rather than humans... Some Greenham women are currently undergoing tests to find out what's happening to them.....



The last Cruise convoy exercise was witnessed by over 1,000 protesters. (March '86). The convoy was halted many times, its schedules disrupted, and cruise launcher vehicles painted with various colours of paint and porridge ! Warning fires were lit on hill tops across Southern England to warn the population that the Americans were practising for Armageddon again. The convoy was tracked all the way to Salisbury Plain and all the way back again. As usual, some policemen were excessively violent, and photographers who captured the violence on film were themselves arrested. One mixed Cruisewatch group stopped the convoy for ten minutes by blockading the road, and then sprinkled aromatic oils on the Cruise missile launchers - just imagine, those evil silos at Greenham Common now smell of flowers !

The police were astounded at the huge numbers of peaceful people who turned up at such short notice. Are we in Shrewsbury too far away to join in? Or can we publicise Cruise deployments in some other way? Perhaps we could have some sort of local Cruisewatch support group? There is a small group of people who are interested in helping out in Cruisewatch activities in the South. It wouldn't mean doing any of the dramatic and dangerous charging around on Salisbury Plain but helping to relieve worn out and over worked Cruise watchers at times.
