Washday in the 1920's

Washday, at this time, was always Monday. As all the work was manual and took up so much time, dinner consisted of vegetables and cold meat from the Sunday joint.

Since there were no washing machines, driers, or even electric irons, the procedures followed the traditional pattern to be described now.

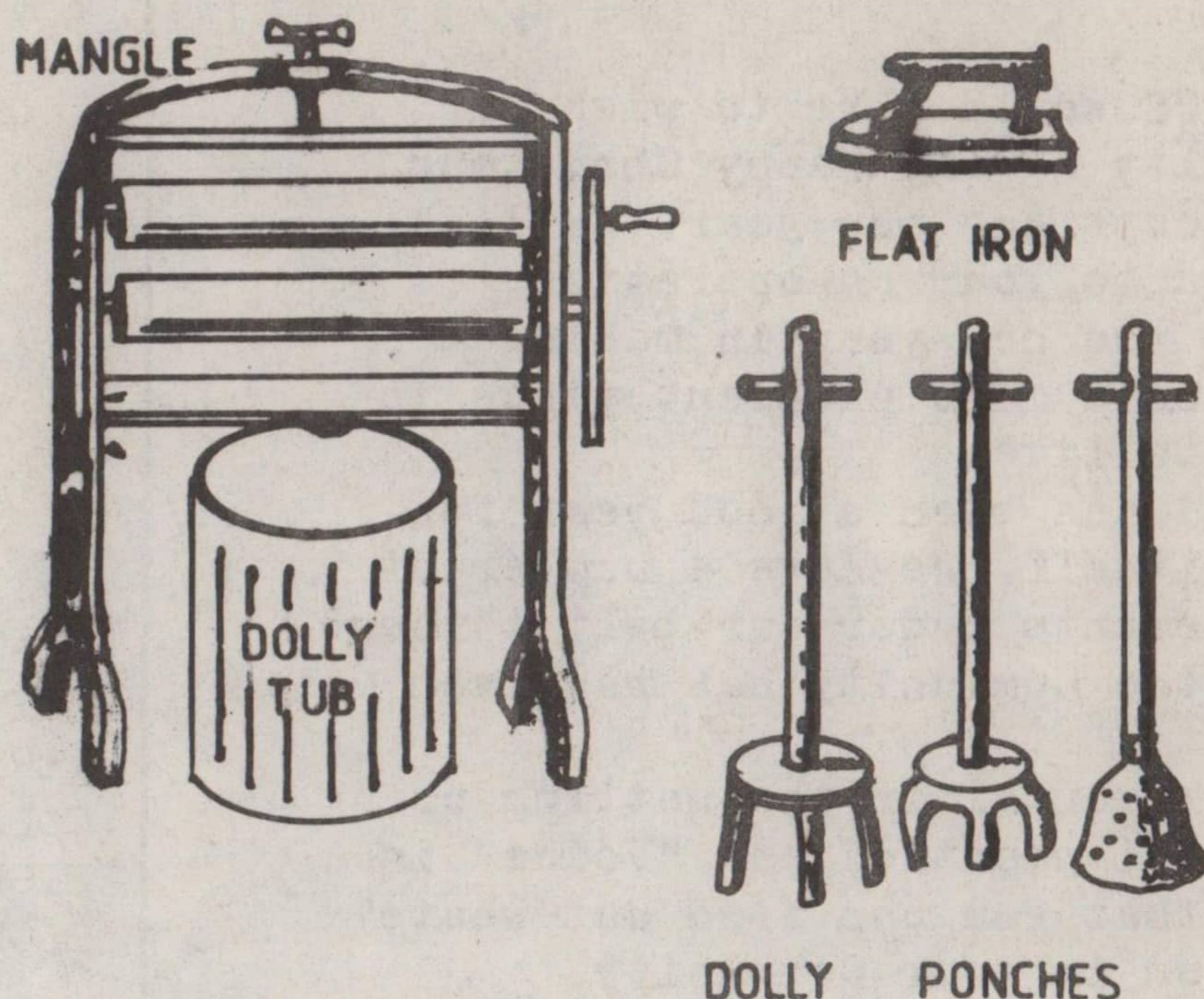
First, the scullery 'copper'- a deep iron basin holding about five gallons or so- was filled with water, and the fire below was started. When the water was boiling it was then transferred into a 'dolly' tub- a galvanized iron container, rather like a dustbin without the lid, with fluted sides. Into the water soap flakes were dropped and the wash followed as they dissolved.

The method of washing the clothes was slightly varied according to the implements for agitation which the housewife owned. If this was a 'dolly' (shown in the illustration), the agitation would be in a circular rotation similar to that in some washing machines; whereas with a 'ponch' the wash would be more or less pounded. Both 'dolly' and 'ponch' were about four feet long, rather similar in appearance and solidly constructed of wood, although some ponches were later made with a copper bowl at the bottom, which was perforated to allow water to pass through easily.

After the clothes had been thoroughly agitated they were wrung out by hand and then put through the 'mangle'- a very large and heavy wringer about five feet tall, with rollers about three feet long and seven inches or so in diameter. The dolly-tub underneath would then be used to catch the water as it was forced out of the wash by the rollers: many mangles would have a wheel at the top of the frame to push the rollers closer and consequently remove more water.

After mangling the clothes would be hung out on clothes lines to dry: If the weather was bad they would be draped over 'clothes-horses' in the kitchen around the fireplace to dry. Later the clothes would be ironed: if the housewife was lucky with the weather she might have the whole business completed by late afternoon,

but it was quite common for the ironing to be carried on into the evening. As flat irons were normally



used for this process, it would mean that the housewife would have two of these in use; one would be heating on the fireplace trivet-or on a gas ring- whilst the other was being used.

It is difficult to illustrate the tiring nature of washday in those days in such a short article as this, but perhaps the imaginative reader can get some idea from this outline.

Founded in 1979, the club aims to serve the community and forward the cause of the Royal Life Saving Society.

Its efficiency in this respect is reflected in the number of people it has given assistance to- 4 wind-surfers, 11 individuals in boats, 2 swimmers, 1 para-scender who's tow rope snapped, 1 puppy! 23 model boats were also rescued.

In 10 cases first-aid was provided. There were 3 cases in which individuals in difficulty were not wearing life-jackets in disregard of the notices which emphasise the necessity of taking such a precaution.

In its two years the club has entered local and national competitions and has emerged as winners in fourteen of these contests. The Chairman, Mr.D. Bennett, in his annual report for 1981, says that the club has had another successful year, but that is somewhat restricted by not having a building in which to store equipment and hold social events. More active members would also be welcome.

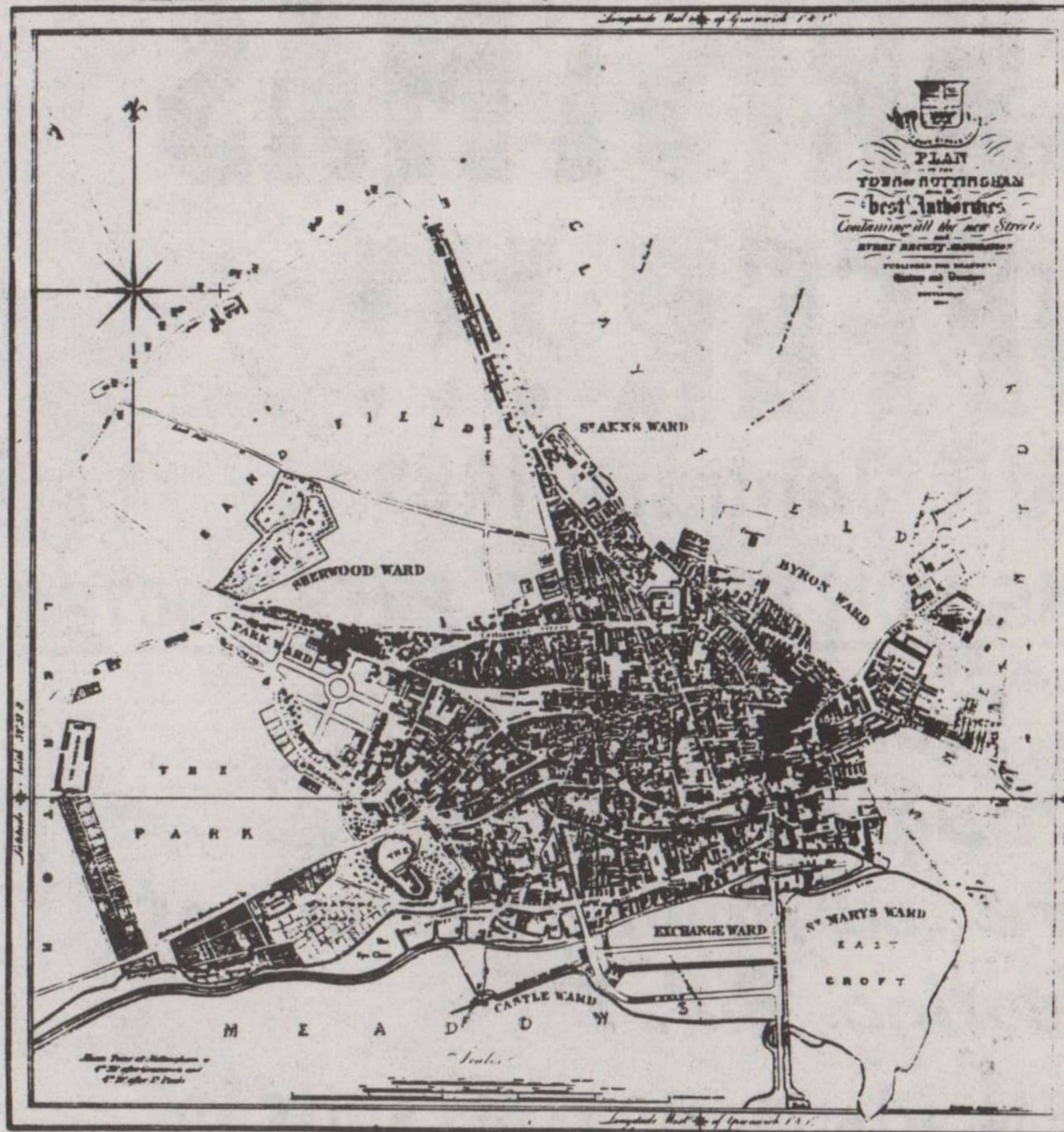
