
The drawings on the theme 'Spring' were done by the pupils of Greenwood Junior School





STONEBRIDGE CITY FARM

It was last summer that Stone-bridge City Farm had a report in the "Voice" so about time we reminded you all of our continued existence and the changes which have taken place since our last article.

Last Sunday on the farm seemed fairly typical for a day "down on the farm".

In the barn there were several rabbits with a litter of furry young, the goats as usual escaped from their paddocks and made straight for the food store, on the field was a lighted fire with local kids sitting in attendance!.

A few spades-and people dressed in their wellies-looked like they meant business.

So some things just the same but also a few changes. The main barn has had an extension which now houses the brightly painted farm van.

Also a new "Community" building had just been erected, as yet I don't suppose the end use for that has been finalized. It will depend to a great extent on what the local community demand of it.

So if you have any ideas please don't hestitate to go down and make your ideas known.

Some changes of staff also heve occured most recently Ken and John andAndy have left, but new people have been employed to replace these. One of these is only here for the next 6 weeks. as a temporary Y.O.P superviser. Since August 1979 the farm has endeavoured to run a Youth Oppertunity Programme (Y.O.P) scheme, but now that the major building programme is nearing completion, the local management committee of the farm have decided that they will have an experiment to see if the farm can be run by 3 adult workers only.



Obviously the aim is not for the 3 adults to run it on their own - but it is envisaged that they will be working with local volunt-eers, more essential to the project now that the YOP labour force has left the site. So if you fancy helping out in any way, then don't hesitate - pop down to the farm, your efforts are needed even more now.

By the time you read this the 2 new donkeys will just about be broken in - if you would like to help - gallop down quick and give a hand.

Remember Stonebridge City Farm is a local community project situated behind the Co-OP on Carlton Road - open 7 days a week for your kids to enjoy and help with some of the simple tasks -why not come along?

The End of the Road....



Colwick Road will be closed at site of bus stop sign

To provide a road connecting the city with the new loop road at Netherfield, avoiding the residential districts, the county council propose to carry out the following improvements:

-To close Colwick Road at the city approach to the old railway bridge and to demolish the bridge.

-To construct a roundabout at the junction of Daleside Road and Racecourse Road and to improve the roads.



View from Daleside Road towards railway bridge where new road is to be built.

-To construct a new road, replacing the old Colwick Road, which would extend from the junction of Racecourse Road and Daleside Road, passing behind the rear of the greyhound track and, crossing the site of the old railway bridge, continue along the disused rail-

way track on the north side of Colwick Road. This would rejoin existing roads at the junction of Mile End Road and Vale Road in Netherfield (see sketch on page 7).



Mile End Road new road will continue behind trees on right.

-To provide new means of access to Nottingham Racecourse, Colwick Park and the 'Starting Gate' public house.


AND MORE NEWS....

There may be, in 1986, a proposal for a new road, linking Manvers Street with Daleside Road, avoiding the level crossing on Meadow Lane and making necessary the provision of a road bridge over the existing railway tracks.

CND IN SNEINTON

The present Sneinton CND group began meeting about a year ago. We now have two meetings a month, one being of general interest, and the other for planning and organising activities — both meetings are open to anyone who is interested. Over the next few months we will be holding a series of meetings looking at the cruise missile, Britain's and France's nuclear arsenals, defending Britain without the bomb etc.

Our group is made up of people of all ages, both men and women. Contrary to 'popular' belief CND is neither anti-men or communist run. We are not affiliated to any particular party, some of our members are, not suprisingly, labour party members, many are not-there may well be some conservatives within the group.

CND opposes all weapons of mass destruction, particularly nuclear weapons, regardless of who owns them. China, India, Britain, France, America and the Soviet Union make no secret of their nuclear weapons. South Africa, Israel and

Pakistan all have the capability to build their own weapons; Egypt, Iran, Iraq and Libya are not far behind. Does this sound like a safe world to live in? Our present government has even voted against a freeze on the production of nuclear weapons and against a ban on testing them.

CND ultimately want worldwide nuclear disarmament; there are already enough weapons to destroy the world 20 times over. Obviously, this cannot be achieved overnight. We are not against multi-lateral disarmament but feel that it needs a good push to achieve anything. We believe that Britain can and should show the way by taking the first step unilaterally to slow down the arms race. This could be achieved by rejecting the American cruise missile which, in any case, adds nothing to our national security.

If you care about the future, you should do something about protecting it. Joining CND is one positive step you could take - voting labour is another!

CRUISE - WHAT IS IT?

The cruise missile is a new American nuclear weapon, 15 times more powerful than the bomb which devastated Hiroshima. It is so accurate, it can hit a target within 30 yards over a range of 1500 miles. It is designed to strike missile silos and can thus be fired first, to start a nuclear war in conjuction with other faster missiles, such as Pershing II.



The SS20 appeared after the decision was taken to develop cruise missiles. Their only similarity is that both can be launched from lorries. The SS20 is less accurate than cruise and is more effective attacking sea-ports and airfields than missile silos.

America plans to produce 5000 are within our reach - cruise missiles, but realising the we can make them work.

vulnerability of land-based weaoons, the vast majority will be installed on their own aircraft and submarines. which are much harder to destroy.

Permitting 164 land-based cruise missiles to come here will make us an obvious target; refusing them will not leave Britain defenceless and could give new impetus to disarmament talks.

THE RISING COST OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS

There are alternative ways of defending a democracy than by threatening to massacre millions of people. There are better ways of spending our money - on housing, on schools and on hospitals - which would improve our whole way of life.

DID YOU KNOW?

Each week each UK household, on average spends £16 on the milita-ry budget.

We spend 3 times as much on defence as on housing needs or education.

Each trident submarine to be purchased by the conservative government could provide 40 general hospitals.

One twelfth of the cost of trident would be 900 houses.


