

All about Fostering

Children need foster homes for many reasons. Sometimes their parents are ill or overwhelmed with problems; sometimes they have been neglected or illtreated or there has been a serious family; sometimes a child will come into care following an appearance in the juvenile court. Their length of stay in care can vary from just a few days or weeks, to years. The ages of children in care varies too - from very small children to teenagers and young adults. Most people think of fostering in terms of young children: they do not know about all the older children and teenagers in childrens' homes who desperately need a family. There is also a need for people to offer accommodation to young people leaving childrens' homes and foster homes between 16 and 18 years of age. The world can be a very frightening place to the boy or girl leaving care with no family to support him or her.


Some people are unaware that you can apply to foster if you are divorced, or a single parent. Many people are unemployed now and that does not stop them becoming foster parents. Some foster parents have big houses and gardens, some have flats; some have children at home and others have gorwn up children who live away from home, or no children at all. So there are no rules about who can become foster parents - it all depends on what people can offer to the children in care.

The Invisible Menace

Readers who saw a recent television documentary, which described the dissemination of
radioactive waste from Windscale
into the surrounding area, and
along the Scottish coast, may
feel that certain plans for our
own environment are equally disturbing. Planning permission has
been granted to Boots at Pinder
Street (off Manvers Street) to
build a new incinerator and 170
feet high chimney, which will
release radioactive particles
into the atmosphere.

St. Ann's, Sneinton and Colwick are directly threatened by this invisible menace. --This installation is the result of the companies experiments and radio-active isotopes on live animals which have to be destroyed afterwards. The corpses then have to be cremated in this plant. As the radioactive material cannot be removed by burning, it is released into the air. The prevailing winds in our area are South-Westerly by Westerly which means that, within a mile of the site there are 10 schools, 2 high-rise flats and a water supply reservoir which are at risk. In addition St. Ann's Hospital, 12 miles away is also in the path of the fallout.

We understand other interested bodies have been told that neither Boots or the City Council consider they should investigate the danger from the cumulative effects of radioactive fallout, on nearby populations. Their defence being that such investigations are the responsibility of the Dept. of Environment. We believe that the Dept. should be required to carry out such an investigation, before work is allowed to begin, of the effects of similar discharge in the past on the surrounding populations.

There is also the moral issue of allowing experiments on living creatures to continue at the present

rate - every 6 seconds an animal dies in British laboratories, for what are obviously totally unacceptable reasons. Until a Dept. of Environment enquiry is concluded, Boots should be required to stop all emissions!

We understand that several local groups have already made approaches to Boots and the City Council Planning Department regarding this installation and that co-ordinated action within our area is now likely.







Sneinton Registered Childminders

Each minder has a certificate to prove that she is capable and that the place where she minds is a safe and suitable place for a child to be. Each minder is allowed to look after three children under the age of five - this includes the minder's own children who are under five. We also look after the over-fives during the school holidays. If there is an emergency, or you have an appointment - even Christmas shopping - contact us and we may be able to assist you. The Sneinton group has just finished a course about work and play. We meet every fortnight to discuss useful topics and ask trained people along to some of our meetings - members of the Education Department, health visitors and social workers.

An officer from the County Hall visits the minder's home regularly to see how the child and minder are getting on with each other, and also to see how the child is developing, both physically and mentally. We are always pleased to see them because they are highly trained in child welfare, and are able to give us good advice.

We are all covered by insurance which includes damage of childrens articles, loss of pushchairs, etc. If anyone wishes to know more details they can contact me. or any other of the minders. We will be more than willing to help you.





Whilst doing the traffic survey to see what Sneinton thought of the Council's traffic scheme, TRACS (Tenants and Residents Association for the Community of Sneinton) spoke to many local people and picked up a lot of other problems. In particular, the tenants of Hoten, Beckford, Cosby and Radbourne Roads seemed very concerned about dampness in their houses. Consequently, TRACS did a survey of the four streets before Christmas, and found that 40% of the households interviewed had a dampness problem. The majority of these had reported this to the Housing Department but were not satisfied with the response, and so dampness continues to pose inconvenience and health problems. The other major complaint found was the absence of any heating upstairs.

TRACS will be meeting again with the tenants so that together we can take the issue up with the council, as it is felt that these problems deserve further attention.






