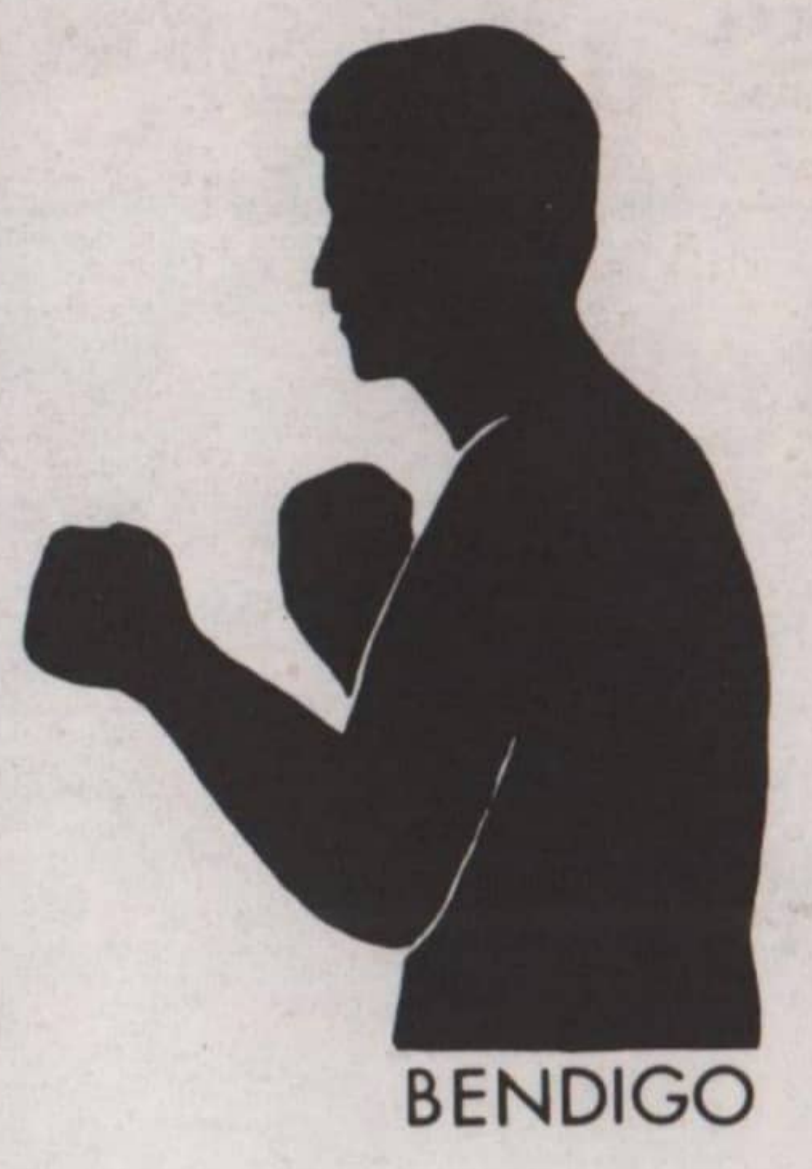

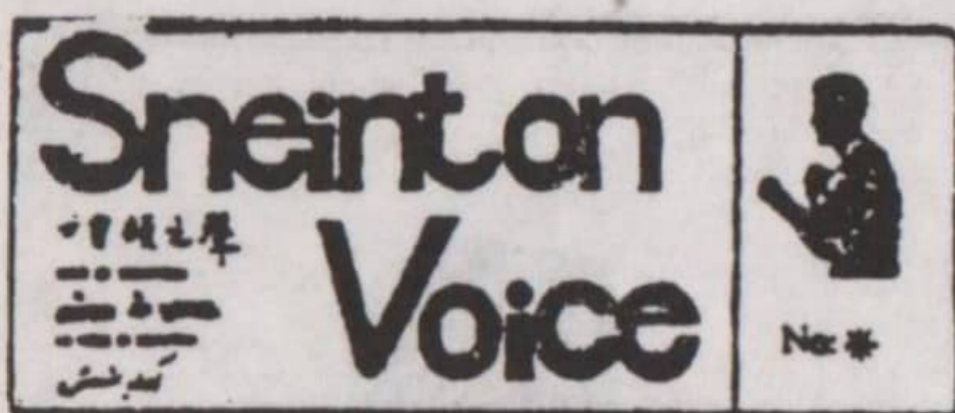

## Letters

Dear Editor,

The miners dispute is a strike that one way or another, whether you live in a pit village or here in Sneinton, will affect us all. It is not just about protecting miners' jobs and communities but about protecting our whole way of life. Coal is an essential part of our society. A thriving and efficient coal industry can guarantee Britain's future. We have enough reserves of coal to last several hundred years - reserves that will keep British industry going long after every drop of oil and every therm of gas has been taken from the North Sea. Only a strong and secure coal industry can free future generations from the terrible dangers of nuclear power, whilst maintaining Britain's independence from the ever changing world energy markets. The decisions for our future have to be taken now: a pit closed now is closed forever, abandoned pits cannot be re-opened.

This is why 15,000 miners are on strike in Nottinghamshire. They know that when efficient pits that are producing excellent coal are threatened with closure merely because some American labels them "uneconomic" that good sense has to be thrown out of the window. When peoples lives and the country's future are on sale to the highest bidder that something is desperately wrong. A fact that hardly needs pointing out in Sneinton, it is visible to all!

In Sneinton we have one of the highest unemployment rates in the country - 19.4% three years ago! We are experiencing what the miners are fighting against. If the decline of areas like Sneinton is ever to be halted and reversed, so are the Tory privatisation plans. This is why we must support the miners. The government's hope is that they can beat the miners by starving their wives and children. Striking miners themselves will not receive a penny from the DHSS,

their families (when they get it) are receiveing £15 a week less benefit, thanks to recent changes in the law. With some families 'living' on less than £5 a week, aid for miners families is essential. Sneinton Miners Support Group has been set up to provide just that. The striking miners' wives and children need food, money and support to continue their fight. We have already been to the pit village of Blidworth, where at least 80% are out on strike, with food and money, but more help is needed.

If you have any spare non-perishable food, then bring it along to one of the collection points listed below; or if you have more spare time than money or food (like me) then come along and give us your practical support.

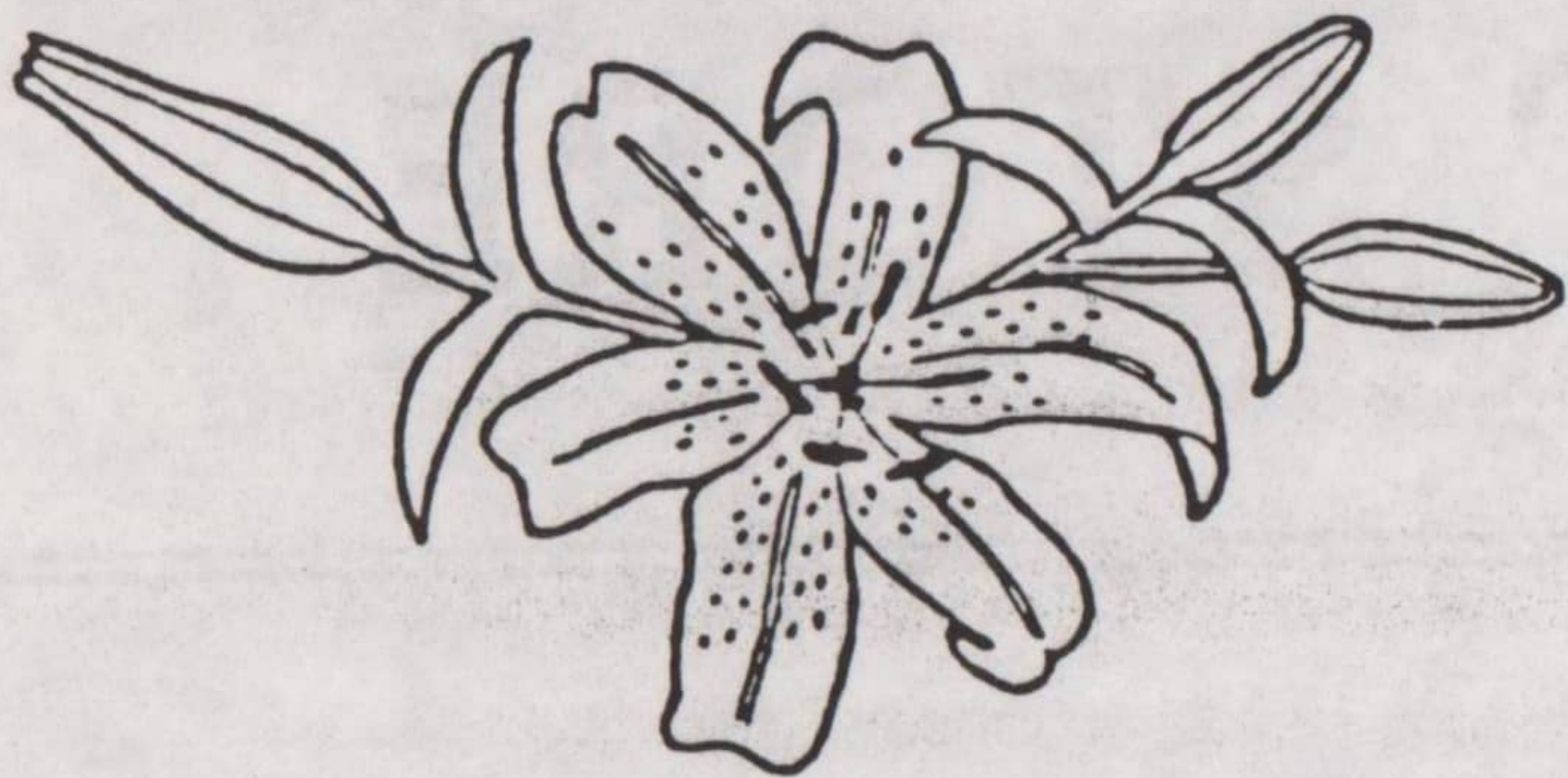

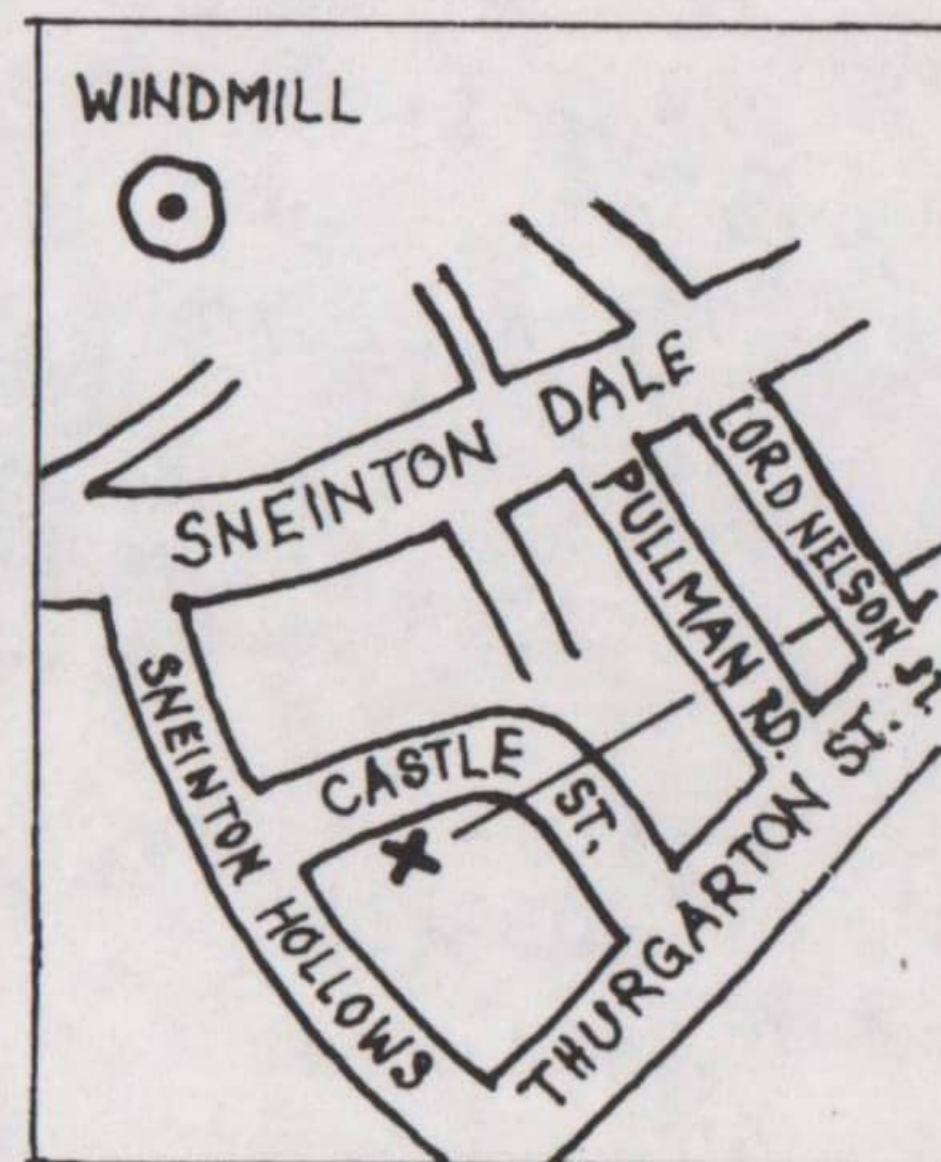
On May 13th we went to Cotgrave Rascals Gala, all our children even the four year olds completed a 2½ mile street march and came back with 7 medals after a field display.

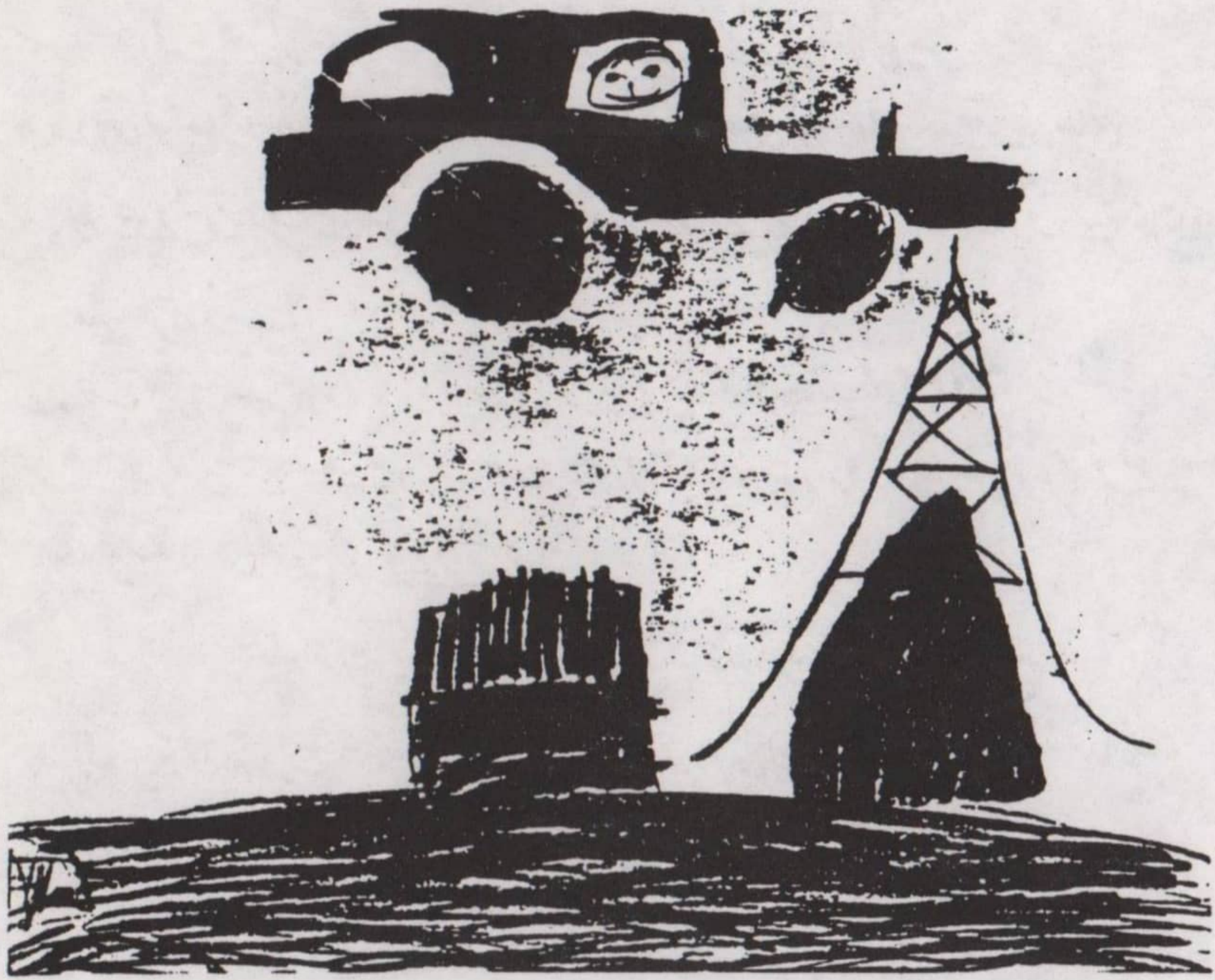

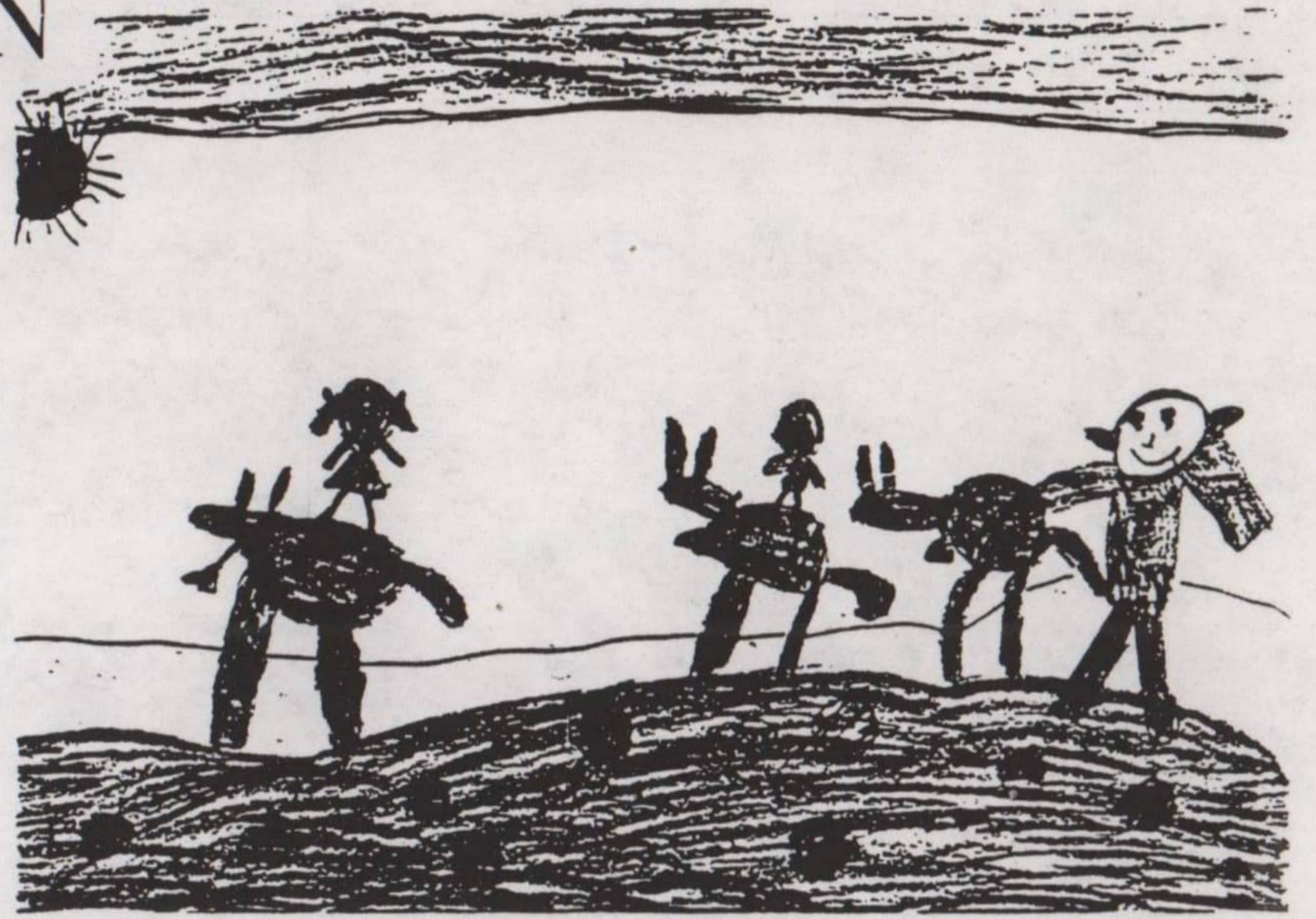

The pictures on the theme of 'SUMMER' were drawn by children of William Booth Infants School and chosen by Mrs. Zulekha Hussain of Rossington Road.

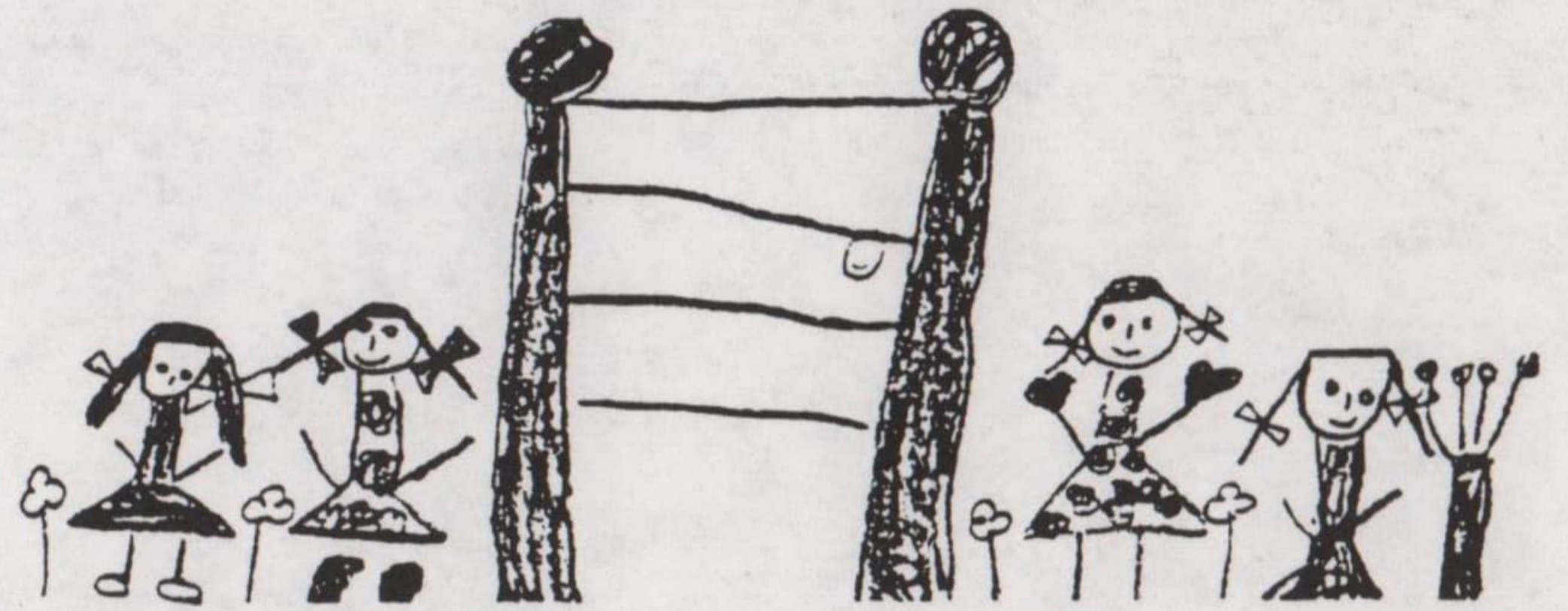

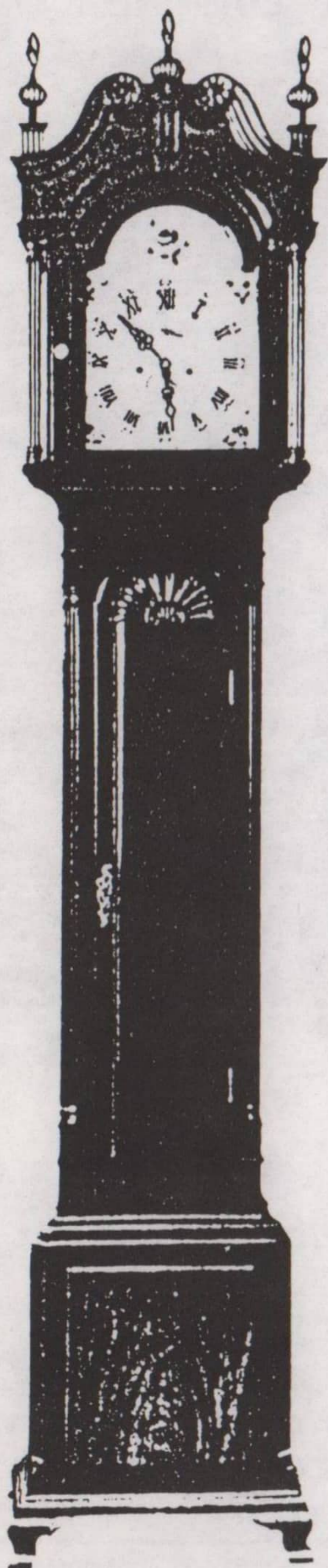

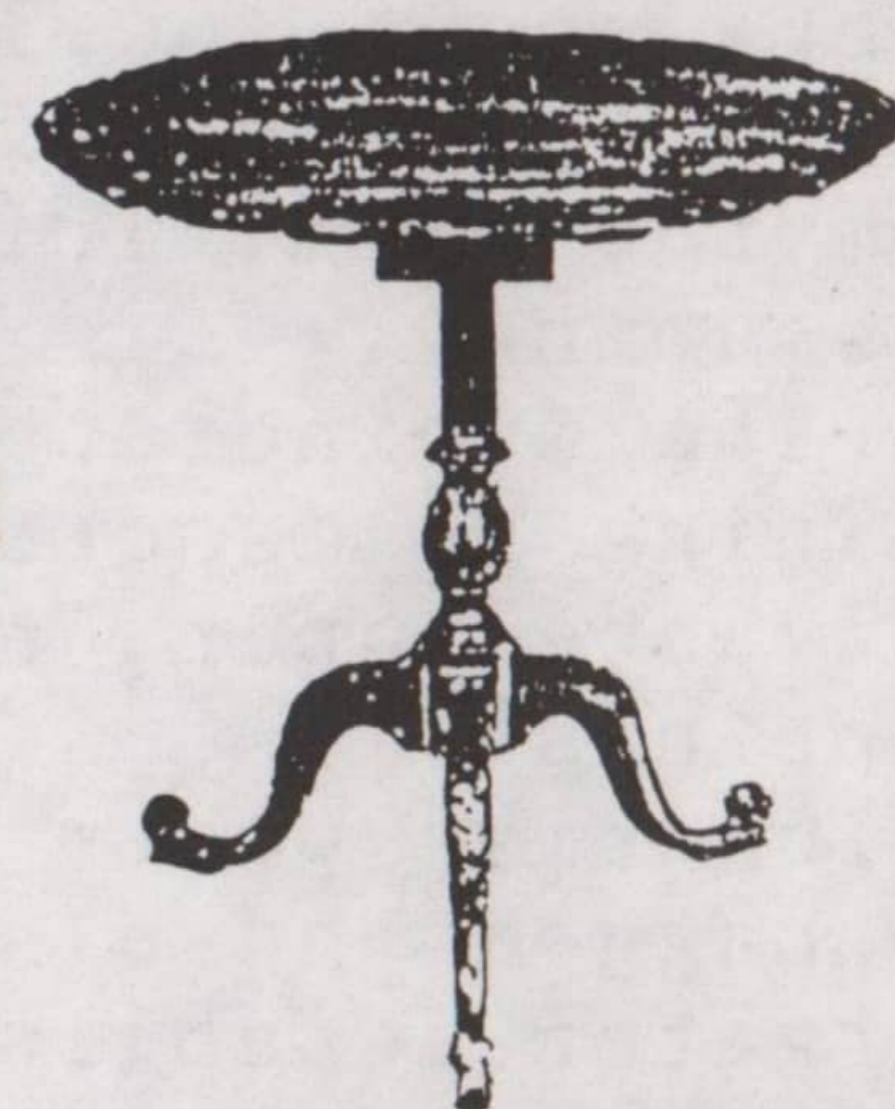

# Campaign for Information about Boots

On March 28th a meeting was held between three ASTMS union members from Boots Pennyfoot Street site and a joint body of Sneinton residents and workers.

As a result of the discussion the following facts emerged:

1. The new building in the Pinder Street/Pennyfoot Street site are upgraded versions of the old, and the experiments and substances used are the same as in current programmes.

2. The radio-active isotopes used are short lived and very low level (In view of current scientific doubts about low-level radiation, and the absence of specific details from the firm, information was not reassuring).

3. The incinerator in the Biology building is described as disposing of 'waste paper, animal bedding and droppings'.

Radioactive waste and animal corpses are bagged and disposed of at Boots Thurgaton establishment. (If the assurance as to 'short lived low-level radiation' quoted above is correct, why is it necessary to dispose of this material at Thurgaton instead of on site?)

4. The chemical factory on Pinder Street will eventually produce only Codeine and Insulin. The rest of the products manufactured there will be phased out over 5 years,

as they are too dangerous to be sited in inner city areas, and will be produced on a site in Northumberland.

(This admission would not have been made had not public indignation, over the April 1983 explosion, caused us to investigate Boots activities.

Since the 'Dangerous products' had been manufactured for some years on this inner city site, it throws some light on the firm's lack of concern for the local community).

The impression gained from the Union Reps' is that, there is nothing to worry about. Why then are Boots and the City Council reluctant to release all the facts? The truth is that representations from Sneinton CND, Trent and Manvers

Wards of the Labour Party and Friends of the Earth, as to what radioactive materials are used on the Pennyfoot Street site, their contaminant effect, and the logistics of transport and disposal practices, have remained unanswered since we wrote to the Planning Dept, in January. (Friends Of The Earth, in fact, began their enquiries last autumn).

We propose to continue our representations to Boots and City Planning Dept until satisfactory answers are received.

Finally, it is clear that an effective freedom of information act is needed. We support this, and urge other groups to join the campaign for such an act within their political or union groups.

# Sneinton at Work

The Second in a Series Of Articles  
by Graham Hall.

As one might expect in Nottingham the Textile industry is represented in Sneinton by several small firms. These include McGowan Textiles on Port Arthur Road, who were featured in the last edition of Sneinton Voice, and Tom Tarpey, on Sneinton Boulevard.



Tom - The expert at work.

Tom Tarpey Co. has been manufacturing clothing for twelve years. He began his company in the Lace Market but moved to Sneinton because of the convenience of the area and because he was fed up with high rates, poor parking and pigeons! (He claims because he was on the sixth floor it was all he ever saw).

Since his move back to the area 2½ years ago, where he was born and bred incidently, business could not have been better, especially with the opening of his discount shop, and he now employs fourteen local people, plus ten who work from home.

He enjoys working within the community of Sneinton where it is relatively easy to find labour and where access is easy, that was until

the new traffic scheme which he has to report has lost him business over the last few months.

The range of goods produced includes ladies and childrens night-dresses, T-shirts and housecoats, products that eventually turn up in Mail Order catalogues or British Home Stores, for example.

One draw back of Sneinton is the problem of expansion. As business grows he would like to increase the amount of floor space he could use, but at this factory it would be impossible to do this. This may become a problem in the future, but should he ever have to move he doubts it will be out of Sneinton, after all he may end up with the pigeons again!

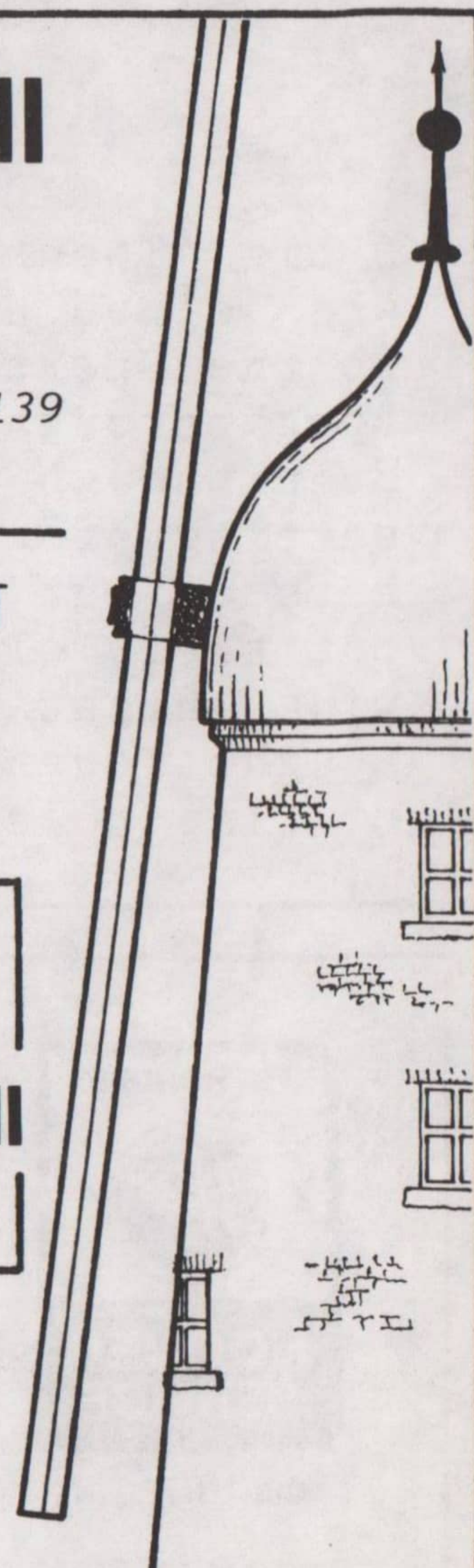

# EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC SCHEME

This scheme which embraces Meadow Lane and Hermitage Junction and side roads between Colwick Road and Sneinton Boulevard, has been kept under observation. Comments from readers have also been collected. The major findings have been as follows:

1. The Meadow Lane traffic lights allow traffic to proceed for only 8 seconds on average, causing traffic to back up to the level crossing.

2. Drivers frequently make U - turns after turning left beyond these lights, obstructing traffic proceeding towards Colwick Road from the city.

3. Many drivers travelling on Colwick Road, after leaving the level crossing by Racecourse Road, ignore the restriction signs and use the side roads as through roads to Sneinton Boulevard. This also happens occasionally amongst drivers travelling in the opposite direction. This presents a serious hazard to residents in these side roads, who are becoming accustomed to the lower traffic levels for which the restrictions were designed.

These facts have been brought to the notice of the Planning Dept' of the County Council.

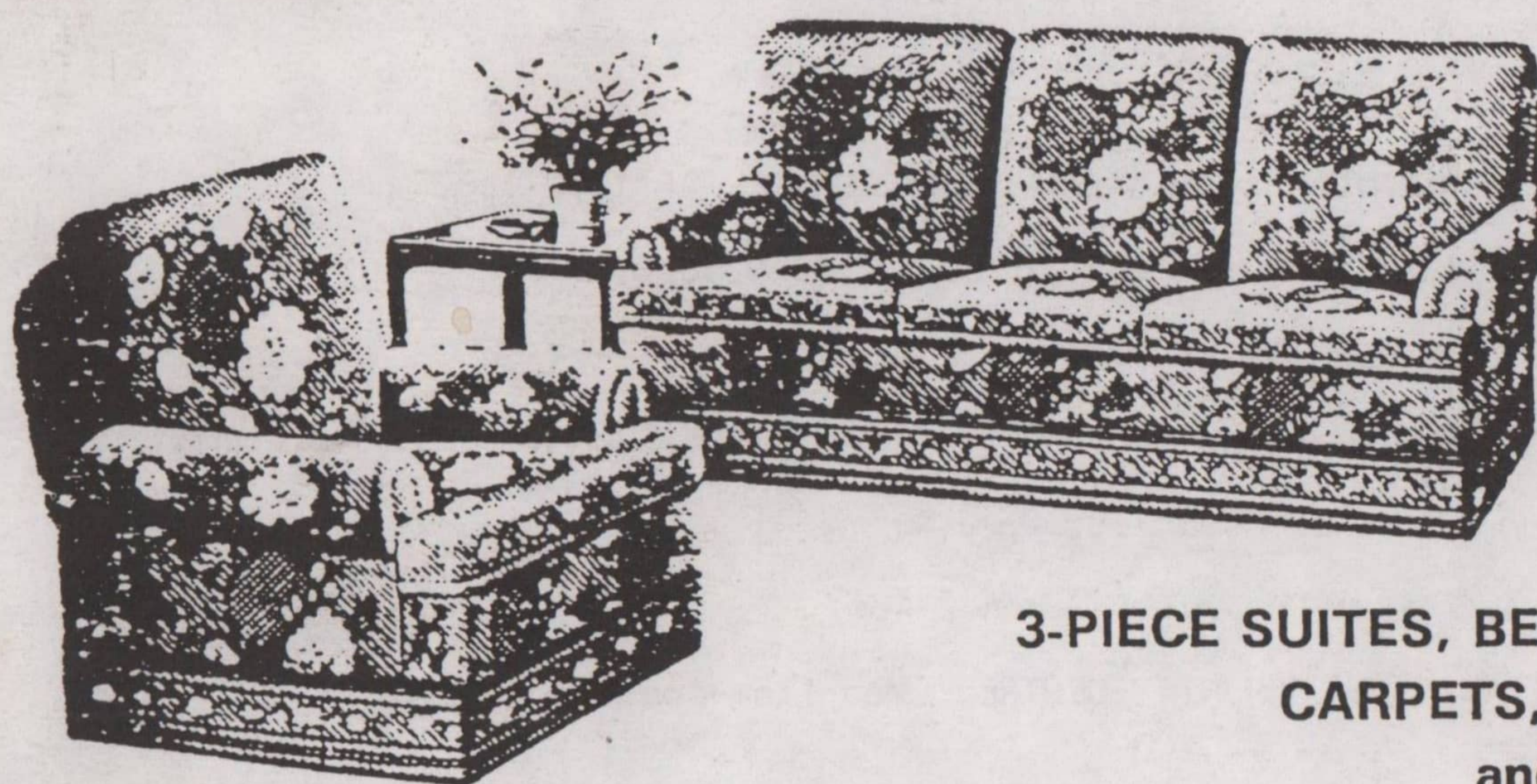
