
Jack Tars 1st.

Indications are that British Rail are likely to sell most of its land bordering on Sneinton. The release of the series of sidings and embankments, stretching from London Road to the racecourse, could have a major impact on the area.



Notts County Council have long had an interest in the land, due to a planned loop road which must pass through the area. Depending on the route that is finally decided for this road, a wide variety of new developments could take place.

New housing, industrial development, open ground including recreational facilities and the construction of a Sneinton railway station
are all possibilities. The vital
first stage in any decision about
the use of this land is the route
of the new road.

The County Council has plans for contructing the road along a series of disused railway embankments. The route would be from Manvers Street just touching Pownalls scrapyard, crossing Meadow Lane about 150 yards from Hermitage Square and then passing close to the Radbourne Road and Whittier Road areas to join an enormous traffic island in the area of the Parliament Street Meths sports ground. The route would seperate Sneinton from virtually all of the British rail land.

An alternative route has been put forward by the City Council. They suggest that Daleside Road could be used instead, and would be joined to Manvers Street by a shorter new section. This alternative would be slower for traffic. There would need to be new traffic lights at the Trent Lane/Daleside Road crossing, and either lights or roundabouts at both Magpies public house and the junction with Manvers Street. The alternative route however would allow additional land to be made available to Sneinton.

Which route is chosen will also affect the flow of traffic into Sneinton. It is ironic that the County Council plans (the "County route") show access via Meadow Lane, making the County Councils controversial road scheme at Hermitage Square redundant. The City Councils alternative (the "city route") would continue to allow traffic to enter Sneinton along Sneinton Hermitage.

Undoubtably the City route opens up greater alternatives for Sneinton. Industrial development could take place beyond the new road while the area between Sneinton and Daleside Road could be developed for housing and recreation. And possibly a railway station on Trent Lane.



One feature that both plans have in common is the traffic island complex at the eastern end of Daleside Road, which will be the junction between the loop road and another new road.

Work is due to begin in 1986 on the Sneinton Dale link, which will stretch north from the loop road, largely using the disused railway line. The route would pass between Colwick Woods Court and the Ginger Tom Public House. The current plan shows the height of this road to be level with the fifth floor as it passes Colwick Woods Court.

The traffic island complex will therefore also be at this level as will part of the loop road. Inevitably the whole complex will be something of a monstrosity, dwarfing neighbouring housing particularly if the county route is chosen.

TRACS is currently researching the situation, and trying to inform the Sneinton public. A survey is being conducted to find out what people think. We have, on the one hand the promise of new facilities in the area, and on the other the spectre of a fast road carrying heavy traffic, at rooftop level. We urge Sneinton residents to make their voice heard on this issue.



New Mental Health Centre

A new community mental health centre to help people who have been through a period of stress is being planned. It will be sited at the corner of Carlton Rd and St Mathias Rd, near the Co-op, and will serve people in Sneinton, St Anns and its surrounding areas. The project is part of an effort by Nottingham Health Authority to develop a community based service, As far as we know it is the first building of its kind in this country.

Following two public meetings in Sneinton and St Anns, a Link Group has been set up so that local residents can help plan the building and sort out the difficulties which inevitably arise with such a project.

Realising that not everyone was able to attend these meetings we want to tell you a little about the centre in this article.

The aim of the centre is to offer early, easily accessible treatment in pleasant surroundings as near to patients homes as possible.

The service will work closely with family doctors in the area, and we hope to make it the first point of contact for a person suffering from

depression, anxiety, agoraphobia, and other common forms of mental illness.

One person in four suffers from these sorts of problems at some time in their life.

The building itself will be two storeys high. The ground floor being for a Day Hospital, and the first floor for offices for Social Workers, Community Nurses and Doctors.

We hope the Centre will be used as widely as possible with evening activities, involving self help groups and other organisations, especially those concerned with the promotion of Mental Health.


Winners Gym would like to take this opportunity to congratulate the following club members on some marvellous achievements in 1984.




The Gym's martial arts and boxing section is now open and is available for hire on an hourly basis. We have leather, canvas and nylon punch bags, also speed balls.

R.B. When were you posted to the Centre and did you need any special qualifications?

I.S. In December 1983 and I did qualify from the University of Leicester in this field.

R.B. Under whose auspices does it run?

I.S. The Nottingham City Council.

R.B. Does it open every day?

I.S. Almost all day, seven days a week. There is a senior and junior youth club and a Disco and Dance night every 3rd Saturday of the month for members and guests. Private bookings are also welcome. R.B. Any other activities?

I.S. Yes, I have also started a

Save our Buses

"The people of Sneinton should oppose attempts to privatise our bus services" - This was the conclusion reached at a special meeting of local community groups called to discuss the proposals announced in the government's white paper.

The meeting agreed that bus privatisation will mean a drastic reduction in services with buses only running at peak times and on profitable routes. Pensioners and school children will lose their concessionary passes and safety standards will inevitably deteriorate. "I will do everything in my power to fight these proposals" said Roger Stenson, who has recently been selected as prospective County Council candidate by Trent Ward Labour Party.

It was decided to call a public meeting (like the one held recently at St Bernadettes School) to alert Sneinton people of the threat to their services. Experts on public transport will be invited to give their views, and local councillors will be given the opportunity to take part in a public debate.



U.F.O.'s

Founded in the 1960's, the Sneinton based Nottingham UFO Investigation Society (NUFOIS) investigates reports of UFO sightings not only from all parts of Nottingham and Nottinghamshire, but also from Derbyshire, where we have an affiliated group, parts of Lincolnshire and Leicestershire.

In the popular imagination UFO's, or flying saucers, as they are often called, are thought to be space craft populated by little green men, however, few serious students of ufology, as the study of UFOs is called, accept this idea, popularly called the extra-terrestrial hypothesis, and none of the hundreds of UFO sightings investigated by NUFOIS since its foundation lends support to it. We have discovered that the vast majority of UFO sightings relate to misunderstood but very mundane events, for NUFOIS has found reasons for the majority of sightings referred to it for investigation. Of course, some cases defy explanation, mostly because we cannot obtain essential data, but in a small number of sightings the particulars are so strange that no easy solution can be found so they remain not so much unidentified (flying object) as unidentifiable flying objects.

PERMISSION REFUSED

Members of TRACS and the residents of Greenwood who attended the City Council Planning Committee meeting on Dec 13th were delighted when the Committee refused planning permission for houses to be built on part of Jesse Boot playing fields. But its not all good news. 
