

All unsigned articles have been written by one or more people on the paper's Editorial Committee.


Letters







RENT RIP-OFF

If you've ever tried to find rented accommodation you'll know how scarce it is. If you were also unemployed at the time you'll know that it's almost impossible to find a landlord who'll take you.

As usual some people are out to exploit the situation and the main culprit has been an agency called Homelocators.

What the agency does is advertise accommodation in local papers to attract customers, but if you call in to ask about a flat, it has always "just gone", but you are told they have lots more. You are then asked to pay a fee of £30 for which your name and details will be put in a 'newspaper' which Homelocators print and circulate to landlords. No one knows how many copies of the paper are printed and there is never one available at the office for you to see. For your £30 your name is 'published' for three consecutive months. Almost no one ever finds accommodation by using Homelocators.

With the shortage of housing and the desperation of many unemployed people who cannot find landlords who'll accept them, more and more accommodation agencies are trying to take advantage of the situation. It's important to know that many of them won't do much to help you but may well demand a fee for their non-existent service. Although you can be charged by an agency after it has actually found you some accommodation, it is illegal for them to

- charge for registering your name or particulars

- charge for supplying addresses or details of accommodation
- publish details of accommodation without the landlords permission.

Luckily the Nottingham branch of Homelocators has closed down but some customers may have been left having paid a fee and not received any service.

If you've had problems with an accommodation agency, particularly Homelocators you can get advice from the Trading Standards Dept on Nottm 507910 or Shelter on Nottm 706662.




