


Dear Friends,

As your local County Councillor, I have been campaigning for the last two years to get the Sneinton Link Road abandoned in favour of the Manvers Street Link Road. I am very pleased therefore to tell you that after consultation with the City council, the conclusion has been reached that the best and cheapest route and also the safest will be the Manvers Street Link Road, which should go ahead some time in the late 1980's or early 1990's. Because the road line has now been changed I am also very pleased to tell you that the Police contact point will be staying until such time as a permanent Police Station can be sited in the area.

What is B.A.N.C.A.?

B.A.N.C.A. is the Bakersfield and Neighbourhood Community Association which is based at the Community Centre, 312 Sneinton Dale.

The Centre has been opened since March 1987 and has a worker who started at the end of 1987.

Various activities and groups meet at the Centre, including; Parents & Toddlers Group; After School Club; Over 60's Group; Welfare Rights Sessions and Karate Club.







Benefit Cuts

Since the changes in social benefits and the new rules have come into force, my Advice Surgeries are inundated with people who are desperate for help. These people are from across the community of Sneinton; the elderly who have now lost up to £10 from their housing benefit, putting more hardship on them, the unemployed, especially the single unemployed who now find it very difficult to claim benefits to keep their standard of living above the poverty line. Families whose children before the changes were able to claim single payments for extra items, i.e. clothing, also those on the old Family Income Supplement who could claim school meals and milk. Those changes are now in force and many people in the area are beginning to realise that those benefits are no longer available.

If the poll tax goes ahead as planned in 1990, all local councils will have to employ Registration Inspectors. Their job will be to track down all adults who are liable to pay the Tax. For this they will be given access to all kinds of confidential information.

According to the Government, Housing Department files, applications for Concessionary Bus Passes, even lists of people using local libraries or receiving Meals on Wheels should be available for details. We have had further discussions with Mr. Bonham of the Environmental Health Dept, on the fumes emanating from Wright and Dobson, Carlton Road. We have been informed that, as a result of the pilot scheme on one of the four Stentor machines, the modifications necessary to improve abatement performance have been incorporated in a second installation. This means that abatement equipment has now been fitted to two of the four Stentor machines. abatement equipment on all four Stentor machines by the summer of this year.

On the technical aspect, it seems that the abatement machinery - which removes, by filtration, the hydrocarbon particles which are causing the pollution - is also designed to conserve energy. In fact, the energy conservation is expected to be so efficient that it will offset the cost of installation to an appreciable extent.

With the Department of Energy having been involved in the design of the abatement machinery, the success of this project in our neighbourhood could lead to further orders for the Nottingham based firm which produces it, not only nationally but also from the continent.

Additional testing of the installations, involving long runs of fabric processing, will be necessary in order for the Environmental Health Dept to determine the efficiency of the abatement machinery.

Provided that the Department is satisfied with its performance, Wright and Dobson hope to complete installation of the We propose to continue monitoring the environmental pollution and, hopefully, be able to report in a forthcoming issue of the Voice on the successful termination of the problem.



A DIAMOND JUBILEE

As an interest for your readers I would like to tell you a little of our family history, which is also part of the local history of Sneinton.

These premises at 115 Colwick Road were first changed into a hairdressing business in 1908, and from then there were four occupiers until 1928, these being till 1914 Frederick Clarke, 1920 Samuel Ward, 1922 Francis W. Clark , 1925 John Henry Agnew.

My father William Thomas Henry Bush



was born in 1901 at 5 Harold Street, Sneinton and became a "Lather Boy" at the age of 12. He started his term of business at Colwick Road in 1928 and has continued, (apart from 3 years as a Fireman during the war) until his death in 1980. I came here to run the family business in February 1972 and my father took on semiretirement. So 1988 is our Diamond Jubilee year for the family hairdressing business.

But I have recently found out that there have been Bush's in hairdressing since 1883, this first one being a Mark Bush at 58 Manvers Street, (now the Bus Depot).

Two other Bush hairdressers that I did know about are John Henry Bush 63 Manvers Street (near the Crystal Palace Pub) and Arthur Leonard Bush at 98 Union Road; this latter Bush also had salons on Willoughby Street and Denman Street. From 1928 until approximately 1960 there were three Bush hairdressers in operation but I don't know if any of them were related to each other.

Does anyone know if they were related and would present family members please get in touch?

The Albion Church has been renovated by the Macedon Trust, and they now use the premises for the benefit of the community.



The upstairs has been retained as a place of quietness.


