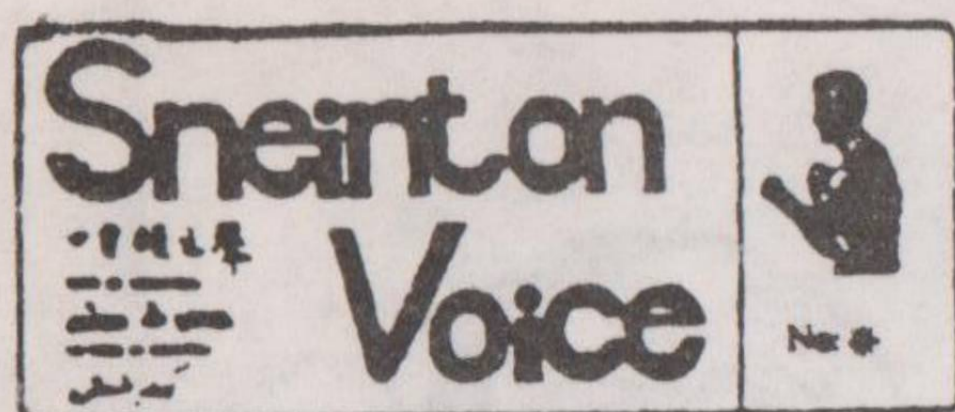

Two brief updates on stories covered in Voice No.34:

The Scottish Office has released official 'guesstimates' of the Poll Tax charges, which will begin in Scotland next April. In Orkney, the charge will be at least £84 per person. In Edinburgh it will be at least £313. Edinburgh District Council though, estimates that the tax will be at least £401 per person!

A flat in an area similar to Sneinton where 5 adults live, currently pays rates of £730 per year. Their Poll Tax bill will be at least £1,565 from April. If the higher figure is right, the bill will be £2,005. That is an increase of at least £835. The increase could be as high as £1,275.

We shall of course keep you fully informed of any further developments.

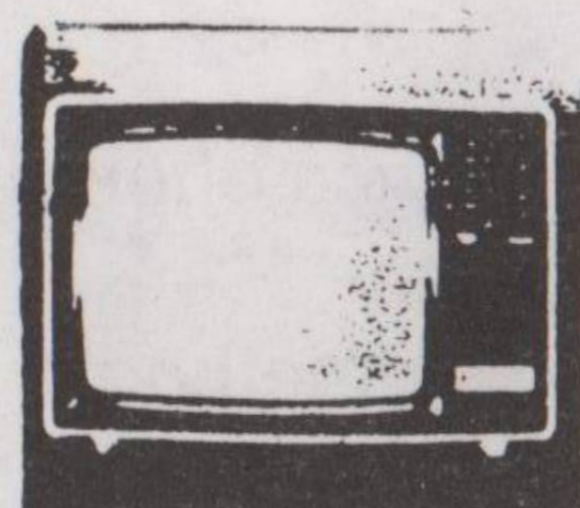

STONEBRIDGE CITY FARM WELCOMES YOU

Stonebridge City Farm is a community and education resource with a farming theme. It provides an opportunity for local people to learn about and become involved in various aspects of farming.

Ten years ago a local residents' committee established Stonebridge City Farm on an area of wasteland near their homes. A generous maintenance budget from Nottingham City Council and charitable donations have enabled the Farm to employ three full-time workers and develop the Farm to include a barn, an office block, a community room, an allotment garden, a farm garden (producing a full range of organically grown fruit and vegetables), a stock of farm animals and poultry, two paddocks and wildlife and conservation areas.

Since January 1986, five thousand three hundred young people have visited the Farm as part of organised tours. They came from schools, playgroups, colleges, adult training centres, family and community centres.

The Farms' objectives are to improve the service offered to the local community, promote environmental conservation and our awareness of it, employ methods of Earth Education (learning through discovery), raising money to enable development to continue and encouraging voluntary involvement.

The Stonebridge Road Farm supplies farm produce including eggs, vegetables, rabbit food, hay and straw,

The Farm is open to the public every day and is ideal for family visits.

The Farm also welcomes teenagers on Work Experience schemes; Community Service and Intermediate Treatment placements (alternatives to custody) come here too.

There is a wide range of opportunities for volunteers in the following areas: management, basic animal husbandry, basic gardening, health safety and hygiene, painting, communication, playwork, fundraising and publicity.

WATER DOWN THE DRAIN

What does the planned privatisation of the Water Authorities mean to the average person?

It means that an essential service, which should be provided to all at cost will be required to make a profit for shareholders. Meters will be fitted in homes, and people on low incomes, and pensioners, will try to avoid using water to try to keep their bills as low as possible - a potential threat to health and hygiene.

Privatisation can also spell disaster for our health. Substances in water are carefully monitored at present, and are removed when necessary. Water is free from bacterial contamination, and water-borne diseases are virtually non-existent. Will the responsible application of European directives on water quality continue when private profit is the main motive?

River pollution is already on the increase, since the Government has prevented the necessary investment for improving sewage works, and our crumbling sewerage system. Privatisation will make the problem worse. There is no profit in cleaning up the environment.

The water sell-off is a threat to our countryside. The Water Authorities own large areas of land in National Parks. In future, you may have to pay for access to parts of the Peak District, or some areas may be closed altogether, or sold to developers or farmers to make huge profits for shareholders.

The Water Industry belongs to us all, and public ownership is the only way to ensure a responsible approach to supply and disposal.

FOOTNOTE - ANOTHER SERVICE TRIMMED!

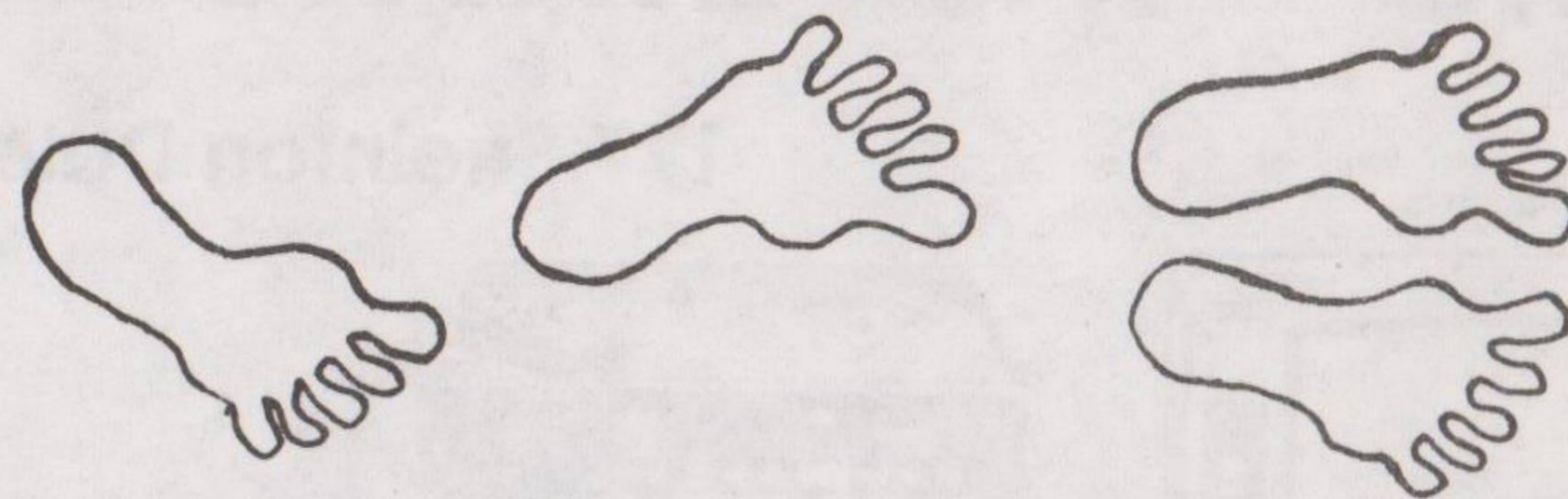

One of the least celebrated branches of the besieged National Health Service looks after the welfare of our feet - the Chiropody Service.

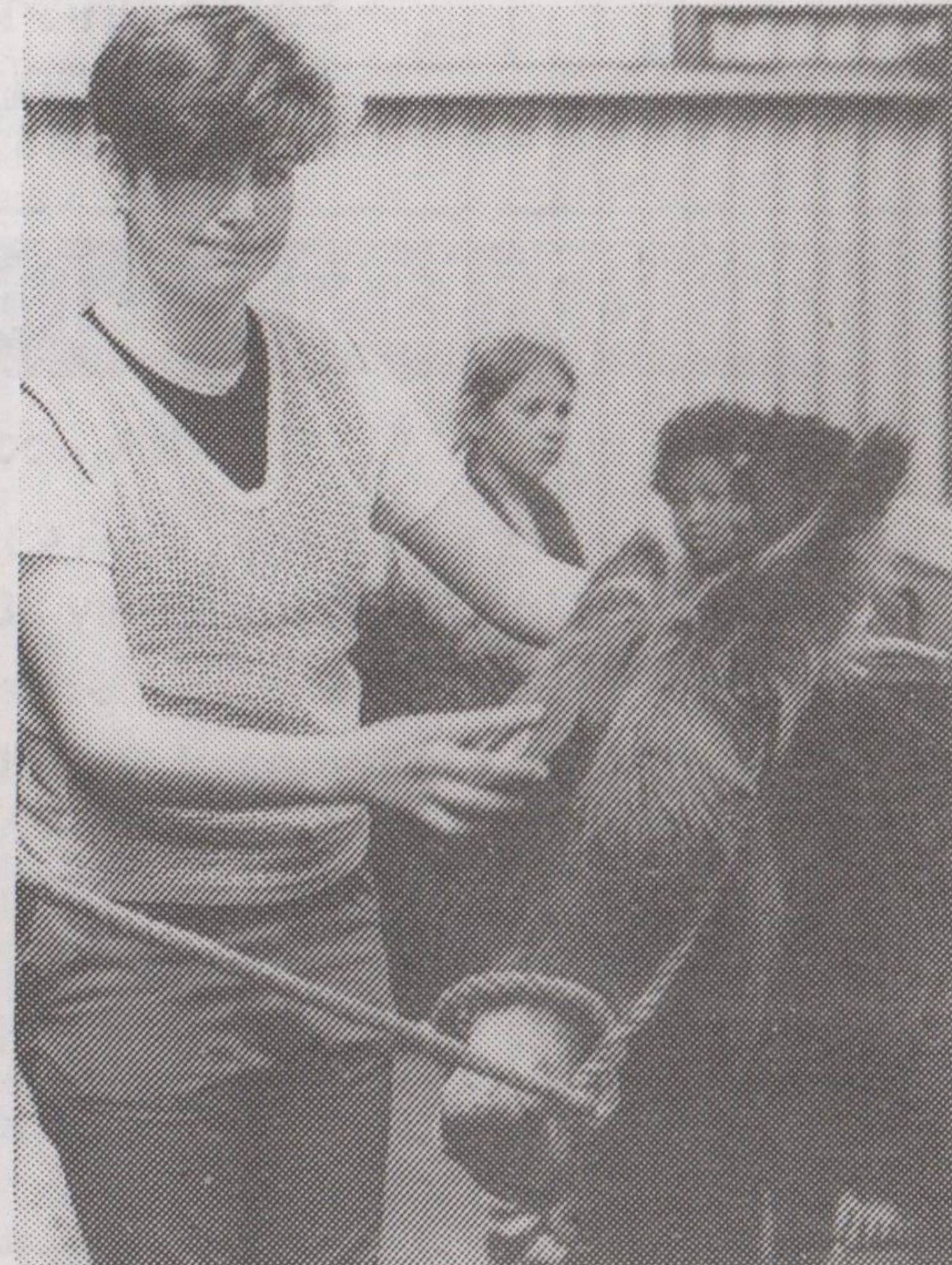
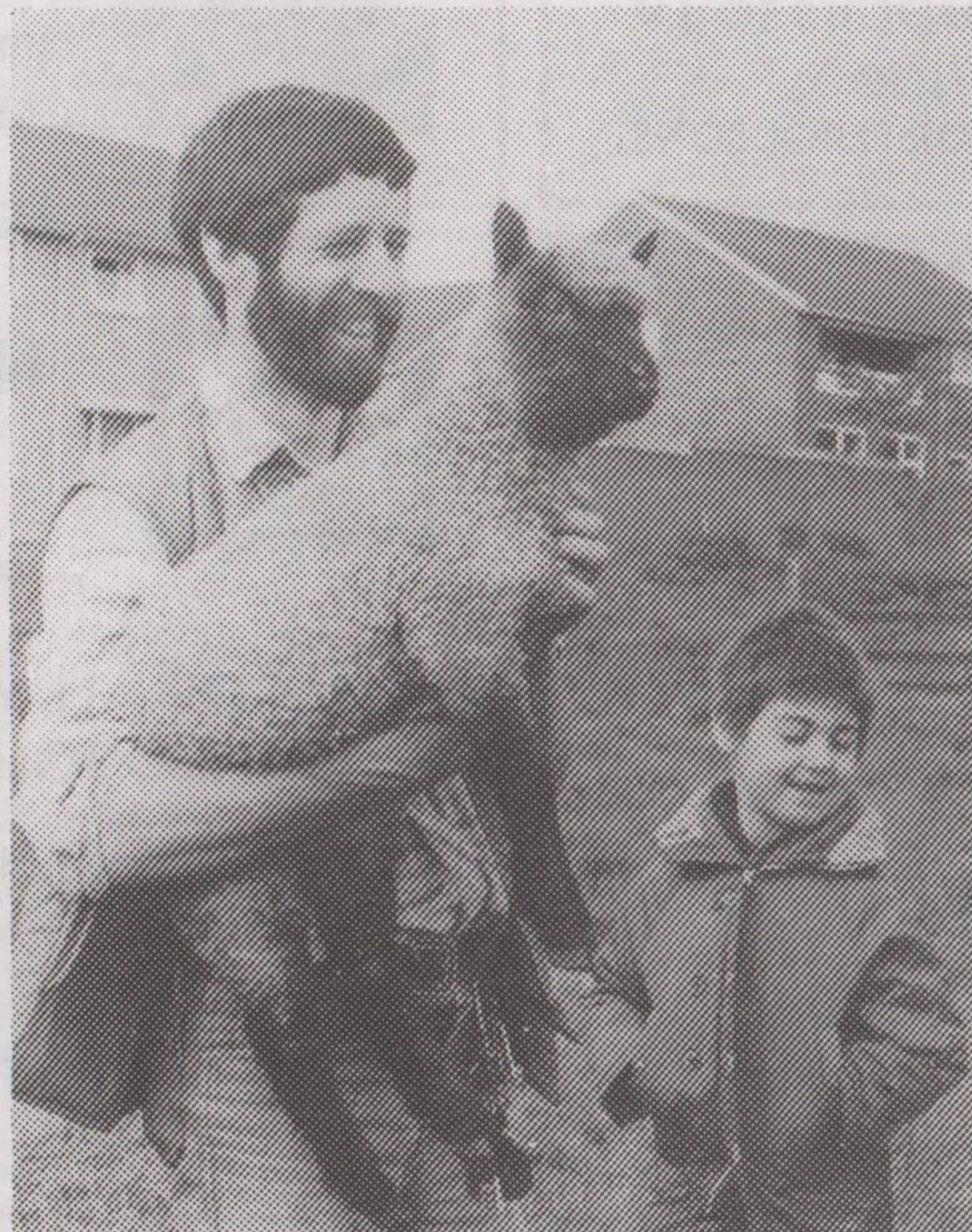
This month one of its' most important functions has come to an end.

Nottingham Health Authority has written to all of the users of the home visit service, mostly elderly and house-bound, to tell them that 'Because of a severe shortage of money and qualified staff' the home visits are suspended 'for an indefinite period'. The service continues in the various clinics, but the letter has nothing to say about how the elderly and house-bound are to get there, and even advises that appointments on a day most suitable to the patient cannot be guaranteed.
