Squatting is not a crime. It is one solution to the growing housing problems of those that only have the choice of overpriced rented accomadation or council bed and breakfast, it is the only solution for people who have been on council waiting lists for years without getting anywhere. There are 4,500 empty council property's in Hackney alone. While 500 people are kept in bed and breakfast, at a cost of £4 million a year. While council bureaucrats argue over statistics, homes are left empty.


We are normal people who demand a basic right, a roof over our heads. And if we are not given one then we have to take it ourselves. Just as servicemen did after both wars when the "Homes

fit for Heroes"were seen to be nothing but empty promises.

The council says it is aiding the homeless in Hackney, but mostly it's aiding homelessness. While the rich get built new luxury homes in the borough we get nothing. Yes there is a long waiting list for homes in Hackney, but there's more than enough empty flats and houses, but why are they still empty? We are not jumping the queue but showing we have the initiative for a little self help. Squatters are not a race apart, we are not junkies and dole scroungers as some papers would have you believe. We don't steal people's homes, the council do enough of that anyway. Rather than having empty places squatted they don't think twice about smashing up sinks, toilets etc. We would be willing to pay a fair rent but the council refuses to accept it. They lose up to £5 million a year because of this.

Squatting is a way of taking a bit of control of your own life, instead of passively waiting for a tommorow that never comes. It is a symptom of the lack of proper housing and not the cause. The only way to end the squatting "problem" is to provide decent homes for all, when nobody pays rent and homes are built for people's needs and not to profit the rich. With the decay of democracy and the inner cities decline under the present government, the only realistic way of achieving this type of socialism is by Direct Action, and not the vote.

To add insult to injury, those time-wasting wankers in the council are telling us that they're taking cuts too, yeah, fucking looff their allowance, and limiting the amount of pink gin they

can down it council meetings-how drastic can you get?
