Ideas raised during the reports from the groups included support for the canvass, community organisation, letter writing, local and national elections and the vital anti-cruise campaign.



The 1,300 delegates met in the City Hall Sheffield, on November 27th and 28th. Fully aware that 1983 should see the culmination of the first important stage of our present campaign - the prevention of the installation of Ground Launched Cruise Missiles, and the rejection of Trident. Our chances of sucess are so great that we cannot afford to ignore any reasonable tactic available to us. In preparation for the probable General Election and the installation of Cruise at Greenham Common expected in December 1983, we must now launch the most concentrated campaign of activity we have ever been involved in. The conference gave its support to a "Peace Canvass" - talking to people on the doorstep and in the workplace, building support - a lobby at Parliament on Cruise and Trident in Frebruary, Easter action at Glasgow, : ureenham Common and Aldermaston, a Festival for Peace on May 7th, the "Greenham Pledge"in which people undertake to participate for a day in a continuous mass picket for peace of Greenham Common, within the frame work of legal and normal political means of persuasion - and a mass rally in London on October 22nd - or a more suitable date depending on circumstances. Following the jailing of women arrested at Greenham Common earlier this year, conference agreed to give full support for the action planned for December 12th. In another resolution conference agreed that non-violent direct action and civil disobedience tactics should be seriously considered with respect to Cruise and Trident missile sites. National C.N. should suggest and co-ordinate such tactics as and when required by its members and will support appropriate action in pursuance of the movement's aims.

The following peopleagreed with the support of the meeting to represent the alliance:-Allan Day (regional executive) Alan Tucker (National council) Paul Wolfe (Shropshire Co-ordinater) Conference was very divided and narrowly passed a resolution that C.N.D. should campaign for British withdrawal from NATO nuclear alliance - the discussion being on the order of priorties and whether our first aim should be to establish European Nuclear Free Zones, so as to weaken the grup of both the NATU and Warsaw Fact military ailiances on the European nations.

Conference passed a resolution calling on branches and affiliatees to work for the setting up of U.N.D. work place branches and C.N.D. trade union groups and to campaign for action, including industrial action to achieve C.N.D. aims.


