1000 000 000 000 Signatures

Yes, a thousand million or a fifth of the world's population. That is the aim of the biggest petition ever, organised by the World Disarmament Campaign. The petition will be presented to the United Nations Special Session on Disarmament in 1982 to demonstrate the world-wide force of opinion.

The petition was publicly launched on 1st January 1981. In this country it will be collected by house-to-house visiting of the entire country. This will make sure that everyone has the opportunity to sign.
