Donnington fire -Community enquiry

The TANG - organised Community inquiry into public concern over the asbestos fall-out and army secrecy as a result of the Donnington fire unanimously passed a motioncalling for an independent public inquiry. About 45 people beard Alan Dalton, from London's ahour Farty Research Dept, review the general hazards of asbestos. Dr. Tony Walsh put the medical view, which was that the risk to those exposed to sbestos in this case was minimal, perhaps one death in 50,000 people in 20 - 40 years time. The meeting felt that the Army should take most if not all of the blame for causing public concern, Several people in fact said that the presence of asbestos was being talked of at the Depot during the day of the fire, despite army denials.

Only one councillor from the asbestos affected area attended (although two other councillors also attended) The point was made that no councillor had expressed concern on behalf of their constituents before this inquiry

was called.

It now appears that there are three other inquiries presently continuing into the fire. One is by the army, one by the Wrekin Council and one is unknown. No terms of reference have been given nor any confirmation of publication of findings, and all were only announced after the TANG inquiry. The S.D.P./Liberal Alliance have also been collecting names for the petition calling for a Public Inquiry.

Mr Hawksley has since appeared on T.V. and in print calling the inquiry a 'publicity stunt' by T.A.N.G. If he considers that taking the initiative in caring both for peoples' health and their fears is such a stunt then we should like to see him engage in a similar stunt. TANG also made the point that if the authorities could not cope with 'ordinary' toxic fire, then how could they cope with any possible radioactive leak from the publicly acknowledged radioactive material store at Donnington.

Donnington time-bomb?

Radioactive materials at Donnington

Quantities of radioactive material are being moved from C.O.D. Donnington, a garrison spokesman confirmed this week.

The statement was made after an eye witness report of vehicles displaying radio-active symbols travelling around the Newport area. A grey 10-ton truck escorted by two blue unmarked Range Rovers and two police cars was spotted travelling towards Eccleshall last week.

#### Training

A garrison spokesman confirmed that the base did store radioactive materials but solely for training purposes. At times these materials had to be moved across the country to other army establishments. "Whenever these are moved, they are moved in thorough regard for the safety of the public. It is so packaged it can withstand impact or fire.

"We are just one of most units that have sources of these insignificant yields. They hardly show up but it is enough for a soldier to be trained in the equipment he would take to war," he explained.

The spokesman added that these materials were moved under heavy guard but details of the quantity of radioactive substances stored at the ordnance depot is restricted by the Ministry of Defence.
