Caravan for Peace.


We have applied for a grant of £750 from national CND regional fund to buy a caravan for the use of the groups here in Shropshire. We will know if we have been successful early in October.

Do you remember the COD Donnington fire and asbestos fallout over north Telford? TANG held a community inquiry into this and had an asbestos expert from London

Now we hear that our expert, Alan Dalton, and his publishers have lost a libel action brought against them by a factory inspector doctor for a book called 'Asbestos - Killer Dust'. Although the damages awarded were small, the costs are in the tens of thousands.

This means that the publishers have had to cease trading, but a journal, called 'Hazards Bulletin' which has also had to cease, is being replaced by 'Hazards'.

This journal is essential reading for safety reps and people concerned with hazards. The former journal carried an extensive feature about the Telford fire.

A spectacular warehouse fire in north London in late August has turned out to be very similar to the COD Donnington fire. The roof was made of asbestos and debris from this was scattered over two London boroughs.

It took six days for anyone one to realise and confirm that it was asbestos, exactly the same time as at Donnington. So the dangers to adults and children alike are obvious.

Similarly, a huge clean-up operation with people in 'noddy suits' collecting the asbestos together was started. The shared exploration of our deepest fears and longings about our Earth has in it the seeds of a profound spiritual renewal. 
