... reap the Whirlwind

We said, when the Task Force was sent to the Falklands, when Britain refused the U.N. offers of mediation, & when the Belgrano was sunk, - as it now appears certain, in order to prevent a peaceful settlement; - that such behaviour further debased the currency of politics. That such immediate resort to violence would breed yet more violence.

The hideous face of war, & the ethics that go therewith, are always vile. It should be seen that the Falklands War & the bombing of the Grand Hotel are two sides of the same coin. In a climate of opinion in which sending the Task Force without attempt at settlement is acceptable; it is hardly surprising that a minority of Irish Republicans (fortunately a small minority) consider sending an action squad (to help retrieve what it holds to be occupied Ireland) as similarly acceptable.

It is also no accident that Thatcher's talk of the enemy within - when referring to the NUM - has been seen as an attempt to enlist the same sort of nationalist fervour that backed her over the Falklands against the Miners; & that Media reportage of the strike has been as one-sided as was its coverage of the War.

It goes without saying that CND, for the same moral & practical reasons as it had for condemning the Falklands War, condemns the bombing. We cannot speak for more than a minority of those who advocate peace education, but it goes without saying that such advocacy stems from a concern that children should not grow up thinking resort to arms is inevitable, sensible or moral.

The sick & perverse reasoning that led some speakers at the Tory Conference to try & pretend that advocacy of Peace Education was the "intellectual equivalent of the bombing"; when that bombing was in fact consistent with their own reasoning & their ethics, and not with ours, could well at some future point breed yet more war, & yet more bombings.

Reace Alliance gets Grant.

The Shropshire Peace Alliance has been granted £700 from the CND regional fund to buy a caravan.

Trident Referendum.
