



THE LARGEST CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE EVENT SINCE THE COMMITTEE OF 100 IN THE EARLY 60s is to take place on the weekend September 21st and 22nd this year. Eight hundred volunteers nationwide are called to openly and non-violently cut the perimeter fence of a nuclear weapons base and be arrested.

For this historic event, the Sculthorpe, Molesworth and other Snowball campaigns have combined to form a national Snowball, under the terms of which you may TAKE ACTION AT YOUR LOCAL BASE if you wish. Provided that you register with the national organisers and abide by the conditions of the Snowball, your arrest will be counted as one of the 800. Groups have formed for Sculthorpe, Molesworth, Burtonwood, Bawburgh, Lakenheath, Mildenhall, St. Margans, Brawdy, West Rayham, Faslane, Fairford and others are being formed.

The campaign which has so far resulted in hundreds of arrests is characterised by particularly honest and open relations with the police in the true spirit of non violence. Recently the authorities have been reluctant to oppose or arrest people who cut the fence, even repeatedly. However since arrest, rather than destruction as such is the purpose of the exercise, the action offers an interesting challenge in the practice of non - violent resistance and the development of its strategies. It may also appeal to Christians and those of other faiths who wish to find a way to express their religious values through active witness against the arms race.

America used nuclear weapons on Japan, the war ended, the world survived. If nuclear weapons are used again, the war will end, but so will our world.

Richard Nixon seems seriously to have considered first use of nuclear weapons against the Soviet Union, if the Soviets were to have become involved in the conflict with China over the India - Pakistan war. America bombs Russia, Russia bombs back, no time for negotiations, no time for settlements, the war is over, we die too.

Nuclear weapons have 'kept the peace for 40 years' due to'deterrence'. From what Mr Nixon says, despite this mythical 'deterrence', America was not openly deterred and would have been prepared to start a nuclear war. This willingness, apart from increasing the chance of deliberate nuclear war also greatly increases the chance of an accidentally started nuclear war. In times of detente computer failure does not lead to nuclear war. But in times of tension, If a soviet computer wrongly indicated that America had initiated a nuclear attack, how easy it would be for the Soviet Union to counter attack. The Soviet Union would be that much more likely to believe america had fired nuclear weapons if American declared nuclear policy included first use.

Nixon considered using A-weapons

MR RICHARD Nixon serioasly considered using nuclear weapons four times during his presidency as a means of ending conflicts, from Vietnam to the Middle East.

Mr Nixon's disclosure came in an interview in yesterday's edition of Time magazine commemorating 40 years of the atomic homh. The former president also describes how the late President Eisenhower used America's nuclear superiority to try to end the Korean war.

The newly-elected Nixon first brushed with using nuclear weapons soon after he took office, when he considered the options to end the Vietnam war.

"One of the options was the nuclear option, in other words massive escalation : either bombing the dykes, or the nuclear option ... I | rejected the nuclear option A

because the targets presented were not military targets," Mr Nixon said.

"Nobody was saying 'pave 'em over' the way our friend in the air force. General Curtis Lemay. would have suggested." Mr Nixon observed. But he said he did not see any targets in Vietnam which could not have heen handled in a conventional way.

The former president was also worried about the strategic ramifications of using the bomb. "I was convinced that it would destroy any chances of moving forward with the Soviets and China," both targets for US diplomacy which Mr Nixon had set himself for his first term. As it turned out, Mr Nixon opened up Peking to the US and put America on the road to detente.

The next time Mr Nixon considered using nuclear weapons was during the Your Kippur War of 1973, "when Brezhnev threatened to intervene unilaterally in the Middle East." he said. He said that he put American forces on a nuclear alert to show the Russians that the US would not stand by and allow Moscow to take a "predominant position" in the region.

On a third occasion, the possibility of using nuclear weapons was discussed in a strategy session with Dr Henry Kissinger during the conflicts along the Chinese-Russian border. Dr Kissinger reportedly told Nixon: "Can the US allow the Soviet Union to jump the Chinese?"

Nixon said that the US had to make it clear to the Russians that the US would not stand by if the Kremin used nuclear weapons along its border.

"Finally," Mr Nixon said, there was the 1971 India-Pakistan war.

"After Mrs Gaudhi com-

pleted the decimation of East Pakistan, we wanted to gobble up West Pakistan . . . The Chinese were climbing up the walls." The US was concerned that the US was night intervene to stop India.

"If they did step in, and the Soviets reacted, what would we do? There was no question what we would have done."

As vice-president. Mr Nixon was also party to the nuclear deliberations within the Eisenhower administration. At one point, according to Nixon, he considered using the bomb to break the staicmate in the Korean war.

"But he was concerned about using the bomb because it was another Asian country," after Hirochima On another occasion, Eisenhower was firm that he would use the nuclear deterrent if the Russians violated the four-power agreement in Berlin.

It seems ironic that in this week of mourning for the victims (and 'survivors') of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, I should be confronted with four field-guns on a traffic island in Donnington. Have you seen them ? Not since I was at Barrow - in - Furnace for last years CND march have I seen anything so blatantly threatening. It seems to me these weapons, displayed so proudly to the public, could be suitable targets of some sort of campaign. My question is, has Telford Anti - Nuclear Group initiated such a campaign at any time in the past ? Has anybody written to the press or members of Parliament or taken any form of action ? I really am horrified that these weapons are allowed to remain on display; I and others have been quite distressed by them. I would be grateful to hear from you about your own reactions to the guns and to my questions.









EIRENE, "AN UNAUTHORISED STRUCTURE"







STAR. WARS

On March 23rd 1983, President Reagan made a speech out lining his ideas on a space defence system using chemical lasers to destroy enemy missiles as they are launched. He called upon scientists & technicians from America & its allies to come together to research and develop the technology needed for such asproject. The speech met a cold reception in many countries, while in others such as Britain great enthusiasm was shown for the research (with its promise of fat contracts) but great caution was expressed to the idea of actual deployment. The history of the arms race has proven many times that once such projects are started they become almost impossible to stop and make deployment inevitable.

Reagans speech in 1983 may have seemed hopeful to many with talk of making nuclear weapons obsolete and thus eradicating the threat of nuclear war, an idea that must encompass the hopes and dreams of every human being. But is that really the case, will the Star Wars system answer our prayers will it eradicate the scourge of nuclear war or will it further destabilise an already shaky balance of terror & launch us into the final lap of the nuclear arms race ?



ACCEPTABLE DAMAGE

Since 1983 the idea of a total protective shield around the U.S has been quietly dropped & a similar defensive system for Europe Courtesy of the United States has never seriously been considered (due to the short flight time of Soviet missiles). It has now been acknowledged that in the event of an all out nuclear attack even with space defence systems in operation some nuclear missiles would reach their targets. No doubt the damage sustained by such a'limited attack' would be written off by military planners as being of 'acceptable damage ' (meaning the deaths of some 20 million U.S citizens.)

President Reagan presented Star Wars as a means of moving away from ' mutual Assured Destruction to Mutual Assured Survival's new and stable relationship in which each side could reliably defend itself against the missiles of the other.

Military Games

FROM SEPTEMBER 2-13, Mr Heseltine, Minister for Defence, will be singing the praises of the 65,000 troops taking part in the Home Defence exercise, 'Brave Defender'. During the exercise, regular troops, part-time territorials, and reservists will pretend to defend vital installations - ports, airfields and so on - against a supposed conventional attack from Soviet saboteurs called 'Spetsnaz'.

This 'Boy's Own' scenario is very different from the course a European war would take. Billions are spent on nuclear weapons, which would be used in any military conflict in Europe:

if nuclear or command bases in Britain were attacked the government could not rely on regular troops, but would be forced to use its nuclear weapons

* NATO and Britain refuse to adopt a policy of 'no first use' of nuclear weapons.

the growing hostility between the superpowers and the deployment of cruise and Pershing missiles has created a highly dangerous situation

Grave Defender

Leading researchers say that the 'Spetsnaz' are not the real threat to Britain. At best this exercise is a waste of time, at worst another deception to convince us that we are being protected.

In Britain, CND works for independent initiatives to end the nuclear arms race. We want Britain to take a lead by cancelling the Trident programme and returning cruise missiles to the US. Such unilateral steps are needed to remove nuclear targets from Britain, and to break the log-jam in nuclear arms talks between the superpowers.

'He (Sir Hartley Shawcross, U.K. Prosecutor at Nuremberg, 1945) dealt with the traditional German defence of Superior Orders, which the Charter excluded. It was no excuse for the common thief to say, "I stole because I was told to steal".... It made no difference that the defendants sought to rob nations and kill whole peoples.... There came a point where a man must refuse to answer his leader if he was also to answer to his conscience."

..... members of the armed forces are bound to obey lawful orders only, and they cannot escape liability if, in obedience to a command, they commit acts which both violate the unchallenged rules of warfare and outrage the general sentiment of humanity. — British Manual of Military Law, Ch 14, para 443

'War crimes were committed on a vast scale never before seen in the history of war. There can be no doubt that the majority of them arose from the Nazi conception of 'total war'... For in this conception of total war the moral ideas underlying the conventions which seek to make war more humane are no longer regarded as having force or validity. Rules, regulations, assurances and treaties all alike are of no moment; and so, freed from the restraining influence of International Law, the aggressive war is conducted by the Nazi leaders in the most barbaric way. Accordingly, War Crimes were committed when and wherever the Fuhrer and his close associates thought them to be advantageous. They were for the most part the result of cold and criminal calculation.

In reality the introduction of such a system will increase the risks of war and may even draw either of the superpowers into using its nuclear arsenals first, e.g In a crisis situation America could be tempted to launch a pre-emptive strike in fear of losing Star Wars as a result of Soviet counter actions. In

turn the Soviet leaders seeing their American counter parts under this temptation would in turn be tempted to pre-empt first & destroy Star Wars in the process. From a Soviet point of view the advent of what they see as potential first strike weapons such as Pershing II, Trident and Cruise the Star Wars defence system would be seen as an integral part of a United States first strike capability. By launching a nuclear attack on Soviet missile silos, command, control and communications centres (including the possible use of Star wars agains't enemy satellites) would already limit the retalitory response from Soviet nuclear forces, with the Star Wars any remaining retaliation would be further limited, thus increasing the survivability of a U.S second strike capability which could be used to blackmail the Soviet Union into surrender by threatening Soviet cities a scenario which frightens the USSR. So how would the Soviets respond? It could develop its own space defence system (indications are that laser weapons are already under development) but it is also possible that response could come in the way of developing countermeasures such as using small missiles to destroy land based lasers, by encasing missiles in materials capable of absorbing laser beams or reflecting them back, by patterning missile launches so to confuse or reduce the effectivness of such a system. It could also respond by deploying more missiles so to overwhelm space defences and ensure that a greater percentage get through. Furthermore such countermeasures are far more cheaper to install then the two trillion dollars needed for the consruction of Star Wars and would use technology already in existance. Whatever response the Soviets choose will mean a major escalation in the arms race and one which may act as the final push into the nuclear abyss. Moreover Star Wars poses a threat to the 1972 Anti - Ballistic Missile Treaty and could effectively wipe out any chance of constructive disarmament agreements in the coming Geneva talks.


America, in its defence against Communism, invested vast sums in military and other aid to Sudan. America withheld this aid, including food aid, at a time when many were starving, because it disapproved of President Nemieri's economic policies. President Nemieri's attempts to comply with Americas wishes led to riots and eventually to his overthrow. America was not worried at losing an ally. The starving would be a powerful lever to see that any new Government did not stray too far from the American line.

I was sickened at the way America only gave food to the starving for political advantage. Then I thought, but at least they do give food. Whereas our Government hasn't

given a penny more in Overseas Aid.

If Governments will only look on aid as investment for their own benifit, can we not persuade our Government that food for the starving is a investment? If the West really fears a Communist world take over, Surely healthy grateful populations in the Third World are a better defence against Communism then spending money on Trident or Cruise missiles, weapons which threaten the lives of every individual on this planet.





Do you realise that it would take 2 - 3 thousand women giving around 4 days a month to being at Greenham. To have

constant presence of hundreds of us there. This hasn't happened yet - it would be a new direction - a new aim.

Greenham Women everywhere pull together - you don't have to live there, give your other life up. (although at different times, different women have and will continue to do so.) Collectively we could blow the cobwebs away and weave a new web for ourselves and the world.

The Phoenix Camping Action is the beginning of this vision. If you feel you still have the energy to give (and giving means getting as well...) then come to the rebirth weekends - talk to other women about what we can do - where we go from here.

No - one is organising anything - its all gone past that -

we're all equal and all responsible - there are no doers and no supporters - we are all one.

You only have to do TWO things to help build the Phoenix Camping Action - come yourself - for 2 or3 or 4 days each month AND take the time to spread the message around... your own words, posters, letters, articles for magazines, leaflet, good thoughts and dreams.

If women don't take it up, feel part of it, spread the idea then it won't happen. This is not a guilt trip - no-one who has had enough need feel pressure-ized into going, the willing and interested women are there somewhere, they just need reaching.

Rise from the ashes of pain and confusion. We have a beautiful common and good access AND 4 years of Herstory to build on. Greenham women - past, present and future - lets go for it.

NUCLEAR JUDGMENT DAY, SEPTEMBER 30

September 30th, is nuclear judgment day. This date is the anniversary of the Nuremberg trial judgment, 1946, when leading Nazi war criminals were severely punished for breaking the laws of military restraint. The judges on that occasion were from Britain, France, the Soviet Union and the United States. They enforced the law against all forms of indiscriminate destruction. Yet the war crimes of their own countries went unpunished, especially city bombing. The result of that one - sided law inforcement was the illegal ' legitimization' of nuclear weaponry and the threats of mass destruction. All the leading institutions of our society, including the judiciary and the legal profession, have colluded with nuclear law - breaking just as the lawyers and judges of Nazi Germany colluded


with their Government.


