



Arms Talks Welcomed.

TANG welcomes the current superpower talks on the potential removal of the cruise and pershing nuclear weapons from Britain and western Europe, and the SS20 missiles from Eastern Europe and European Russia.

"It's one of the steps which we and many others have been campaigning for," a spokesperson said, "But we will believe it when it happens, especially following the specially guarded welcome given to the proposals by western Europeans."

It was in 1979 the western governments said that the cruise and pershing missiles were being introduced because of the Soviet's SS20's. If the Soviet's removed their missiles, the West said, there would be no need for cruise or pershing."

"We will soon see whether all governments involved are true to their words. Or will there be obstacles put in the way of even this small degree of disarmament? Each side may be trying to bluff the other, with perhaps even the Soviets being none to ready to agree despite them having put the recent proposals forward."

IS THIS FOR YOU?

TANG has some ambitious plans for the next few months. The help of many people will be needed to carry them out.

The task is twofold.

First, to deliver a carefully designed, illustrated leaflet through every door, area by area, within the Wrekin district. This leaflet will put the case against Trident in particular and nuclear weapons in general. It will be clear and concise. And not party political.

Second, to then call on as many residents as possible to ask their views on these nuclear matters using a very short questionnaire. Some residents may wish to request more information (which will be available to hand out or state there and then).

The overall purpose?

To challenge residents in the Wrekin to consider and perhaps review where they stand on nuclear issues. And to make the conclusions public.

Interested?

Deliverers will be needed. So will callers.


You can do either or both. In pairs if you wish.

Training in 'discussions with residents' will be available. You can do a few days or a few weeks.

We hope to have sufficient deliverers and callers to cover several areas simultaneously. Whatever way, a group of people can be put in touch with each other, then meet and 'do' an area together over a number of days and weeks. Mutual support is thereby provided.

The aim is to start the delivering and calling from Easter onwards for about 2-3 months (it will be suspended if a general election is announced).

With curious coincidental nature; the nuclear power authorities in Britain, France, the U.S.A., & the U.S.S.R. all state emphatically that accidents need only be feared as happening once in IO,000 years. We do not know how long Australia has had a nuclear reactor, but we are certain she has not had one for IO,000 years, so there is added reason for suspecting that the general safety level is somewhat less than the authorities calculate.

ISRAELI NUCLEAR EXPOSURE DETAINEE DENIED RIGHTS.

Mordechai Va'anunu, the Israeli nuclear technician who disclosed to the Sunday Times in September last year that Israel manufactures and stocks a large quantity of nuclear weapons has been denied his full rights as a detainee in Israeli prisions and has been on hunger strike since January 3. He demands full rights as a detainee- in particular, the right to receive visitors, which have been denied by prison. authorities when he disclosed to the world press the time the time and place of his hi-jacking by Israeli secret agents. MAY DAY weekend

May Day celebrations will this year be in three parts:

FRIDAY, MAY FIRST, Wrekin Trades Council & May Day Committee is organizing a concert at Oakengates

MONDAY, MAY FOURTH, the traditional May Day March, and subsequent speeches, (but this year not followed by entertainment,) will be in Wellington. Tam Dalyell M.P., will be one of the speakers.

MARCH FOR A NUCLEAR FREE BRITAIN

All nuclear technology is dangerous. No one has it under control. An accident in a nuclear reactor, a nuclear warhead convoy crashing on an icy road, nuclear war triggered by a faulty computer in a tense world.

A year ago fire leaped out of control at Chernobyl nuclear reactor—the accident they said could never happen. Radiation spread across the world, silent, invisible, spelling death. Modern nuclear weapons also rely on two things which can easily fail: high technology and human beings.

Chernobyl could mean 100,000 extra cancer deaths. Nuclear war could mean the end.

Since last April opposition has grown to the deadly twins, nuclear weapons and nuclear power. People near US bases used for bombing Libya are outraged at being used in someone else's war. People in villages where the Government wants to dump nuclear waste know it's not safe — not in their backyard, nor anywhere. People are angry because the Government is ignoring all the known dangers and planning six new nuclear reactors, including one at Sizewell. People throughout the country realise that a defence policy based on nuclear weapons puts us all at risk.

As support for a nuclear free Britain grows, our chance for change grows too. That's why — a year after Chernobyl — the Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament and Friends of the Earth are calling a demonstration. If you want peace, if you want to take your future into your hands, if you want Britain to be nuclear free — be there. You could make all the difference.

E.N.D. CONVENTION

The sixth annual convention for European Nuclear Disarmament will be held in Coventry from Wednesday I5th July to Sunday I9th July.

The convention is supported by a wide range of British organisations, including, the Campaign for nuclear diarmament (CND), European Nuclear Disarmament (END), the Bertrand Russell Peace Foundation, the National Steering Committee of Nuclear Free Zone Local Authorities, The Green Party, the Communist Party of Great Britain, Plaid Cymru and the Scottish National Party.


Over IOOO, activists, experts and major national and international speakers will discuss and debate the options facing Britain, Europe and the world. 'Prospects for a New Detente' to 'After Chernobyl' 'Human Rights and Detente' to 'Enemy Images in Popular Culture'; 'Europes Role in Third World Conflicts 'to 'British politics and Nuclear Disarmament', are a few of the subjects that will be discussed.

The previous five conventions have been seen as ways of building a dialogue between concerned citizens of both East and West. This year will be no exception. Invitations have gone out to a wide range of groups in Eastern Europe, including government sponsored Peace Committees, social movements such as Solidarity (Poland) and Charter 77 (Czchoslovakia), independent peace groups in many Eastern European Countries as well as churches, Trade Unions and Foreign Policy 'Think Tanks'.


Viewed with Concern
