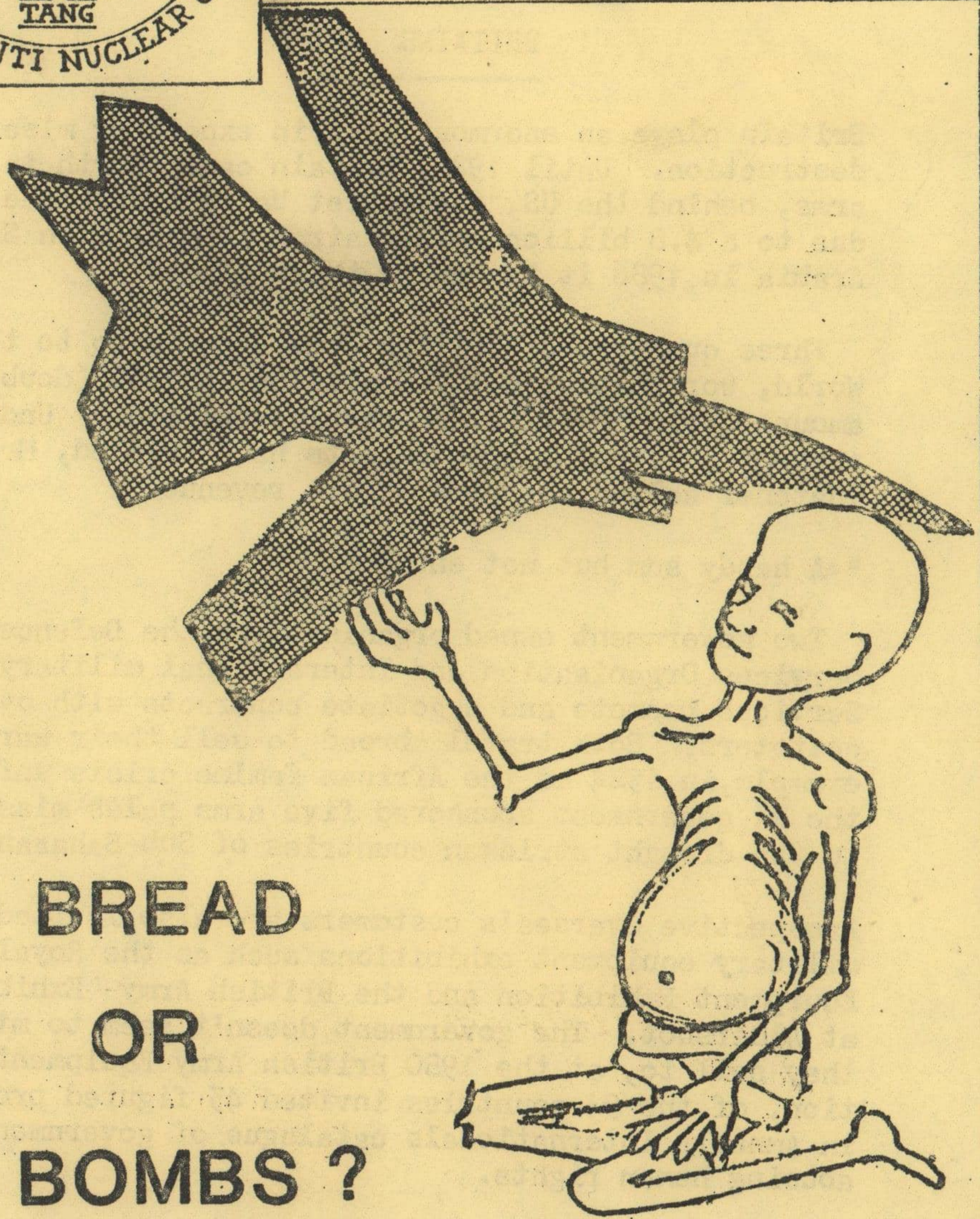

BRITAIN'S TRADE OF DEATH.

EVERYDAY 15,000 people die from hunger and 30,000 more from preventable diseases. Yet last year Third World governments were encouraged to buy 24 billion dollars worth of armaments. The vast amounts of money spent on weapons not only wastes resources and distorts economies but fuels wars across the globe.

BRITAIN'S ROLE

Britain plays an enormous part in exporting misery and destruction. Until 1985, Britain came fourth in exporting arms, behind the US, the Soviet Union and France. But due to a 4.8 billion dollar aircraft deal with Saudi Arabia in 1986 it is now in third place.

Three quarters of British arms exports go to the Third World, worth about £ 3,700 million in 1986 (double the amount given in official development aid.) Under the present government arms exports have tripled, Mrs Thatcher called the arms export revenue

" A handy sum but not enough"

Two government owned organisations, the Defence Exports Services Organisation and International military Services promote and negotiate contracts with overseas customers. Both travel abroad to sell their wares for example, in 1984 as the African famine crisis unfolded the UK government sponsored five arms sales missions into the drought stricken countries of Sub-Saharan Africa.

Prospective overseas customers are also invited to military equipment exhibitions such as the Royal Navy Equipment Exhibition and the British Army Exhibition at Aldershot. The government doesn't seem to mind who they sell to, at the 1980 British Army Equipment Exhibition, of the 94 countries invited 43 figured prominently in Amnesty International's catalogue of governments abusing human rights.

The government claims it has tight control on arms exports and to which countries it sells arms. The arms dealers (of which it is believed 300 operate in London alone) don't agree, they claim that for financial or political reasons the British government frequently turns a blind eye to arms exports that bend the rules or are illegal(1) This is illustrated by recent revelations of continued arms shipments to Iran and Iraq, (2) and allegations made by the Los Angeles Times that the British government agreed to CIA requests for Blowpipe anti-aircraft missiles from the government owned Shorts of Belfast for the Nicaraguan contra's.

Arms and other military hardware can also be tied into the aid programme, up to 60% of the aid we send is tied to the purchase of British goods and services. The Aid Trade Provision uses aid money to help British companies win orders in developing countries for projects not normally funded by the aid programme eg. In 1986 the Overseas Development Administration gave the Indian government £65 million worth of Westland helicopters. India wanted to use the money in other ways but were told that it was that or nothing. This counted as aid.

In 1984, the U.N. General Secretary Javier Perez de Cuellar said

"The arms Trade impoverishes the receiver and debases the supplier."

How long will Britain go on making profits out of misery and destruction?

Stop Star Wars at Fylingdales



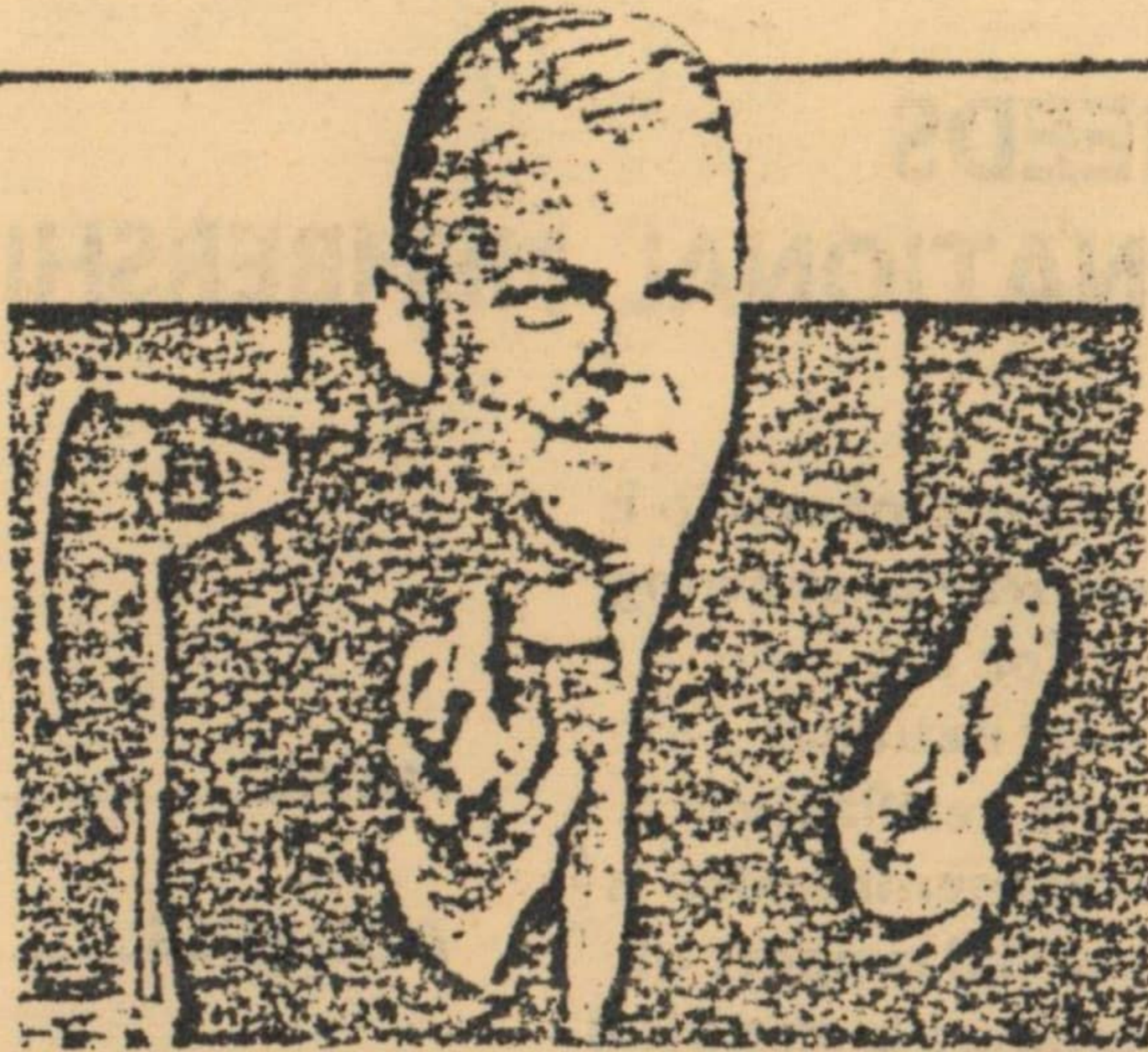
On American Independence Day, July 4th, the RAF base at Fylingdales will be non-violently blockaded from noon until 4 p.m. This base is an early warning station which is currently being fitted with phased array radar, at US expense - £200 million - but with different programming, would become part of a Battlefield Management System, linked to Reagan's Star Wars.

Everyone is welcome to come, whether to blockade or not. Please bring food, musical instruments and banners. The organisers will provide information, maps, legal support, creche, first aid and toilets.

They advise good preparation beforehand, and that people come in groups of blockaders and supporters. They can provide non-violence/NVDA workshop leaders/notes.

From June 12th-14th, there will be a three-day public information weekend in the local communities near the base. Houses will be leafleted on Star Wars, Fylingdales and the motivations behind the blockade. Vigils, street theatre, peace films, a musical evening and a peace picket will also be held.

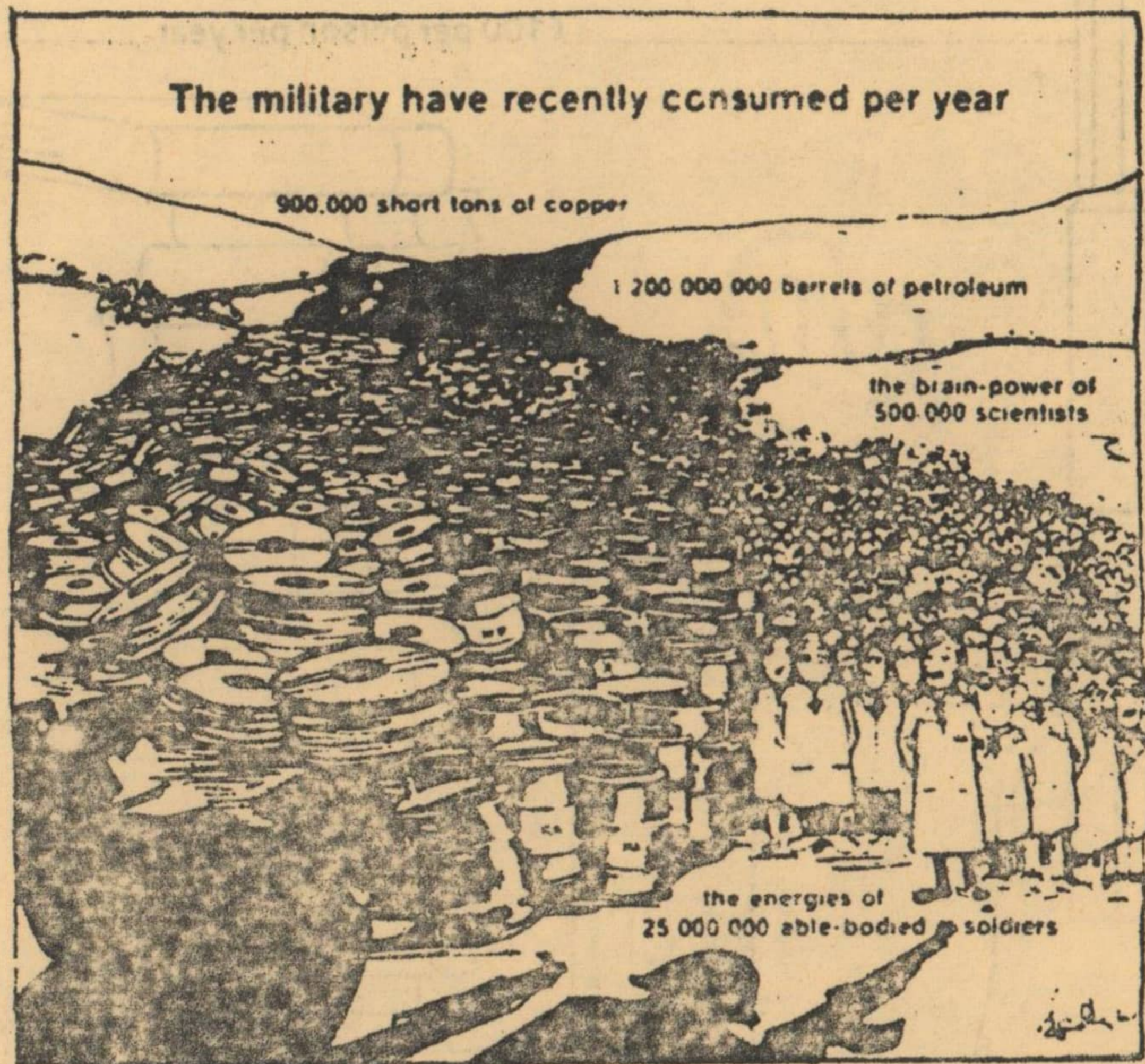

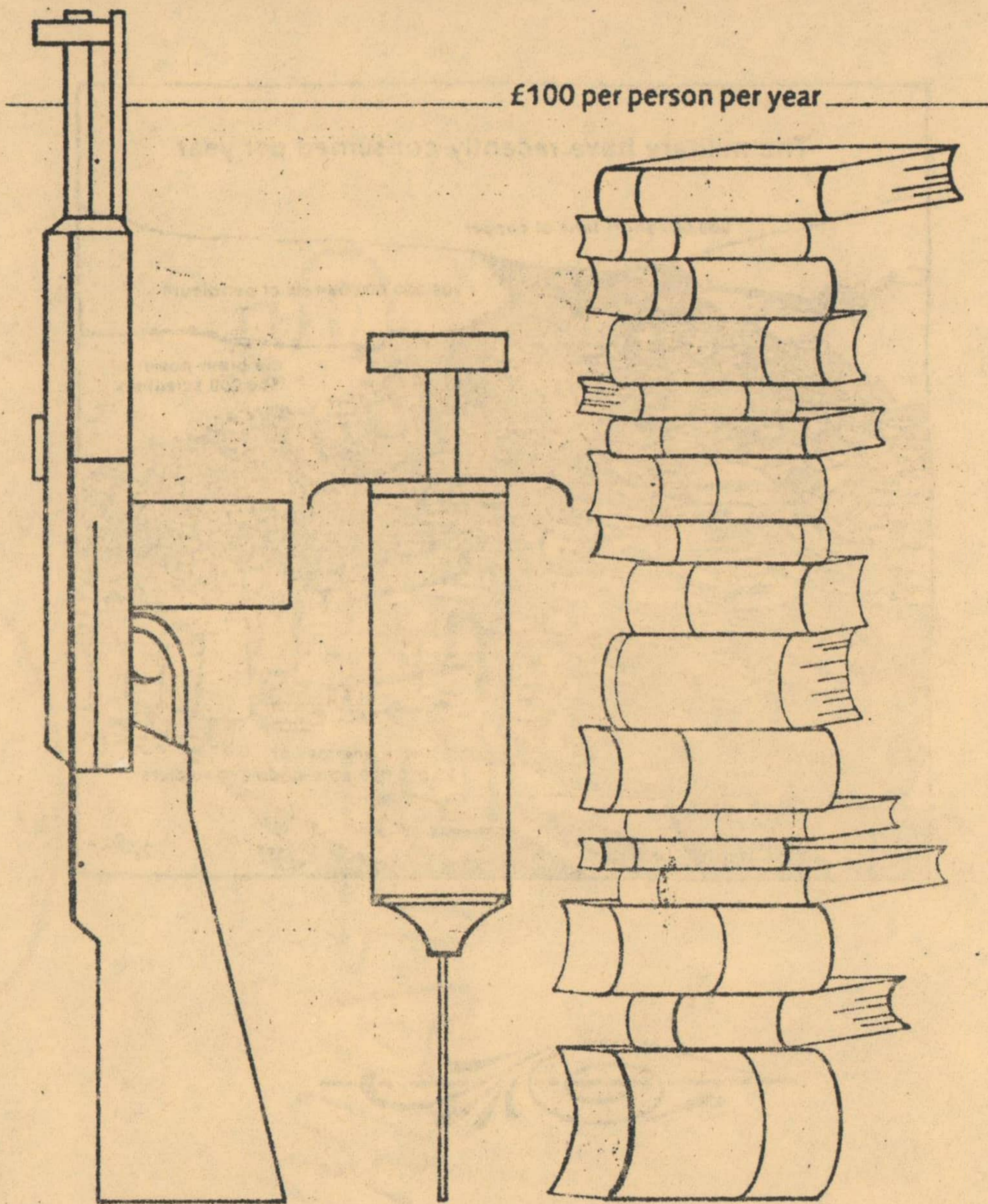

ANOTHER MILITARY COUP IN THE NAME OF DEMOCRACY;

Whether or not the coup on Fiji was CIA planned, and a letter in the Guardian (May 19th), from someone recently a Vanatu government employee, confirms suspicions in the matter, hardly matters.

What is certain is that a military force allegedly in place for the defence of democracy, has once again used its powers to abolish that democracy.

That while the reason for the coup may well be rivalry between the indigenous pacific islanders and the Indians imported in the years of imperial rule to do the work, the excuse is in large part the necessities of the Cold War.

Whether that excuse was advanced with the hope that the people would accept the coup designed to keep a small island state in the Western Alliance; whether it was in the hope that the U.S.A.'s financiers would look favourably on requests for money advanced by a regime stressing its opposition to neutrality; or whether the excuse was a reflection of CIA involvement hardly matters.

One way or the another Fiji demonstrates that the necessities of the Cold War are always more important than the ideologies to which the two blocks pay lip service. The West claims to stand for democracy, but sanctions Apartheid & scores of military regimes; while stalinists - claiming to stand for workers' rights - suppress Solidariosc etc.

The proximity of Fiji to states which have already joined the Pacific nuclear free zone, the pressures of protest against Pacific tests (of the article on Mururoa elsewhere in Chain Reaction) obviously exacerbates tension; but doesn't lessen the fact that this is just another aspect of the peace that nuclear weapons have not preserved.

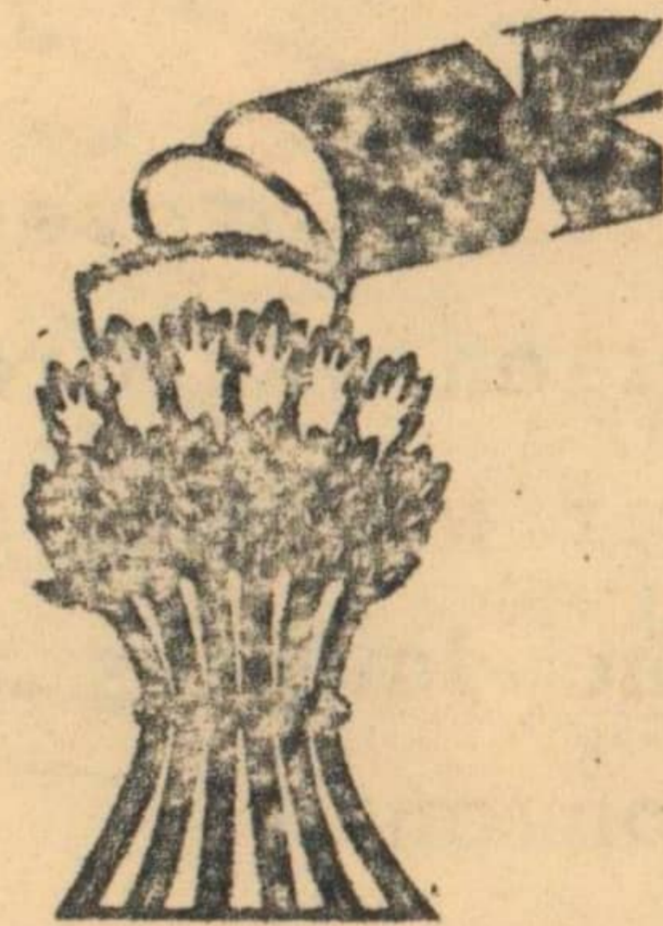

On November 29th last year TANG joined groups from all over the country in highlighting the nuclear convoy routes.

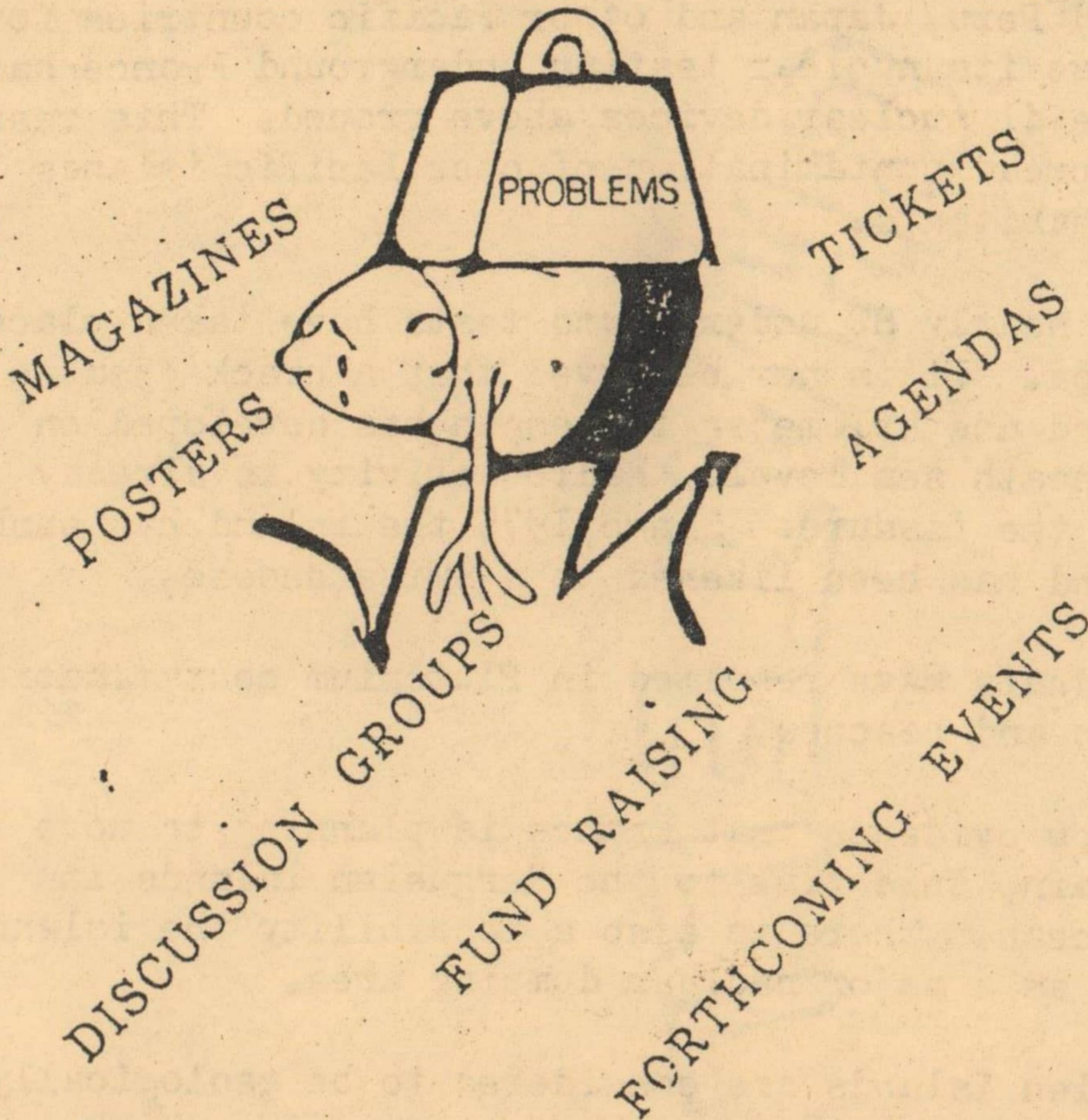
The action proved enormously successful, public attention was drawn to the existence of the nuclear warhead convoys, the routes they take and the dangers they pose to people and to the environment.

FRENCH TEST SITE MOVE

Since 1966 when France moved its nuclear test site from the Sahara to Mururoa atoll in the Pacific there have been over 100 nuclear test explosions.

Up until 1975 when pressure from Australia, Aotearoa (New Zealand) Peru, Japan and other Pacific countries forced France to move its nuclear testing underground France had exploded some 41 nuclear devices above ground. This resulted in widespread contamination of other Pacific islands and their inhabitants.

Since 1975 nearly 80 underground tests have taken place on the Mururoa. It is now believed that a crack 35cm to 50 cm wide and one kilometre in length has developed on the atoll beneath sea level. Radio-activity is already leaking from the fissure. Since 1975 the island has sunk 1.5 metres and has been likened to a Swiss cheese.

Other accidents have resulted in Plutonium contamination of the lagoon and beaches.

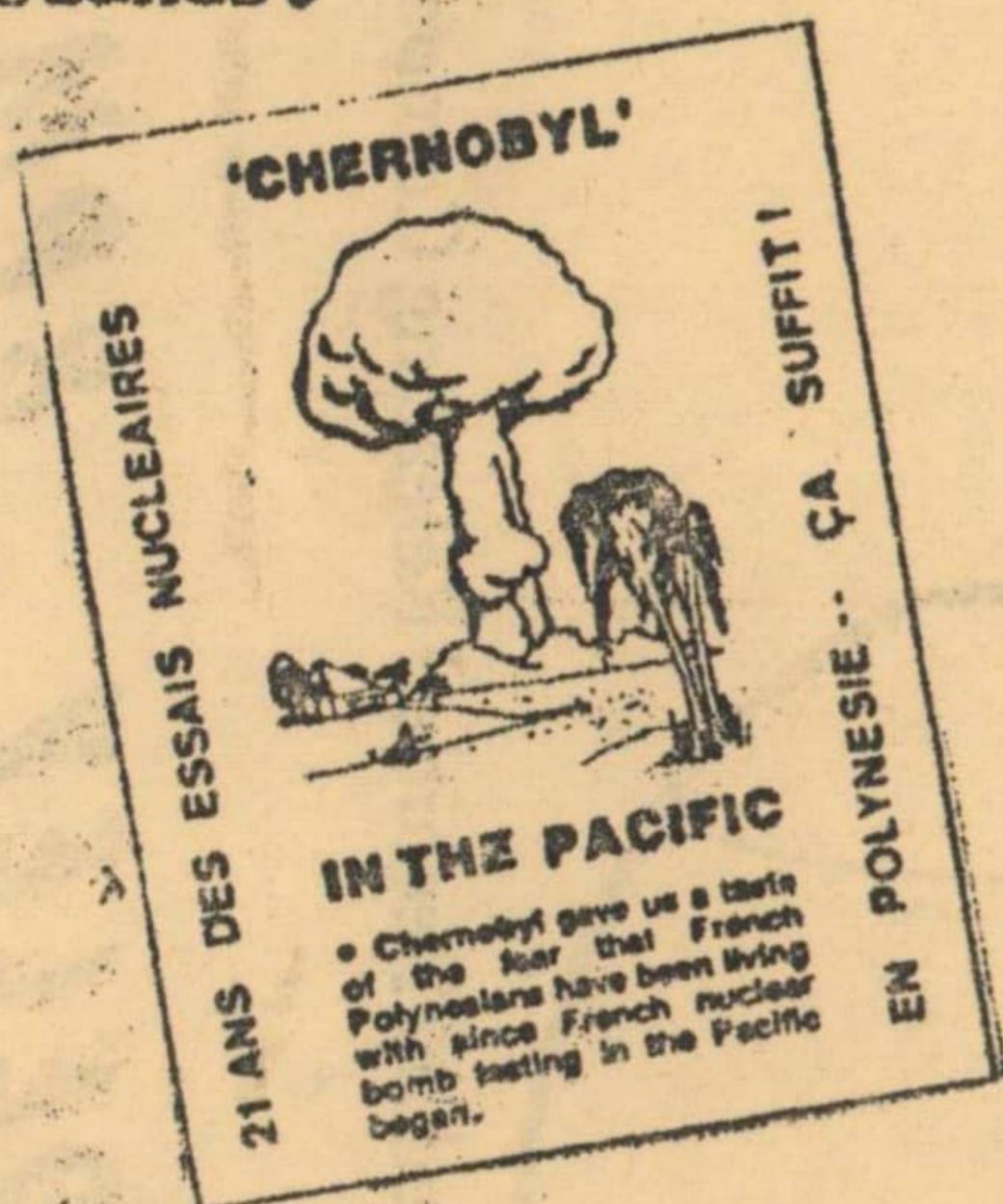
There is now evidence that France is planning to move its test site again, this time to the Kerguelen Islands in the Indian Ocean. There is also a possibility the islands will be used as a major nuclear dumping area.

The Kerguelen Islands are considered to be geologically unstable, and form part of a subterranean ridge which connects the Heard Island, an active volcano in Australian territory and the Antarctic volcano Gaussberg.

The independent Pacific nations have consistently condemned the tests and in August 1985 the Pacific Forum declared the area a nuclear free zone. In the early 70s Greenpeace took direct action against the tests. In 1982 both Greenpeace 111 and the Pacific Peacemaker sailed into the test zone in protest.

French sensitivity to protest against testing was revealed in 1985 when the Greenpeace ship 'Rainbow Warrior' was

blown up in Aucland harbour as she prepared to sail to the test zone. It is interesting to note that Admiral Lacoste former director of the intelligence section responsible for the outrage is now head of an agency set up to combat "press lies" about the impending move to the Kerguelen Islands.

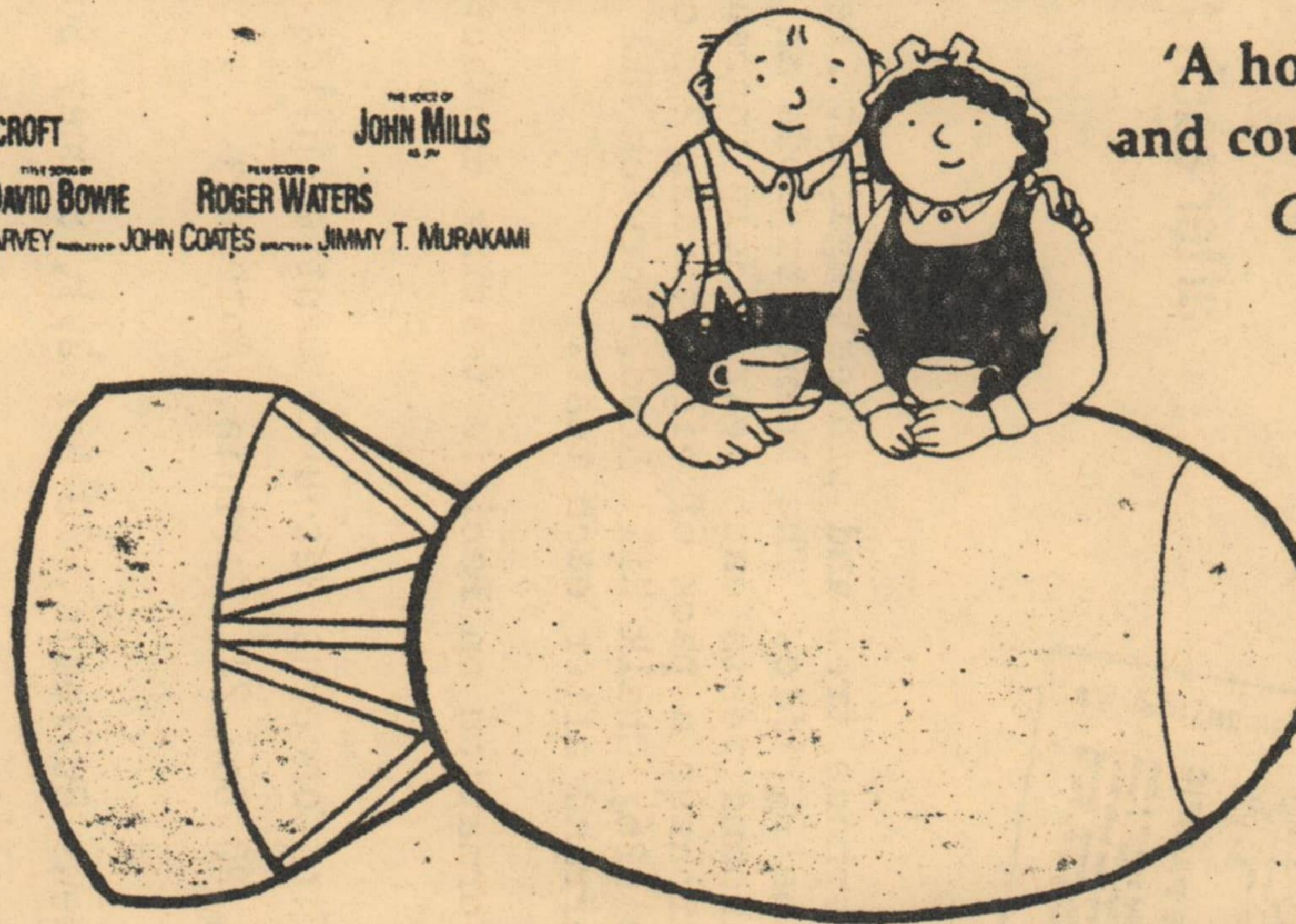

COURT CINEMA MADELEY

PARA - MILITARY ORGANIZATION LINKED
TO THE CONSERVATIVES (POLICE)

Tam Dalyell in his May Day speech said that it is fully time that the police published the report of the enquiry made more than two years ago, by an outside senior police man into the Shropshire police's handling of the investigation of Hilda Murrell's death.

That enquiry was made two and a half years ago, months before the West Midland's police had announced that they were about to make an arrest in the case, and that they had a good idea as to who the murderer was. When the arrest was not forthcoming and when the police continued to ignore any evidence that the state may have been involved in the killing, popular demand forced an enquiry, but the results have never been shown even to the police authority.

We have learnt from the Wright revelations that the state authorities had, a few years earlier, engaged in a treasonable plot. All done of course with the justification that Cabinet members were alleged to have treasonable or at least unwise discourse with a Cold War enemy.

We know also (from the Kathy Massiter revelations, and also from recent discoveries,) that the authorities illegally used surveillance methods against CND, and used a black propaganda campaign against us to smear the Labour party in the last election.

We have no reason to suppose that Hilda Murrell's murder was necessarily connected with the matters discovered; though in that she told me (L.O.) that she had papers "not about Sizewell" and these have not been discovered. it is a possibility; but we can say that had the police followed up clues they have been given, (had they not refused to interview a number of people,) they would have come up against scandals such as these.

Did you know that every time a cruise convoy goes on exercise in Britain it not only meets resistance here but also in the United States.

Cruise Alert U.S.A. reaches 50 states and over 800 peace groups through its Peace Net Computer Network. This is on top of the personal phone calls and post cards which take the message all over North America.

A GAG ON TANG

TANG's proposed door-to-door visiting (Chain Reaction, April) in the Wrekin to deliver information and then to ask a short questionnaire cannot go ahead due to general election law.

This is despite the fact that in the leaflet or the survey we were not mentioning any political party nor encouraging people to vote for any particular party.

Yet also we legally cannot tell you here what we would have said because Chain Reaction would probably fall foul of the same law (Representation of the People Act 1983).

Only if the cost for the whole exercise was included as part of the (strictly limited) authorised expenditure by one or more of the election candidates can we legally go ahead.

So thanks to those who offered help. We may try later in the year when the situation is different.

This law does not apply to leaflets not referring to the election in any way. TANG has several thousand of these needing distribution.

NICARAGUANS ARE DYING FOR PEACE

There can be few of us who have not witnessed the recent media coverage of the Irangate scandal. Perhaps it would have been more appropriate if the media had used the phrase Contragate with equal consistency. Whether President Reagan suffered a temporary loss of sanity is irrelevant (his sanity has always been questionable). The inescapable fact of the matter is that the Reagan administration traded arms with Iran in order to fund U.S. terrorism in Nicaragua (an activity it has been pursuing since 1981).

Since the United States began funding the Contra in 1981, they have killed, wounded or kidnapped 17,000 Nicaraguans. Most of them were civilians; 1,778 of the 4,700 killed were children. A further 7,500 children have been orphaned. Nicaragua is a country of barely 3 million - scarcely a family has not been affected.

The contra are a force created, armed, trained, funded and directed by the U.S. in order to bring down a democratically elected government of the Nicaraguan people. President Reagan calls the contra "freedom fighters" - in fact they are comprised of former members of the National Guard from Somoza's dictatorship known for their brutality. He is seeking a further 105 million dollars from Congress to finance a campaign of torture and murder

US POLICY IS IMMORAL

In June 1986 the International Court of Justice found the U.S. guilty of conducting a covert war against Nicaragua ordering it to desist immediately and pay reparations.

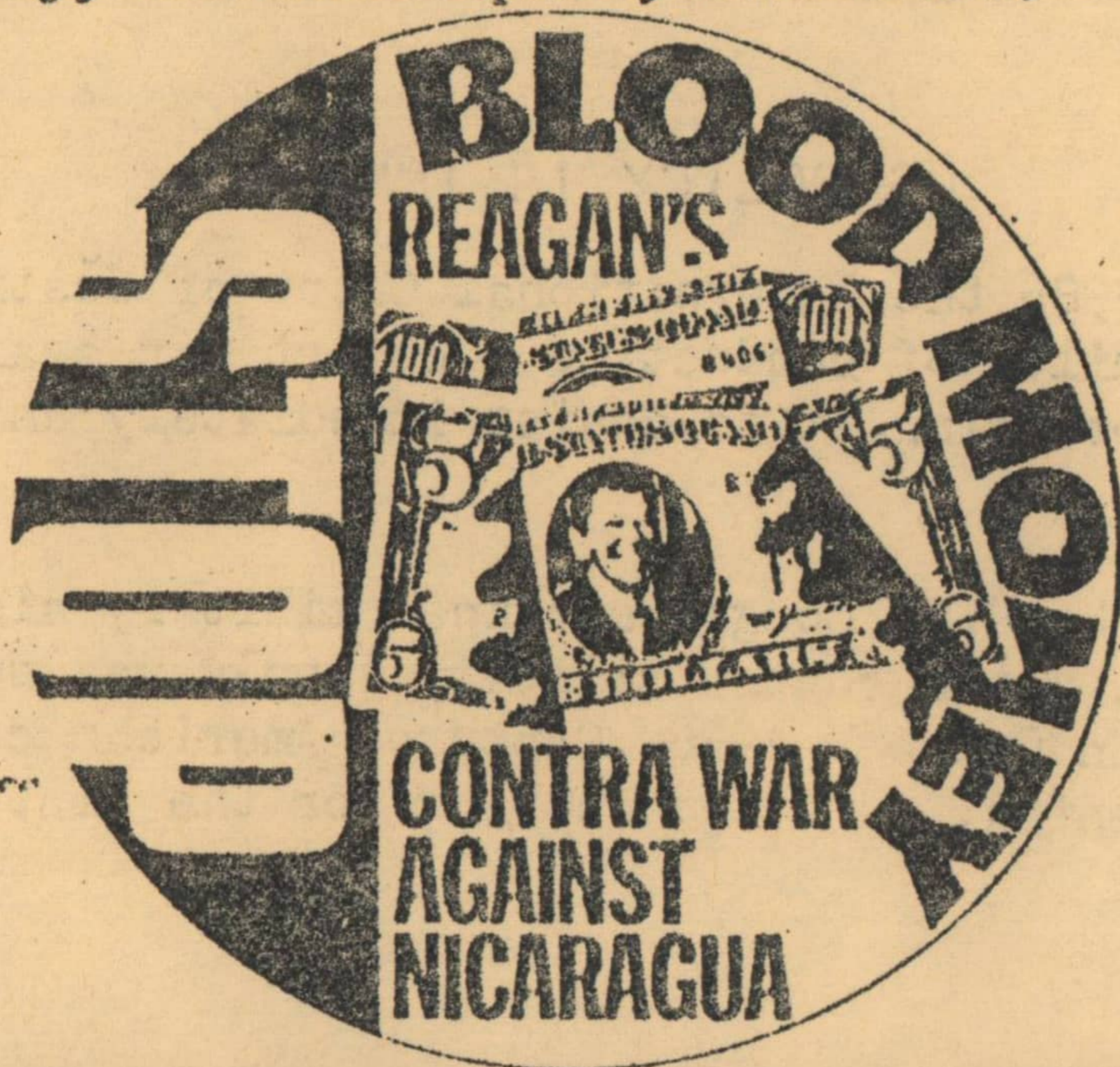
From 1984 the U.S. Congress banned military aid going to the contra, yet a contra military supply was downed in Nicaragua in October 1986. Captured American crew member Eugene Hasenfus, admitted working for the CIA.

In November 1986, the 'contragate' scandal broke, revealing that senior US officials had illegally sent up to 30 million dollars to Contra, avoiding the Congress ban.

If Reagan gets his blood money, it will mean more death and more suffering for the people of Nicaragua. Nicaragua has the right to life and peace.

FOR A HABITABLE PLANET

New penguin special edition by Dan Smith and E.P. Thompson. Extracts from a review in the weekly Quaker journal.

' This book assesses the peace movement's impact on the governments and the public between 1980 & 1986. The activities have ranged from mass rallies, direct action, the heroism of the Greenham women, to quieter work such as lobbying M.P.s influencing political parties, vigils, & developing specialist groups among doctors and scientists. All this has not stopped deployment of missiles or discouraged new weapon systems like binary nerve gas or Star Wars. " If we count weapon ry the armourers have won" says E.P. Thompson.

But this is not the whole story. Protest movements take time to change human thought patterns and enable governments to modify their policies. Since 1980 public opinion has swung slowly in relation to nuclear weapons. The vast majority of governmnets vote in the U.N. for radical disarmament policies. Sad to say the British government is in a small minority opposing a nuclear freeze, and an end to test explosions and outlawing nuclear warfare.

Some of the books authors are prominent in END, which links nuclear disarmament to support for East European groups (such as Solidarnosc, Charter 77, & Moscow Trust Group). In my view it is unhelpful to argue that these groups are the authentic peace movement in Eastern Europe & to ignore the contribution made by bodies like the Soviet peace Committee and the Soviet Peace Fund. In Eastern European countries the peace committees ensure a greater public involvement

in U.N. International Year of Peace than anything arranged by groups in the West. In relation to human rights there are major differences of emphasis between East and West. It does no service to link this issue to attempts to create a growing movement for a nuclear-Free Europe from the Irish Sea to the Urals.

Bruce Kent warns peace activists: "They are going to have to accept the first lesson of politics- the art of the possible. No government is going to be able to deliver all we want at one fell swoop". He concludes his essay (and the book) with his vision: " Nation shall not lift up sword against nation neither shall they learn war any more ".

The peace movement, while learning from its failures, must build on its successes as it looks towards the 1990s'.

Crossing The Line

It was my incredibly good fortune in early February to share, with 2000 new friends, one of the most rewarding and moving experiences of my life.

Peace activists from all over the United States gathered on February 5th at the Nevada Test Site to stage a peaceful demonstration which included an act of non-violent civil disobedience: crossing the line into the Test Site, where the first nuclear explosion of 1987 had taken place underground two days earlier.

Facts cannot capture the power of non-violence. I found that non-violence means far more than crossing a legal line in order to be arrested. Non-violence means crossing other, more meaningful lines: social and spiritual lines, which one crosses to enter upon a path of peace, from which return is neither possible nor desirable. I do not think it is possible to express, with words, the inner meanings of crossing the line.

However, back to the material plane, these:

Driving, talking, laughing and singing with nine other peace activists on an 18-hour drive; not sleeping much and not minding; getting to know everyone; feeling like a family on vacation.

Attending non-violence training; feeling immersed in an ocean of peace activists and thinking of Woodstock;

hearing Carl Sagan and others call upon the President to JUST SAY NO to more nuclear weapons; sleeping on a concrete floor while, all night long, peace activists continue to arrive.

Sitting with 2000 people at 9am as six members of Congress and other national figures speak about the arms race; Ramsey Clark noting that "today the greatest threat to peace and security is the nuclear arms race"; Rev. Tim McDonald, referring to politicians who speak falsely of ending the arms race: "Today, we will not only talk the talk -- we will walk the walk!"; Carl Sagan observing "we have not bought security. We have bought a fool's bargain."

Cheering and flashing the Peace Sign as the first 44 are taken by bus to jail; being number 281 to cross the line and remembering that 281 was my Vietnam Draft Lottery number; more cheering and solidarity as we arrive at the Beatty Community Center for detention; being treated with kindness and respect by the arresting sheriffs and deputies; telling one of them that Max Gail ("Wojo" on *Barney Miller*) had also crossed the line and watching him dig through the photograph box; getting my citation for trespassing and being released on my own recognizance for a March 18 arraignment; on the return bus, talking to a college student majoring in Computer Science who had just renounced career opportunities by getting arrested; more singing; finally getting to sleep, very tired and very happy.

Saying goodbye to so many new friends; discovering that I had been washed in the river of non-violence and forever changed in the process.

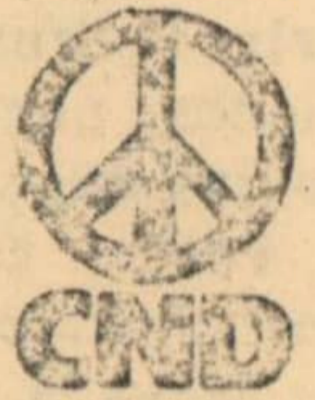

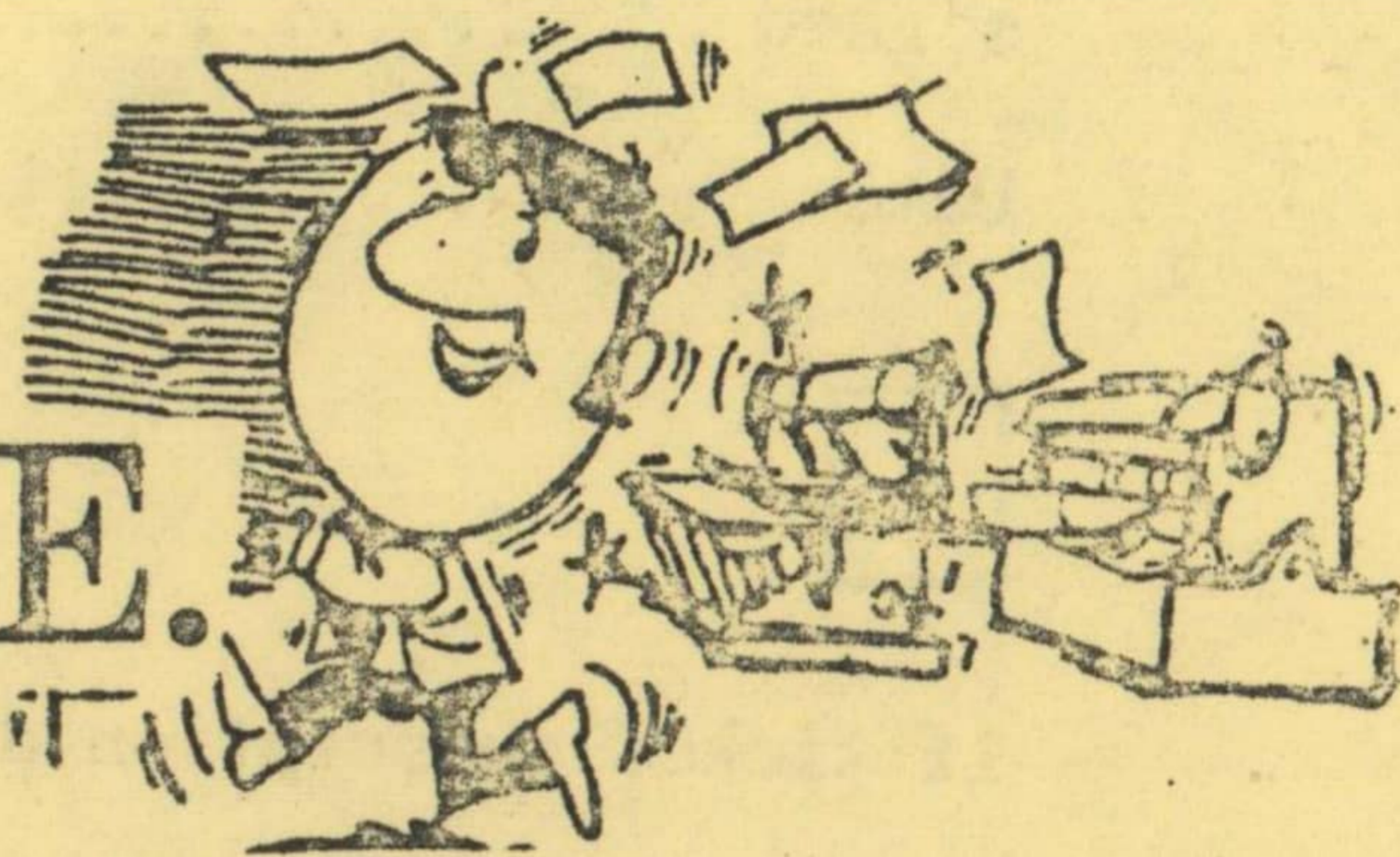

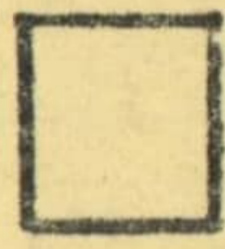
