The Conservative group on the County Council have being trying to overturn the Shropshire Nuclear Free Zone policy. However at the last full council meeting it was agreed (narrowly)



NUCLEAR FREE ZONE LOCAL AUTHORITIES

CONFERENCE LEEDS 10-11TH SEPT

I went as a representative of the Wrekin District Council and found the most interesting parts of the two day conference were group discussions and full plenary sessions on 'Publicity and the Law", "Legal aspects of civil Defence", and disposal of Nuclear Waste".

Councillor Margaret Crompton from Humberside described the joint campaign against Nirex and nuclear dumping. Two particular problems were raised including the significant problem of deciding what should be done with the present waste because even if we achieved a halt to the nuclear industry today there will be waste which requires disposal.

On Civil Defence (protection) many authorities with policies of minimal compliance with the haw now face a difficulty with Central Government demanding the preparation of plans by October Ist. To carry out a thorough task will require many hours of work gathering and collecting information. The most important contribution N.F.Z. authorities can make is to keep the public fully informed and avoid a conspiracy of silence as is practised by Government and M.O.D.

Some concern was expressed about the effects of the new Education Bill when the 'core' curriculum is defined and imposed by the Conservative Government.

Prosecution tries to silence activist

Katya Komisaruk, the US disarmer who destroyed Trident navigation equipment at Vandenburg Air Force base, California, in June (see PN August 14), is facing an attempt by the prosecution to silence her. Katya's trial begins on September 29, and she faces a sentence of up to 20 years in prison for what has been named the "White Rose" action. Prosecution lawyers want to prevent Katya from mentioning motives, ethics or international law during her trial.

Katya intends to base her defence on Common Law and the Nuremburg Frinciples, which forbid genocide. The long-established "defence of necessity" holds that it is right to commit a lesser crime to prevent a greater crime or greater harm. Thus, it is legally correct to destroy a weapon which could lead to the greatest harm of all—nuclear war—and to interfere with one's government when that government is committing a crime. The US constitution states that the government is bound by international laws—such as the Nuremburg Principles. If the US government is breaking such laws, then it is the right of citizens to interfere.





Peace Pledge Union for nonviolence

The white poppy as a symbol of peace began in 1933. It extended the narrow nationalistic and militaristic view of Remembrance to remembering all the dead in wars, irrespective of nationality, civilians as well as those in the armed forces; it is a reminder that unless we act now more will go on dying in wars of the future. Its use reached a peak in 1938 — and it has been used sporadically since then. Recently the Peace Pledge Union's promotion of the white poppies and of alternative Remembrance events has met with a great deal of interest and now the work is being developed and extended.


VISIT TO THE U.S.A.

This summer we visited America staying with family and friends in Virginia and Washington D.C. Many of the views that we held about America before going were unfortunatly confirmed.

America is a very materialistic society, in which ownership of c car is not only necessary but essential. To be without your own transport contributed to the isolation and alienation that of many sections of society feel. There is little or no public transport except in the larger cities. The quality of television programmes was extremely poor and coverage of world affairs both on television and the newspapers lacked balance or was limited.

The size of America is perhaps the single most impressive factor and that as a nation it is youthful, with a blending of different national cultures still taking place. This feeling is exciting and generated an atmosphere of growth and development with a future of great potential. Visiting America has enabled us to place in perspective our own nation and developments in this country. . The erosion of public services , and the desire for material wealth undermines a sense of community care and only contributes to the isolation and despair that many people express.

We did not have many opportunities to discuss issues concerning the nuclear arms race, Third World issues, international relations but American people seemed no different to any other nationality in that many were concerned, interested and wanted to find out more. They have many of the same fears for the future as people in Europe. I think that one of the most constructive actions we could take is to make contact with a group or individuals to inform them of our views



about world peace and just as important listen to them. So how about it - could TANG make contact with a group in America?






VISIT LIGHTHOOR NEW COMMUNITY?
