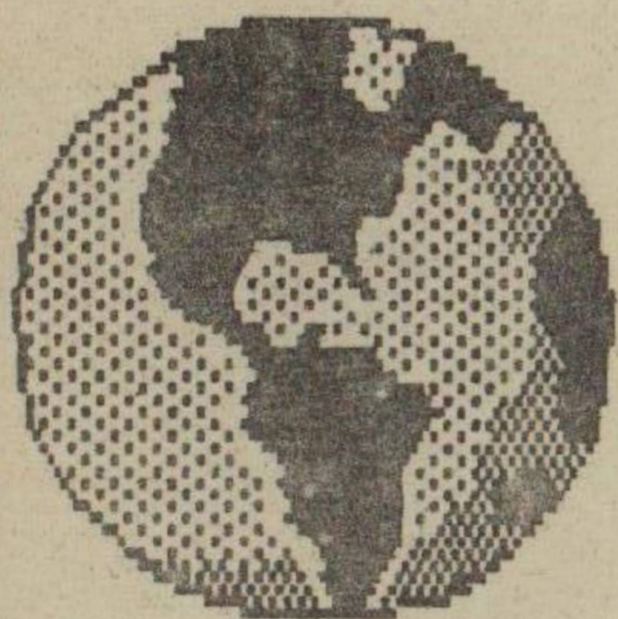

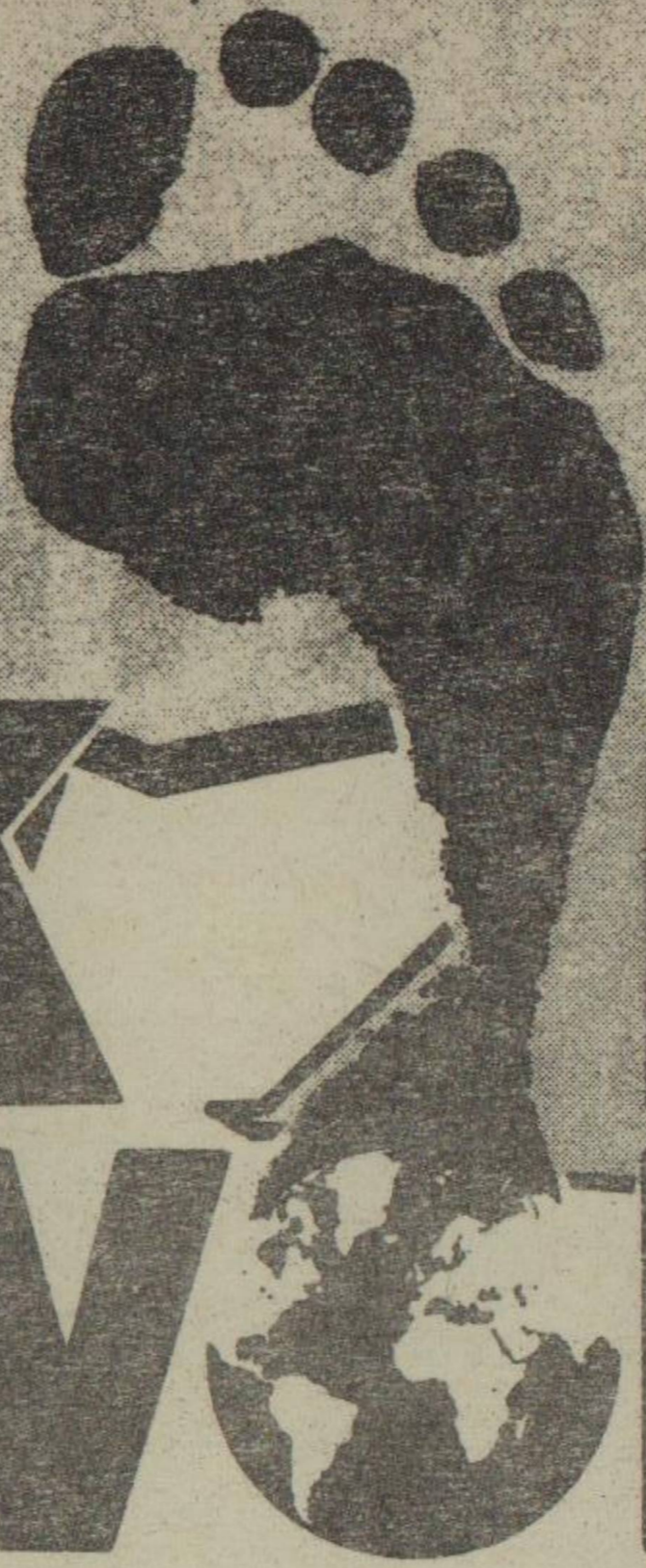
We urge our government to take these five steps

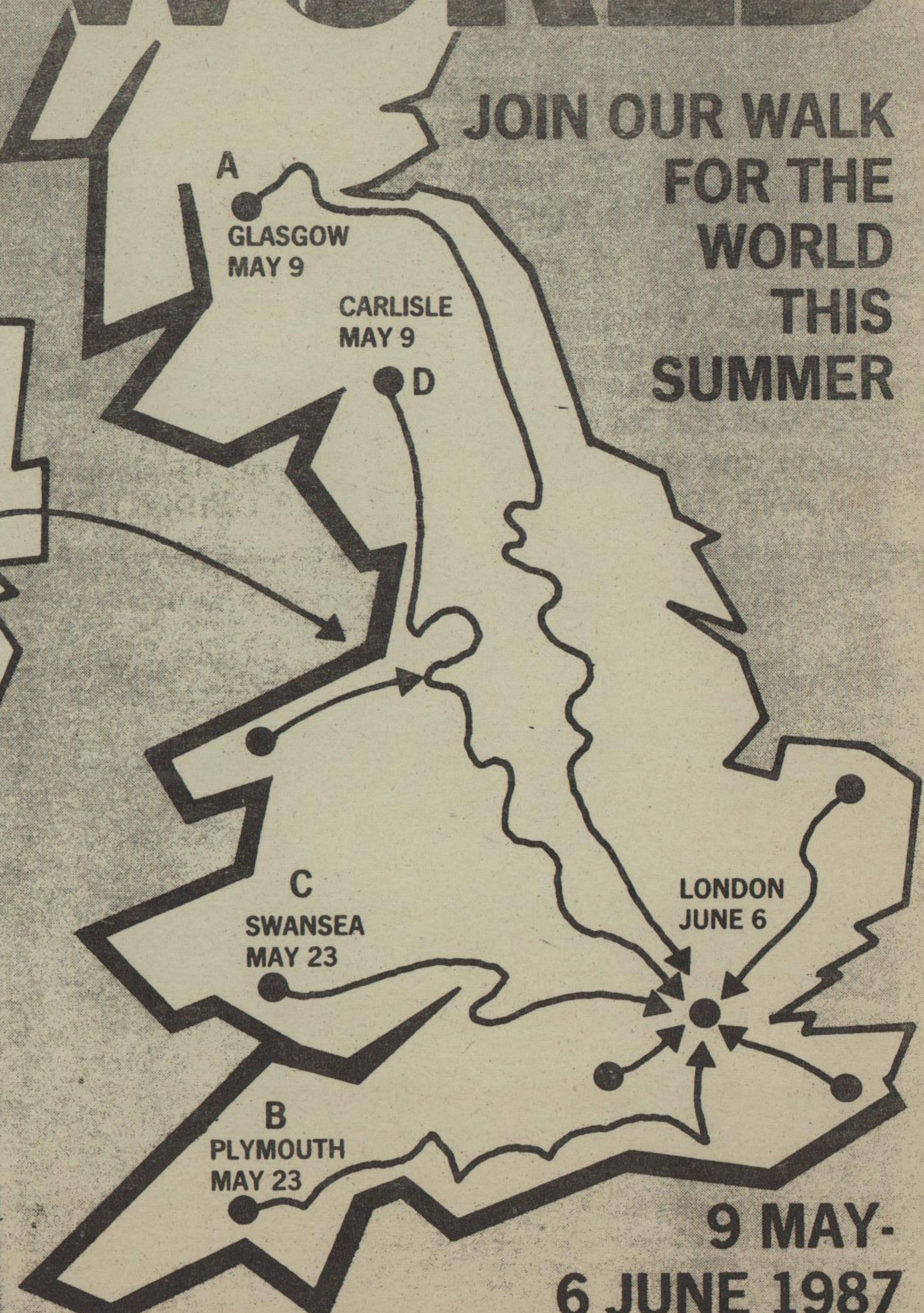

Lord God, we undertake Christian Aid Week in your name. Let this week really proclaim your love and your salvation to all the people we know and live with.

Let's share the joy of the many freedom fighters in the U.S.S.R. who have recently been released from prison: we see many indications of the power of hate in the world, but here is clear proof of the power of love to produce political change.

We constantly see images of people giving to Africa; but the developed world continues to take much more from Africa - in debt servicing - than it gives. Pray that genuinely international thinking may be brought to bear in solving problems of the whole African economy.

Our country expects a general election this year. The contest will, in the first case, be about who holds the reins of power, but pray that it may be about justice and peace as well.

We hear a lot about the "developed" and the "under-developed" nations; it is easy to forget those many tribal groups in the world who chose to be hunters or nomads, whom we probably think of as "primitive". Many such tribes are facing virtual extinction, e.g. in Amazonia, in Australia, in Bangladesh, and are not helped by governments greedy for their land. Let's pray for these people.

There cannot be justice between nations or peoples if there is not justice between men and women, because all unjust power structures tend to support each other and so multiply. Pray for justice between men and women in our society and in our homes.
