Dear Member,

The following programme has been arranged for March.

Monday, 6th March. Social evening at the Pavilion Club, 123, London Road, Shardlow. This function is for members only and during the evening the officers and committee of the Group will be elected.

Tuesday, 21st March. Meeting at the Pavilion Club. It is hoped that Michael Launder of the London CHE will come and talk to us about the C.H.E. Befriending Service which he was responsible for founding. If Michael cannot be present an alternative speaker will be arranged. The talk will be followed by discussion and there will be dancing until midnight for those who wish to stay. In order to conform with the rules of the Pavilion Club it will be necessary for non-members of the Group who are not members of the Pavilion Club to be introduced as guests of members. i.e. persons who are not accompanied by a member of the Group or a member of the Pavilion Club cannot be admitted.

The Pavilion Club is situated on the A.6 road about three miles from the point at which the A.6 crosses the M.1. on the way to Derby. Users of the M.1 should leave the Motorway at Exit No. 24 and take the road to Derby. People travelling from Derby should take the A.6 from Derby - Shardlow is about six miles out of Derby on the way to Loughborough. People travelling from Leicester and Loughborough can take either the M.1 or the A.6. From Nottingham the alternative routes are either via Beeston and Long Eaton on the road to Birmingham and East Midlands Airport, turning right on the A.6 where it crosses the Birmingham road, or the road through Clifton, past the East Midlands Generating Station, over the M.1 and on to the A.6 to Derby. The Pavilion Club is next to the Shakespeare Inn, opposite a cafe between the Church and a large petrol station. Cars should be parked in the car park between the cafe and the petrol station opposite the Shakespeare. The white door on the right hand side of the pub car park is the entrance to the Club. Anyone who requires further directions should contact me by letter or telephone.

If people with cars who are willing to give lifts would let me know suitable picking up points and times and those who want lifts would let me know their requirements I will try to put drivers and passengers in touch with each other.

Both meetings will begin at 8 p.m.

The Group now has a paid up membership of 31. Non-members should note that this is the last newsletter which will be sent to them.
