WHO OWNS THE ZEBRA?


This brain-teaser can be solved by combining deduction, analysis and sheer persistence. The essential facts are as follows:-

CHE BULLETIN

The second of our new thrice-yearly "CHE Bulletin" will be distributed to local organisations which have shown interest in, or support for our aims, during the first week of November.

The main subject of this bulletin is the impending loss of the right of an individual to petition the European Commission on Human Rights. If you have not already done so, please write to your MP urging him to press the British Government to ratify article 25 of the European Convention on Human Rights which would maintain the right of individual petition.

N.C.C.L.

A Nottingham branch of the National Council for Civil Liberties is being established and Nottingham CHE (as an affiliate of NCCL) has been involved in this from the start. The Article 25 issue is one of NCCL's current campaigns which we are supporting and we expect the NCCL group to support us on the John Clarkson case and in other ways which are under discussion.

WORD IS OUT - GAYS AND FILM

Ever since the cinema began, its images have been used to define masculinity and femininity. By and large this has meant also the production of oppressive stereotypes of gays and gayness. Alternative and more positive traditions do exist, however, and have been consolidated in recent years in particular. This programme of films, which we have collaborated with the Midland Group Gallery to devise, is designed to highlight these positive traditions and more generally to raise questions about the depiction of gayness in the cinema. The films will all be shown at the Midland Group Gallery on Warser Gate in the Lace Market. Unless otherwise indicated, the starting time is 7.30 pm.

Tuesday 4th November "Word is out". A riveting documentary, made in America, consisting simply of interviews with gays from all walks of life. Much praised and much shown, its strength lies in its very simplicity and in its non-voyeuristic stance. (135 minutes)

Tuesday 18th November "Home Movie" and "In the Best Interests of the Children". The latter is a sympathetic documentary on the problems faced by lesbian mothers, the former a short celebratory autobiography made by Jan Oxenburg, an American lesbian filmmaker. There will be an introduction and a discussion led by a member of the Lesbian Mothers Movement.

Tuesday 2nd December "Witches, Dykes, Faggots and Poofters",
"The Queen" and "Fireworks". "Witches" focusses on the militant
struggle fought by gays in Sydney for the right to demonstrate,
following the violent disruption by police of the 1978 Gay Pride
March. "Fireworks", Kenneth Anger's first film, depicts the
fantasies of a young sailor. "The Queen" is a documentary account
of the grand finale to the 1967 Drag Queen contest in New York.
An extraordinary and sympathetic study of a fantasy world that
is often burlesqued, but that here is deadly serious.

(50 + 15 + 68 minutes).

Tuesday 9th December "The Bitter Tears of Petra von Kant". Fassbinder's stunningly stylised film about the oppressions lying at the heart of the lesbian milieu he portrays. Insisting on the fact that general social attitudes pervade all relationships the film is ultimately equivocal in its own attitudes to lesbianism. (114 minutes)

Tuesday 16th December "Army of Lovers". Rosa von Praunheim's stunning kaleidoscope of images, attitudes, contradictions and experiences. The success of the film lies in its willingness to confront eroticism and ambiguity, and in its refusal to normalise homosexuality. The film will be introduced by Jack Babuscio, writer and Gay News film critic. (107 minutes).


