



ctivists sick of the money-spinaning antics of fat cats, gorging themselves on the back of Britain's repressive anti-asylum laws and the privatisation and expansion of pris-

ons, protested outside a Bristol hotel on Saturday 23rd February.

Over 40 activists demonstrated against transnational prison privateers Sodexho, a major investor in the company which owns the Mariott

Hotel where the protest took place.

Despite the presence of undercover cops and the usual uniformed flatfoot variety, activists snuck inside the hotel, barricaded themselves in a room and hung a banner out of the window. Meanwhile, a larger group assembled outside the steps to the hotel and hung banners, banged drums and distributed leaflets and information to the public.

One activist perched on the win-dow ledge while the others made their escape. He refused to come down contrary to the wishes of the police and an enraged hotel manager. Two police vans arrived on the scene, and were later joined by a couple of fire engines. No arrests took place.

"What Sodexho represents is the degradation of humanity in the pursuit of profit," says Mark Foran, of Bristol's Sod-Action collective. "By taking action we can show Sodexho and their like what we really think of their dirty trade. It's (continued inside)

<mark>Pristol activists gathered to</mark> protest agains<mark>t the</mark> Prevention of Terrorism Act 2000 on Saturday 17 February. Over 40 people assembled in Castle Park to voice their rage at the new law, which extends the power of the British criminal injustice system.

The Act is a move to criminalise all dissent – particularly Islamic groups (most represented on the proscribed list), direct action and animal rights activists.

In defiance of the biggest government attack on protest since the infamous 1994 Criminal Justice Act, the demonstration proceeded through

joined people against Marks and Spencer's investment in Israel (see article) and continued on to join a local group cam-paigning against the sanctions and previous night's bombing of Iraq.

The real terrorists who need to be persecuted are Bush, Blair, Straw, Cook and the whole gang of hypocrites who claim bombs are humanitarian gestures yet prop up capitalism, the world's biggest killer.

ristol's very own globetrotting football renegades the Easton Cowboys have returned from Mexico in January, having completed their second tour of the Zapatistas' autonomous zones of Chiapas. It's the third of its kind since the Cowboys made their groundbreaking visit in 1999. The team visited a number of

communities and emerged victorious in two of the three tournaments that

took place.

Things have noticeably changed since the team's first tour two years ago – in more ways than one: "The Zapatista teams have definitely improved," remarked midfield general Paul Morris. "Also we weren't stopped by army checkpoints this time and we didn't see any spy planes while we were playing." planes while we were playing."

This is connected with the shift-

ing nature of Mexican politics. Since coming to power last August incoming right wing president, Vincente Fox, has made numerous loud noises about peace and, indeed, two out of the five military bases in Chiapas have been dismantled. Despite this over half of Mexico's federal army is still based in the southern state.

However, scepticism is rife in the Zapatista communities over what this all means. Juan Martinez, President of the Morelia municipality explained to ASW's Mexican correspondent.: "We are all waiting to see what happens. Fox has spoken a lot in his election campaign about fulfilling the San Andreas peace accords [the peace deal that the Zapatistas negotiated in 1996 which the government reneged on] and demilitarising, but nothing really has changed."

(continued from front page) not a 'single issue', there's something here for everyone."

Sodexho has offices on the outskirts of Bristol and is a prime example of the ease with which corporations profit from misery. Administrators of the asylum seeker voucher system, contractors for NHS catering, suppliers to the military and police, the rabidly anti-union Sodexho started off as a catering chain in France. It branched out to the US and took over the Marriott Hotel chain, earning a reputation for vicious union-busting.

Not satisfied with its already

huge profits, Sodexho is rubbing its greedy mitts over its latest British venture - private prisons. Working notorious US company

Corrections Corporation of America (CCA), Sodexho hopes to profit from the privatisation of British criminal justice system. Through the consortium UK Detention Services it's building new jails as well as bidding

for prisoner transport contracts. Behind the polished corporate image, glossy brochures and promises to shareholders of dividends lie uncomfortable truths. CCA prisons in America are brutal and overcrowded. Female prisoners in CCA's facility in Florence, Oregon were expected to perform strip shows and sexual favours for the guards. A Federal investigation into CCA found 80% of guards had no corrections experience and that chronically ill inmates were left untreated. In Tennessee it was discovered that

there were 28% more serious incidents in CCA than state institutions. Brutality in CCA facilities is routine, with prisoners tear-gassed, stungunned and beaten senseless.

Private operators are paid per head, per day, and profit maximisation translates into packing in as many prisoners as possible. It's a case of stack 'em high, feed 'em cheap and guard them with poorly paid, badly trained, non-unionised screws, all topped off with minimal recreation and education facilities.

WAR OF WORDS IN THE BASQUE COUNTRY

Once again only the demos against ETA are news in our newspapers, ignoring other aspects of the Basque conflict which keep it going, such as the systematic repression and the denial of the most fundamental rights like self-determination, unity and the respect of

the language and culture. This situation continued through the 14 months of ETA's ceasefire in 1998/99 and has increased with the non-dialogist attitude of the conservative PP government.

It's now happening with the language itself becoming a target for Spanish nationalism, alongside Basque organizations and activists. The latest offensive against language normalization has been focused on school books, with Basque schools demanding an end to their subordination to the Spanish education system and to protest the persecution and arrest suffered by teachers. The last straw was the decision of the regional government of Navarre to withdraw the Basque language from all signs, and the withdrawal of funding for the Basque Summer University and other Basque initiatives. This decision had the approval of the Spanish political parties in the other Basque provinces who have threatened to implement it in their areas as well. Basque people have been demonstrating against this anti-Basque offensive as they have for years been working for the language's recovery and normaliza-tion. However, their efforts haven't had the same publicity that all those anti-ETA demonstrations organized by the government and aided by the media. Some of the parties marching against a Basque cultural identity also regularly take part in anti-ETA activities. As usual the British media followed the lead of the Spanish government and its propaganda machine, and chose to overlook the grassroots issues at stake in the Basaue region.

24,000 demonstrated in the capital of Navarre, Irunea (Pamplona) on behalf of the Euskera (Basque language), known by the Romans - the first to record its existence - as Lingua Navarrorum. This demonstration, like previous ones with the same aim, brought all the Basque parties together. This hasn't happened since the end of the ETA ceasefire, when the Basque moderate nationalists broke with supporters of the armed struggle. The demo was led by the mayors of the Basque-speaking areas together with ones from what is considered in the region to be non-speaking areas. Also there were e head teachers of the Ikastolas (Basque schools), trade unions, AEK (adult Basque education) and other organizations campaigning for the normalization of the language. The main banner had the slogan "The Basque, everybody's right". Last Saturday's demo was the biggest event on behalf of the Basque language apart from the region's Nafarroa Oinez or Basque fiesta. This demo wasalso bigger than December's event of 15,000 people.

The organizers criticized the Navarre government for encouraging the Spanish language over Basque and for denying Basque speakers their right to choose the language they want. One of the mayors criticized the

Navarre government's attitude for ignoring a culture that is recognized all around the world for being ancient and unique. And this is happening in one of the Basque provinces where this language is still alive but fighting every day for survival.

All this happens in the Basque Country, fragmented by the governments of France and Spain: the Basque Country that the British media states time and again enjoys autonomy and where the Basque language is persecuted less than during Franco's dictatorship. Too right, but it's still a long way from the status that other languages enjoy in other countries. The governments of Spain and France and all their regional puppets continuously justify the existence of nationalism and

of violence in the Basque Country.

The day after the massive demo the president of the regional government of Navarre, Miguel Sanz, didn't ignore it, but instead claimed such demos undermined the moves to normalize the language and that "they place us in the pamphletarian mobilization and in the pro-ETA publicity". He didn't believe that to deny the legitimacy of the language in the administration would affect the Basque language. The fact is that the regional administration is denying Euskera to be the native language. For president Sanz, the new decision will allow the Basque "to develop in freedom". If this is freedom, then what does freedom look like?

The Act provides for an appeal

process. After the Order comes into force, it will be open for any of the organisations so proscribed, or any person affected by their proscription, to make application to the Home Secretary for deproscription. If that application is refused, the Act provides for an appeal to a new inde-pendent tribunal, the Proscribed Organisations Appeal Commission, established by the Terrorism Act.

South-west activists have joined a nationwide campaign to boycott Marks and Spencer to raise awareness of the killing of Palestinians in Israel's occupied territories.

The campaign started in London in November and has spread around Britain, with 10 stores currently being picketed, including shops in Bristol, and Gloucester, with six more cities set to join the boycott. Marks and Spencer has been targeted because of its trade with Israel which the Jewish Chronicle, says amounts to \$233 million a year. İsraeli imports to M&S amounts to £240 million annually and the company's economic support of Israel was praised by Israel's Ambassador in London last year.

Over 10,000 Palestinians have

been injured and 363 killed by Israeli forces between 29 September 2000 and 4 February 2001. Over one third of those killed were under 18 and 43.5% were shot in the head or neck (including 9 from behind). Most deaths took place on civilian demonstrations with 40% occurring in lulls between clashes - including assassinations by the Israeli state, a practice banned by the Hague resolutions.

"Young children are being shot and manhandled by heavily armed troops," said a Swansea Friends Of Palestine spokesman. "We're not happy with M&S's support of this by trading with the Israeli government."

"I got involved after seeing

Muhammed Al-Durah being shot on TV," explained a spokesman for the

Bristol campaign, which picket the city's store on Saturday mornings. "This is not a matter of religion, it's about the fact that children are being killed and you just can't shoot children. We need to get through to people that this is happening, which is

why we're doing this."
"So far, we've been getting a good response from the public," he added."
For every person that has a problem with us, six or seven say that they support us and that they think what's going on over there is wrong.

A Marks and Spencer spokeswoman refused to comment on Israel's treatment of Palestinians and saidtrade with Israel would continue. ffi: Meet every Saturday outside M&S, Broadmead, Bristol. 11 am – 1 pm.

olombian activists are coming to Bristol as part of a European tour to raise awareness of the low-intensity war waged by the Colombian government with US help.

Plan Colombia is a \$1.7 billion financial package from the US, aimed at further militarising central america, corporate expropriation and the suppression of any form of resistance, under the guise of the

'War on Drugs'.

The initial drafts of the plan were written in English - so the majority of Colombian politicians were unable to understand the wording. With the vast majority of the funding being military, Plan Colombia's 'War on Drugs' is a facade for the battle over the ideological control of Central America. The suppression of any popular movements or guerrillas is an essential part of the Plan. Much of the dirty work is carried out by CIAtrained Colombian government-backed paramilitaries who carry out arbitrary attacks, dissapearances and large-scale massacres against the

civillian population.

The 'War On Drugs' is also a farce, but with the use of genetically modified fungus 'Agent Green', plans to fumigate massive areas of Colombia are taking place. The aftermath of this will bring more repression and pave the way for multina-tionals to move in to Colombia and promote monocultural agricultural

production.

The Mapuche International Link (MIL) is an international organisa-tion working for indigenous peoples and human rights, formed by a group of South American Indians and Europeans. MIL principally reflects the Mapuche Nation - an indigenous people in the horn of South America attacked by seven-teenth-century European conquis-tadores, and eventually overrun by the newly-created states of Chile and Argentina in 1885 - but takes up the wider cause of indigenous people everywhere.

Operating from Bristol and Alkmaar in the Netherlands, MIL aims to raise and their struggle for survival and to develop links between European

and indigenous people.
Practically MIL promotes cross-cultural understanding through twinning schools, and also through the Rukantun Land Fund. This gives land to indigenous community projects, such as in Temuco, Chile, where a plot was provided for a community centre to be built by local Mapuche and European volunteers. The Temuco centre will be a valuable resource for local groups and will also be the administrative centre for the Mapuche Interregional Council,
