

In the months prior to May, thousands of workers, skilled and unskilled, men and women, Negro and white, native and immigrant, organised and unorganised, were drawn into the struggle. By mid-April almost a quarter of a million industrial workers were involved in the movement.

In Chicago alone 400,000 workers went out, and more than 45,000 were granted a shorter working day without striking. Chicago was the main centre of the agitation, and in Chicago the anarchists were in the forefront of the movement. It is to no small extent due to their activities that Chicago became the outstanding labour centre of the country and made the greatest contribution to the fellow workers'." eight-hour movement.

They were murdered in an attempt to stem a movement that instilled terror in the American bourgeoisie. Philip S Foner's introduction to The Autobiographies of the Havmarket Martyrs provides an excellent overview to the situation and the following is culled from his work.

"On the night of May 4, 1886, a dynamite bomb was thrown into a group of policemen who had just begun to disperse a small crowd of workingmen still milling about in the Haymarket of Chicago's West Side. One policeman was killed instantly by the bomb, several others were wounded so severely that they died later. The police immediately opened fire, and before the Haymarket riot ended, several workers were killed (how many is unknown)













In May 1985, fifteen men appeared in Sheffield Crown Court to face charges of riot and possible life imprisonment. The charges arose out of incidents at the Orgreave coking plant during the miners' strike in the previous June.

"The most serious incident of public order in this country has seen this century," was how Mr Anthony Clements, the assistant chief constable of South Yorkshire, described the events of June 18th.

Forty-eight days after the trial began it collapsed amidst a saga of perjury, forgery and vanishing statements, disappearing witnesses and police brutality - and the fifteen men walked free.

One of those men, Bernard Jackson, presents a detailed account of that evidence, of the day itself and the events which led up to it. Tony Wardle is the writer who enabled him to make public the truth of what happened at protected at all costs. Orgreave.

Anton Pannekoek is the intellectual mentor of the council communist movement. Drawing particularly on the experience of the Soviets and Factory Committees in the Russian revolution and the Räte that developed after the military defeat in the Germany of 1919, Pannekoek's work developed an emphasis on the issues of state power, selfmanagement and workers'

His vision of revolution was the direct administration of society by workers' councils without the mediation of a revolutionary party. Not surprisingly, given the libertarian edge to Pannekoek's ideas, they have been considered by some as akin to syndicalism. "State socialism", he concluded "is a design for constructing society on the basis of a working class as the middle class sees it and knows it under capitalism."

Most recent interest has focused on this council communist period of his life, but prior to World War One, Pannekoek was a widely recognised figure in the mainstream of the international socialist movement. A militant in both the Dutch and German Socialist parties, he emerged with Rosa Luxemburg as a leader of the left in the SPD and was among the first to call for the forming of a third international.

By 1920, however, Pannekoek was a major critic of Leninism and he broke with the Bolshevik dominated Comintern. Under the pseudonym of John Harper he is the target of Lenin's Left-Wing Communism: An Infantile Disorder. If the working

class had broken ground by the development of councils. Pannekoek thought that the Bolsheviks should be fostering them, rather than using their party's ideological influence and state power to impose industrial discipline.

Telos Press have done us a great service by the publication in English of Serge Bricianer's book. It is a thoron his conception of marxism, on how materialist theory could be extended from the natural into the social sphere, and undoubtedly had significance in his later disputes with Lenin. Dietzgen, now a generally overlooked thinker, was ranked by Pannekoek as "third among the founders of socialist science".
