Russian Tragedy A Berkman **Phoenix Press** paperback £2.50 ISBN 0 948984 00 7

The life-long anarchist militant Alexander Berkman was one of the first to speak out against the Bolshevik Myth, the myth that the Bolsheviks were alone responsible for the Revolution and that under their regime free socialism was emerging. He also saw early on that the Bolsheviks were moving towards the creation of a statecapitalist society. At the time that he was writing (1922) lenin was instituting his New Economic Policy encouraging free trade but Berkman was able to see that 'economically it (Russia) is a combination of State and private capitalism. Politically it remains the "dictatorship of the proletariat" or, more correctly, the dictatorship of the inner circle of the Communist Party.

Unlike the Trotskyist mystifiers, who seem to regard the rise to power of Stalin as a magical date for the end of 'real' Bolshevik Communism, Berkman was able to see that the institution of repression and bureaucracy started almost immediately after the Bolsheviks seized the reins of government, Indeed, as materialists, how can the Trotskvists ignore the fact that Stalin did not spring out of nowhere, but was the direct result of conditions established by Trotsky and Lenin?

Berkman was deported from the States for anti-war activities in 1920 and went to Russia to aid the Revolution. Like some other anarchists, he was by no means hostile to the Bolsheviks, being prepared to give them the benefit of the doubt, and hoping that they had really broken with the practices of Marxism. But two years actual experience of the Bolshevik regime, the news he heard about the persecution of the anarchistinfluenced Makhno movement in the Ukraine, and finally, the crushing of the Kronstadt insurrection, convinced him of the bureaucratic and repressive nature of Bolshevism.

Indeed at first Berkman was prepared to believe the Bolshevik lies about the Makhno movement - that it was not anarchist, that it

was a bunch of marauding bandits. I have seen an article by Berkman in an early Freedom of 1921 restating these 'facts'.

He was however able to learn the truth. He, with other anarchists, attempted to mediate between the Kronstadt sailors and the Bolshevik regime. He was ignored, and the military offensive began against those who called for free soviets and the authentic values of the Revolution.

Berkman recounts those tragic events in this book and examines the processes that led up to them.

At a time when the Leninist domination of the revolutionary movement in Britain is beginning to collapse, the appearance of books like The Russian Tragedy is of great value. It can be used along with argument and the actual practice of building a credible anarchist alternative, to finally defeat Leninism.

BEST BEFORE 1984

Best Before 1984 Crass Records £6.50

This double compilation of singles, demo tracks and snatches of conversation documents the first seven years of the career of Crass, the band most responsible for popularising the ideas of Anarchy amongst my generation. During the late Seventies the pidgin Trotskvism pedalled by the SWP front of RAR was the only political alternative available to a youth aware enough to know that Labour wasn't working, that the Tories would never work for any but their own class and that the National Front were a Nazi Front, I was that youngster and I swallowed the whole package, I marched in the carnivals, sold papers on street corners, wore the RAR Star badge and at first felt outraged when a punk band with a strange symbol told me that 'Marx Fucks!' That band was Crass, and whereas the Pistols had already said 'I believe in Anarchy in the UK', somehow I could sense that these people were talking about an alternative, not just mouthing a shock slogan.

What was innovative about Crass was that although they had their own slogans aplenty ('Do They Owe Us a Living?'/'Fight War Not Wars'/'Jesus Died For His Own Sins, Not Mine') they were essentially a group who questioned, who asked listeners to reach their own conclusions. Always their style was to present a mixture of information, anger, and a glimpse of their vision of what could be, the possibilities which lie beyond the clichés into the more tangible realms of

the potential of the human spirit. The motivating factor behind Crass was a profound vision of love and hope, and that vision is clear amongst the rage throughout all the tracks here.

Records were put out because the group believed in them, not because the statements they contained were fashionable, and they were not to be put off by the danger that the flutes and Koto of 'Nagasaki Nightmare' or the Joni Mitchell style parts of 'Bloody Revolutions' might not sell well amongst their predominantly punk audience. The State, with its threats of prosecution for blasphemy and obscenity, were even less of a deterrent.

From the squatting of the Zig Zag club to graffiti-ing the walls of London's underground network, involvement in Direct Action was always an important part of Crass, and some of their other activities, such as the duping of 'Loving'magazine into distributing a flexi-disc of a track from their 'Penis Envy' album, exhibited their subversive sense of fun.

For those previously unfamiliar with Crass, this record is an easy way to obtain their now largely unavailable singles, albeit minus the informative covers, always an integral part of any Crass release. For those who bought them first time round this is not such an essential purchase, but, like me, I'm sure you'll find it full of reminiscences, a musical journey through the last eight or nine years of the Anarchist Movement.

SPANISH REVOLUTION

This is a lavish yet inexpensive package commemorating the 50th anniversary of Anarchism's finest moment. It consists of two singles and a book containing a wealth of previously unpublished photographs from the archives of the CNT. 150 pages document in words and pictures (mainly pictures) the course of the Spanish Civil war from the anarchist viewpoint; the collectives, the citizens militias, the beautiful, proud faces of the peasants and communards, the gutted prisons,

the red and black flags raised in hope to the future, and, ultimately, the bitterness of betrayal and defeat. The music is as well executed and inspiring as the book. Two of the songs are self-written compositions, the others are traditional civil war tunes given an electric/punk treatment.

The Ex have produced a worthy tribute to the proud and dignified history of the international Anarchist movement.

THE FREE By M.Gilliland. Hooligan Press. £1.80. (£1.20 to distributors, @groups and publications.)

THE FREE is about an anarchist revolution on an island at the edge of Europe. A fantasy thriller that's hard to put down once you've started, it describes a future revolution from bitter beginning to bitter end. Much of it is told in the words of the revolutionaries

themselves, speaking from the heart, describing what they feel, see and do in everyday working class dialect.

The scenario is quite straightforward, familiar to anyone living in the inner city. The economy is in the shits. Houses are empty and people homeless. Factories are rotting and workers are on the And the State set on a course of bungling repression. But some people, the Free, decide to do something about it, basically to live their lives without asking for permission. They squat houses, start co-ops, take over the derelict factories, establish free areas and consolidate them, and eventually found Free Trade Unions and evn infiltrate the army. Finally, inevitably, things come to a head and there's an upriing and the City is liberated after a 'dirty bloody battle'. 'A great victory's no doubt', according to tinker poet Macker McDonagh, but also a nightmare 'you shiver and shake to think about'. This is not a book that glosses over violence, be it revolutionary or otherwise.

It's about the revolution of the people, the dispossessed of this world, not of the ideologically correct vanguard. There are no Lenins, no Trotskys, no leaders. It's the ordinary people, the dockers, the unemployed, the co-ops, the squatters, the rail workers who organise and eventually confront the State. People who have boring jobs, suffer from hangovers, fuck, drop acid now and again and say silly things, swear, lose their tempers, are not immune to sexual jealousy and crack jokes like; 'What do you call a cop on a bicycle? A pig on wheels! No, a moving target!' The trendy lefties, the Trots and the Militants don't get a look in.

On the thriller level the action is provided by the street fights, the takeover of the docks, the role of the pirate radio and the guerilla war in the countryside against the counter-attacking State. All tensely and realistically described, but always through the eyes and senses of the people involved, the revolutionaries, the refugees, the workers. In parts it is hilarious and sometimes it is very moving.


A YEAR OF OUR LIVES is a different kind of miners book, with contributions from at least two dozen people, from grandparents to kids, from the miners community around Hatfield Main colliery in Yorkshire. Compiled and narrated by Dave Douglass, the NUM delegate from the pit, the book is a unique record of the real struggle - how the people organised together to survive and fight back in one of the strongest areas of the coalfields. Of course the Media view of the strike was a pack of lies, but even if they had been truthful you would still see the strike as a series of encounters between miners and police or scabs. But the strike was much more than this, and A YEAR OF OUR LIVES shows up, in the words of those involved, just how it was possible to strike for over a year without strikepay. There are chapters on Welfare Organisation, The Womens Support Group, Stew Kitchens, Picketing, The Strike Committee, Children in the Dispute, the Fate of Scabs, etc., as well as eye witness accounts of the police invasions of the area.

This is no another book by lefties cashing in on the miners struggle- indeed the Trots, TUC,etc are given short shrift, while the local @'s are praised for their selfless support. A YEAR OF OUR LIVES is a monument built by the miner community around Hatfield, recording and celebrating their fight, in speeches, history, reports, opinions, poems, drawings, songs and a host of photographs.

For anarchist readers the book provides a mine of information on tested methods of collective organisation for any future social revolution in this



More than that it blatantly promotes the anarchist view on freedom of the Airwayes, and traces the lessons of a host of pirates around the world, as well as the important involvement of anarchists and their ideas, right down to Radio Libertire and Radio Vrije Keizer in the present day.

The title comes from a quote reportedly made in in her defence by Chantal Paternostre, the Belgian anarchist still awaiting trial in isolation, framed up with planting bombs for the CCC. She was working for Radio Air Libre, the Brussels pirate, up to the time of her arrest ..

RADIO IS MY BOMB was put together by people from the forner 'Our Radio' pirate, with help from the present Free the Airwaves Campaign. The aim is the same, to 'Make 1000 Aerials Radiate' ie to make pirate radio so cheap, simple and accessible that HM's monopoly is broken by a horde of unstoppable local stations.

RADIO IS MY BOMB has designs simple enough for any electronics hobbyist, but it is also backed up by Free The Airwayes, as wellas a further team of anarchist wizzos, who will supply technical and development aid, for a small (or large if you like) supporting fee.

This book lays bare every secret of piracy, so carefully kept by the commercial pirates, to all who may read it. Its effect on those in power will be much more than its own weight in gelignite!.

The Charles H Kerr Company, theoldest revolutionary publishing house in North America, and probably in the entire world, is currently celebrating its centen-

Founded a few weeks before the Haymarket Tragedy in 1886, Kerr is best known as the publisher closest to the Industrial Workers of the World (IWW) in its heyday, and to the revolutionary, anti-parliamentary left-wing of the old Socialist Party. Non-sectarian from the start, the firm provided a haven for a broad spectrum of dissident radical authors whose manuscripts were shunned by the large commercial houses. Classic works by and/or about Edward Carpenter, Ralph Chaplin, Clarence Darrow, Eugene Debs, Arturo Giovannitti, Covington Hall, William D Haywood, Mother Jones. Peter Kropotkin, Jack London, Mary Marcy, William Morris, Lucy Parsons, Emile Pouget, P-J Proudhon and many others have appeared under the Kerr imprint.

In recent years Kerr, a not-forprofit co-operative, has published numerous original works and reprints on the history of anarchism, radical labour and the women's movement, as well as a series of classics of revolutionary humour.

It is time that this lack was solved - and this is the aim of Anti-Copyright. The idea is not to produce thousands of posters, but to produce posters which are then distributed and photocopied-/printed by local groups. We would like to distribute other people's posters, so please get in touch if you have any designs. But the basic purpose of Anti-Copyright is to assist in the process of getting out on the streets and spreading revolutionary ideas.

The Sheffield Anarchist is produced by the Sheffield Anarchist Collective (members of Sheffield Anarchists). We hope to spread anarchist ideas by producing a locally relevant anarchist paper to counter state propaganda and stimulate resistance

In 1975 the paper was revived and continued to appear somewhat sporadically throughout the '70s, Since March 1983 it has been produced on a quarterly basis.

The paper has no fixed price: a continuation of the original policy of the founders so that the want of a few pence shall not prevent the sharing of ideas. We pay ourselves no wages under any guise, have no expense accounts and support no other enterprise (nor are we supported by any other enterprise). All money received for the paper goes towards ensuring that we can print more copies of the next issue. And those who are able to give generously ensure that copies can be available for those who cannot afford to give anything.

The Anarchist Black Cross

The Anarchist Red Cross started in Tsarist Russia. It was active on two fronts – the organising of aid for political prisoners and organising self-defense against political raids by Cossacks. In this latter capacity it helped start Jewish worker's self-defense against pogroms. It was sustained economically by Russian Anarchists in North America, particularly in Chicago.

During the Russian Civil War, when the Red Cross was active in organising relief, it was thought better to change the name to avoid confusion, and so it became the Anarchist Black Cross.

After the Bolsheviks seized power the organisation moved to Berlin — still with its main aid Chicago based — and continued to help Russian prisoners (now of the Soviet Union) with the added task of helping the victims of Italian Fascism, and the prisoners of the post-war German reaction. Finally, when Germany succumbed to

fascism and the depression hit North America, the decline in the amount of financial aid and the huge wave of people needing that support, broke the back of the organisation.

The revival of the Anarchist Black Cross as such took place as a result of Stuart Christie's imprisonment in Spain. With the publicity he attracted Christie received Solidarity from a great many countries. As a result we found that aid to Spanish prisoners was possible.

When Christie returned to Britain he wanted to aid prisoners in Spain and began to work with Albert Meltzer. Together they revived the Anarchist Black Cross and began to publish a Bulletin of the Anarchist Black Cross in 1968.

The Black Cross first worked for the release of Miguel Garcia who was near to the end of his sentence (which did not mean automatic release). When he came out he joined them in London to organise the International Black Cross.

The aims of the Black Cross as reconstituted was to provide a 'springboard' effect — get people to work for the release of, and where possible the assistance of, political prisoners and Anarchists in particular — and in turn get inspiration from them in carrying on the struggle.

It was not our intention to set up Black Cross groups in other countries but Black Cross groups sprang up there, particularly in West Germany and Italy, nevertheless. Since then Black Cross groups have been set up almost everywhere, some with slightly different ideas to our own, others the same.

They have had their own problems too. Guiseppe Pinelli, a railwayman and secretary of the Black Cross in Milan, was murdered by the Italian police and flung from the window of a policestation. George von Rauch, secretary of the Black Cross in Berlin, was murdered by armed police too

The greatest satisfaction we had was the release of Goliardo Fias-

chi. Released from 209 years imprisonment under Franco he was re-arrested and charged on deportation to his native Italy under an old fascist conviction. Our intervention apparently brought his release (it happened barely a week after we approached the authorities).

There were a number of other cases where we managed to obtain the release of people either already sentenced or on trial. International protest probably saved the Murrays, but so far alas they are still in an Irish jail. Today Anarchist Black Cross groups exist in Australia, Canada and Denmark as well as in Britain.


Black Flag

One offshoot of the Anarchist Black Cross in this country was the transformation of the Bulletin of the ABC into Black Flag in 1971. Like the Black Cross, it was intended as a ginger group among what seemed to be the Anarchist movement at the time. It has since become the most regular Anarchist paper in the English-speaking world, supporting Class Struggle, Anarchism and International Solidarity as well as the Anarchist Black Cross.

Although *Black Flag* is produced in London, contributions come from all over Britain and the world. The ABC keeps good contact with Anarchists around the world too and we exchange *Black Flag* with many other Anarchist publications worldwide. *Black Flag* and publications we have gone on to produce are sent free on request to prisoners anywhere in the world where it can be received.

Through the pages of Black Flag and by protest we go on struggling for the freedom of class war prisoners and encouraging Anarchists to organise. Currently we are trying to save the life of Katsuhisa Omori, along with many others, from the death penalty in Japan.

Stephen Knight's The Brotherhood is an excellent starter for anyone becoming interested in this shady little club. Covering the origins of both international and, more specifically, British Freemasonry. It is a catalogue of infamy, as one example of corruption is followed by yet another, in the legal, judicial, political and economic spheres. In local government Freemasonry is rife. When all the major businessmen, lawyers, bankers, builders and councillors are in the same lodge the way is open for the T Dan Smiths and Poulsons of this world. Sadly, Knight died before he could expand upon what he described himself as 'just a framework for a larger work.' Yes, it's more general than specific, but well worth reading.

For a more specific look at the effects of the 'Brotherhood' we have to thank some excellent work by members of Bradfords One-in-Twelve Club. Entitled *The Secret Society of the Freemasons in Bradford — An Investigation*, this pamphlet is a good example of how that Secret Society can be

uncovered.

Like most towns Bradford suffered the ravages of 'redevelopment'. Wholesale destruction of people's homes and massive rebuilding led to many lucrative contracts being on offer.

The links between town hall Freemasons and various architects (in particular J.G. Poulson) and builders, in their system of 'lodges', provided an excellent opportunity for making a profit. Not content with this more normal capitalist dealmaking, there was widespread bribery and corruption, and we all know who paid the final bill! The Brotherhood doesn't just provide business opportunities. It is a social and political network, that extends across party lines, even class lines (well, upper and middle at least) in a common purpose; to keep things as they are, and make a good living out of it. One-in-Twelve are to be congratulated for this publication. 




