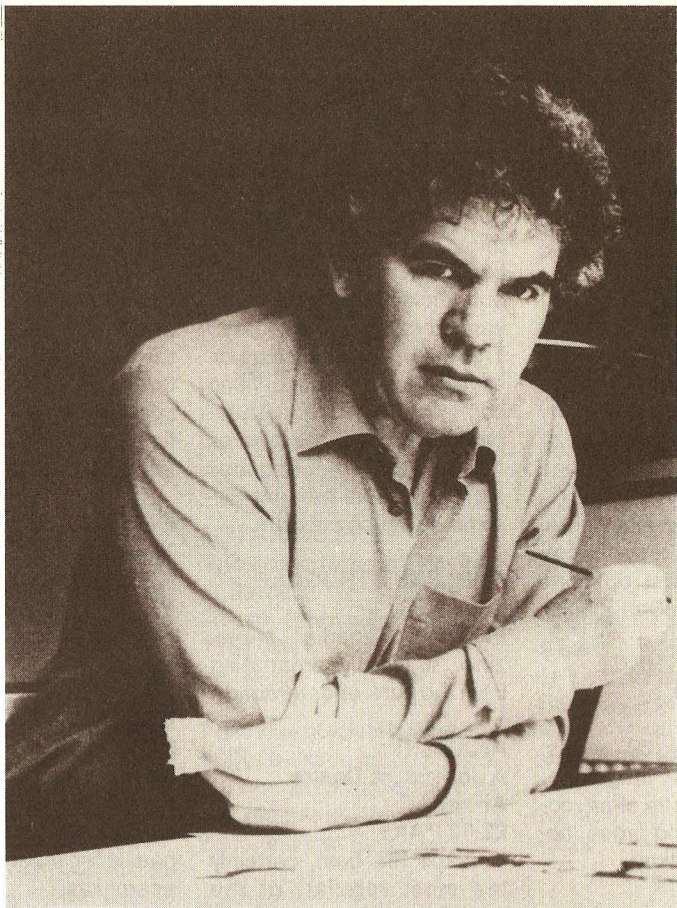
As the title suggests, a magazine for homosexual/lesbian punks (though the appeal is far wider). Written by anarchists.

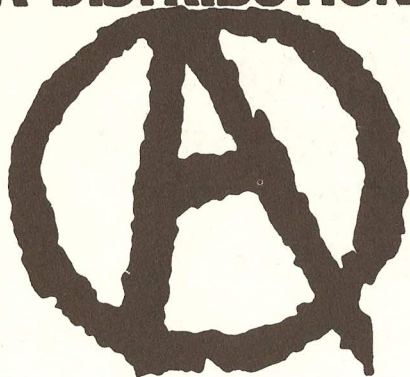

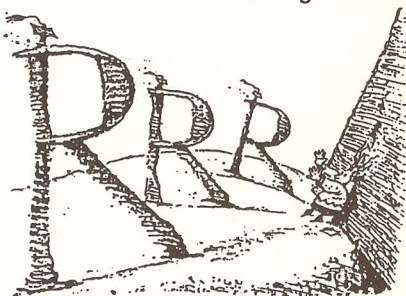
