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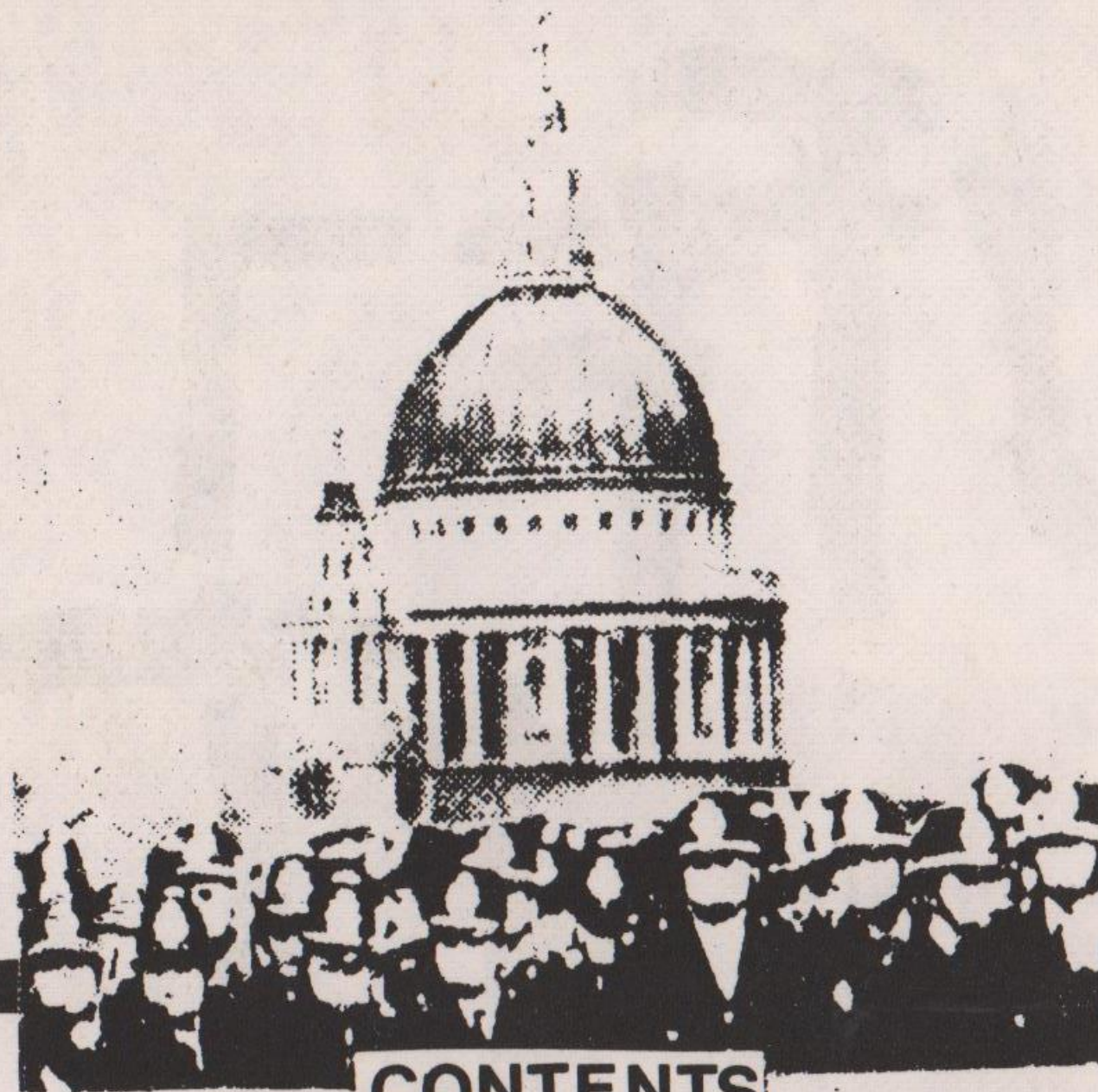

"Half an hour later the police 'copter appeared and the riot police moved in , with Telecom vans conscripted to block roads. I stopped a pig with a C.S canister on his back. There were shouts and sounds of windows smashing, then a long line of dejected people in the distance, many in handcuffs. They were made to stand in lines whilst being loaded into vans, at least one womyn looked very pregnant. One man I met said he'd just walked out of the field and the police hadn 't noticed him. Police had gone berserk. Met the ITN crew who were white and shaken. Some said they'd been in the Falklands but not seen anything this bad. "They were beating babies" one said. Soon some beat bobbies arrived and said "20 seconds to get out of here or you're arrested". We left for the car and I felt like emmigrating. So far the Police have spent 1 million Quid beating the shit out of people who wanted to sit on the grass....."

Free speech, what does that mean when it's you who is being denied freedom, assaulted and treated like shit because of your colour. # INTO THE VALLEY...

Unlike the lefty groups who jumped on the band wagon of the miners struggle we decided to continue our support after the strike was over. Our actual help is pretty minimal (we have no illusions about this) and based on personal links with militant miners in Oakdale colliery (S. Wales). At the present time we send money for sacked miners/prisoners and distribute some literature (including STUFF IT) informally.

Since the end of the strike many left papers have been spouting on about their links with the "MINERS". What are these fabled "links" and are they serving any practical use (other than boosting fake optimism)? We found ourselves included talking about solidarity to other groups without really explaining what we were doing (ie. not very much). It's very easy to pretend that something significant is happening, just to give you, your group or your party (yuk) an ego boost.

A few weeks ago six of us who were involved with supporting the picket at Oldbury Nuclear Power Station visited Oakdale Village for a weekend. The main event was a social evening organised by the "Miner's Wives" (Wimmings) support group at the local Working Men's Club. The first part of the evening was really great, lots of chat with friends that we had met on the picket line. The alcohol flowed freely and we swapped stories of police violence, media liars and the possible future of the struggle. The culture-shock when we refused the meat sandwiches led onto a discussion about veganism and we managed to explain why we weren't dying of malnutrition. This was quite amazing, as before the strike we would have been run outta town for being deviants....

Unfortunately we did leave for a couple of reasons.... We wouldn't stand for the Welsh National Anthem, unlike the lefties who conveniently forgot that the "Working Class" has no country. Our rejection of nationalistic shit didn't go down too well to say the least. As the evening wore on the lads became blads. Soon the sexist jokes were flying around and it became obvious that we were going to be in for a long night of the same old sexist shit. The wives were sent home to look after the kids and the lads were looking for a good night out, whoooooaa!

# WELL FUCK THIS!

Even though it was shit at the end of the night, it was far better than before the strike we're sure. The only way things are gonna change is by showing solidarity with all oppressed groups regardless of their prejudice's. # MONEY for All...

First off you need to be in a University City (Never!) and then you need the services of a student, if you're not one your-self. A full time student is best; but part timers, student nurses or any one of that ilk will do. The idea is to set up an "Anarchist Society", which is going to provide a service to the students- in other words, if it doesn't you are wasting your time, and you'll never get it recognized by the student union, and so not get the loot. Don't worry about this, all it really means is that when you produce your societies aims, you simply sprinkle the word student about alot! There should be no problem about having an "Anarchist Society" as it is "Political", so it is only another view-piont, along with the Tory society etc. The thing to watch for is having done it once, and you find how easy it is, you then want to set up other "Dummy" societies, make sure they are equally worthy, so they can't be turned down before you start. Other fronts can be reading groups, or green groups or even libertarian groups etc.

The way you go about setting up the "Sec" will vary, but should be something like this; Your student visits the union bureaucrat and gets a fist full of forms. One of these will be your members list, and you need to get over a set amount to cop the cash (twenty in Bristol). So you get the signatures of the students, which is easy. You will also need a subscription from each member. If they pay it, good, if not pay it your-self, because depending on how the cash is made up, each sub. is met by an equal or bigger amount from the unions funds. In other words, if you pay the front money, you get it back with more on top!

You now need to list your aims. Any will do, just mention students, and say no hierarchy, as this means you only need one active student as treasurer, to get funds out, and not four or five to fill all the posts (as anarchists, you are opposed to hierarchy anyhow). The only other important thing to put in your aims, is the way you are going to use to liberate the funds. The cash you get, even though they say it is yours, is really only meant for paying for things you may do using the student union's facilities, and who needs that. So say you are going to build up an anarchist library, and write out your own invoices, or when you do printing say that it is A2 size or colour or anything they can't do at the union, and again bill your self, it's easy!

Then you have a form to fill in for the amount you want and why! To start with, try and stay under one hundred pounds, and remember it's for "student" demo's or conferances etc. If you ask for loads, there is a bigger chance of them looking at what your up to. Any way the cash may be given out on the numbers of members you get, rather than on how active you are. If you do all this at the start of September, you should have a University Fair to get members, if it's later in the year you'll have to work a bit harder at getting the names, but only a bit harder! There will be a meeting, at which you have to say "Why" you are doing it, and they say how much cash you get, and at the years end you say how you spent it (They keep a track of this, so you can copy out there figures!) All in all it's simple, so much so that newcomers why unscrupulous folks don't set up a whole host of "Sec's" and get four or five hundred pounds out of it.....

At long last the Bristol Chapter of the Anarchist Black Cross\* stopped talking about fund raising events, and got things sorted out enough to put on a Benefit Gig, at a venue in thrilling central Bristol. Events came together inside a week, so we did not have time to contact everyone who had offered to help, nor could we get the "Trial by Media" video, which was in Scotland.

With a minimal amount of publicity, and a maximum amount of running about by various 'activists', all came good on the night. We had to content ourselves with a general announcement about the Vancouver Five, and Julie Belmas\* in Particular, for whom the benefit was arranged. Things kicked off with the showing of various (almost irrelevant!) videos, which played all night.

Quite a few laughs were then supplied by "Hernia Warthog", a theatre group from Brighton, followed by a stirring performance from a combo whose name escapes me, (SORRY!) and the evening ended with "Lunatic Fringe's" usual quality performance.

All-in-all we raised £77.08, as well as a donation of £25, originally going to the Diner, but due to things (See else where) it was felt that it would be of more use here. So the grand total was over £100, and the whole event was FUN, so we'll be doing it again soonish. By the way, the fabled Drowned Rat Bookstall had an outing and we failed to sell any copies of "The Chinese Anarchist Movement", let alone anything else...Shame!

# 'EVENING ALL?'

Do the Police 'solve' crimes ? Well, from their own figures they only 'solve' twenty percent of the crimes that end up in Court, the other eighty percent are 'solved' by you and I. (This figure ignores the crimes that are never 'solved', or reach Court etc). Yes it is members of the Public coming forward and giving the "Polis" names, leads etc that puts people in Jail, and not the much vaunted 'Detection' skills of the "Boys in Blue".

It is into this context that the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme fits, with the promotion of self Policing and the attempt to legitimise grassing direct to the filth. There is only one thing wrong with the idea of a Neighbourhood Watch, and that is the fact it involves the Polis. If the members of a local Community act together when they see something that they feel is wrong, and those same people are prepared to take responsibility for the 'punishment', then and there, it can only be admired. This is of course the opposite of the way that things are supposed to be done, you are supposed to tell the cops, and if they choose to do anything about it, it will be months after, and a long way away that 'justice' is not seen being done.

The only way that 'punishment', for 'crimes', can really make sense is if those who are put upon, put the 'punishment' upon the offenders.

This is a real Neighbourhood Watch and has nothing to do with the coppers nark nonsense being pushed at us at the moment. It can and does work, as is clearly shown when Asian/Black communities come under attack. The filth either don't give a dam, or are the ones carrying out the attacks, so that the only answer is for the locals to come together and act for themselves. Of course this gets up the noses of the old Bill, but it also outrages the 'left', who can only think in terms of Charlie Bronson and "Death Wish".



There are a whole host of ways of dealing with people who Carry out 'crimes', just as many not involving violence, as there are that do. It is important not to fall into the trap of mistaking similar solutions carried out by the state on the one hand and

by the victims on the other, as the same thing. If the victim, and members of the local community, act it is because they have a real reason to do so, where as the Courts only act if forced to do so, and at such a remove from the events that led to the

Court Case, as to make the whole preceeding meaningless. The punishment for the 'crime' is at times next to nothing compared with the period of time spent, as an innocent, on remand. As for the victim, the delay in 'punishment', can easily break all connection between what happened, and the 'punishment'. It can only be to the good to have summary justice, with each offence being dealt with as and when they occur, by those to whom it has happened. Since as stated at the start the 'guilty' party is almost always known, to some one, the quality of 'justice' can only be improved. Finally to those who would decry "people should not take the law into their own hands", why not because if the law is not for the peoples hands, whose hands is it for...

If reading this piece has stirred up any degree of interest, here's how you can do something about putting it into practice.

In Bristol recently a woman was assaulted by a male. It wasn't at night, and it didn't happen in a back alley in the bad part of town. The 'victim' was not one to go tell the Cop's, so that they could do sod all about it. So instead the assailant was tracked to a local tech, and with the aid of an 'older' anarchist, playing 'Dad', got to see the files, to confirm that the shit head was a student. They then kicked up a stink, causing maximum trouble for him. The next stage happend when a group of fellow anarchists managed to get his photo. This is at this very moment being turned into a poster, with a description of what he does, and soon will be fly posted around the city. Most of us can get a camera, and a photocopier will churn out posters cheaply.

Swerving, to escape the piss-heads, and at last it was escape.

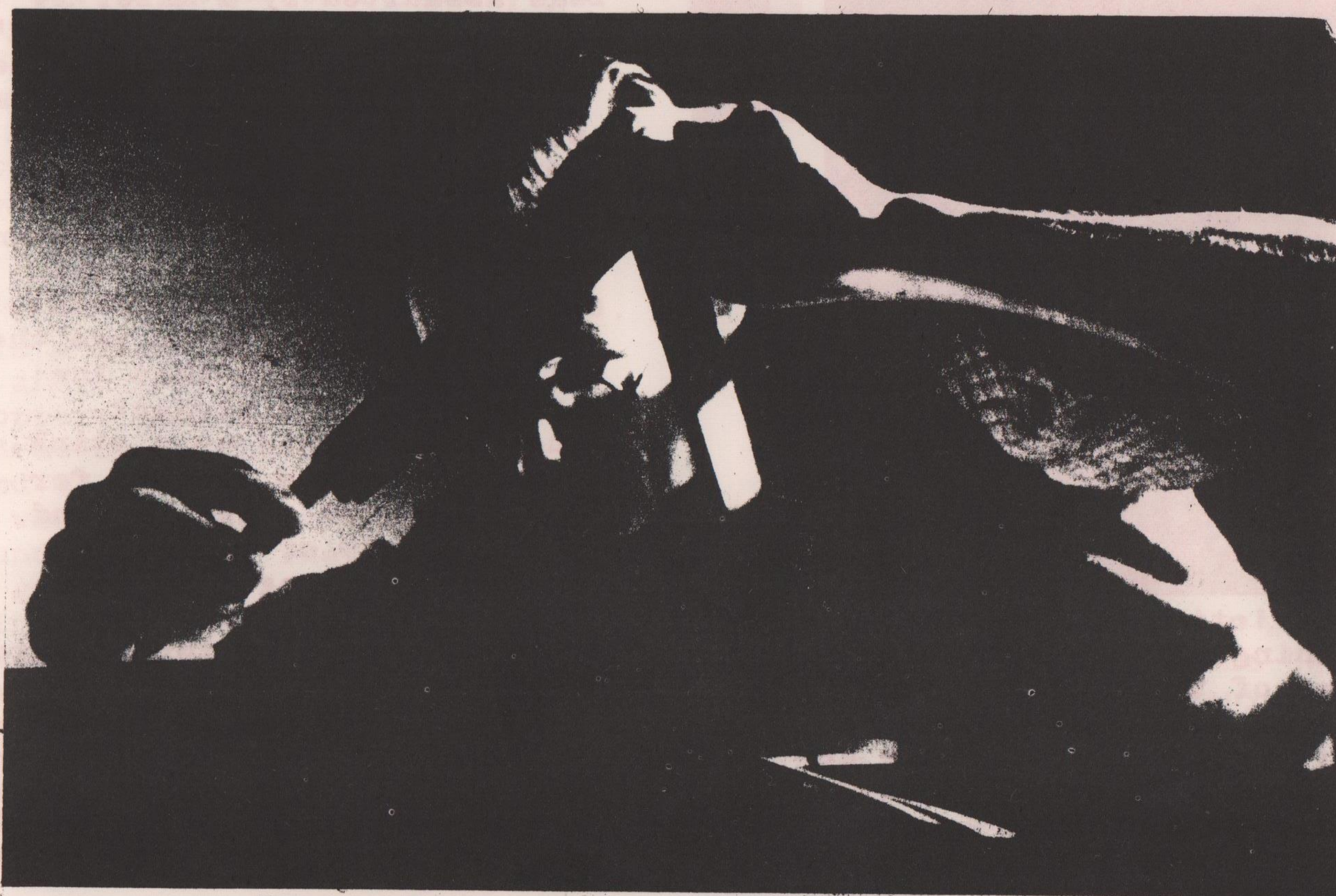
"It's done", and tracking down the entry team, for stage two.

# COMISO Two Years On...

Comiso where some of the 112 American cruise missiles scheduled for deployment are now based, was a typical small south eastern Sicilian town of approx 28000 inhabitants. With no Mafia connections, situated on a very fertile plain with considerable amount of industry based on marble-quarrying. Sicily is of great strategic importance to the Americans with the missiles only 20 minutes away from Col. Gaddafi in Libya should he step too far out of line, (with the obvious interest in the Middle East). The missiles are as much for the East/West conflict as that of the North/South - Comiso is at the centre of the two great divides of this world.

We recently returned to Comiso after an absence of two years to find things had changed dramatically. We walked round the base, closely followed by military police. The old dilapidated airport of Al Magliocco was hardly recognisable, half built missile silos were clearly visible and around the outer fence were signs - with picture for emphasis - or for foreigners? - that trespassers would be shot. Looking at all that construction inside was like watching something out of a Sci-Fi film it was especially incongruous with the local Sicilian architecture. The first signs of cultural attack were there too "English spoken" signs on many of the shops and just outside the base a huge bill-board advertising car sale/hire in "Down-town Comiso".

authorities suppress opposition to the base - with Italian nationals they have expelled them from the Comiso area & Ragusa province, giving them a sort of liberty in exile! All this for exercising constitutional rights in the "free west"? Yet worse was the August 83 blockade when towards the end of a peaceful 3 day blockade police suddenly charged lashing out at demonstrators with truncheons, using tear gas, and even attacking a medical group wearing the red cross.

A more successful story has been the Land buying campaign. Thanks to donations the Italian Tax Objectors, International Peace camp, Cudip, and all the hundreds of donations from individuals who bought a square meter of resistance. Four large plots of land plus cottages have been acquired close to the base - There is Verde Vigna about 15000 m<sup>2</sup> bordering the base, and within eye sight of the main entrance. Here a local group ecologists called Cactus work the land Organically growing grapes for wine, wheat and vegetables. La Ragnatela (spiders web) is nearby there are no women there at the moment (April 85). International Meeting against Cruise (I.M.A.C.), a bit of a tricky one - bought jointly with money from the International Peace Camp and the local Communist dominated peace committee C.U.D.I.P. (who manage to take credit for every peace initiative in Comiso). All the pieces of land are in multi-ownership the idea being that this will considerably slow up the

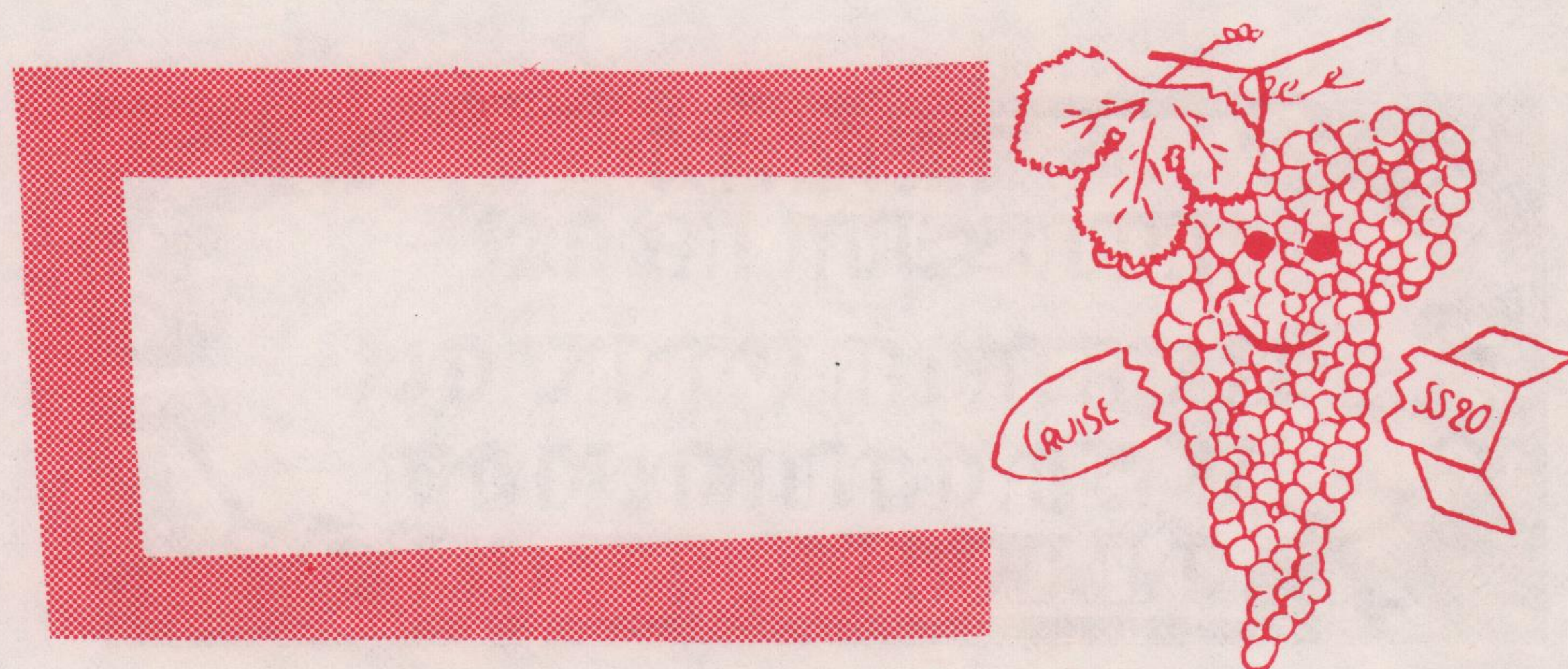


Opposition to the base had started back in 1981 on a local level and in August 82 an International peace camp was set up. It varied its location over the next 6 months eventually being housed in Via G. Morso 29 a house donated by a local shop-keeper. This is now the house of La Ragnatela the women's peace camp. There was also a camp outside the gates of the base for 3/4 months. In the last 2 years there have been many demonstrations including religious ones, trespassings and blockades.



Most of them especially the latter were dealt with very violently by the police. In 83 there was the morning blockade of March 11<sup>th</sup> where one woman got her arm broken and did not receive treatment for days, and 12 women (non Italians) were deported to their respective countries. We went to their appeal on April 18 this year (this delay is typical) against the charge of "Violenza privata" which is literally violence against an individual - ie stopping the lorry drivers going into the base, was a form of "violence". Being committed to Non-Violent action they spent a lot of energy fighting this accusation but were found guilty anyway - 20 days suspended and court costs. Other unwanted non-Italians have been deported or expelled and told never to return. This is the way the

process of expropriation if as seems probable the authorities want to expand the base, as each owner will have to be contacted individually! Expropriations are expected to start soon as there is good evidence that the military (U.S.) have been doing a lot of work on maps, and property owners around the base - ie classification of land etc. A lot of thought is going into how to resist this - the feeling being that people won't do anything until it's actually happening, when it's too late.



Another important area of resistance is against the plans of the military to make a huge training area in the Nebrodi mountains, N.E. of Comiso which would involve a lot of expropriations around the towns of Mistretta, Castel di Lucio, Caronia disrupting farming communities and destroying livelihoods. It seems certain that this plan is not unrelated to the installation of the Cruise missiles and the wish to take them out on manoeuvres. Local people are strongly against the expropriations and the attitude of the authorities. The sudden construction of roads in the area which they've been demanding for decades is viewed with suspicion. Just now the construction of a road as far as Gela - near Comiso has been approved. In Caronia the inhabitants were assured that they wouldn't be affected, the area was 8Kms away. The town's councillor said he'd like to look at the map anyway and found to his horror that on their map Caronia didn't exist - it's former location was only 1km away from the training area and it would lose its newly acquired aqueduct as this was in the firing range and all the trees that supported its charcoal industry!

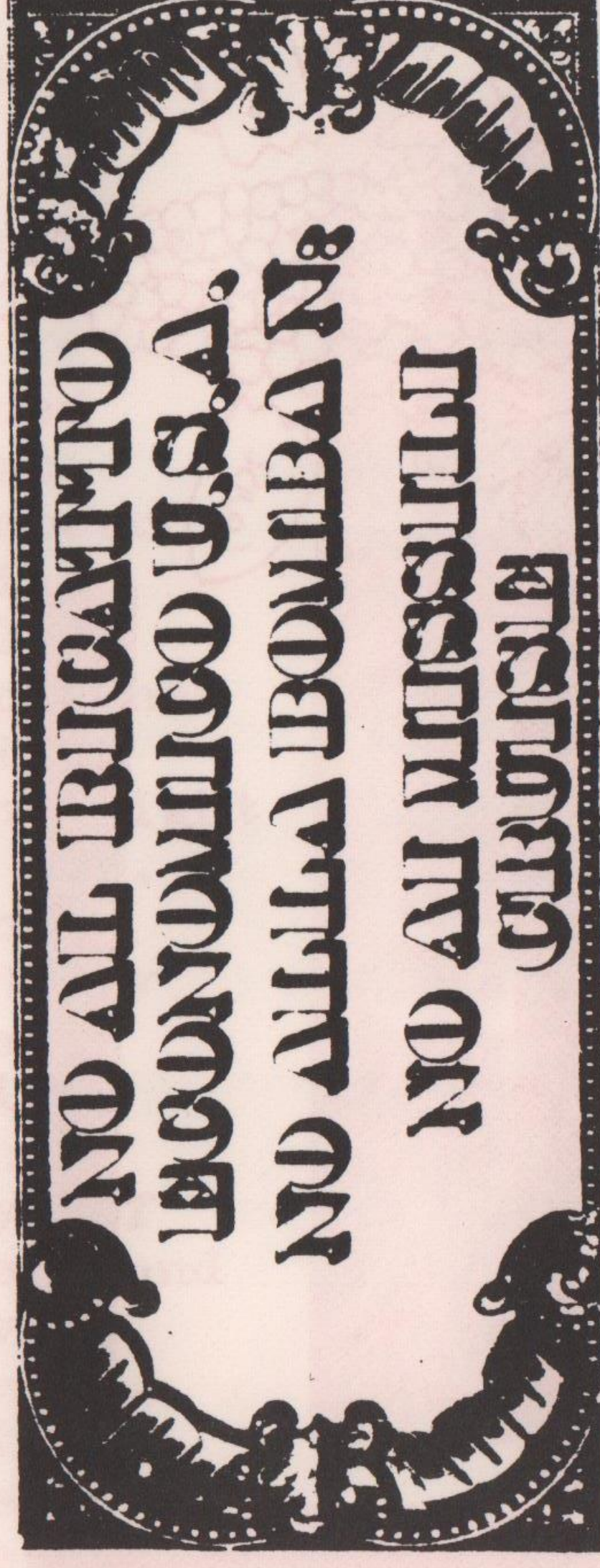


The military plans for the Nebrodi give us all here in Britain a link, with the proposal to close 32 miles of public footpaths on Salisbury plain just north of West Down Plantation where Cruises favorite haunt is.

The latest project of the I.P.C. which seems promising is to buy a house in the town to use as a centre and also for workshops, crafts to hopefully get peace activists more involved in the local community- Also the groups at Verde Vigna are hoping to open a whole food café. Another way of involving local people in "peace" issues is through local politics where, very popular in Sicily owing to the vast number of political parties. Alfonso Navarra, who spent 7 months in jail on bail in "preventative d tention" after defying an order not to return to Comiso after trespassing at the base, is currently standing as a candidate for the "Green list" in the local elections. Even if he is not elected, through canvassing etc he is raising a lot of issues - as well as exposing the hypocrisies of the local Communists who do not campaign against the base and are preparing for an historic compromise - coalition with the Christian Democratic party?! (very right wing).



We found very few activists or pacifists as they always get called, actually present and active in Comiso. Some Italians had returned to their own towns and were involved in other things, foreigners previously active were still under deportation orders - for what ever reason, energy was at a low ebb (perhaps if Greenham had been nearly as far away from some of the most major town as say the Orkneys, then maybe we would have ebbed as well) and people were thin on the ground. One English woman who'd been the sole representative of Ia Ragnetela for quite a while got expelled while we were there, also 3 Italians were arrested for blockading at Easter and were still in prison when we left.



This summer there will be work camps on the building at Verde Vigna although only 4 people can stay on the site. There are other places nearby if more people arrive. The work includes reconstruction of the roof of the lean-to destroyed by the wind, plastering internal and external walls, plumbing and flooring. 30-35 hours work per week are anticipated. Board and lodging will be provided by Verde Vigna. The people who work in Verde Vigna are all local and there should be a good opportunity to appreciate the situation in Comiso. 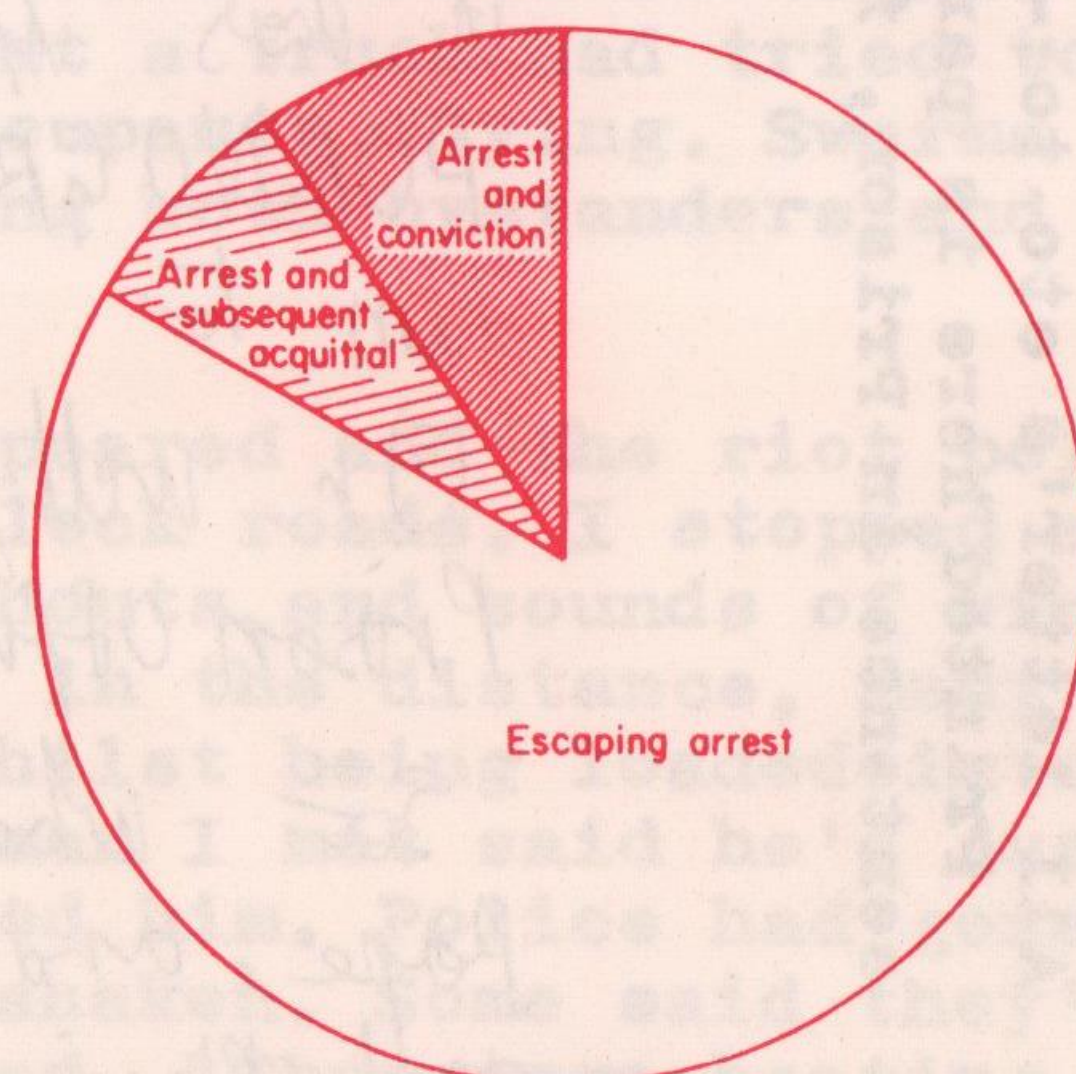


Figure 1.2 The professional criminal's chances.

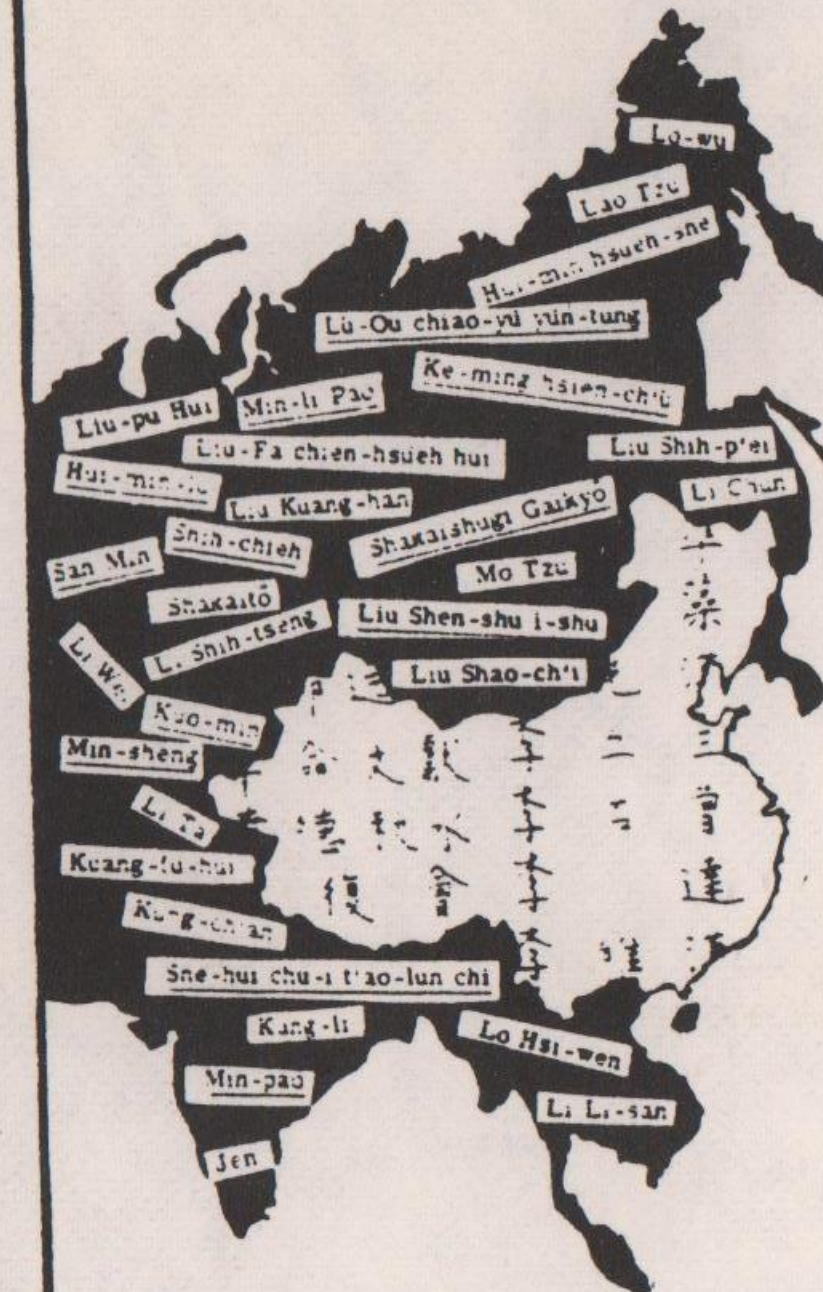

### The CHINESE Anarchist Movement



"The Chinese Anarchist Movement" is a  
very interesting pamphlet just issued  
by the Drowned Rat Publications Group

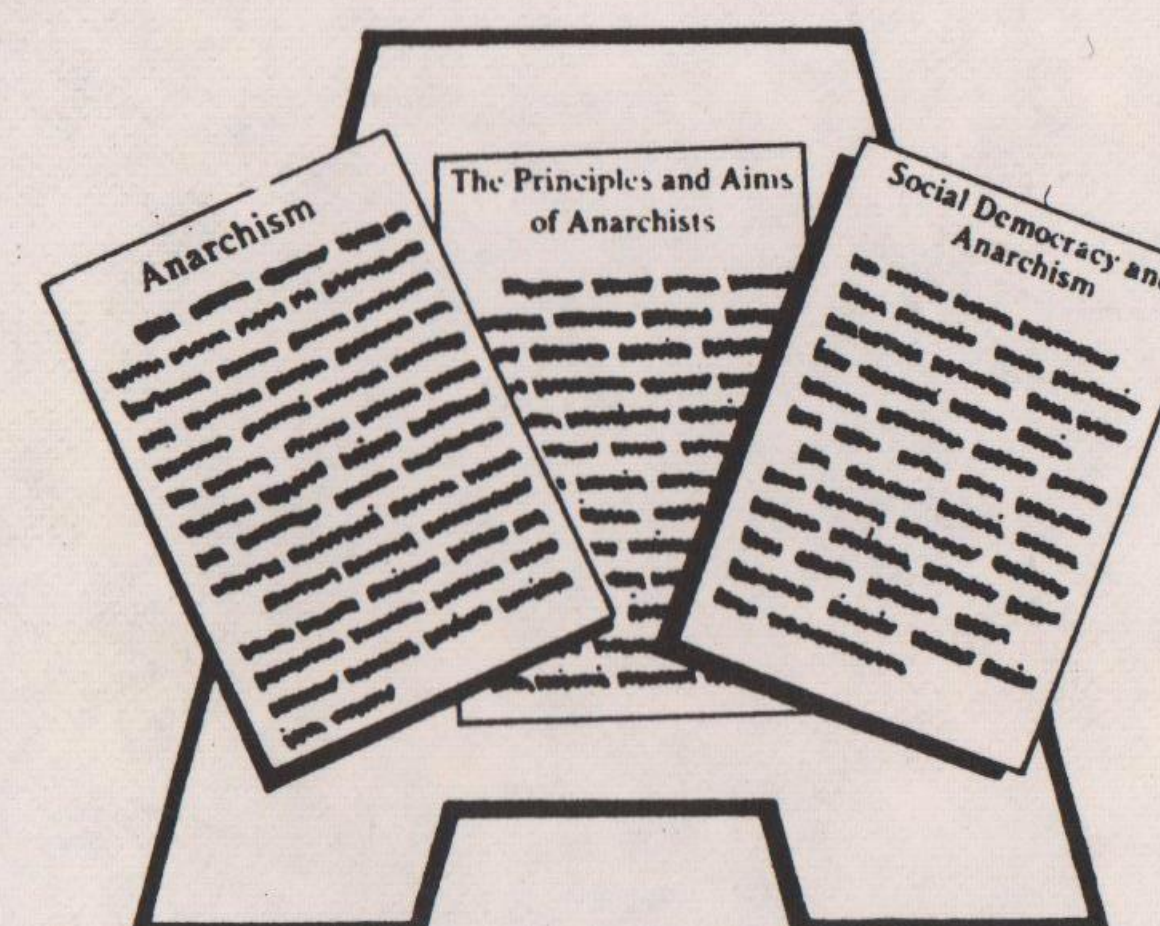
