Parliamentary attacks on health, women, education, unions, blacks & sexuality all herald the swift slide of the democratic charade into parliamentary fascism. The



only way to overturn the wrongs of the past and to alter our apocalyptic future is to mobilise all the now-divided sections of the working class in unity and destroy every last particle of the ruling class and their lackeys-our oppressors. Now Thatcher has, (with the help of scab union beaurocracy) unleashed the ruling classes revenge on the workers by attempting to destroy the potentially dangerous feeling of working class solidarity, banking on division and self-interest to break the rank and file.

The miners, printworkers, railway workers and healthworkers (to name but 4) all have faced up to the physical intimidation of a ruling class on the run. Union executives see great personal gain in working class defeat and enslavement, and this will support the ruling class to the hilt. They are leeches on our class; shown perfectly by the T.U.C.'s retiscence on solidarity action for any section of workers and against antiworking class legislationparticularly now with reference to the Poll Tax.

The Labour party and the TGWU are currently in the process of trying to avert an inevitable confrontation of interests; between the dockers and the ruling class over the renewal of employment rights. Now we must anticipate all out action by the dockers. Together we can reverse the tide of defeat & despair, Together the rank & file can and must win; the future of our world is at stake.

## What's the connection between McDonald's and starvation in the 'Third World'?



THERE's no point feeling guilty about eating while watching starving African children on TV. If you do send money to Band Aid, or shop at Oxfam, etc., that's morally good but politically useless. It shifts the blame from governments and does nothing to challenge the power of multinational corporations.

#### HUNGRY FOR DOLLARS

• McDonald's is one of several giant corporations with investments in vast tracts of land in poor countries, sold to them by the dollar-hungry rulers (often military) and privileged elites, evicting the small farmers that live there growing food for their own people.

The power of the US dollar means that in order to buy technology and manufactured goods, poor countries are trapped into producing more and more food for export to the States. Out of 40 of the world's poorest countries, 36 export food to the USA – the wealthiest.

#### ECONOMIC IMPERIALISM

children are undernourished, are actually exporting their staple crops as animal feed—i.e. to fatten cattle for turning into burgers in the 'First World' Millions of acres of the best farmland in poor countries are being used for our benefit—for tea, coffee, tobacco, etc.—while people there are starving. McDonald's is directly involved in this economic imperialism, which keeps most black people poor and hungry while many whites grow fat.

### DEATH BY MONEY

HILLSBOROUGH has become another name to add to the enormous list of wasted lives. Feople speak of 'learning the lessons of Hillsborough'. But if the lessons of Manchester Airport, Bradford, Heysel and the Herald of Free Enterprise had been learnt then the Hillsborough tragedy might have been avoided.

What all these have in common is they all involved the processing of people through time or space in the name of entertainment, holiday and sport. One of the central purposes of the economy-the leisure society. The necessity of making as much money out of people as possible. Because these experiences are associated with pleasure (football matches, air and sea travel) it is easy to disregard the dangers; non fire proof seats on aircraft. overloaded ferries and football grounds that prove to be deathtraps.


It is only when things go wrong that we see the value placed on human life by those behind this.

People trapped at Hillsborough said they felt like animals in a zoo. Watched by the cameras of the media, police videos and computers. Thousands of pounds worth of electronic surveillance equipment to watch every scream yet not help. Loctors present said there was no oxygen and no defibrillators. But with the cameras we were treated to a real life tragedy on our T.V.

Football, unlike other large crowd scenes in society (shopping centres, pop concerts etc.) is perhaps the only remaining part of social life where a partisar passion in engaged, and it is a passion of locality.

The passion that emerges of the mainly working class crowd continues to be the object of great anxiety and suspicion to the state. The unruly, defiant and unpredictable mob in a society where all other passions are tame and controllable. Imagine if we could harmess that energy to social and political endevour and you realise the states insistence on surveillance equipment, crowd barriers and now the identity card scheme.


What an irony is the states obsession with identity cards when a sense of identity is what many people are trying to reclaim. For what differentiates Sheffield, Liverpool, Manchester, Nottingham, and Leeds with their homogenous housing estates, shopping centres and the identical service sector economy.

The 'fans' are again the subject of the blame and humiliation from all commentators. Indeed there is already the great gulf which exists between the 'fans' and the 'stars' with the inflated transfer fees, publicity no matter how trivial. They are remote from their followers who have to be content with their place behind bars at grounds, the wall poster of the team and the fantasy.

The identity cards are not just a blatant attack on our civil rights by the ruling class, but also a part of the phychological war being waged on the 'public', forcing them to take a humble view of themselves - as belittled and a partial

account of a human being.

As with industries like air and sea travel, (no longer seen as 'services' but as profit orientated affairs) football is no longer an amiable Saturday afternoon pastime but part of the remorseless money making machinery of the ruling classes. How fitting it was to see advertising hoardings used in the place of the absent stretchers.



## AN INJURY TO ONE

On April 22nd the British National Party (BNP) held their public local election campaign meeting at Alderman Newton Secondary School, New Parks. Although the meeting was opposed by both staff and pupils (many of whom attended the simultaneous protest), law dictates that even fascist groups are allowed to use schools for election purposes. In the BNP's case this is a blatant manipulation of election laws; in the name of democracy they are allowed premises to use for the organisation of rallying meetings. The only true public in attendance at the meeting were those protesting.

From 1pm onwards 300 protesters, 20 police vans, 6 ambulances, hundreds of police, many with dogs gathered outside the school.

At the meeting, John Peacock (New Parks BNP candidate) and John Tyndall (BNP leader) ensighted their following, of about 50, through megaphones. Most of the BNP supporters having come from outside Leicestershire. The protesters who were allowed in (about 80) were kept seperated from the BNP by lines of police. The meeting closed with Hitler salutes and calls of 'sigue heil' from Union Jack waving Nazi's. About 30 protesters were arrested, 2 of whom have since been charged. Suprisingly no fascists were arrested!

-Ansell's brewery are trying to close down O'Jays bar, which provides a free venue for music, unless a benefit is being played. Recent benefit have included Hunt Sabs, P&O strikers in Dover, Animal concern etc. The venue also provides cheap rehersal rooms for many local bands. On Sun. 30th April, they demonstrated just how violent they can be. About 8 members of Leicester Animal Concern were holding a peaceful demo outside the circus, holding banners and handing out leaflets, when Phil Gandey came out and grabbed a banner from a protester and broke it in half (bashing the protester round the head as he did it). Then a woman from the circus pulled a female protesters hair and repeatedly punched her in the face. If this is how they treat peaceful campaigners, imagine how they treat their animals!

The "Axe the Poll Tax" posters being put up around by the Leicester Against Poll Tax are VITAL. You must put these in your window-most people will only want to avoid paying if they are sure that there are enough people doing likewise. The only way people can kno know you're not raying is by butting something in your window that says so! It may be unwise to actually state "I'm not paying" (i.e. "I'm breaking the law") as the filth may get onto you, but try to make your position clear. The LAPT posters will propably do and you should get one through your door.
