Centre, what Centre?

Earlier this year, a general meeting of members decided to assess the viability of a property - 259 Mansfield Road - with an intention to buy. A cafe co-op was formed, business plans drawn up and much hard work undertaken - our thanks to all involved.

After several months of consideration, it became clear that whilst the building was eminently suitable as a centre, the location was not, both from a community and cafe business perspective. The work carried out has not been in vain, what it has achieved is raising the profile of the group enormously; membership has risen from 200 to 300 people with this giving Out House the skills and talent of new people to move forward with.

An Apology

Our apologies for the lack of Newsletters this year, this has been due in part to the enormous rise in new members and other administration.

Which way NOW?

With a committed intention of 300 people, £60,000 plus and the backing of the City Council in the shape of a community development worker but with no building or immediate prospect, where now?

After much consultation, outreach and strategy planning meetings, it is obvious that we need to refocus and define the steps to fulfill the target of opening our centre. Our secretary, Paul Amann, is therefore, coordinating the production of possible business plans for our centre. Whilst recognising that business planning does not sit comfortably with the community service provision that Out House is aspiring to, business planning is seen as necessary to convince backers to fund us through grants, loans or other means.

These plans will provide focus as to what is feasible for us to take on now and what we will need to do to achieve our aims. They will incorporate the aspirations of the community as received through the market research that has been carried out. They will also draw upon the expertise of the community development worker in checking where we might get any extra funds.

These will be presented for consultation in the General Meeting on Tuesday, 23 January.

Consulting

Over the past six months, there has been much outreach work by Out House. This has seen us taking the time to involve the community in our project, raise membership and take note of opinions. New market research questionnaires (see enclosed) and new membership forms have attracted new people to the project and ensured that people are passing on their views. Local pubs and clubs have hosted our displays, and members have spoken at meetings of various local LGB groups.

If you are interested in getting involved with outreach, or have any ideas about outreach - let us know. Paul Amann is coordinating much of this and would love to have some help and/or ideas. The display stall will be at the Birthday Party at the Admiral Duncan on Friday 15 December - see over!

The results of the market research will be processed for presentation at the January meeting - but they are already showing some interesting responses:

- Computer Software

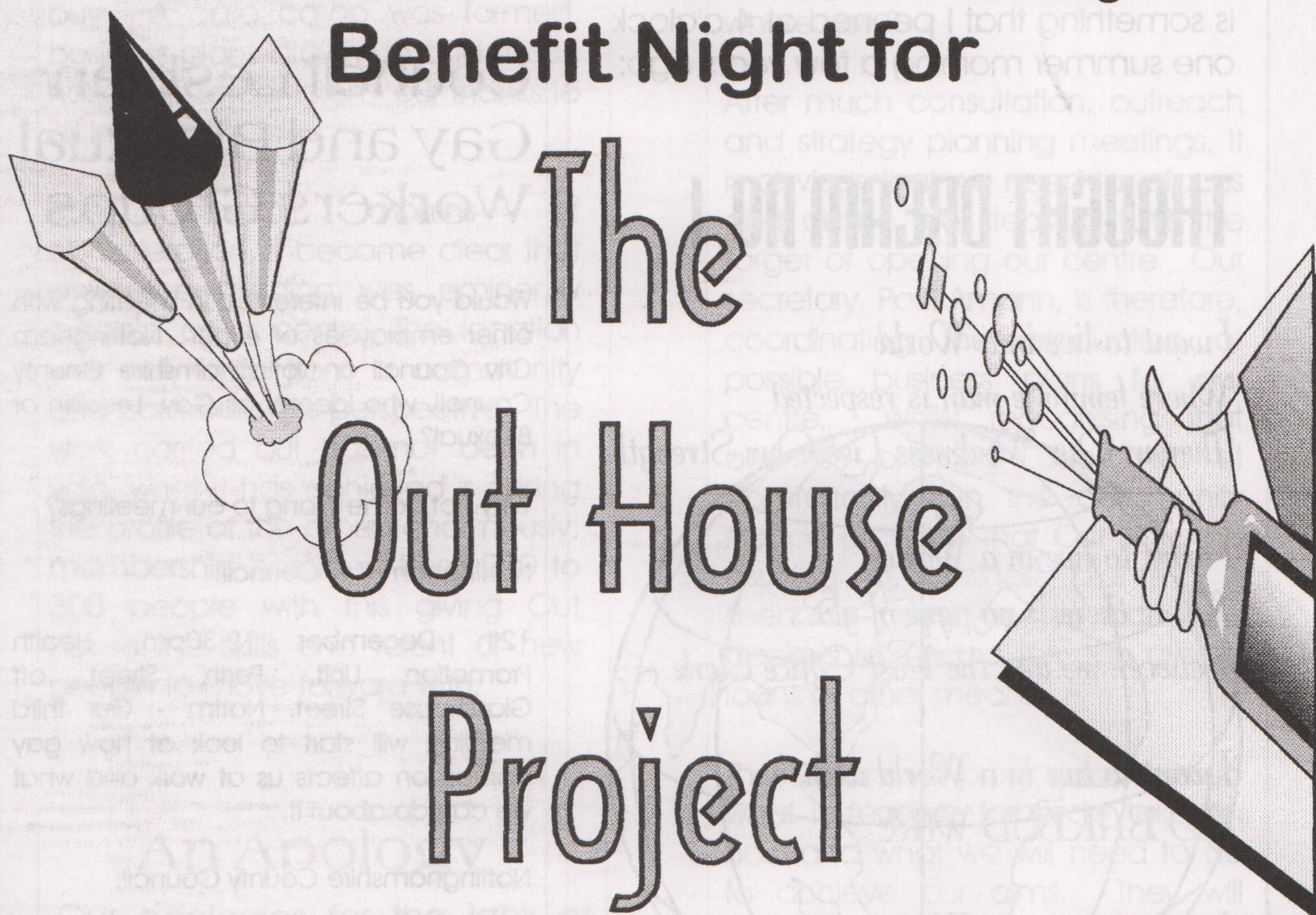
