Project Pehchan

1, Aims & Objectives

Project Pehchan was set up in 1984 to meet the special needs of Asian young people.

Its prime functions are:

- 1, Providing support, assistance, training in the development of existing youth groups.
- 2, Helping to identify issues amongst the Asian young people, i.e. Unemployed, Homeless ness, and helping to resolve these.
- 3, Providing training to workers, volunteers and other interested individuals through County Council or by other means.
- 4, Providing help in the development of recreational and social activities.
- 5, Helping to develop cultural activities, i.e. Arts, etc.
- 6, Helping to promote exchange youth visits locally, nationally and internationally.
- 7, Offering Advice, Counselling and Information to young people and youth groups.

While the project is run by the County Council, responsible for the financing, supervision and staffing, the policies are agreed by a Policy Steering Group consisting of politicians and equal members from voluntary asian youth groups.

2. Resource Centre

Objectives:

- 1, The collection of culturally relevant information and material for young people.
- 2, Development of specialist material deal with Asian issues, for example, training material, information packs.
- 3, Dissemination of information by:
 - i) material for distribution to different centres and groups;
 - ii) development of training for staff and volunteers in special skills for use in their groups;
 - iii) a newsletter whereby Pehchan groups and centres can publicise each others work and activities.
- 4, Support the work of colleagues.
- 5, Provide resources for people using the base as a Drop-In centre.

Tumhara Naam Kya Hai?

→ (What Is your name?)

In Britain, the naming system generally used involves one or more personal names followed by a surname which is shared by the whole family.

In the Indian sub-continent however, the naming system involves the use of names which are shared by a person's or sub-caste.

Let's look at the Sikh, Hindu and Muslim naming systems.

SIKH NAMES:

The title Kaur (meaning princess) for females (both single and married) and Singh (meaning lion) for males is used in Sikh names. Sikhs have a personal name, followed by Kaur or Singh, which is followed by the name of the whole family. e.g. Mohinder Singh Sandhu; Gurmit Kaur Sandhu.

Sometimes, however, the surname is dropped, so that the individual calls him/herself e.g. Mohinder Singh or Gurmit Kaur.

On marriage, a woman takes her husband's surname only if he uses it. Otherwise she can call herself Mrs/Ms. Kaur (instead of Mrs/Ms Sandhu).

Most of the personal names can equally apply to women and men. The title Kaur alone indicates that the name in question belongs to a female.

Children should be addressed by their personal name. Adults should be addressed as Mr. Sandhu Mrs/Miss/Ms. Sandhu etc., if they use their sub-caste name. Otherwise as Mr.----- Singh or Mrs/Miss/Ms. -----Kaur.

There is no correct way of spelling Asian names which using the western alphabet. Each individual chooses like he/she decides is nearest to the spoken word. This spelling is then generally adopted in order to avoid confusion.

Asian people suffer the use of their name in a badly pronounced and badly spelt and misunderstood form. This can be avoided by learning about the systems, correct pronunciation and spelling, thus showing respect and understanding.

Over a number of years there has been an increased involvement of black workers in Youth & Community Work, both within the statutory and voluntary sectors of Nottingham.

Their contribution has been from an **black perspective** in terms of approaches, methods and evaluation of work.

However, recently Asian workers have begun to closely examine their own practices in relation to working with Asian young people in their respective communities - hence this has resulted in discussion and debate around Asian Youth & Community Work and Training needs being identified.

The 3 day residential was to bring together Asian Youth & Community workers from various settings to address some of the issues that have been raised but, most importantly, to identify and complement the various styles and nature of our work and to develop a coherent approach to Asian Youth & Community work, in order to meet the demands of the Asian community in Nottingham.

OUTCOME:

The 3 day course was a very positive experience and helped individuals/ organisations to stimulate discussions around the issue(s) of what is Asian Youth & Community Work.

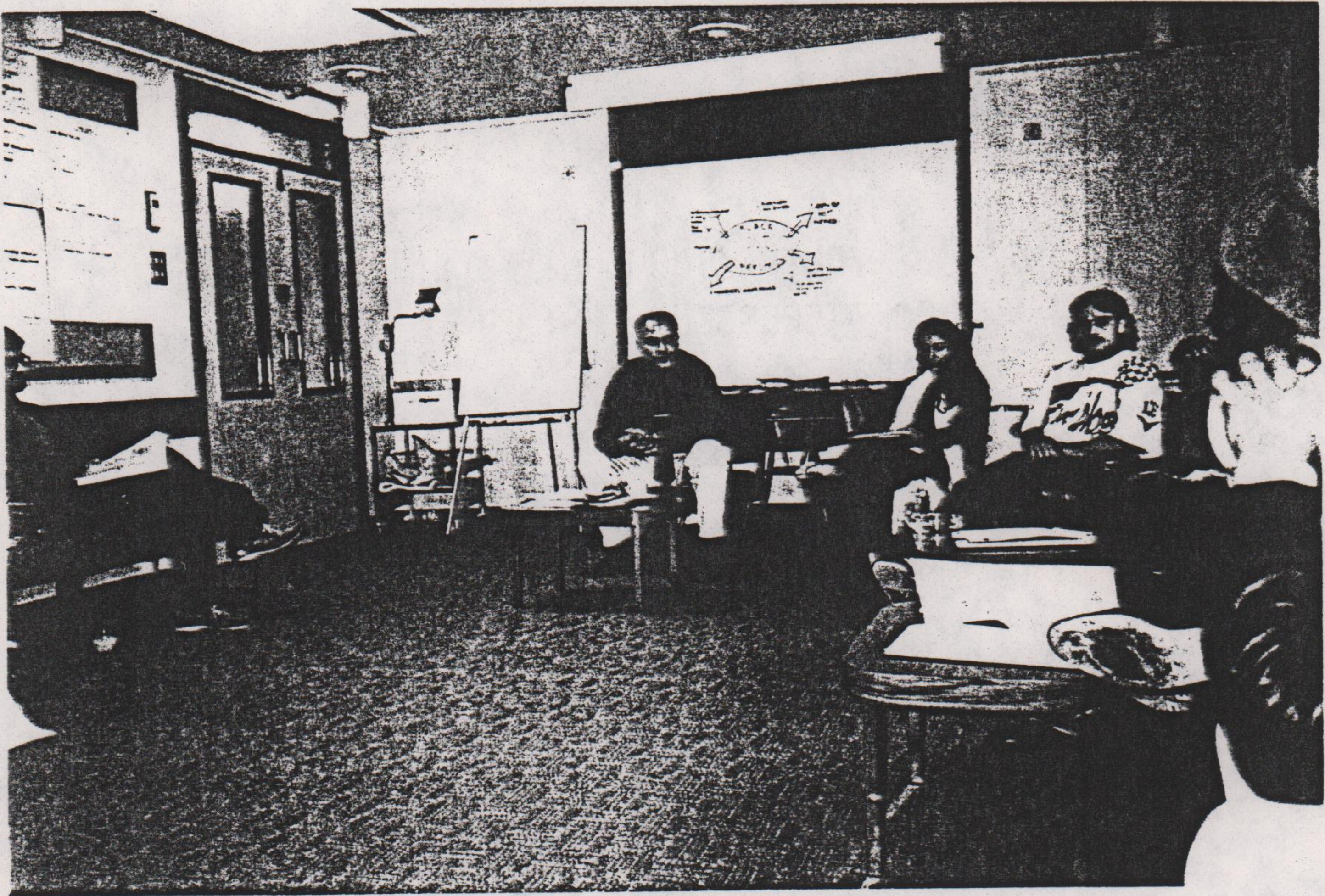
It gives us an opportunity to:-

- To identify constraints in our work and strategies to overcome them.

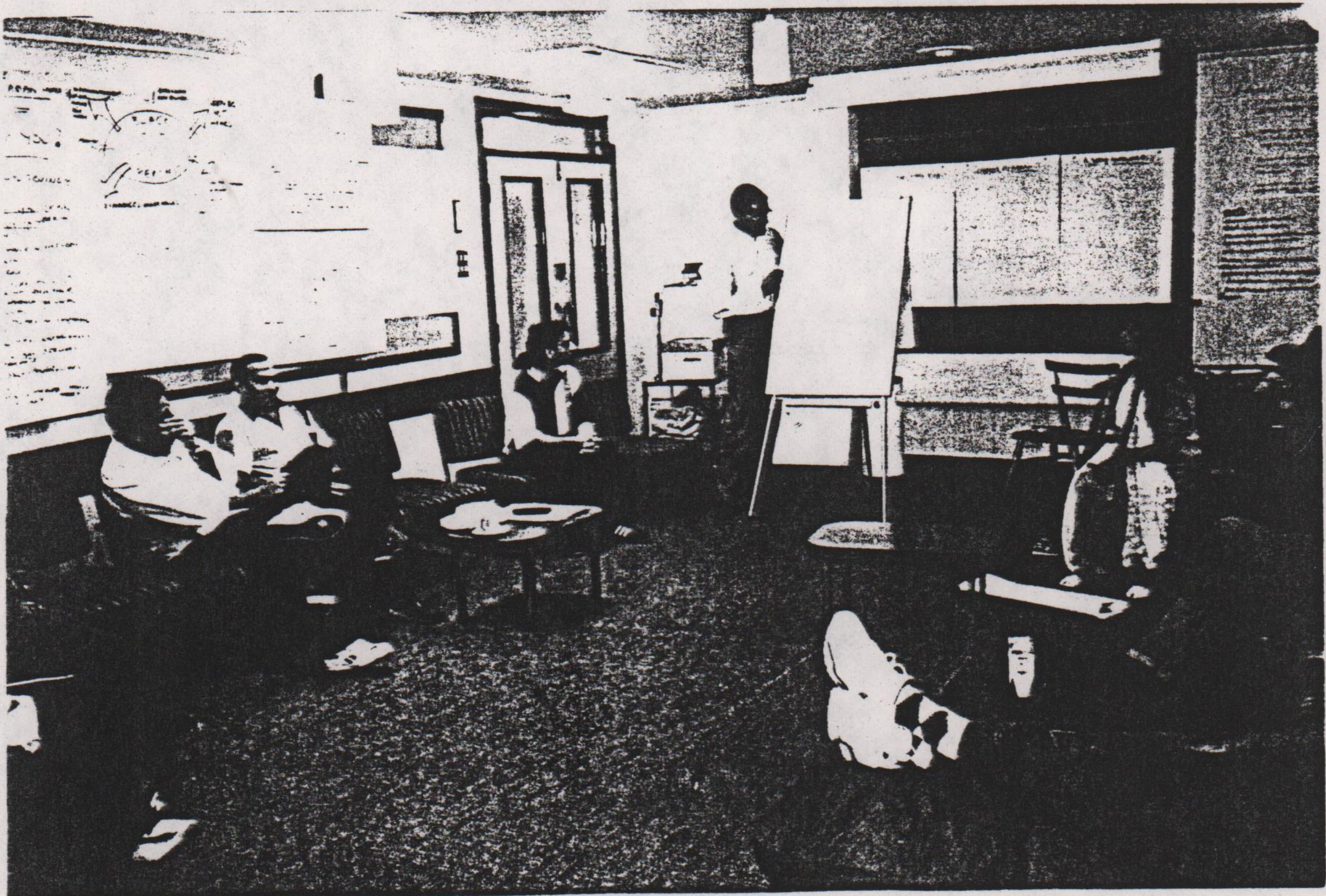

Youth and Community Centre

The Youth Centre offers ample opportunities for various groups to use its facilities. The large hall can be used for Badminton, Football, Table-Tennis, Netball and Volleyball. The T.V. lounge can be used for discussion groups, meetings as well as for Snooker, Music, Darts etc. It also has facilities for refreshments and the Kitchen is equipped with modern facilities for cooking.

The centre will be used for day time activities for the Unemployed, a Drop-In Coffee Bar, and Information and Advisory services, the Elderly, Girls and Womens groups and the promotion of Cultural and Social activities. These are some of many new initiatives now being promoted.

The centre will be exclusively used by the young people, supervised by qualified workers, for at least 4 nights a week.

Community groups and organisations are encouraged to make full use of these resources.

There are many people who are helping in the development of the Project and its various activities throughout the city.

There is a team of full-time, part-time seconded workers and volunteers who are there to ensure that policies are implemented and issues are brought to the attention of relevant agencies through a Policy Steering Group.

1. The collection of culturally relevant information and material for young people.
2. Development of specialist material dealing with Asian issues, for example training material, information packs.
3. Dissemination of information by:
 - i. material for distribution to different centres and groups.
 - ii. development of training for staff and volunteers in special skills for use in their groups.
 - iii. a newsletter whereby Pehchan groups and centres can publicise each others work and activities.
4. Support the work of colleagues
5. Provide resources for people using the base as a Drop-in Centre.

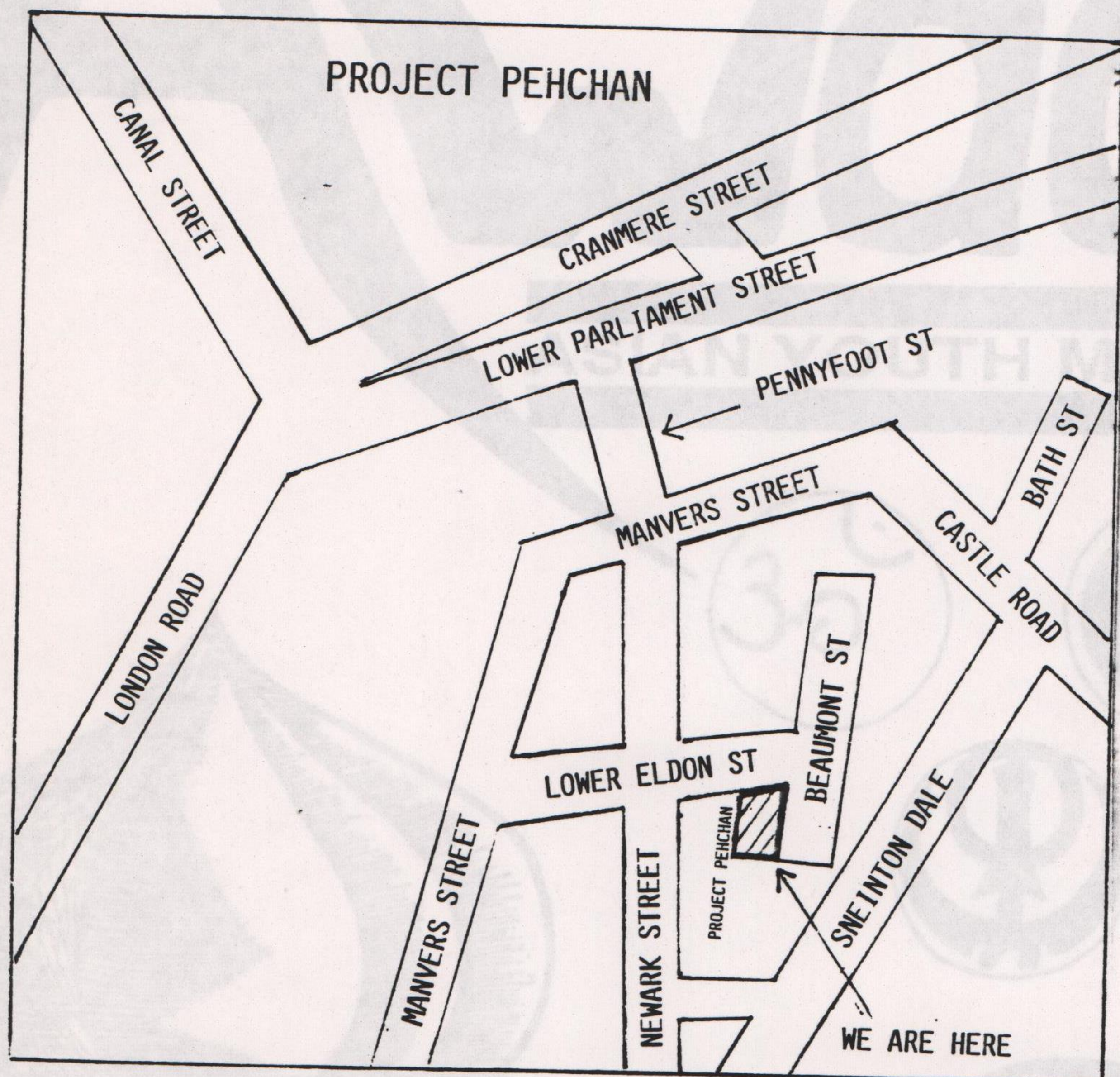
Sports Equipment
