Things have improved somewhat in recent months. You will be glad to hear that Frank Rowe, whom you spoke with in Hyde Park last year, has re-joined, and that we have several more new members.

In Liverpool, the old U.A.C. group has disbanded, due mainly to lack of any *raison-d'etre*. That leaves Fude, Kistly and Tom Fullard as an S.W.F. nucleus.
