Dear Sir,

We wish to thank you for the six copies received of 'Direct Action' with particular reference to your report on Rival Lampo Dispute.

This dispute has been a long drawn out struggle for Trade Union Principles in this establishment. We have had the co-operation of many Trade Union Organisations throughout the country. G. E. C. works at Wembley on Sept 26th 1952 sent the following resolution to their management.

Mr. Britton.

In the matter of the dispute at Rival Lampo we the organised workers of No. 11. Factory, regret that we find it necessary in order to defend Trade Union conditions, to refrain from handling orders from this firm whilst the dispute is in being.

This resolution should bring about the early conclusion as G. E. C. are the only suppliers of tungsten wire needed for production of Lampo.

Members of the Strike Committee have tried to contact

Bro. A. Deakin General Secretary of the T. G. W. U. with the sole aim of blackening gascoes supplied by B.O.C. of Wembley. Up to date our efforts have not met with very much success, if this co operation could be gained we feel sure this dispute could be brought to a successful conclusion within a fortnight.
