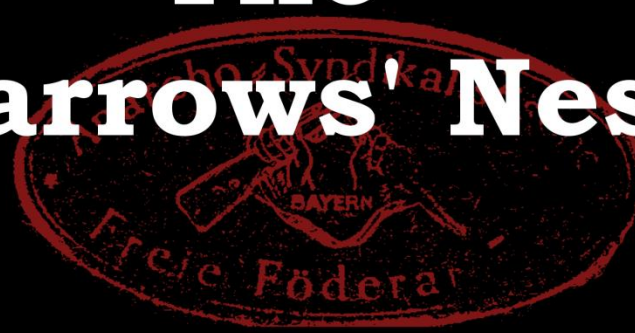

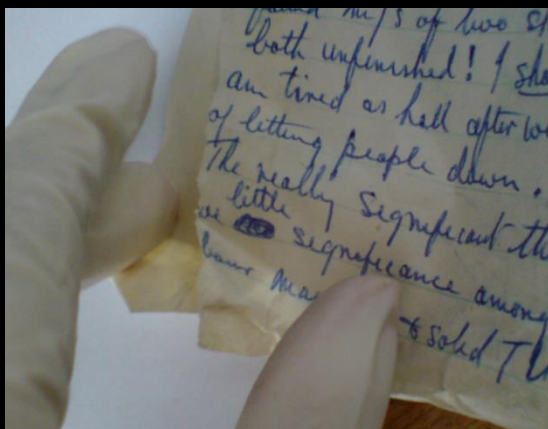

Ron's Collection -

Syndicalist materials 1940s-1960s

Ron's Collection is an amazing treasure trove of leaflets, newspaper cuttings and (most numerous and interesting) letters, providing fascinating insights into the history of syndicalist groups and individuals, active in Britain and around the world. Please browse the table below by either using your browser's search function or scrolling merrily about.

The documents primarily record activities of the Anarchist Federation of Britain (AFB), which subsequently became the Syndicalist Workers' Federation (SWF), between the 1940s and the early 1960s. The collection therefore provides researchers with unique source material on a period often overlooked in the history of radical politics, the years between the end of the Spanish Civil War and the iconic events of the late 1960s.

Part of the collection's importance is that it not only contains information on British syndicalists, but on groups and people from all over the world and with very different politics. For instance, the processed documents were sent to and from 25 different countries, feature six languages and refer to a total of 195 groups, parties, trade unions, committees etc. as well as 71 different publications.

Ron's Collection is complemented by the [archive of the Solidarity Federation \(SolFed Collection\)](#). Whereas Ron's Collection contains mostly internal documents, the SolFed Collection includes many of the AFB/SWF's publications, such as papers and pamphlets.

The Sparrows' Nest holds the archives of a number of organisations and individuals, e.g.

- Anarchist Federation
- Solidarity Federation
- Ron's Collection

These contain published materials as well as unpublished sources.

Members of the London Group have been dissatisfied for some time with the apparent stagnation of our movement. Since the election of the Labour Government in 1945 the AFB has not developed as we anticipated at the Glasgow Congress. Members have lapsed and have not been replaced by new blood, organised Anarchist activity in Scotland - keystone of our movement during the war - has ceased, and our propaganda elsewhere has, to a large extent, fallen on deaf ears. Our work on the international field, for the formation of a World Anarchist Federation has not borne fruit - indeed, our position was decisively rejected at the International Congress in Paris last Autumn.

successful syndicalist activity. The AFB clearly lacks the organisational form both to attract discontented workers and to give an alternative to T.U. organisation.

After lengthy discussion on the basis of the above points, the London Group has decided to submit the following proposals to provincial comrades:-

1. That the AFB should transform itself into an organisation which will concern itself solely with syndicalist propaganda and action.

2. That this organisation should aim: firstly, at carrying out industrial propaganda and forming, where possible, rank-and-file groupings in the different industries; secondly, to act as a liaison organisation between these groupings and; thirdly, to provide, by these means, the basis for a National Confederation of Labour in this country.

We have received alarming news concerning the situation of the Spaniards detained in Madrid and Barcelona, accused of subversive activities. A Military Tribunal has demanded the death penalty for one of them, a young student. All of them are young libertarians (Youth Movement of the C.N.T.).

These trials by Franco's regime are direct attempts against the freedom and dignity of the Spanish people. We are conscious of the reasons that allow the continuity of this regime, but we rely on the humanitarian feelings of those who defend the elementary rights of justice.

The young student, Jorge Conill Vall, is in danger.

We appeal to you and your friends to make every possible effort to save his life.

In solidarity with the Spanish people, we need your support, either using your known influence by writing to the Press, to the United Nations or any other means available.

May Day in Dundee

For the first time there was an Anarchist contingent on the May Day march in this city. Eighteen people marched under the Dundee Anarchists' banner (a red one with black lettering - the only red banner on the march).

Before moving off a Labour Party official said to one of our group "We'll allow you to take part in our march if you behave yourselves." He was reminded that May Day belongs to the people, not to any particular faction. Another LP man drove a car into the Communist contingent, nearly knocking a young woman over. He then called a cop and told him to prevent the commies and

Anarchists from taking over Labour march. However, he was overruled by another official and we set off.

Half the cheap housing is being pulled down to make more office space that won't be used while the other half is in the clutches of the University. The Council shits spend our money on shopping centres for the rich to get richer, then expect us to swallow "rate-capping" and "land shortage" crap.

Inspired by a copy of the Squatters' Handbook, we took the anarchistic approach to housing. Thake's cycle shop (22 rooms) in the centre of town was bought by the Council to widen the road! The bumbling bureaucracy has now changed its mind (after the Tories lost control) and doesn't know what to do with the building. We did. We moved in in the early hours of Saturday 7th September. As well as somewhere for us to live we plan to start a vegetarian cafe, a wimmin's space, a creche and a few other things

Before we can do that we need help and money for repairs and clearing up. From this base we hope to open up squats for others in our situation. If you want to help or you need help to house yourself, come and see us at Thake's in East Road. Why let your rent support the rich - SQUAT THE LOT!

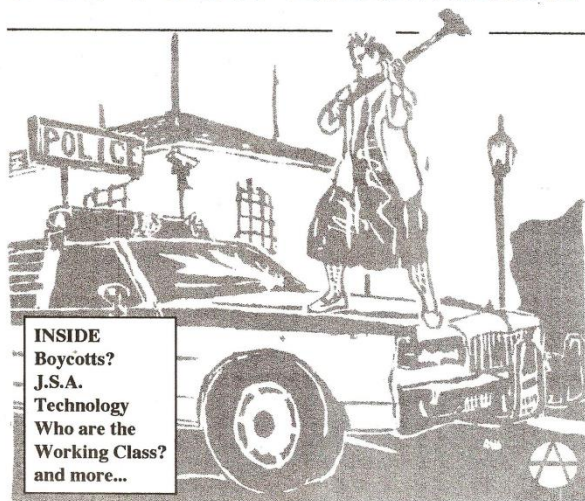

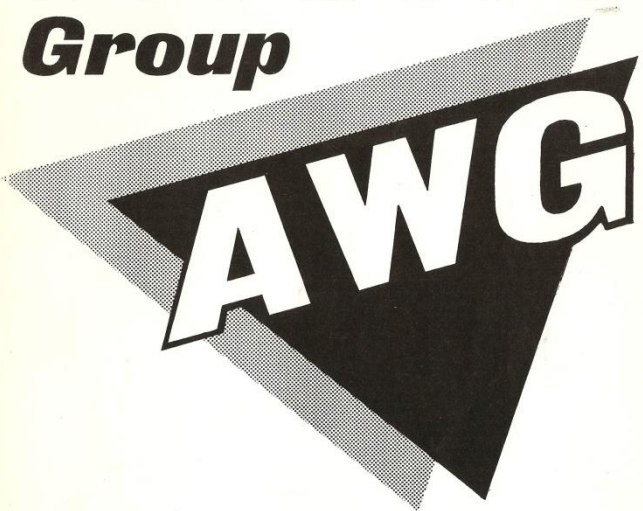

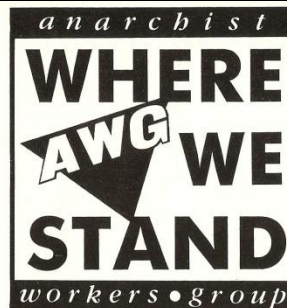

Founding Statement



UNDER CAPITALISM the workers produce the wealth of the world but neither own nor control the produce of their labour. Capitalism creates poverty, starvation, unemployment, waste, pollution, war and the threat of nuclear annihilation. Only when the working class seize control of, and plan production, for use not profit, can human needs be satisfied.

THERE IS no parliamentary road to socialism. The company directors, top civil servants, security and army chiefs and landlords exercise real power and will prevent parliament from legislating for fundamental social change. The power of the ruling class can only be contested effectively at the point of production which is primarily where socialists must organise.

THE STATE is an instrument of class domination and cannot be used in any way to further the interests of the working class. All gains conceded by our rulers can only be defended through the class struggle. The capitalist courts, local councils and industrial arbitration bodies cannot serve as a substitute for direct action by workers. The state cannot be reformed, bypassed or brought under democratic control. It must be destroyed and replaced by the power of workers councils.

THERE CAN be no socialism in one country. Capitalist production is international and therefore, social revolution must be international in order to succeed. The working class have no country; British workers have no common interests with their bosses. As internationalists we side with all oppressed peoples fighting imperialism whilst promoting the primacy of working class interests in all such struggles.

THE TRADE unions exist to defend workers' interests within the limits of capitalism: they cannot be vehicles for its revolutionary overthrow. The trade union leaders are a bureaucratic caste whose existence depends on the maintenance of their role as professional negotiators. This role fosters a conserva-

ative outlook to act as a brake on militancy. It is necessary, therefore, that workers organise a rank-and-file movement within the existing unions across sectional divisions and independent of bureaucracy. Such a movement would act, firstly, as a political counterpoint to the reformist bureaucracy and, secondly, provide, in times of struggle, the organisational framework to bypass the leaders who always side with the bosses in a revolutionary crisis.

THE LIBERATION of workers must be achieved by the workers themselves. This task cannot be carried out on behalf of the workers by a vanguard party. Any attempt to usurp the role of the mass of the workers must be opposed. There can be no socialism without workers' democracy. Therefore we do not consider the Soviet Union, Eastern Europe, China or Cuba to be socialist.

CAPITALISM generates systems of oppression which divide the working class. To create a unified workers' movement and a genuine communist society we must fight all forms of oppression in principle.

To this end we oppose the oppression of women. In the family women are burdened with the main responsibility for childcare and domestic labour. We stand for free abortion on demand and the socialisation of childcare and housework through free provision of 24-hour nurseries, laundries, dormitories and restaurants.

We are opposed to all forms of racial discrimination. We are opposed to all immigration controls and support the right to physical self-defence against racist attacks.

We oppose all forms of discrimination against lesbians and gays and stand for the full decriminalisation of homosexuality.

ALTHOUGH WORKERS learn through struggle they do not spontaneously become revolutionary. Therefore we advocate a political organisation of anarchist workers which can win workers to libertarian communist ideas and intervene decisively in the class struggle. We stand for the fullest democracy and independence of all workers' organisations. Therefore we defend the right of all revolutionary currents to participate within workers' councils. We urge all those who agree with our objectives and policies to join us in building such an organisation so that Libertarian Communism can become a reality.
