Local Survey

Workers at the Neighbourhood Centre are hoping to do a piece of research to find out what people living in Forest Fields would like us to be doing. Over the next few weeks we will be visiting just over 250 houses in the area to talk about your concerns. The interview will take about 15/20 minutes. We will notify those households to be visited in advance.

Anything that you tell us will be totally confidential and used only to help us decide what work we should be doing in Forest Fields.

After talking to people we will publish the results in the Link so that you can see what sorts of things people are interested in.





Area Caretaker

Forest Fields has an Area Caretaker called Derek Beardall who is employed by Nottingham City Council to do the following work:

- * Securing the removal of accumulations of rubbish.
- * Having abandoned vehicles removed
- * Securing vacant properties.
- * Carrying out temporary/emergency repairs on behalf of certain householders (e.g. Single parent families, elderly and disabled people, and those on sickness benefits).
- * Giving advice or guidance to all residents and liaising with local groups and various agencies in solving problems.

Please report rubbish, abandoned cars and other hazards to the caretaker, and contact him if you need advice or assistance within the above guidelines.

Please note that Divisional Commander Superintendent Pearson is the new Officer in charge of Radford Road Police Station and its surrounding area.


Road Improvements

As you have probably noticed, Berridge Road has a Repaving and Traffic Calming scheme in process. The Repaving is being carried out by Nottingham City Council, and the Traffic Calming by Notts County Council.

Sam Jones L.E.A.P. officer was responsible for public consultation for the City Council. The three main concerns she found were:

- 1 Street lighting should be bright white light.
- 2 Kerbs should be dropped at road junctions.
- 3 Bins were needed outside shops.

These concern were fed back to the city council and all three have been instrumental in the design of the scheme, so residents will get what they asked for. The scheme should end mid-May 1993. Sam wishes to thank everyone who took part in the consultation process.

MONTH OF RAMADAN

One of the Muslim's best-known religious acts is the ninth Lunar month of Ramadan. The Qur'an was first revealed in this very day of Ramadan. This means abstaining from eating, drinking, smoking and conjugal relations during the hours of fasting. It is recommended that one eat immediately after sun has set. One may then eat another, lighter meal before dawn. Eating and drinking unintentionally is forgiven and does not break the fast. Fasting is prohibited for pregnant or menstruating women and for women who have given birth. They can make it later. Travellers, old and feeble persons, children, the sick and insane are exempt.

According to Islamic religion fasting develops self-control and helps
Muslims to overcome selfishness, greed, laziness and other faults. It gives then the feeling of hunger and thirst. They experience for themselves what it is like to have an empty stomach. Fasting is expected to develop their feeling for the poor and hungry people.

Ramadan started 22nd of February this year and will last 30 days. The Muslim year is shorter than the solar year by approximately eleven days, this causes the month of Ramadan to fall back by that much each solar year. Because of this, Ramadan and its fast will fall in all of the natural seasons every thirty-two solar years.

At the end of Ramadan there is a festival known as the Feast of Fast Breaking (Idul Fitr). It is one of the great occasions for the Muslim community. On this day, celebration cards are exchanged among the Muslims, and also friends and extended families gather for food and entertainments.


