













































Savages

So please stop moaning. Mind your own business, enjoy life to the full and remember that nobody owes you a living.







WHY is it when I purchase cooked meats from reputable food shops in Nottingham I am charged for layers of paper that are not removed when weighed.



Now I don't eat paper — it's not good for my digestion. So why am I charged for something I've never ordered!


