About £800 would buy us a luxury replacement..... or if even half of our Out House members contributed five pounds each, we be able to afford to upgrade the P.C. we have.




The only thing is we need a committed group of people to help organise it. If you can spare an hour or two a week, can work co-operatively with others and enjoy having a laugh-this could be for you.

Excerpt from Wendy Lawrence's (GMB member) Letter

Wendy writes "In 1989 I lost my job because of contracting Repetitive Strain Injury. I became a member of the GMB, as an individual, as there was not a union established at the place where I worked . I was advised to take up a claim for personal injury as the conditions under which I worked showed a failure in the duty of care towards me, by my employers. And management was also harassing me"

Wendy goes on to say that she received nothing but empathy and support since joining the GMB and as a result of the encouragement and extensive training given by the Union, Wendy helped to set up an I.R.S. Support Group.

She found her whole association with the GMB very empowering and Wendy went on to say that she would urge everyone to join a trade union to safeguard their interests and not to wait until some crisis occurs.

At this first meeting it was discovered that one of the potential members was already an avid (Continued on page 6)


