

#### **DESOLATION ROW BLUES 1984**

STREETSONG FOR ANARCHIST POETS celebrates some twenty years of pamphleteering. Publishing, editing, designing magazines; posterpoems, and pamphlets — including Henry Thoreau's LIFE WITHOUT PRINCIPLE and Alex Comfort's WHAT ROUGH BEAST and Kenneth Patchen's LOVE & WAR POEMS. Also in 1964 | put on my first poets' and jazz musicians' event - Whisper & Shout - at the White Horse, South End Green. Just as the very first pamphlet, NON-**VIOLENT RESISTANCE by Nicolas Walter, was published out of belief without** money or previous knowledge; so the first poets' event was organised out of a desire to read and perform poems, and give an opportunity to other poets. The costs in both cases were largely covered - after the events. In other words anyone with sufficient interest could do it. The White Horse was crowded because of posters and local newspaper adverts, and because it sounded interesting.

Pamphlets continue to be important because they are relatively cheap compared to books, but more important because they reach out onto the street beyond the booksellers windows, and most important of all, because they contain ideas which may well be popular and radical but which few publishers will touch. From the English Civil War period when the Levellers, Ranters and Diggers issued pamphlets because their beliefs were of such strength they could do no other; to Thoreau and Tolstoy - whose pamphlets: ON THE DUTY OF CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE and WHAT THEN MUST WE DO? could be considered to be two of the most influential pamphlets, since the former inspired both Tolstoy and Ghandi; whilst the latter has probably inspired countless unknown individuals. William Morris and Peter Kropotkin have numerous pamphlets to their names; George Orwell and Alex Comfort several neglected but important contributions; and as can be seen in Housemans Bookshop and Freedom Press Bookshop, both PEACE NEWS and **FREEDOM** keep up the tradition. **FROM PROTEST TO RESISTANCE** (1981) I was involved with helping Chris Jones and Rose Bradshaw put together a 'collage' of photographs, articles, with actual leaflets and posters reproduced - as an important aid to understanding the ideas and actions of that time. The time of the Committee of 100 and Direct Action Committee Against Nuclear War. Unfortunately space was too limited to allow more than a third of my Chronology of the Times --1960s. This meant the names of those who were involved in the early actions got left out - a loss to everyone since individuals like Peter C Brown, author of SMALLCREEPS DAY (Picador), a unique and brilliant novel and today one of the British Isles finest potter's; were instrumental in creating ripples which ultimately involved countless small groups in towns and villages across the country. (FROM **PROTEST TO RESISTANCE is PN/Mushroom Bookshop pamphlet no 2)** 

To my shame a projected pamphlet on the Burghfield Blockade: Easter 1983 which I saw as a useful handbook for future nonviolent actions — never got past the printing stage. This illustrates the necessity for following a project through closely to the very end of the print run - since this pamphlet had been written by various people involved at Burghfield - the place left off the new ordnance survey map! The area now shows nothing but two tiny streams! However, anyone getting hold of the earlier edition will find it fully penned in - showing what a huge factory it is - as the twin establishment to Aldermaston AWRE nearby.

Of recent pamphlets, THE GREENHAM FACTOR (magazine size) and IT'LL MAKE A MAN OF YOU - Penny Strange (PN pamphlet no 4) are anti-militarist and feminist 'bestsellers' whilst BREACHING THE PEACE is an Only Women Press

pamphlet, critical of the obsession with barbed-wire-fenced Common Land! But nevertheless a popular pamphlet because it asks some very important questions. Poison Girls and Crass are two anarchist bands who issue pamphlets. Meanwhile in the world of poets, Christopher Logue's posterpoems and Adrian Mitchell's paperbacks have sold consistently because the poets have regularly given public readings and performances. Dinah Livingstone has given birth to some fine pamphlets (Katabasis, 10 Camden Close, NW1) since her poems erupted some sixteen years ago. Pat Van Twest has issued forth magazines, postcards, but why not a pamphlet, Eh? Jeff Cloves I first met through his lovely Football Special edition of POETS-DOOS. (Three of us met up in RIFF RAFF POETS performances!) His BIG BANG magazine can be had for 30p from 67 Chiswell Green Lane, St Albans. Pat Van Twest can be booked from 69 Lower Redland Road, Bristol 6.

Meanwhile if you have the confidence and courage to go ahead yourself, good luck. Remember you can always duplicate the first little pamphlet. You can always silkscreen your first posterpoem. You can always write out by hand - whoops! your first postcardpoems. But also remember that poets like Walt Whitman and William Blake and Percy Bysshe Shelley have been pamphleteers — have controlled their own publishing and printing and content. As poets and pamphleteers always have!

BURGHFIELD PEACE CAMP was published with map (OS) which does show Royal Ordnance Factory! as a poster for setting-up of peace camp. HENRY MILLER 1890-1982 was written as a tribute when I read of his death whilst in Durham.

MINGUS was a celebration of the Underdog - more accurately a brilliant jazzman! WORTHY FARM NAVAHO-BACK-ADJUSTMENT BLUES was a song written for 1982 Green Gathering and printed in daily newspaper on site. (Illustration is three West African Juju men. 1812).

POETS MANIFESTO, SITTING ON THE FENCE and BOLTCUTTER BLUES were written after taking the photos and supporting the womens' action of October 29th 1983. PERFORMANCE published two on letters page. **BLUES FOR FOR REDRUTH DAYS was written in Redruth 1972.**




