## About NSPM

We are a group of students and academics committed to affecting change in society and bettering the world around us. We campaign on a range of social justice and peace issues, at the individual, local, national and global levels. NSPM works through encouraging dialogue, facilitating discussion, planning events and engaging with campaign groups and other organisations.

We aim to understand social, political and economic ideologies and structures; to challenge and confront the root causes of injustice, conflict and suffering.

## Our Objectives

1. To increase the awareness of Nottingham students on issues of peace and conflict, and social justice.
2. To provide a space for Nottingham students to discuss issues of peace and conflict, and social justice.
3. To encourage interaction between students from different cultural and political backgrounds.
4. To help Nottingham students join in with activities of other societies and external organisations, where they are consistent with our own aims.

## What We Do

We are involved in a range of social justice campaigns on and off campus, including ethical investment, environmental justice, ethical careers, and disaffiliation from the arms industry.

We produce a political journal 'ceasefire', hold a weekly film night 'cinema pacifico'; organise conferences on social and environmental justice and conflict issues; participate in cross-society networking, attend demonstrations, protests and actions.



## How We Work

NSPM works on the principles of 'horizontal' or 'non-hierarchical' organising. Planning meetings run on consensus decision-making principles and the society functions with an inclusive ethos.

## The World Around Us


As students at a wealthy institution in the global north, most of us lead privileged, sheltered, comfortable lives. It is all too tempting for us to be complacent, ignorant or apathetic about the state of the world around us. However, our planet and species are in a woeful and worsening state that we cannot and should not ignore. NSPM proposes we seek an alternative society to one that has created the following problems, and positive solutions to them:

- Every day 24000 people starve to death or die of easily curable diseases.
- Approximately one third of the World's population is at war.
- US spending to date (Sept 2008) on the Iraq war is \$600 billion.
- Estimated annual cost of providing basic healthcare for the world's population: \$15 billion.
- In 2003, the US spent \$360 billion on its military. This is 33 times the combined military spending of the seven 'rogue states' (Cuba, Iran, Iraq, Libya, North Korea, Sudan and Syria)
- The estimated cost of replacing 'Trident', the UK's nuclear weapons system is £56 billion.
- In 2007, global military spending was over \$1.2 trillion.
- Within the past year, global food prices have risen by 75%. Between 2006 and 2007, profits made by ADM, one of the world's leading agribusiness firms, rose by 67%.
- A third of household food in the UK is thrown away.
- More than 150 countries use torture. That's more than two thirds of the countries of the world.

The Arts Organisation is a community space for arts, events and social projects. It boasts a tea room, a gallery and space for events such as live music and diverse classes from photography to banner making.



## Some Terms. What is....?

Bellow are some terms that you might hear used at meetings or events. Many of them are complex subjects and have had books and mountains of essays dedicated to them; so the bellow definitions are only intended to give you the most basic outline understanding.

**'Anarchism'** - a political philosophy encompassing theories and attitudes which support the elimination and rejection of all forms of coercive control and authority (eg. governments). Defined by The Concise Oxford Dictionary of Politics as "the view that society can and should be organized without a coercive state."

**'Capitalism'** - the prevalent current economic system, in which the means of production are owned by private persons, and operated for profit; and where investments, distribution, income, production and pricing of goods and services are predominantly determined through the operation of a 'free market'.

**'Socialism'** - the politico-economic theory of social organization advocating that the means of production, distribution, and exchange should be regulated or owned by the community and/or state.

**'Skipping'** - Salvaging unwanted goods (ie food, furniture) free of charge, from skips and commercial dustbins.

**'Terrorism'** - the use of violence and threats to intimidate or coerce, often for political purposes. Reminds you of the Iraq war doesn't it?

**'Counter Terrorism'** - Action or strategy intended or seen to counteract or suppress terrorism; sadly this usually consists of using 'terrorism' to fight 'terrorism', much like trying to put out a fire with a petrol fire-extinguisher.

**'NVDA' (Non-Violent Direct Action)** - political action to challenge or remedy a problem at it's source by direct means; ie physically getting in the way, affecting or preventing something. Direct action may violate criminal law, though not necessarily.

## Acronym Buster

Sometimes during meetings, people may suddenly break into acronym-speak. Confusing at first for some, everyone comes to understand and use them eventually. So if you're new to these abbreviations, here are some of the basics to get you started:

**BAE** - 'British' Aerospace - Multinational Weapons Corporation. We don't approve of their war-profiteering, to say the least.

**RR** - Rolls Royce - Similarly, an Engineering corporation involved in the production of engines for battleships, warplanes, nuclear subs and many other unwholesome endeavours. The company are very influential at this University, incidentally.

**H&K** - Heckler & Kock - German small arms company with an office in Nottingham.

**CAAT** (Pronounced 'cat') - Campaign Against the Arms Trade

**BNP** - British National Party - the fascists. Boo hiss.

**SWP** (Sometimes referred to as 'swappies') - the Socialist Worker Party. You're sure to encounter these guys.

**SU** - The Students Union - The student body to which our society is officially affiliated and through which we operate

**CND** - Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament

**UDHR** - Universal Declaration of Human Rights

**WTO** - World Trade Organisation - Organisation of senior economic and political figures that seeks to demolish trade restrictions in favour of a 'free market', often violently and/or at the expense of individual and local cultures and wellbeing, in a nutshell.

**IMF** - International Monetary Fund - Organisation that collaborates with the World Bank, frequently using loans and national debts, particularly in developing nations, to push the free market agenda/crusade.
