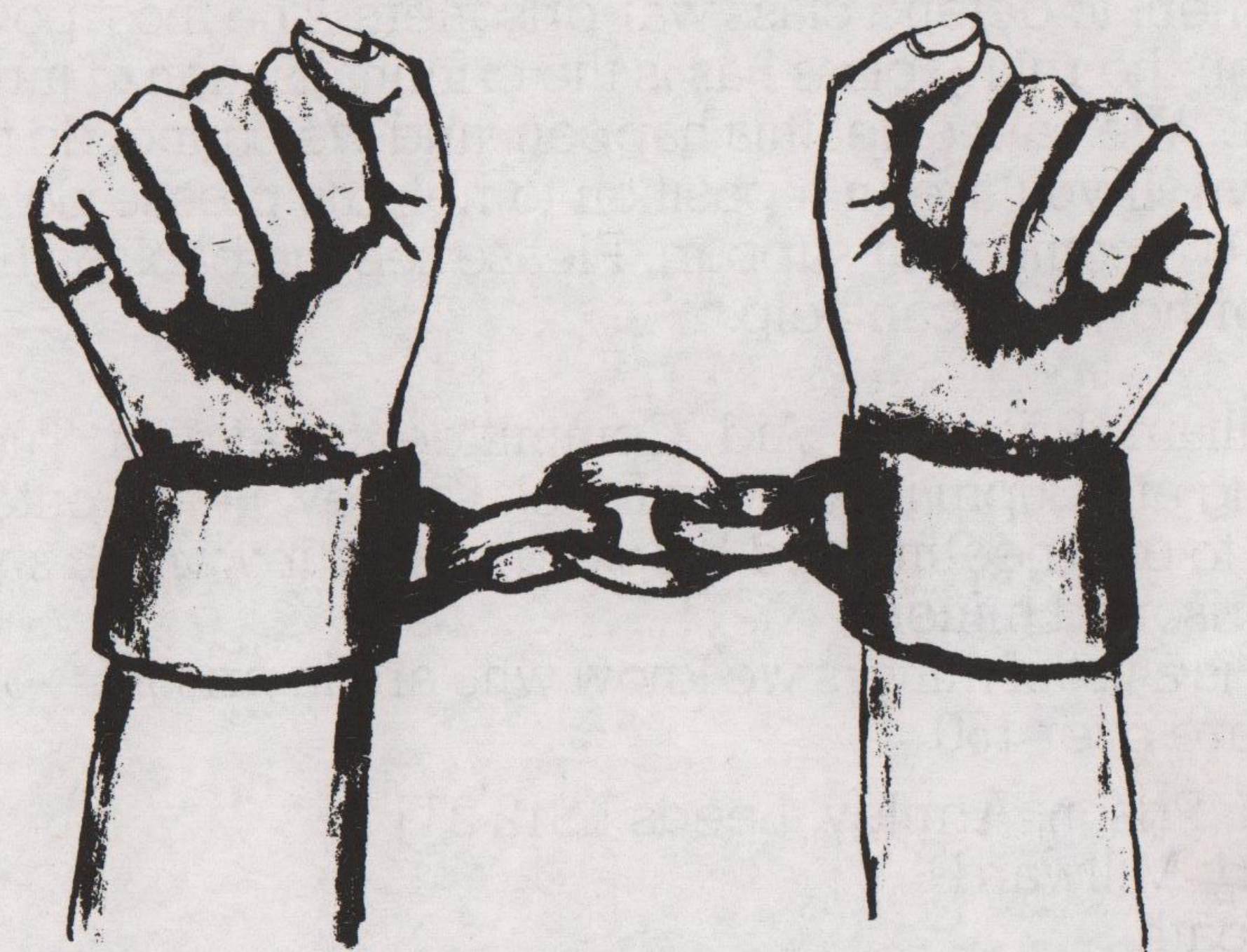

We have set up Fitzwilliam Prisoners Aid Committee to assist which ever way possible our comrades in prison. Following the traumatic experience of the Fitzwilliam Nine trial and the imprisonment of one of our community we set up the Fitzwilliam Prisoners Aid Committee.

We intend that our comrades in prison shall not be forgotten and left isolated. They are in prison for one thing alone, fighting for their jobs and their class. They are not criminals and should not be treated as so: they are class war prisoners. They deserve Justice, theirs is a just cause.

The Prisoners Aid Committee has held public meetings, street collections, written letters to prisoners and helped their families financially. We hope to attend and hold public meetings, rallies etc. We think it is vital to build a solid movement to defend class war prisoners. The most powerful weapon the ruling class has is the criminalisation of innocent people. We cannot let this happen, and we cannot do this on our own.
