

This year is particularly busy as we're also coming to the end of our history project WoLAN (Women's Liberation in Nottingham and After) so we have a number of events planned as part of that. - A month long exhibition at the Central Library, starting 1<sup>st</sup> March. The exhibition covers the Women's Liberation Movement from the early 1970s up to the present day, including the development of Nottingham Women's Centre, Greenham Common and the new wave of feminism happening now.
- Open mic event 'Silence the Violence' at the Maze on Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> March, 7pm late, featuring local poets. £3 on the door with proceeds going to local women's charities.
- Something a bit different... Friday 7<sup>th</sup> March, Nottingham Women's Centre and TAKEOVER presents 'Celebrating female Reggae artists and poets'- with Dawn Penn. 7pm late at Spanky Van Dykes. Cost: £12 (adv), £15 (on the door) with proceeds going to Nottingham Women's Centre.
- On International Women's Day, Saturday 8<sup>th</sup> March, we're taking a coach load of women and children down to London for the annual Million Women Rise march. Tickets for the coach may still be available so please get in touch if you are interested.
- We're hosting a Mother's day Arts and Crafts Fair on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> March, here at the Centre. 12noon 4pm, cost: £1, children free

## Intersectional Feminism in Nottingham

A new group, facebook-based but with occasional meets in the real world, is aiming to promote discussion and consciousness-raising in a safe, non-oppressive, intersectional space.

What is intersectionality? First coined by women of colour to describe the way in which white, middle class feminists spoke of a universal female experience that ignored the very different experiences of women of colour. Intersectionality has now become embedded in many facets of modern feminism and activism from radical through to liberal. It has come to be used academically to highlight the way various different structures of power and privilege intersect in complex and often cumulative ways. To give a very crude example, an intersectional feminist is able to see that the Queen of England is not, in fact, more fundamentally oppressed than a black, disabled, gay elderly man living in poverty.

Why do we need a space to develop intersectional thinking? It is probably fair to say humans are naturally more adept at noticing their disadvantages than their privileges. This has been an issue in feminism, as it is in the larger world, leading to, for instance, white, middle class, able and articulate women speaking for others, unconscious of their privilege. Hopefully, we have created a space where this can be thought about, reflected on and challenged in a safe and friendly way.

What are examples of an intersectional approach? It is a place where, for example, we promote the voices of women of colour, and where we challenge the right of white westerners to critique other cultures. We also ensure that sex workers are given their own voice and not spoken for by people who are not sex workers. We take into account any able and neurotypical privilege in terms of access and communication. A final example is that transgender people are assumed to have more knowledge of themselves than non-transgender people, and we hold that non-transgender feminists speaking for, or theorising about transgender people is inherently oppressive.

What are the Advantages? Self-reflecting on our own privilege and recognising intersectionality gives us unique insights into the obstacles to dismantling structures of power, and how these can be overcome. The revolution comes from within, and in focussing on raising our own consciousness it returns to some very important feminist roots.
