
CLASS STRUGGLE IN A GERMAN TOWN

An account — pre-unification — of the building of a nuclear power plant in Phillipsburg, Germany, by some of the pol-

iticised workers involved. It shows how the German state has benefitted from increasing marginalisation of workers and the casualisation of work. How a system of 'slave traders' — subcontractors who hire workers out to other companies — has allowed an increasing number of Germans, as well as 'guest workers', to be employed without proper contracts and in appalling conditions. At the time of the Phillipsburg construction, many of these workers were already beginning to refuse to take this lying down. An especially timely pamphlet.

LOCAL COMMUNITY SOLIDARITY GROUPS

There will be special discussion workshops at the Anarchist Bookfair and the London Greenpeace Fayre on the subject of local community solidarity groups. These are intended for all libertarians/class struggle activists who believe in practical, community-based activity.

The anti-poll tax struggle has shown that there's great potential within our communities/localities for working alongside many people who share our disgust with the authorities and who genuinely care about the community they live in. This potential goes largely unrealised due to people's isolation from each other and the lack of a clear, practical and accessible local strategy for people to get involved with.

Libertarians and class struggle activists are doing excellent work producing and distributing national papers, running bookshops and centres, involved in single-issue campaigns and groups, trades unions and so on. But our work on the ground is fragmented, and there are community-based groups active in only a handful of areas.

Yet it's there, where we live, that our ideas can be systematically spread, where we can learn from struggles and the people in them, and where practical solidarity and radical opposition can influence the course of events.

Many of us who've been active in APT work (and other large-scale campaigns) don't want to be consigned to marginal or purely ideological activity — we need to get stuck into a broad range of popular and practical local issues, and to develop local solidarity networks.

So let's get on with it — in every locality in the country.

The organisers of this year's Anarchist Bookfair and London Greenpeace Fayre have called for the last two weeks of October this year to become a countrywide fortnight for the anarchist alternative.

Civilisation is now at a social and ideological crossroads, with capitalism offering only more social control, exploitation and devastation, and with state communism totally discredited. Therefore we need to encourage the spread of genuine and coherent, positive alternative ideas for the future — libertarian and anarchist ideas.

We wish to recognise the initiative, diversity and local priorities throughout the movement, whilst aiding the development of countrywide co-operation and solidarity. Hence we're calling for a wide range of local, regional and national events around that time.
